I heard a curious story, which I thought required investigation because it sounded remarkably like active discrimination at ^{s.22}

I'd had a tale recounted to me concerning a number of International Students who, upon seeing the posters inviting students to the Volleyball try-outs, decided they wanted to experience more of the Canadian school culture so went to the try-outs. Imagine my surprise when I was informed they were 'told to go home'.

I called s.22 to seek clarification; perhaps try outs were not open to International students, or students who had not previously played competitive volleyball, but the AP with whom I spoke assured me "all" the students were invited to attend. Why does it not? Perhaps the coaches find it too difficult teaching basic volleyball skills? Or is it that only elite volleyball players are sought for the school teams? Regardless, this is a situation that does need to be addressed with School staff because I interpret it as blatant discriminatory behaviour, and as such Should Not Be Tolerated, nor condoned by anyone for any reason.

I look forward to hearing the justification that will be proffered for this outrageous behaviour.

Dear Minister

Thanks so much for meeting with us about our Indigenous Law program at the end of the summer. I know that your agenda is full. We are grateful for your time. We remain keen to have you come to speak to our students (let us know when would make sense). We would also be pleased to discuss access-to-justice initiatives and how we might work together on those.

This message picks up an issue that arose at our previous meeting. I thought that more information on law-school enrolments, articling placements, and so on might clarify what is going on with the supply of would-be lawyers.

You had asked, in that meeting, whether we ought to convert places in our regular program to JD/JID places. We are very reluctant to do so. As I said at the meeting, we don't want to wind down any of the other very good things we do; our JD/JID students themselves will need those things. It is also true (though I didn't say) that we would have trouble, for reasons of tenure, reducing faculty members in other areas in order to hire people who know Indigenous legal traditions. Building our engagement with Indigenous Law has to be supported in its own right. I attach letters in support from the national

AFN, BC AFN, First Nations Summit, and UBCIC, and from the BC Aboriginal Justice Council.

But it is also worth clarifying the background questions: Is there a shortage of articling positions in BC? If so, what is its cause? I will give information below, but the bottom-line is as follows:

- 1. BC law schools are still placing our students in articling positions at essentially the same rate and essentially the same ease as past years.
- There may, however, be a weakening in the conditions of articles both pay (including instances of unpaid articles) and the rate at which students completing articles are kept on.
- 3. There is segmentation of the market, with students with foreign legal training having a much more difficult time finding articles.
- 4. #3 above, together with the rapid expansion in numbers of students with foreign training, suggests that rather than having too many law school places, we may have too few. Very many of those with foreign legal training are Canadians who have gone overseas to law school. We have in effect begun to outsource our legal training.

To be clear, I am not arguing that we exclude those with foreign legal credentials. Those folks have been very badly treated in the past. But it does suggest that limiting Canadian places may be the wrong solution. I say this as Dean of a Law School that has strongly resisted increasing its enrolment in order to maintain a high-quality, collegial, learning environment.

Here is more detail:

- There was never an "articling crisis" in BC equivalent to that in Ontario, let alone that in the United States. At the time, many people extrapolated from those jurisdictions to ours, when our situation was substantially different.
 - When the question first arose, we at UVic intensified our surveys of our students to determine a) if there was a problem; and b) if so, where. See the attached detailed survey of 2012 and 2013 graduates.
 - o That survey made clear that our students were still getting articles in about the same rate as they did in the past: a rate well above 90%. That doesn't mean that the process is anxiety-free. The search for articles for some students has always continued beyond graduation. We were delighted, then, that when we shared our survey with the LSBC and VBA in 2014 they exhorted their members to increase places. But there is no significant change from previous years. Recent surveys show comparable results (see attached for 2016 graduates).
 - UBC and TRU have shared their placement information in the context of a LSBC inquiry into articling in BC. Their performance is comparable to ours.
- This does not mean that there has been no impact from the weaker economy.
 - The rates at which students are kept on by their firms in BC appear to have dropped –
 although this is anecdotal: once students obtain articles, our response rate on
 employment surveys declines so dramatically that the results are unrepresentative.
 - We know that the terms and conditions of articles declined in 2012 and 2013. Please see the attached survey, which shows the increasing prevalence, especially on Vancouver Island, of unpaid articles. (Note that the increase in unpaid articles has

- become a matter of concern in BC. We shared our information with the Law Society and Victoria Bar Association; each has exhorted members to offer paid articling positions.)
- But, above all, there appears to be a segmented market for would-be articling students: Canadian law schools place their students well, but students with foreign legal training ("NCA students") have much more difficulty.
 - This diagnosis is anecdotal for BC. BC statistics are not helpful because those that include NCA students are based on students registering in PLTC, and to be accepted to PLTC one must already have an articling position. But what is clear is a) that the number of students with foreign training applying to enter the profession in BC has been increasing dramatically in recent years (see below), and we hear that they have greater trouble finding positions.
 - The existence of a stratified market is clearly indicated by the Ontario experience. See attached LSUC report from 2016 evaluating the "Pathways Pilot Project." The table at page 75 has a comparison of the rates of internationally-educated and Canadian-educated students in articling and the non-articling Law Practice Program (LPP). The Canadian-educated students are almost twice as likely to find articles as do the LPP. The internationally-educated students are five times as likely to do the LPP as to find articles.
- The increase in the numbers of NCA students in recent years has been astounding.
 - See attached "NCA Program Review Report" (2017) at 20. The number of applications to the NCA has almost tripled since 2008. In 2015 it stood at 1718 per year. The graph on that page indicates how rapidly it has increased in recent years from about 200 in 1999, to about 400 in 2005 to more than four times that amount ten years later.
 - The "Pathways" document (page 10) provides figures for the increase in the number both of Ontario law school places and of NCA students seeking to enter licencing placements in Ontario. They show the following:
 - Between 2001 and 2011, the total number of Ontario law school places increased by 15.5% (from 1152 to 1330).
 - Between 2007/08 and 2010/11 (ie a little under one-third of the above time), the number of NCA students seeking to enter placements in Ontario increased by 292% (from 93 to 272).
 - Here are more recent figures for BC. These figures are taken from those enrolling in PLTC. Thus, all of these students have articling positions; these figures do not include NCA students who could not find articles.
 - 2015: 383 Canadian law school grads and 111 NCA
 - 2016: 390 Canadian law school grads and 86 NCA
 - 2017: 397 Canadian law school grads and 114 NCA
 - Given that UVic has a maximum of 110 students in each of its cohorts, NCA students now outnumber by a significant margin UVic students entering the profession in BC.
 - o It is important to realize that the NCA students are made up of three quite different groups:
 - 1. Immigrants to Canada who acquired their legal expertise prior to

immigrating.

- 2. Canadians who went abroad to study law at elite universities (eg Harvard, Oxford).
- 3. Canadians who went abroad to study law because they were not admitted to a Canadian law school.

I have not been able to find public figures that indicate the proportions in each group. It is clear that group (2) is tiny. I suspect that the balance between (1) and (3) is close to equal, though (to judge from the graph on page 11 of the NCA Program Review) perhaps shifting towards (1) in recent years.

At page 27, the NCA Program Review says: "Canadians studying abroad and returning to Canada to practise are not the majority". Nevertheless, it is clear that many of the students are within that category.

To me, the lesson of these figures is not that we should be scaling back our receptiveness to immigrants with foreign credentials. We, in the professions, have not done a good job of recognizing immigrants' skills. We should of course ensure that their supplementary training is high quality, however. The Federation of Law Societies of Canada has begun to examine the latter question and the NCA will be the focus of this years FLSC conference on October 19 (in Victoria). The FLSC's review of the NCA was the reason the attached NCA Program Review Report was commissioned.

My focus is rather on the large category (3). The figures on NCA admission to the profession make clear that law firms are hiring those folks; there is, then, a demand for new lawyers that outstrips our domestic training of lawyers. I would rather that those folks be trained within Canada than in law schools in the UK or Australia (often second-rate law schools). This militates in favour of a gentle increase in the number of places at Canadian law schools.

Having kept us wine-only after taking away our discount was completely unfair of the Liberals and a blatant attempt to force us to sell our licences to grocery. These changes are severely harming us as we are constantly losing business and it looks like we are gouging people if we mark-up any of the popular wines that the LDB sells and people are actually looking for. We are forced to order fringe wines that are more difficult to sell that takes two weeks to arrive! You already know this and know it is such a difficult way to operate a business. We want to be specialty, but we would also would love to be able to offer specialty beer & spirits.

We have lost 3 full-time staff because we simply can't afford to pay anybody. It's becoming obvious that we simply can't compete. It's down to just me, my brother-in-law and one P/T staff member. We would love to provide more jobs and support more families in our community, but are simply unable to do so. We are a local family that just wants to keep our business going into the second generation and to maybe one day pass it onto our kids. It's actually getting quite critical and it feels like only our noses are above the water. There are enough "for lease" signs on \$5.22 as it is!

With that said, I am wondering if there is a timeline for giving us the tools to participate in the level playing field? We know things don't happen over night, but we would love to know if there is a light at the end of the tunnel.

If you could help us, that would be fantastic. We know that you already know what we are facing. We also know that you have your plate full with your new appointment so we expect our small shop to be a small blip on the radar. We just want this to be a level playing field as we stand to lose everything if this continues much longer.

Recommended response:

"British Columbians deserve a court system that is properly staffed and able to hear and resolve disputes in a timely manner. That's why we will be taking action by increasing the number of court sheriffs, expanding the use of duty counsel, and increasing staffing of the Court Services Branch to address court delays.

"The ministry is looking at ways to add additional classes to make sure there are sufficient sheriffs in the courtrooms. Sheriff Services received applications from across the province during the last recruitment process, and the top 30 applicants were selected to participate in sheriff training at the JIBC.

"In 2017, more than 54 new sheriffs were added to the provincial complement, which brings the total to 490 sheriffs on the ground in B.C. who provide courthouse security, jury management and the safe and efficient escort of those in custody to and from court, correctional centres and police lock-up facilities. In addition, another sheriff recruit class will start early next year.

"We will continue to make improvements to ensure we do not let down court users across the Province."

I firmly believe that this monopoly of insurance needs to drastically change. The agency has become complacent in its attitude towards improvement. Raising the

rates for bad driving is a logical step, but in the same cenario should exceptionally good customers with perfect driving records be additionally discounted.

It does not make sense that if you are prepared to drive substationaly less due to either using trait in some form or maybe retirement as an example I have reduced my driving from 30k km per year to around 10k km.

Should this not be considered as I now have 66% less chance of an road incident. I have been a claims free driver for over 30 years bur my insurance rates never decline, the discounts when applied never realistically reduce the yearly cost. I wonder if it is time to introduce a dash camera that would show the cause or fraudulent claims that are so prevalent in BC.

This can be implemented with a discount for those choosing to partake. Finally I would like to see open competing for all insurance. This usually leads to pricing competing and coverage as companies vye for market share.

The government can mandate the essential cover that the insurance companies offer.

Your email of July 25, 2017, addressed to the Honourable Mike Farnworth, Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General, regarding Insurance Corporation of British Columbia (ICBC) management compensation and suggestions for a pay per use insurance policy has been referred to me.

Our government has made three commitments to British Columbians:

- To make life more affordable;
- To deliver the services that people count on; and

• To build a strong, sustainable, innovative economy that works for everyone.

Premier John Horgan restated these commitments in the <u>mandate letter</u> he presented to me on July 18, 2017, in which he also listed "a comprehensive operating review of ICBC" as one of my key priorities. I am pleased to report that this review is in the process of being organized.

Please be assured, ministry staff and I are working collaboratively with ICBC, the Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General, the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure, and the Ministry of Finance to determine the actions needed in order to help ensure ICBC is viable and efficient and that the costs of vehicle insurance to British Columbians are both fair and reasonable.

You may be aware, on March 3, 2017, ICBC announced changes to Basic insurance to increase the accountability of drivers who cause crashes, by changing how much an at-fault crash affects their Basic insurance rates.

Going forward, drivers who cause multiple at-fault crashes will lose their safe driving discounts faster than they do today, while long-term safe drivers will continue to have their discount protected if they are at-fault for a crash.

In regard to your suggestions for a pay-as-you-drive or distance based automobile insurance in British Columbia, both government and ICBC, monitor developments in the auto insurance industry across the world. Over the past several years, various auto insurers have implemented different versions of pay-as-you-drive insurance, with mixed results. It now appears some auto insurers are looking to include distance travelled as one aspect of an insurance system while also monitoring other ways drivers use their vehicles.

While ICBC has concluded that distance, as a single factor, is not an effective predictor of insurance risk, they use a number of factors to predict insurance risk, including claims history, driving convictions, where the vehicle is located and how it is used. ICBC also offers customers a number of insurance options that take into account distance travelled (short versus long commutes), vehicle usage (pleasure, drive to other transportation, etc.), and driving patterns (urban versus rural).

Hello David,

As a preliminary, I offer my belated congratulations on your ascension to glory. Whodathunk that in just a few short years, you would move from the humble abode of Pivot in the downtown east side, championing the cause of the poor and the downtrodden, to a corner office in the hallowed halls of the Legislature, determining what justice should look like in this province (please tell me that you have a corner office!). Your rise has been as meteoric as it has been richly deserved. We are lucky to have you.

As to the reason for this email, I have long been interested in electoral reform. The first-past-the-post system is obviously undemocratic (witness the last federal election before the advent of the Liberals, where with a little over a third of the popular vote, the Conservatives were able to form a majority government). It needs to be fixed, but how?

Proportional representation is a much touted alternative. In theory, it is the most democratic; parties have representation in the legislative body in exact proportion to their public support. In practice, however, elections by proportional representation tend often to result in governments which are less than stable and worse, governments which in important respects do not reflect the will of the citizens.

Rarely in western democracy does one party achieve 50% and more in popular support, so coalition governments are the norm in proportional representation systems. While two or more parties can work cooperatively for full electoral terms (witness Germany, where governments rarely fall before the next scheduled election), the opposite can also be true (witness post World War II Italy, with its seemingly endless series of fractious and short-lived regimes). As to democratic efficacy in proportional representation systems, consider the fact that as the price of its support, the smaller party can and often does demand the implementation of the most important policies in its election platform. Such policies may also be the most controversial and garner the least public support (witness concessions on issues such as illegal settlements in the Occupied Territories, which Binyamin Netanyahu must make in order to maintain the support of Avigdor Lieberman's hard right Yisrael Beitenu party, a party which, if memory serves, has something like just 5 seats in the 120 seat Israeli K'nesset).

While not inevitably the case, governments elected by proportional representation run the risk of being unstable and, in important issues, undemocratic.

The French run-off system has a certain appeal; where nobody gets over 50% in the first round, all but the top two candidates are eliminated, the winner being determined in a second vote some time later. But it must be hideously expensive to have two rounds of voting, and there may still be some of the problems which are inherent in the first-past-the-post system (more complicated to explain, so in an attempt to make this piece less prolix, I'll leave it out for now).

All of which leaves my current favourite: preferential balloting. Voters rank the candidates in order of preference. If one candidate gets over half of the first choices, he or she is elected. If not, the candidate who gets over 50% when counting the first and second choices together gets in. Or the #1, 2, & 3 choices, etc. In this system, the general political leanings in a riding are respected. In a federal riding where most voters are centrist or left leaning, for example, the experience has often been that the Conservative candidate has received most or all of the right-of-centre votes, there being no other credible right wing alternative. The centrist and left of centre vote is typically divided among the remaining candidates, so the right winger wins. Given that the right winger would commonly have the lowest ranking on the ballots of the left wing and centrist voters, such a candidate would not get elected in a riding where the sentiment of the majority was centrist or left wing. This seems more democratic to me than any of the other systems.

That said, I am by no means settled in my views as to the best electoral system. There should be full debate without preconditions. Which brings me to the reason for this lengthy email: I have heard something about there being the "citizens' assembly" struck to consider the question and make recommendations. If there will be such a body, would you or one of your able assistants be so kind as to tell me if it is possible to apply for membership and, if so, how one goes about it?

When I wonder why governments never seem to get around to reforming the electoral system, I am reminded of Machievelli's observation that the proponent of a new order will encounter stiff resistance from those who have done well under the old order and only lukewarm support from those who may do well under the new.

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

Since our meeting this past summer, there have been some new developments on the action being taken by five small BC wineries (mine, Okanagan Crush Pad, being one of the five) regarding R. v. Comeau. As you are aware, this case will be heard by the Supreme Court of Canada in December 2017. We had top line discussion on the matter at the time of our meeting.

Our lawyer Shea Coulson applied for intervener status and we have learned that this has been granted. I have attached a copy of our final argument for your information and below is the press release our group issued today.

We are providing this to you as this case is of utmost importance for the nature of the Canadian federation and the province's ability to regulate all Canadian grown, produced and manufactured goods shipped from other provinces, including liquor. Mr. Coulson did have a discussion with the BC government counsel on this case. While we have not yet seen the government's factum, we have some concern arising out of those discussions that the BC Attorney General's office will be asking for quite a restrictive interpretation of s. 121 that would allow the imposition of quantity limits and other onerous requirements. We remain open to discussion on these matters as imposition of severe provincial restrictions would not be a viable outcome for small BC wineries. We look forward to further discussion on this extremely important case.

We understand these are very busy times for your office and appreciate any support you can provide in ensuring lines of communication remain open.

Requesting a statement about whether government still intends to follow through

with the surcharge on luxury vehicles that the previous government intended to bring in as an 'interim' measure.

Background:.

In 2016, the BC Utilities Commission approved the doubling of the basic premium for high-value/luxury vehicles, which are defined as a vehicle with a MSRP over \$150,000, effective Jan. 8, 2017. The new rates apply to private passenger cars only, and not commercial trucks, pick-up trucks, collector cars, limousines or RV's.

Owners of luxury vehicles were already paying more for optional insurance. Repairs to luxury cars come from optional insurance not basic.

ICBC insures luxury vehicles for basic and optional. The former government committed ICBC to not insuring luxury vehicles in the longer term but this change has not yet happened. The new government would need to determine whether to move ahead with this next stage. Despite their high repair costs, luxury vehicles are currently a profitable segment of the market for ICBC. In addition to their higher basic premiums, luxury vehicle owners already pay a lot more for their optional insurance. There are other options which could be implemented that would shift more of the cost of basic Insurance from the average vehicle owner onto the owners of high value luxury vehicles for reasons of fairness while still allowing ICBC to insure this segment of the market.

For those who write to ask about housing:

Thank you for writing to me about housing issues. As you know, I have worked for many years on the challenges in housing in British Columbia, from homelessness, to the serious and credible allegations of money laundering and tax evasion in the BC real estate market, particularly in the Lower Mainland.

In my role as Attorney General, I have taken action on allegations of money laundering in BC casinos by appointing Peter German, a former RCMP deputy inspector, and author of Canada's leading legal textbook on anti-money laundering law, to conduct an investigation into the matter and make recommendations to me.

Important to your query, I have asked Mr. German to advise me immediately if he determines through his review of casino allegations whether he identifies connections to any other area of BC's economy, including real estate, with recommendations on how to address any identified problems.

In addition to initiating Mr. German's investigation, I sit on the new government's Housing Cabinet Committee, where I am supporting my colleagues in their work on several initiatives related to increasing affordable housing supply, but also, and just as importantly, addressing the toxic speculation, money laundering and tax evasion which we know is taking place in the Lower Mainland.

Reform is urgently and critically important, on both the demand and supply sides of the equation, but it's important to know that complicated legal changes are required.

These matters remain a priority for us, and we are working on them – we have been in power for just twelve weeks. Our goal is carefully prepared, effective policy, legislation, and enforcement that will address the concerns of many people in our community about the various activities in our housing market that have gone on for years without interruption.

While your patience is appreciated, I understand strongly your sense of urgency and share it. Thank you very much for writing to me.

Your suggestion of re-attempting to address my concerns with \$.22 personnel may well be an exercise in futility, as, in any problem-solving process, I addressed my concerns with the school staff First. That endeavor was met with the same obstreperous, highly emotional, vociferous, response to which I had become accustomed when \$.22 attended. It was disappointing indeed to see that very little had changed or progressed, and the response by \$.22 employees remains obstructive. (This, in itself, was very apparent when, on the first day of school, staff seemed very comfortable making denigrating comments about the International Students.) I'm sorry, but continuing to address concerns with those who believe they are justified in reacting as they do, is a lesson well remembered from s.22 , and not one which I am prepared to revisit. Therefore, as in my previous experience, continuing to move up the Line of Authority is the most efficient problem solving process.

Points made in my initial conversation:

- <!--[if !supportLists]-->• <!--[endif]-->If volleyball tryouts are for *Experienced* students only, this should be noted in the posters and announcements.
- <!--[if !supportLists]-->• <!--[endif]-->As much as the Assistant Principal endorsed that volleyball tryouts were for ALL the students, he was not able to answer 'Why' to either scenario. WHY were the International students sent home? WHY were the inexperienced, International students sent home if they are allegedly "invited" to participate?

This discussion no longer involves me. I have zero need to continue bringing this issue to your attention. This is a very clear issue of Discrimination which needs to be addressed at the Ministerial Level. When Secondary schools 'invite'

International Students to be part of their community, then blatantly exclude them, in front of their peers, this is a very clear problem of Mixed Messages. You cannot 'invite' someone to attend an activity then send them home because they don't meet your standards. These students are also here for the "Canadian Experience". Since when did being Canadian translate to mean exclusionary? discriminatory? dishonest?

There are no words to express my disappointment in the actions of the s.22 staff, most of which are inexcusable and beneath us as Canadians.

Two solutions are options at this point:

Good Morning Taralee

Thank you for responding to my email.

My initial concern has not been met. As \$.22 does not have a competitive volleyball team and are in fact *invited* to participate in the Vancouver league they only play non-competitive games, typically referred to as "Exhibition Games". These, essentially, amount to nothing more than a fun, athletic activity for all students involved.

I am very aware of the skill level of my student, and indeed the majority of other students who attended the 'Try outs'. My question remains. Why were they "told to go home"?

From what I have been told thus far, by the many people involved in this fiasco, whom I interpret as attempting to white wash a dog's breakfast which should not have happened, it is a 'complex' issue with many aspects. I was also informed my student was "unruly", which I know is an outright lie as this young man is extremely well behaved. And, as a s.22 I am indeed, skilled enough to assess his behaviour and attitude so when I'm told his behaviour was "disruptive" then I know he has either been confused for another student or I'm being 'diverted' from the real event.

Also, I was informed the volleyball coach is a 'Volunteer'. In this context I interpret volunteer to be synonymous with incompetent. Volleyball is not so complex a sport the skills are difficult to teach nor convoluted beyond comprehension for the student. So, again, why were these students sent home? Having worked as a Recreation Therapy Assistant I am very familiar with teaching sporting activities to clients based upon their skill and ability levels. As these are healthy, active, competent, adolescents where would the difficulty lay in teaching them a new sport? Certainly not the comprehension, but perhaps the "Teacher" may have questionable skills. Is this the real reason the students were Excluded? It is beyond the capabilities of the *coach* to teach basic volleyball skills to a group of youth in a non-competitive activity? I've never found it to be rocket

science so I'm confused as to wherein lay the difficulties.

In response to your comments regarding my discussion with the VP you may have been misled regarding my emotional response. There was no emotion on my part. I was not, however, impressed by the VP's pallid attempt to obfuscate the issue at hand by diverting the conversation therefore remained on topic and continued to question the rationale for the exclusion of these students. He did seem somewhat put out by my lack of acceptance of what I could only describe as total nonsense. I expect the staff at any school board to do better, but perhaps my standards are too high.

Regardless, I want to know why these students were excluded? Nothing I have heard thus far is logical or rational so I can only continue to see this event as discriminatory. This is unacceptable. At the very **least** these students are owed an apology!

Good afternoon s.22 and thank you for your email.

I had the opportunity to ask about the concerns that you are bringing forward below.

I can confirm that team tryouts are always open to all students. Each team has its own set of criteria that allows selection of the players – on the senior teams there is a greater expectation of skills and competition whereas with the junior teams there is a greater emphasis on participation and development.

The s.22 Vice Principal confirms that he did speak with you and that unfortunately the conversation did not go well. Understandably emotions may have been running high, but he was unable to determine, during your discussion, which team tryouts you were referring to. He did let me know that at the Senior Boys Volleyball tryouts three International students attended but that two had very basic/beginner volleyball skills. The coach spoke with these two students privately during the water break because the next drill was going to involve spiking. It was out of a concern for the safety of the students that he suggested they not continue further with the tryouts. The third International student displayed a high volleyball skillset and has made the Senior team.

It is my understanding that the coach spoke respectfully with the students and explained that the senior team was expecting a higher level of skill than they had. If this is not the case, the Vice Principal would certainly want to follow-up.

I heard a curious story, which I thought required investigation because it sounded remarkably like active discrimination at \$.22

I'd had a tale recounted to me concerning a number of International Students who, upon seeing the posters inviting students to the Volleyball try-outs, decided they wanted to experience more of the Canadian school culture so went to the try-outs. Imagine my surprise when I was informed they were 'told to go home'.

I called s.22 to seek clarification; perhaps try outs were not open to International students, or students who had not previously played competitive volleyball, but the AP with whom I spoke assured me "all" the students were invited to attend. Although, he did not have an explanation as to why the international students were 'told' to leave. He did, however, inform me he didn't appreciate my attitude. Apparently challenging his definition of "All" was rather more involved than he is accustomed; perhaps it stressed him having to explain the negative behaviour of ASS athletic staff.

My question does remain the same. Why were the international students, both male and female, 'told' to go home before the first practice was completed? If the try outs were meant for Local students only why was this not indicated on the posters? If the try outs were for students with previous experience, again, why was this not indicated

on the posters? To be informed by the assistant principal that "all" students were welcomed to attend, is, in fact, misinformation. "All" students were not welcomed.

I would say, considering the amount of money the parents of the international students pay for tuition to the Schools in North Vancouver, I would imagine that should include sport participation as well. Why does it not? Perhaps the coaches find it too difficult teaching basic volleyball skills? Or is it that only elite volleyball players are sought for the school teams? Regardless, this is a situation that does need to be addressed with School staff because I interpret it as blatant discriminatory behaviour, and as such Should Not Be Tolerated, nor condoned by anyone for any reason.

I look forward to hearing the justification that will be proffered for this outrageous behaviour.

Minister Farnworth:

By now, I am assuming you have seen some of the media coverage pertaining to a report from 2016 that reviewed various cash handling practices at River Rock Casino Resort, which is a property of Great Canadian Gaming.

Needless to say, we were disturbed by some of the opinions expressed in the report and we feel it is fundamentally important to convey to you that we take our role of "recording and reporting," as directed by the BC Lottery Corporation, the Gaming Policy Enforcement Branch and FINTRAC, as critical to the operation of our business; we have not become the largest gaming operator in the country without fulfilling and exceeding this foundational mandate.

What is particularly inaccurate in the report, and the subsequent media coverage, is any implication that we have not taken our role of meeting every standard, rule or obligation imposed by our regulatory authorities as anything less than the operational norm of our business. Contrary to what the report may allege, we have built a culture of compliance, and adherence to everything that is expected of us. In other words, regardless of what regulatory agency mandates action from us- the BCLC, GPEB, FINTRAC or any other authority- we follow their rules and regulations consistently and completely, which meets or exceeds their oversight in the form of daily audits, site checks, on site investigators embedded in our operations, or any other way they validate our work.

We feel you are a stakeholder in our business, so that's why we wanted to share this quick note with you, in advance of anything that we may be stating further publicly.

Dear Neighbours:

Thank you for your patience in waiting for this newsletter. As British Columbia's new Attorney General, I've been "drinking from the firehose" of information being delivered to me concerning my new job.

While I'm very proud to be responsible as Minister for the administration of justice, ICBC, gaming, and liquor policy in BC, it's a lot to take in over the last twelve weeks!

I'm very keen to share with you what your new government has been doing to make life better for British Columbians, and for people in our community.

Last week, I joined Premier John Horgan and our Education Minister Rob Fleming for an exciting announcement that Kitsilano will be home to a new school at the Bayview Elementary site. Funding has been allocated for the replacement of the well-loved, but challenged Bayview building. Long overdue issues of mould, asbestos and a desperate need for seismic upgrades will be addressed all at once by this funding announcement, which is great news for Kitsilano families.

In other education news, British Columbia is currently hiring teachers in a big way, as our government moves to address the desperate issues of class size and composition that so many of you have written to me about over the years. Now, instead of talking about closing schools, we're talking about hiring teachers. This is great news for BC's kids, especially those who will thrive and succeed with more teaching attention.

Some of the most vulnerable kids in BC, those in government care, got the good news from my colleague Melanie Mark that they can attend university or college in BC tuition free, giving them the chance at success that they deserve. Those struggling with student loans got the welcome news that government has reduced the interest they have to pay.

But it hasn't all been education. In my role as Attorney General, I have taken action on allegations of money laundering in BC casinos by appointing Peter German, a former RCMP deputy inspector, and author of Canada's leading legal textbook on anti-money laundering law, to conduct an investigation into the matter and make recommendations to me.

I sit on the new government's Housing Cabinet Committee, where I am supporting my colleagues in their work on several initiatives related to increasing affordable housing supply, but also, and just as importantly, addressing the toxic speculation, money laundering and tax evasion which we know is taking place in some areas in the province, especially in the Lower Mainland.

For Vancouver, addressing supply issues has meant my colleague Selina Robinson has rolled out funding for 2,000 modular housing units for those living on the streets right now in BC. This will result in hundreds of units of modular housing for Vancouver, which we hope the city will be able to deploy to house people living in a near permanent tent city on an industrial site in the Hastings area.

Similar tent cities in Surrey and Maple Ridge will also be benefitting from this initiative which will deploy housing units across the province for emergency response to an out-of-control homelessness problem.

In my role as Attorney General, I introduced bills in the house that, if passed, will ban big money in politics – ending donations from corporations and unions and strictly limiting donations from individuals to a maximum of \$1,200, the lowest limit in Canada with the exception of Quebec's \$100 limit.

As Minister responsible, I also introduced legislation to guide BC's referendum on electoral reform (proportional representation), and a consultation process will be rolling out on that in the next few weeks. Finally, I introduced a bill that restricts lobbying by former Cabinet Ministers and Board members of public organizations, prohibiting them from lobbying for a period of two years. My colleague Mike Farnworth is currently undertaking a public consultation on BC's response to federal cannabis legalization on July 1, 2017, and you can participate at this website: https://engage.gov.bc.ca/govtogetherbc/consultation/bc-cannabis-regulation/.

My Ministry is also engaging in a public consultation about re-establishing BC's Human Rights Commission to advocate for and protect a diverse and tolerant community in our province. If you're interested in participating in this consultation, you can learn more at: http://engage.gov.bc.ca/govtogetherbc/consultation/bc-human-rights/

Our new budget has increased BC's carbon tax, committing the revenue to investing in carbon reducing technologies and initiatives like transit. We've cut taxes for small businesses, and reduced MSP premiums by 50%. We've sent Site C to the Utilities Commission for a review to ensure that the project doesn't proceed if it's not in the interests of British Columbians.

Just last week, a distinguished and nationally recognized lawyer hired by my office finished our government's legal submissions in the Federal Court of Appeal arguing that the Kinder Morgan pipeline expansion is not in BC's interests given the risk of a catastrophic spill for our community, for Vancouver, and for the coastal economy in BC generally. We expect a decision in that case in the coming months.

My colleague George Heyman, last week, introduced new legislative reforms that shift responsibility for oil and chemical spills from pipelines or rail from exclusively resting on the shipper (the pipeline company, trucking company or railway) to include the originating oil or chemical company. These reforms will ensure that influential and wealthy large companies shipping toxic substances play an active role in ensuring that products moved through BC are shipped safely and appropriately.

As Minister responsible for ICBC, I inherited a crown corporation with a half a billion dollar annual deficit – something that the previous government forgot to disclose to the public before the last election. I'm currently working hard with a team of people to reform car insurance policy and law in BC to address this crisis at our public insurer.

ICBC can deliver affordable insurance to British Columbians; it has in the past, and it will again. To that end, I'm currently having difficult but important conversations with groups that benefit from ICBC about the need to reduce costs. This includes autobody repair shops, lawyers, and others. I've also instituted a business audit that will be reporting back early next year with potential reforms. I

look forward to reporting back to you about this challenging work as it moves forward.

Locally, we've had a complete change of staff at my constituency office on Broadway. Gala, Lucinda and Anna have all accepted jobs with the new government in Victoria, with the Ministry of Attorney General, Health, and Mental Health, respectively.

Joining us at the Vancouver office full time in the last month is Dulcy, and we hope to announce final hiring of a second staff member in a few weeks. Dulcy has been joined by Nadja, Sam, and Nick who have been filling in critical roles during this transition period. Thanks to all of them for their hard work.

On the note of fiscal prudence, our government has delivered a balanced budget while completing all of these initiatives, including considerable room for "fiscal prudence" in the event of changing economic circumstances.

We have been in government for twelve weeks, and we're making life better for British Columbians, but there is still much to do. If you have an issue you think our new government should be addressing, please let me know.

Despite my provincial ministerial duties, ensuring that I remain available to our community remains my priority. I'm always glad to meet with people from our constituency, so please reach out to me and my staff if you have questions, concerns, or if you'd like to know more about what we're doing.

Dear Honourable David Eby,

I am writing to request that in your new position as Attorney General that you take leadership on bringing the operations and activities of the BC Association of Chiefs of Police (BCACP) and BC Association of Municipal Chiefs of Police (BCAMCP) into compliance with BC law.

As you are aware, both the BCACP and BCAMCP engage in lobbying government as well as in coordinating many important provincial police operational activities, and yet are subject to neither BC lobbying laws nor to BC freedom of information laws. In essence, these associations are functioning as vitally important public bodies but are not subject to any provincial or federal laws governing public bodies. Indeed, by last count at least 7 members of your own Ministry regularly participate in the BCACP in their public capacities, yet their activities at these meetings are not directly subject to FIPPA. If historical patterns continue, you may be attending their meetings yourself on occasion.

As you are aware, s.22 In 2014, Information and Privacy Commissioner Elizabeth Denham conducted her own investigation of the police chief associations and issued her own report. Denham urged the government to bring the BCACP and BCAMCP into compliance with BC law by adding the BCACP to Schedule 2 of FIPPA immediately, and adding the BCAMCP to Schedule 2 of FIPPA as soon

as possible (by urging the BCAMCP to hasten its non-profit organizational status, or declare itself definitively to be a public body subject to FIPPA). These actions were also recommended by the BC Civil Liberties Association and Pivot Legal Society,. And the BCACP and BCAMCP indicated that they would accept whatever government decided.

s.22 ... Commissioner Denham also reiterated her recommendation to that committee. And in November of 2015, in its presentation to that same committee, the Provincial government officially declared that it would, in fact, add the BCACP and BCAMCP to Schedule 2 of FIPPA. However, to my knowledge no action has yet to be taken. Therefore, I urge you to take leadership on helping bring about these changes as soon as possible, and add the BCACP and BCAMCP to Schedule 2 of FIPPA.

I look forward to your reply.

- 1) How much was the yearly budget of IIGET when it was in operation?
 - When IIGET was established in 2003 it received \$1.5 million. This amount increased incrementally each year to \$1.66 million by 2008.
- 2) Whose decision was it to cut its funding, and the whole unit?
 - Funding for IIGET was discontinued in April 2009 and IIGET was disbanded that same year
 a decision made by the previous government.
- 3) In hindsight, knowing what was known in 2009, as cited in IIGETs report, and what is known now, was this a good decision?
 - The Joint Illegal Gaming Investigation Team (JIGIT) was established in 2016 and is mandated to investigate organized crime and gang involvement in illegal gambling and prevent money laundering both inside and outside B.C.'s gaming facilities.
 - JIGIT is situated in the Combined Forces Special Enforcement Unit (CFSEU) B.C.'s integrated anti-gang police agency - where members have access to significant anti-gang and organized crime resources.
 - JIGIT is drawing on the anti-gang and organized crime expertise of CFSEU-BC, which is something that the previous IIGET team was not given authority to do.
 - CFSEU-BC draws and develops highly-specialized officers from federal, provincial and municipal agencies around the province.
 - CFSEU-BC's mandate is to target, investigate, prosecute, disrupt and dismantle the
 organized crime groups and individuals that pose the highest risk to public safety due to
 their involvement in gang violence in B.C.
- 4) The reporter would also like a comment on a statement in the IIGET report that read: "a conflict of interest or perception of corruption undermines the integrity of gaming in B.C. and so this is a very important part of the report."

Attorney General David Eby –

"On assuming responsibility for gambling policy in BC, I received briefings that caused me to be

concerned that government was not doing enough to crack down on money laundering and allegations of criminality related to BC gaming facilities. That is why I have hired Peter German to conduct an independent review and investigate anti-money laundering policies and practices in B.C. casinos. Through that review and the work of the Joint Illegal Gaming Investigation Team under the Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General, I am committed to finding policy and enforcement solutions to curb the issue of money-laundering in lower mainland casinos."

"Public confidence that gambling is conducted responsibly is threatened by any perception of corruption or conflict of interest, which is why British Columbia relies on the work of the Gaming Policy Enforcement Branch (GPEB). Among other responsibilities, GPEB's role is to identify individuals involved in organized crime or other criminal activities and to prevent them from being involved as investors, contractors or employees in BC casinos. Protecting public confidence means ensuring that high standards are enforced, and that criminals are kept out of casinos."

The reporter would like to determine whether the ministry through gaming is cracking down on the enforcement of giving proceeds of games to individuals instead of registered charities. The reporter was told that the veterans group ANAVETs was advised that it can no longer run meat draws because it gives its proceeds to veterans in need.

Background

This is a follow-up to a media request from October 6, 2017. Note that the licensing team has not told the veterans' group that they will be discontinuing meat draws because the proceeds go to veterans. The current licensing application submitted by this organization is on hold while the audit and licensing staff help them complete submission of their outstanding financial reports from past licenced events. The group has also been provided sample reports to assist in completing this task as quickly as possible to move the licensing process forward.

Recommendation - Provide response on background

Why is this happening? Is there a crackdown on 50/50s and other types of fundraising games?

RESPONSE:

Provided Background

- All groups that wish to raise funds through noncommercial gambling in B.C. must obtain a gambling event licence issued by the Gaming Policy and Enforcement Branch (GPEB).
- To be considered for a gambling event licence, applicants must meet the eligibility criteria under the Guidelines and Standards Procedures that include how money generated from non-commercial gambling events can be used in B.C. This information is available online:

http://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/sports-

culture/gambling-fundraising/gambling-licence-fundraising

- GPEB issues licences to charitable organizations so they can raise money through gambling events for the benefit of important programs and services in B.C. communities.
- Some examples of the charitable gambling events that GPEB licences include raffles, 50/50 draws, meat draws and bingos.
- There are three kinds of licences a charitable organization can apply for, depending on how it is structured, how much money will be raised, the prize value, and ticket price.
- The three kinds of licences an organization may apply for include:
- o Class A More than \$20,000 in gross revenue
- o Class B \$20,000 or less in gross revenue
- o Class D \$5,000 or less in gross revenue
- Fairs and exhibitions in B.C. may apply to GPEB for a Class C licence, which allows them to operate ticket raffles, bingos, wheels of fortune, and limited casinos.
- Generally the net proceeds from Class A and B noncommercial gambling events must be used for eligible

disbursements related to the direct delivery of programs and services in B.C.

- Class D events raise funds to benefit a community and/or third party within B.C. or an eligible general purpose of a group or organization that provides direct benefit to a third party or the broader community.
- o A Class D gambling event license could be used (if approved) is to help an individual or family facing an exceptionally unfortunate circumstance, such as the recent loss of their home and/or belongings.
- o These exceptional cases are evaluated on a case-by-case basis
- o In general gambling event funds can never be used for personal gain they must provide a direct benefit to a third party or the broader community.
- The branch requires that all organizations applying for licences be in good standing, have a democratic governing structure, and operate with sound financial practices. GPEB encourages any organization with questions or concerns about a specific application for a gambling event licence to contact us at Gaming.Licensing@gov.bc.ca or 250 387-5311.

I am responding to your August 25, 2017 email, regarding your claim with the Insurance Corporation of British Columbia (ICBC).

By virtue of legislation, the *Insurance (Vehicle) Regulation*, ICBC is entitled to settle or compromise any claim or action brought against any of its insureds as it deems appropriate.

The decision to pay an injury claim is not guided solely by the amount of damage to a vehicle. Other factors, such as objective signs of injury and pre-existing health conditions that could make a person more susceptible to injury, are considered when assessing the claim.

According to Section 74.1 of the *Insurance (Vehicle) Regulation*, ICBC is given authorization to accept an injury claim and payment is only made where there is sufficient evidence, including medical documentation. For ease of reference, I have attached a copy of this section for your reference.

Thank you for sharing your experience. I have announced a business audit of ICBC files to ensure they are carefully, fairly and promptly reviewing and settling injury claims.

Under the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*, ICBC is not permitted to release the nature of the other party's injury claim to you.

Your email dated August 24, 2017 addressed to Premier John Horgan, regarding your request for an off-sales endorsement on \$.22 liquor primary licence, has been referred to me as the Attorney General and the Minister Responsible for Liquor.

I am sorry to hear of the recent economic struggles you and your community have faced.

As you referenced in your email, the distance criterion for off-sales endorsements is 30 km. One of the reasons for this is to limit the total number of liquor retailers in the province, while still allowing rural communities access to a liquor sales outlet.

Licensees must meet the current criteria in order to be approved for an endorsement even if the establishment previously had an endorsement. Liquor regulations evolve over time so the Liquor Control and Licensing Branch must ensure the current rules and regulations are being applied fairly across all licensees.

I can appreciate the frustration of falling below the qualifying distance criterion. Unfortunately, exceptions cannot be made to requirements set out in the Liquor Control and Licensing Regulation.

I appreciate you raising your concerns about the residents of Fort Fraser not having nearby access to retail liquor. The Fort Fraser community may quality for liquor service through the Rural Agency Store Program. Under this program, the owner of a general store in a rural area that has been in business for over a year may apply to sell liquor. Please contact the Liquor Distribution Branch (LDB) for more information about this program, you can find contact information for the LDB at the following website: http://www.bcldb.com/about/contact

You may also be interested to know that government has committed to creating an advisory panel for matters relating to British Columbia's beer, wine, and spirits industry. This panel may consider issues related to the broader liquor industry, and I encourage you to keep an eye out for further developments as they are announced.

Thank you for writing to me about ride sharing.

During the election, I committed to advocating for ride sharing to be legalized in British Columbia.

I also committed to ensuring that ride sharing in BC be introduced in a responsible way. In particular, I said we need to protect passenger safety through driver background checks, ensure adequate insurance in the event of a car accident that injures a passenger, and use this unique opportunity to support BC businesses and technology development if possible.

My commitments to our community have not changed on this issue since I was elected. Premier Horgan has been clear that our government will be bringing in ridesharing to British Columbia, and we will do so in a responsible manner.

Fortunately, taking the time to get this right is not an issue on which the parties in the legislature disagree.

The post-election BC Liberal throne speech in June, 2017, said "your government has heard the message that legitimate implementation concerns [concerning ridesharing] remain. Any proposed legislation will be referred to an all-party committee for extensive consultation with the public and stakeholders, in particular regarding boundaries and insurance."

Every BC Liberal MLA voted to support extensive consultation, and taking the time to get outstanding issues right before ride sharing starts in the province. And no wonder; very little implementation work had been done by the previous government despite Uber requesting access to British Columbia's market since 2012.

The consequences of not taking the time to ensure we're protecting British Columbian's interests are apparent from other jurisdictions around the world.

London recently suspended Uber's ability to operate in that city for a variety of alleged infractions. They're not alone. A number of places that rushed Uber implementation have had to revisit that decision for various reasons, or faced serious consequences for not taking the time to get their systems right: http://www.telegraph.co.uk/technology/2017/09/22/has-uber-run-trouble-around-world/

As a supporter of ride sharing technology for a number of reasons, I'd like to see ride sharing in BC as soon as possible. But as part of government, we have a responsibility to take the lessons that were learned elsewhere, and use them to protect the interests of British Columbians.

My colleague the Minister of Transportation is doing the important policy work required to do exactly that as I write.

Thank you for writing to me about the proposed Kinder Morgan pipeline expansion.

In addition to being your local MLA, I have another important job. I am also British Columbia's Attorney General. As Attorney General, I hold a special role in the executive committee of government (the Cabinet).

My job is to ensure that the government in BC respects the law, and to ensure litigation involving the province is conducted responsibly and according to our various constitutional and legal obligations.

The proposed pipeline expansion has resulted in a number of significant legal actions in which the province of BC is involved.

To assist me in this litigation, I hired one of the most respected environmental and First Nations law lawyers in Canada, Tom Berger, QC, to help ensure that British Columbians' interests are protected as best as possible during this process.

Mr. Berger has assisted our government in obtaining intervenor status at the Federal Court of Appeal, to argue that the federal government failed to ensure British Columbia's interests were considered during the approval process. He asked, on our behalf, that the Court overturn the federal permit that authorized the pipeline expansion to go ahead.

If that case is successful, the pipeline project will stop completely, and the approval process will completely reset.

That decision is reserved, which means that the Court will be providing a decision at a later date, likely a number of months from now.

Mr. Berger, QC, is also assisting me in fulfilling our government's constitutional and legal obligations in two cases at the BC Supreme Court that challenge the province's approval processes. My ability to discuss these cases in detail is unfortunately very limited by my role as Attorney General for the province, because it is the province's processes that are being judicially reviewed in these cases.

Yesterday we saw a disturbing example of the nature of this federal project. Kinder Morgan says that they have applied to the National Energy Board to ask for an order that Kinder Morgan not have to wait for permits from the city of Burnaby.

Because the pipeline is a federal project, the National Energy Board has the ability to make orders like this to overrule governments at the city or provincial level.

While litigation continues, my colleague George Heyman is very engaged in ensuring that BC identifies and uses all tools available to ensure our province's interests are protected in relation to this project.

Please be assured that I share your very serious concerns about this pipeline, the concerns of First Nations communities, the increase in tanker traffic in our community, and the carbon emissions associated with this project. Thank you for writing.

For many years, for several important reasons, many British Columbians have advocated for an end to the trophy hunt of grizzly bears.

In August of this year, our government responded by banning the trophy hunting of grizzly bears, effective November 30, 2017.

Given the significance of the policy change of banning the trophy hunt in BC, our government committed to consult with the community about the impact of that ban. Your feedback is important for that process.

Until Nov. 2, members of the public can provide input into two policy documents outlining the proposed regulation changes required to implement the ban. While input on any concerns is welcome, input is specifically being sought on:

- Changes to manage the ban in hunting areas that overlap the Great Bear Rainforest;
- Changes that will prohibit the possession of "trophy" grizzly bear parts;
- Changes that will manage prohibited grizzly bear parts;
- Changes to prohibit the trafficking of grizzly bear parts, and
- New reporting requirements for taxidermists.

- The CRT opened its doors for strata claims in July 2016

Diana has drafted this paragraph for anyone needing to send out a written "standard response" to address the concerns now being raised:

"The Mental Health Review Board's primary concern is to provide fair hearings for patients within short statutory deadlines. The Board is required by legislation to schedule hearings within 14 days, or in some cases, within 28 days. In every case, the MHRB tries to schedule in-person hearings within these statutory deadlines, across the province, where all three panel members are present in person. Where this is not possible, and to ensure that the hearing still goes ahead, the MHRB has scheduled in-person hearings where one or two panel members attend by telephone. In other cases, the MHRB has scheduled videoconference hearings. After days of speculation, Pitt Meadows city councillor David Murray has resigned.

John Becker, Pitt Meadows' mayor, said on Sunday afternoon via <u>his Facebook page</u> that he'd met with Murray earlier in the day "and obtained his resignation from City Council."

Murray was convicted of sexual assault in Port Coquitlam provincial court this week for an incident that occurred about 25 years ago. The victim's name is subject to a publication ban.

Becker expects a special closed meeting of city council on Monday. He said there would be no further update until then.

Becker had previously announced that he would be seeking Murray's resignation in the Sunday meeting.

Several councillors said they were considering resigning if Murray didn't.

"I think it places a huge cloud over us as a council and the reputation of our city," said Coun. Bill Dingwall, a retired RCMP officer with a law degree from the University of Ottawa. "It completely sends the wrong message about sexual assault to victims and in particular this victim."

I am responding to your email of August 25, 2017, regarding Crown Counsel's charge assessment decision involvings.22

I appreciate that this is a stressful situation for you\$.22 , however, as a general rule the Attorney General does not become involved in individual prosecution cases, nor does the Ministry of Attorney General supervise the investigative agency.

The BC Prosecution Service is responsible for the conduct and supervision of criminal prosecutions in British Columbia. In completing a charge assessment, Crown Counsel are guided by <u>policy CHA 1</u> and impartially assess the investigative file that is brought to them, carefully balancing all relevant factors in light of the available evidence, the governing *Criminal Code* provisions (as informed by the relevant case law), and their assessment of the public interest as agents for the Attorney General of British Columbia.

Crown Counsel are obliged to fairly, independently, and objectively examine the available evidence in each case in order to determine if the charge approval threshold established in policy CHA 1 has been met.

Your email has been shared with the Vancouver Region of the BC Prosecution Service, which was responsible for making the charge assessment decision. You will be receiving a separate correspondence from Mr. Grant Wong, Deputy Regional Crown Counsel, who will respond more specifically to your concerns.
