Now that we have completed and sent you the panel recommendations, I am writing to you to kindly and urgently request a meeting at your earliest convenience.

As I pointed out to each of you at our last meetings, the Craft Distilling industry is **urgently** in need of help, and is right now at the brink of being irreparably harmed if immediate action is not taken. Action that will benefit not just the distilling sector, but even more profoundly will bolster the Agricultural sector and increase revenues for the LDB and the province of BC.

Urgent and immediate action is required on the following:

1. **Elimination of the Hangman's Clause** on page 1 of the Craft Distillery Policy, which states, "When a distiller grows to a production level greater than 100,000L they will no longer be considered a craft distiller. Therefore, the distillery will no longer be entitled to the reduced mark-up on their products and will no longer be entitled to direct sales to restaurants, bars, and private retail stores." This is an industry killer and absolutely has to be removed (this clause was also in an old version of the craft brewers production agreement and was removed due to it's harmful affects) as it will hinder all craft distilleries from being able to grow, and if they do, they will be forced to revert to using **no** BC agricultural inputs (we would have to switch to buying pre-made alcohols (NGS)) like the non-craft guys, and also necessitate laying off approximately 90% of staffing just to survive as it is their only economical model to move forward). At the 100,000L mark a distillery would then be without their direct delivery and would not have the mark-up benefit on the first 50,000L escalating up to 100,000L, and thus because none of us presently sell through the LDB, due to their crushingly high mark-ups, we would be left with having to let all of our existing accounts know that they can no longer purchase though us, and would now have to go only through the LDB, a place which most of us would have no products listed. ***This request for reform had unanimous support from the liquor advisory panel **BTAP** but was too specific in nature to have it included as a specific recommendation in the BTAP report. Instead it is referred to in Recommendation 16, stating the "**urgent and immediate"** need to engage with local producers to remedy the inequities and imbalances in their production agreements.

2. Secondly, increasing the ridiculously low mark-up exempt production limits imposed by the previous government. As discussed before, this volume was decided upon without consultation or understanding of the industry, and therefore, what we are requesting now, is for you to release the pressure on the industry with an immediate increase to 500,000L (this may sound like a large request but it is honestly really quite modest...literally we are asking for the ability to grow to literally half the size of Gray Monk or Quails Gate before being negatively affected by escalating mark-ups at which point we can more realistically afford to do so)! We further ask that you strongly consider making this increase effective immediately, even prior to an omnibus full scale review recommended by the panel so that distilleries can make business expansion decisions and not further contract back inwards on themselves while they wait for eventual sensible change. (We are worried that a full scale review will once again lead to years of delays without action.)

Subject: following up regarding HIV criminalization and prosecutorial guidance in BC

Dear David, Gala (and Tanera):

Somewhat later than planned, I'm following up on our discussions at the end of April regarding HIV criminalization, with two purposes:

- (1) I wanted to provide you with some additional material as discussed; and
- (2) I wanted to inquire about getting scheduled soon the follow-up meeting that we discussed. As you can appreciate, the window for making positive and necessary change on this front is open now, and we should not miss the opportunity to rectify a long-standing and ongoing injustice against people living with HIV.

(1) Materials

During the course of our discussion, we said that we would share with you a number of documents that would be helpful in taking up the task of improving BC's prosecutorial stance vis-à-vis allegations of HIV non-disclosure. Therefore, I am attaching the following:

- Canadian scientific consensus statement: This statement was authored by 6 leading HIV scientists in Canada (including Dr. Julio Montaner) and endorsed by more than 70 others and the Association of Medical Microbiology and Infectious Disease, and published in 2014 in the peer-reviewed Canadian Journal of Infectious Diseases and Medical Microbiology. It was written specifically because of the concern that the criminal justice system's "poor appreciation of the science" is leading to over-application of the criminal law and miscarriages of justice. It has been used in numerous cases to secure a withdrawal or reduction of charges originally laid, and as an adjunct to the testimony of scientific experts (some of them authors/endorsers of the statement) in prosecutions. Note that the scientific case for limiting the application of the criminal law has only grown stronger in the 4 years since that statement was published, given additional research studies that have reported results. I should note that, as mentioned at our meeting, next month, in conjunction with the International AIDS Conference (AIDS 2018) in Amsterdam, an updated, international scientific consensus statement, co-authored by 20 of the world's leading HIV scientists, will be released in the Journal of the International AIDS Society, with endorsement by many other scientists, UNAIDS, the International AIDS

- Society and the International Association of Providers in AIDS Care (IAPAC), reflecting a global consensus among key experts and agencies regarding the need to limit overly broad HIV criminalization.
- Also attached is a **briefing note prepared recently for a ministerial roundtable held here in Ontario** with the Attorney General, representatives from some other relevant
 ministries and a number of key community stakeholders, scientific experts and HIV
 clinicians, etc. It was prepared by the Canadian HIV/AIDS Legal Network and the HIV &
 AIDS Legal Clinic Ontario (HALCO) for the Ontario Working Group on Criminal Law and
 HIV Exposure (CLHE). It provides the most current summary of the state of the law and
 prosecutions in Canada, the many concerns with the overly broad state of that law, the
 developments that have happened recently, and lays out what needs to happen next —
 including with 12 recommendations to the Province of Ontario. We submit all of those
 recommendations are also entirely relevant to all other jurisdictions in Canada, including
 BC.
- Attached is the **original report of the CLHE in Ontario**, based on consultations around the province, with numerous recommendations for the development of guidelines for prosecutors in that province it is a more detailed document providing more detailed rationale for the various recommendations. Again, much of the substance would be applicable in any province.
- I'm also attaching both the 2012 report of the UN's Global Commission on HIV and the Law (see Chapter 2 for the discussion of, and recommendations regarding, overly broad HIV criminalization), and the subsequent 2013 Guidance document from UNAIDS laying out the various scientific, medical and legal considerations about limiting overly broad HIV criminalization, which provides much more detailed guidance on translating those recommendations into law and policy.
- Let me also draw these important cases to your attention, that have been decided since the Supreme Court of Canada's 2012 ruling in $R \ v \ Mabior$ (links provided below):
 - o 2 separate rulings in proceedings involving an HIV-positive teenager in Nova Scotia, not least because of their reasoned critique of the *Mabior* ruling's defects and a sensible interpretation of that decision's "realistic possibility of transmission" test for conviction:
 - R. v. J.T.C., 2013 NSPC 105 (Acquittal; unprotected sex with an undetectable viral load) (also see <u>Summary</u>)
 - R. v. J.T.C., 2013 NSPC 88 (Condom use; low viral load; critical analysis of R. v. Mabior)
 - o R. v. C.B., 2017 ONCJ 545 (CanLII) (acquittal, condomless sex with undetectable viral load)
 - o <u>R v. Thompson</u>, 2016 NSSC 134 (condom use or low viral load or no ejaculation), and then the appeal before the NS Court of Appeal correcting the error by the trial court regarding the issue of "harm": <u>R. v. Thompson</u>, 2018 NSCA 13
- Attached is the **updated Ontario policy guidance** issued on December 1, 2017 which was then also distributed by the Attorney General to all police services across the province. Note the highlighted portion that represents the clear statement by the Attorney General that prosecutions will not proceed in cases where the person living with HIV has a suppressed viral load for at least six months.

- You may also be interested in this recent study indicating the harmful public health impact in Ontario of overly broad HIV criminalization, including by deterring some people from seeking HIV testing an impact that of course flies directly in the face of efforts, in which BC has been a leader, to connect people to testing and to ARV treatment not only for their own well-being but also as a key element of effective HIV prevention.
- Lastly, I believe I shared this at the time it was published, but in case you didn't see it then, here is the link to our **op-ed in the Vancouver Sun** that appeared at the time we met outlining some of our critique of the very disappointing policy on HIV non-disclosure prosecutions issued by the BC Prosecution Service on March 1st:

As discussed, it is profoundly disappointing that the new guidance adopted by the BC Prosecution Service on March 1, 2018 doesn't even clearly state – unlike the policy in Ontario – that there will be no prosecution against a person with a suppressed viral load. But as we stated in response to the new Ontario policy last December – see attached statement – that is just one very modest (and necessary) step that must be taken in modernizing prosecutorial policies in Canada. At the very least, as discussed at our meeting, any prosecutorial guidance in every jurisdiction in Canada should reflect the recommendations in the Justice Canada report released last December, including the following:

- Consistent with the relevant SCC jurisprudence, the criminal law should not apply to persons living with HIV who have engaged in sexual activity without disclosing their status if they have maintained a suppressed viral load (i.e., under 200 copies per ml of blood), because the realistic possibility of transmission test is not met in these circumstances. A person living with HIV who takes their treatment as prescribed is acting responsibly.
- The criminal law should generally not apply to persons living with HIV who: are on treatment; are not on treatment but use condoms; or, engage only in oral sex (unless other risk factors are present and the person living with HIV is

aware of those risks), because the realistic possibility of transmission test is likely not met in these circumstances.

This position is also endorsed by (what is now) more than 160 organizations from the HIV sector and beyond from across Canada, in the *Community Consensus Statement* on ending unjust HIV criminalization. We shared a copy with you at the meeting, but I attach it again here for convenience, along with an **FAQ** document that provides a bit of background about how this consensus statement came to be.

We look forward to continuing to work together to ensure revisions to BC's prosecutorial stance to better reflect science, and to better respect human rights and protect public health.

(2) Follow-up meeting

From our discussion at our meeting at the end of April, I understood that you planned to have some further discussions with the BC Prosecution Service, in light of concerns raised about the current prosecutorial policy.

We also agreed that that a follow-up meeting involving community representatives and the BC Prosecution Service would be useful. I'd like to see if we could get that scheduled as soon as possible. We had talked about June or July as possibilities for this. I'd be grateful if we could try to nail down some dates and make this happen; I'd be happy to talk with Tanera about that.

(In the meantime, I did have a bit of follow-up discussion with colleagues locally in BC who work in the HIV sector about some key stakeholders that could be brought together for this discussion, including women living with HIV, and am happy to pick up those conversations with them and facilitate that once we can nail down some options for a meeting.)

Lastly, I did want to note that we all recognized that, as Attorney General, Minister Eby has the legal authority to issue a directive to BC prosecutors should the Prosecution Service be unwilling to adopt prosecutorial guidance that he feels is satisfactory. While we appreciate that it would be much preferable for the Prosecution Service to indeed adopt a much sounder policy, we also know from history that this may be very difficult to achieve — and certainly in a timely fashion. As noted above, we don't want to miss a window of opportunity that currently exists, with an Attorney General who understands the concerns, to get sound prosecutorial policy in place. (David, for a trip down memory lane: I stumbled upon this article from 2012 in connection with the Mabior case, in which you were commenting, as Legal Network president, about the need to not prosecute people who use condoms: http://www.cbc.ca/news/canada/manitoba/supreme-court-hears-hiv-disclosure-case-1.1160825.)

I've copied my colleagues Ryan (from HALCO) and Nick (from the Legal Network) here; as you recall, they were at our meeting.

I look forward to hearing from you about how we can move quickly to ensure greater justice for people living with HIV in British Columbia.

In late 2017, Mark Hicken was appointed as the Ministry of Attorney General's Liquor Policy Advisor to advise on possible law and policy reforms for government to improve efficiency and outcomes for business and government in relation to government responsibilities, regulations and oversight roles that intersect with the activities of B.C.'s private liquor businesses.

Mr. Hicken is a British Columbia lawyer with expertise in provincial law and policy related to liquor.

Liquor Policy Advisor Mark Hicken has presented government with a report that includes 24 recommendations that aim to improve efficiency and business relations between government and B.C.'s liquor industry. Hicken chaired a panel of industry representatives that met with stakeholders and health and labour experts to provide recommendations that reflect industry consensus.

ernment would like to thank the panel for this report and acknowledge the time and effort spent developing recommendations that reflect the knowledge and perspective of this important B.C. industry.

The report sets out possible regulatory and policy reforms to improve efficiency and outcomes for business and government in relation to government responsibilities, regulations and oversight roles that intersect with the activities of B.C.'s private liquor businesses. Government will review each recommendation over the coming months to analyse and consider the potential health, public safety, social, financial and labour impacts of implementation, as well as ensure that any actions taken in response to the recommendations are compliant with British Columbia's trade obligations. This analysis will require additional engagement with public health experts and labour representatives.

Government will be focusing its resources on assessing the panel recommendations, and will not be entertaining other industry requests for law and policy reform until the assessment and determination of next steps is complete.

Subject: Taxation of Craft Cider Dear Attorney General David Eby,

I am a partner with a small law firm in Squamish, B.C. I am also a partner in a small craft cider startup in Squamish, named Northyards Cider Co. Ltd. We are anticipating opening our doors in July 2018. I hope it is ok that I have reached out to you directly. I was not able to attend the session you held earlier in the year to discuss liquor policy and I would like to add some more context to the issue.

On April 16, 2018, two other small producers and I submitted a position paper to the Business Technical Panel on Liquor Law and Policy (attached here for your reference). As we get closer to opening our doors, I am becoming more and more anxious with respect to how the current taxation policy will affect our business, which is why I am writing to you today.

Below is a brief summary of the issue:

- cider is treated as wine for the purposes of licencing and taxation;
- wineries are either land based (and grow a percentage of their fruit) or commercial;
- land based wineries do not pay a provincial mark-up;
- commercial wineries are further divided into VQA and non VQA wineries;
- VQA commercial wineries enjoy a tax break as they use 100% BC fruit (and pay VQA membership fees); and,
 - there is no VQA equivalent for cider which is, we are advised, the reason why commercial cideries are subject to the 72% mark-up on top of cost and profit <u>regardless of the origin of the fruit.</u>

I believe the last bullet point is the flaw in the current policy. Our cidery will use 100% B.C. fruit because we are committed to buying local and supporting the B.C. economy. Under the current policy, there is no incentive to buy B.C. fruit and, in fact, we could access cheaper fruit and a greater variety of apples if we bought our juice/apples from Washington State. Notwithstanding, we have an agreement with a orchardist in Lake Country, B.C. Our farmer, \$\frac{1}{2}\$ manage their own small orchard as well as a few other small orchards near their land. Prior to working with us, they sold their apples and apple juice at farmers markets in Vancouver. We purchased 25,000 litres of juice from John in 2017 (and froze it). Our 3 year plan is to purchase at least 100,000 litres

annually. This results in significant cash flow to the farmer with less effort than selling his products at farmer's markets.

For the purpose of collecting tax, a distinction should be made between commercial cideries who use 100% B.C. fruit and those who import fruit and/or use additives. The Federal Excise Tax law makes this distinction between wine (cider) producers who use 100% Canadian fruit and those who don't. We will not pay any Excise Tax as long as we use 100% Canadian fruit. The federal government has strict reporting guidelines designed to monitor the origin of the producer's fruit.

I am not a tax expert, however, my lay-person opinion is that it seems lowering the mark up on cider producers could have the following positive effect on small business and the B.C. economy overall:

- allow farmers to expand their operations and give them access to a more efficient income stream;
 - allow our business to hire more employees and to expand faster, increasing revenue;
- put us on a more competitive pricing model with craft beer (cider is consumed like beer but made like wine making it more expensive);
 - expand the cider producer market 100 producers paying, for example, a 12% mark-up
 will likely result in more revenue to the Province than a small number of producers
 struggling to make a profit and paying the 72% mark-up.

The land based producers are opposed to a tax break to commercial producers. The argument being that they have taken on the additional work of becoming farmers and that there should be incentive to run an agribusiness. With respect, commercial producers are also supporting agribusiness by opening new markets for fruit. As long as we are using B.C. fruit, we are supporting B.C. farmers. A distinction can easily be made between small craft producers and those large producers who are calling themselves craft. The large producers are manipulating the product by distilling the juice and adding sugar, water, fruit flavouring, grain alcohol etc. in order to be profitable. We are committed to a true craft beverage and will only use 100% fruit. Our inputs are expensive but we believe this makes a superior product.

At the outset I mentioned being anxious about how this tax will affect our new business. We have invested \$ 22 s) in this enterprise

between purchasing our commercial unit and outfitting the manufacturing space. You may be asking yourself why I did this knowing the current mark-up makes it close to impossible to be profitable. First, we are passionate about this business and believe it will be good financially for our families, will create jobs and will contribute to the growing craft beverage and tourism industries in Squamish (there are currently three breweries with several more brewery applications in place as well as two additional cideries and a distillery). Next, we took a risk that the taxation model would likely change based on the modernization to the beer, wine and distilling taxation policies. I think there is good evidence to support the change in policy so that the taxation is fair in the growing cider sector. I thank you for taking the time to read my email and I would be very happy to speak to you further about this should you have any questions.





Here are just a few things our government has announced this week -

Province opens the door to housing investment on reserves

- · Housing affordability affects us all and, for too long, the impact of B.C.'s housing crisis on Indigenous peoples was ignored. With these new provincial housing funds, our government is taking a major step forward in making sure Indigenous peoples everywhere in British Columbia have access to the safe and secure housing they need.
- British Columbia will become the first province in Canada to invest provincial housing funds into on-reserve housing. Through the new Building BC: Indigenous Housing Fund, the British Columbia government will invest \$550 million over the next 10 years to build and operate 1,750 new units of social housing for projects, both on- and off-reserve. Click here to learn more about this announcement.
- · "Everyone in British Columbia deserves a good home, including people who live on-reserve," said Premier John Horgan on Monday, June 18. "That's why we're opening the door to all Indigenous communities to join us as we make housing better and more affordable for people in every part of the province."

Family-and-friend caregivers to received much-needed relief with expanded supports

- The previous government failed seniors and their families by making home and community care visits too short, rushed and stressful. We are doing things differently and improving the services that help seniors stay at home longer while reducing stress experienced by family members, friends and other caregivers.
- The Ministry of Health is investing \$75 million to expand respite care and adult day programs, helping both seniors and their loved ones, announced Adrian Dix, Minister of Health. Over the next three years, the Province will improve and strengthen respite services and adult day programs to support seniors and their family-and-friend caregivers. The number of respite beds will be increased, and overnight care at home will be made more accessible. In addition, the number of adult day program spaces will be increased, and the hours of operation will be expanded to provide services on evenings and weekends.
- · "Many B.C. seniors count on their spouses, children and close friends to help them stay at home, and cope and manage chronic conditions," said Minister Dix on Monday, June 18. "Caregiving without adequate supports can impact the whole family, particularly a person's ability to live at home, which is what most seniors and their loved ones want. Giving seniors better options and supporting unpaid caregivers to take time for themselves is a necessity."

Students to benefits from more classrooms in Surrey and a new school in Vancouver

- The previous government caused years of instability in our classrooms, making it harder for kids to thrive at school. We're upgrading and building new schools to make sure students are safe and growing communities have places for kids to learn.
- · Students at Sullivan Heights Secondary school are getting a bigger, better school, with the Government of British Columbia investing in a new 700-seat addition, click here to see the release. The Ministry of Education is also providing \$79.3 million to fully replace Eric Hamber Secondary the largest seismic project in Vancouver's history (click here for more information).
- · "Vancouver students and their families have been waiting for schools that will be safe in the event of an earthquake," said Rob Fleming, Minister of Education on Tuesday, June 19. "Today's announcement moves us one step closer to achieving our goal of ensuring all British Columbian students can receive a quality education in a state-of-the-art, safe and healthy school."

Government cracking down on hidden ownership of real estate

- The B.C. government is taking steps to end the hidden ownership of real estate to make sure people are paying their share of taxes, as part of its 30-Point Plan for Housing Affordability. The Province is establishing a new, publicly accessible registry of who owns real estate in British Columbia. It will be the first registry of its kind in Canada, and will improve transparency in the real estate market. It will provide tax auditors and law enforcement agencies, as well as federal and provincial regulators, with information that will assist with their investigations.
- · "British Columbia has developed a reputation as an attractive place to anonymously invest and hide wealth.

 Right now in B.C., real estate investors can hide behind numbered companies, offshore and domestic trusts, and corporations," said Carole James, Minister of Finance on Wednesday, June 20. "Ending this type of hidden ownership in real estate will help us fight tax evasion, tax fraud and money laundering. Our goal is to return fairness to the housing market."

B.C. government announces new approach to salmon farm tenures

- · For far too long, the previous government ignored concerns about the impacts of open net salmon farming on our environment and on wild salmon. We are taking steps to transition to a sustainable industry that respects wild salmon, embraces reconciliation with First Nations and protects jobs.
- The Government of British Columbia will establish rigorous new rules and expectations for the renewal of salmon farm tenures in B.C. waters. Effective June 2022, the Province will grant Land Act tenures only to fish farm operators who have satisfied Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) that their operations will not adversely impact wild salmon stocks, and who have negotiated agreements with the First Nation(s) in whose territory they propose to operate.
- · "The challenges facing our wild salmon have been ignored for far too long," said Lana Popham, Minister of Agriculture on Wednesday, June 20. "That's why we are putting in place a new approach to provide clarity and outline our expectations moving forward for a sustainable industry that protects wild salmon, embraces reconciliation, and provides good jobs."

Public consultation begins on revitalizing B.C.'s environmental assessment process

- From now until July 30, 2018, British Columbians have an opportunity to shape the future of how major
 projects are assessed in B.C., by providing feedback on recommended changes to B.C.'s environmental

- · "We've worked extensively with First Nations, stakeholders and community representatives throughout B.C. to ensure the proposed changes to B.C.'s environmental assessment process do a better job of protecting British Columbians' natural environment, health, heritage and societies, while continuing to attract investment and sustainably growing our economy," said George Heyman, Minister of Environment and Climate Change Strategy on Monday, June 18. "I'm looking forward to hearing from British Columbians from every corner of the province on the proposed changes, so we can be sure we get it right."

New grants have potential to create new child care spaces

- · For too many people, child care is nearly as expensive as housing and even harder to find. We are taking action to support child care providers and increase access to the kind of quality care our kids deserve so that there are more affordable options available to everyone.
- · Families searching for quality, licensed child care in their communities will have hundreds more options through a new grant program. Eligible unlicensed child care providers who are currently limited to providing care to a maximum of two children unrelated to them, or a sibling group can now apply for financial assistance to become licensed family or in-home multi-age (IHMA) child care providers. Becoming licensed allows child care providers to care for seven or eight children, depending on their license. To help providers switch over, the Province is investing \$750,000 in the program per year, over the next three

years.

· "Thousands of parents, providers and educators have told us that the availability of quality child care is the number one concern for them," said Katrina Chen, Minister of State for Child Care on Wednesday, June 20. "This grant program will offer providers a new source of funding to become licensed, and it – along with other initiatives – will help to further enhance the quality of programs."

We wanted to make sure that you were aware that the Minister of Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs (CIRNA) intends to convene a meeting with provincial and territorial ministers responsible for Indigenous affairs, justice and intergovernmental affairs, to discuss the Recognition and Implementation of Indigenous Rights Framework. We understand that CIRNA is planning to hold these meetings on either July 11, 12, or 13 in Ottawa; grateful if you could let us know by Wednesday if there are any specific preferences among these dates.

We recognize that this is just prior to the meeting of the Council of the Federation, and that this will be a particularly busy time for your governments. However, as we discussed in the spring, CIRNA is intensifying its work on the Framework, and we recognize that this will include the need for political discussions.

As we stressed during our discussions on the Framework a few weeks ago, collaboration with provinces and territories will be essential to make meaningful change that recognizes and implements Indigenous rights. And, while the Framework will ensure that the recognition and exercise of Indigenous rights will be consistent with the Canadian constitution, the Framework could have impacts on provinces and territories and your relationships with Indigenous peoples.

To that end, we hope you will encourage ministerial participation in these upcoming meetings. This will be an important opportunity to ensure that the views of provinces and territories are heard and considered.

Recommendation – provide information on background

What has government already done and what effects have those actions had on the money laundering problem?

- In December 2017, Dr. German provided two interim recommendations that were approved by the Attorney General.
- On Jan. 10, the BC Lottery Corporation (BCLC) implemented the first recommendation that requires casino customers to complete a Source of Funds Declaration for cash deposits of \$10,000 or more. If a customer does not provide the required information, the service provider must refuse the transaction, document it, and notify BCLC.
- At the peak of money laundering in B.C. casinos in July 2015, \$20 million went through B.C. casinos in suspicious cash transactions in a single month. In March, the most recent month for which we have statistics, there was \$200,000 in suspicious cash transactions.
- The second recommendation required that government regulators have a presence on-site and are available to service providers throughout the day and during peak hours.
- After seeking clarity from Dr. German on this recommendation, the Gaming Policy and Enforcement Branch (GPEB) is ensuring regulators are present when and where they are most needed.
- GPEB is increasing the regulator's presence at five high-volume casinos, including at the Hard Rock Casino in Vancouver, Starlight Casino in New Westminster, River Rock Casino & Resort in Richmond, Grand Villa Casino in Burnaby, and Parg Vancouver during peak activity.
- The plan uses existing GPEB investigators to provide an increased presence at high-volume casinos in the short term, while hiring additional investigators to fully meet the recommendation.
- GPEB has recently hired four additional investigators, and recruitment efforts to seek additional temporary staff continue.

Colleagues,

We wanted to make sure that you were aware that the Minister of Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs (CIRNA) intends to convene a meeting with provincial and territorial ministers responsible for Indigenous affairs, justice and intergovernmental affairs, to discuss the Recognition and Implementation of Indigenous Rights Framework. We understand that CIRNA is planning to hold these meetings on either July 11, 12, or 13 in Ottawa; grateful if you could let us know by Wednesday if there are any specific preferences among these dates.

We recognize that this is just prior to the meeting of the Council of the Federation, and that this will be a particularly busy time for your governments. However, as we discussed in the spring, CIRNA is intensifying its work on the Framework, and we recognize that this will include the need for political discussions.

As we stressed during our discussions on the Framework a few weeks ago, collaboration with provinces and territories will be essential to make meaningful change that recognizes and implements Indigenous rights. And, while the Framework will ensure that the recognition and exercise of Indigenous rights will be consistent with the Canadian constitution, the Framework could have impacts on provinces and territories and your relationships with Indigenous peoples.

To that end, we hope you will encourage ministerial participation in these upcoming meetings. This will be an important opportunity to ensure that the views of provinces and territories are heard and considered.



It's been a little bit since we last connected. Your Minister has been super busy lately! Hopefully you'll get some time over the long weekend.

A lot of work is being put in by a whole host of stakeholders to ensure that government has clear information on its options for ridesharing. From recent conversations, there seems to be a bit of a disconnect between what ICBC had historically told us and what we are hearing is government's current understanding of the situation and potential for ridesharing insurance. I was wondering if you, or the relevant political staffer, ICBC and any relevant officials would have time to connect in the next couple of weeks to discuss ridesharing insurance. I think it would be useful to have a big group for the discussion, but happy to have it at a smaller table first if you prefer. We would touch on the insurance structure we are seeking, the benefits, and how ICBC outlined it could be protected from losses.

Hi Ravi: In our telephone conversation of April 26, 2018, I was asked to provide a list of persons who could be consulted on the issue of an apology to the Sons of Freedom Doukhobor Children (referred to as "New Denver Survivors" in the letter from \$.22 Please find attached two documents.

The first is a list of the persons we think were in New Denver. There were approximately 200 children in New Denver between 1953 and 1959. The list is not complete and may not be entirely accurate because the New Denver institution did not keep completely reliable records. Some of those in New Denver would have died before the list was compiled and others since it was compiled. As well, this list was compiled over 5 years ago so the contact information will have changed for some. The list shows that most reside in the Kootenays. No one on this list should be contacted without an introduction from someone in the community.

The second list ("Various Contact Information") is a list of client contacts, government witnesses (including two Doukhobors who were in New Denver) and others who were involved in some way with the human rights complaint brought by Walter Swetlishoff on behalf of the New Denver Survivors' Collective. In particular, Linda Neville (formerly with the AG) and Greg Cran (an expert on Doukhobor history) would be good persons to start with for further background information and insight into the complexities of negotiating with this community. If you want to speak to Linda or Greg I'd be happy to make the connection for you.

Subject: Taxation of Craft Cider Dear Attorney General David Eby,

I am a partner with a small law firm in Squamish, B.C. I am also a partner in a small craft cider start-up in Squamish, named Northyards Cider Co. Ltd. We are anticipating opening our doors in July 2018. I hope it is ok that I have reached out to you directly. I was not able to attend the session you held earlier in the year to discuss liquor policy and I would like to add some more context to the issue.

On April 16, 2018, two other small producers and I submitted a position paper to the Business Technical Panel on Liquor Law and Policy (attached here for your reference). As we get closer to opening our doors, I am becoming more and more anxious with respect to how the current taxation policy will affect our business, which is why I am writing to you today.

Below is a brief summary of the issue:

- cider is treated as wine for the purposes of licencing and taxation;
- wineries are either land based (and grow a percentage of their fruit) or commercial;
- land based wineries do not pay a provincial mark-up;
- commercial wineries are further divided into VQA and non VQA wineries;
- VQA commercial wineries enjoy a tax break as they use 100% BC fruit (and pay VQA membership fees); and,
 - there is no VQA equivalent for cider which is, we are advised, the reason why commercial cideries are subject to the 72% mark-up on top of cost and profit <u>regardless of the origin of the fruit.</u>

I believe the last bullet point is the flaw in the current policy. Our cidery will use 100% B.C. fruit because we are committed to buying local and supporting the B.C. economy. Under the current policy, there is no incentive to buy B.C. fruit and, in fact, we could access cheaper fruit and a greater variety of apples if we bought our juice/apples from Washington State. Notwithstanding, we have an agreement with a orchardist in Lake Country, B.C. Our farmer, \$\frac{1}{2}\$ manage their own small orchard as well as a few other small orchards near their land. Prior to working with us, they sold their apples and apple juice at farmers markets in Vancouver. We purchased 25,000 litres of juice from John in 2017 (and froze it). Our 3 year plan is to purchase at least 100,000 litres annually. This results in significant cash flow to the farmer with less effort than selling his products at

farmer's markets.

For the purpose of collecting tax, a distinction should be made between commercial cideries who use 100% B.C. fruit and those who import fruit and/or use additives. The Federal Excise Tax law makes this distinction between wine (cider) producers who use 100% Canadian fruit and those who don't. We will not pay any Excise Tax as long as we use 100% Canadian fruit. The federal government has strict reporting guidelines designed to monitor the origin of the producer's fruit.

I am not a tax expert, however, my lay-person opinion is that it seems lowering the mark up on cider producers could have the following positive effect on small business and the B.C. economy overall:

- allow farmers to expand their operations and give them access to a more efficient income stream;
 - allow our business to hire more employees and to expand faster, increasing revenue;
- put us on a more competitive pricing model with craft beer (cider is consumed like beer but made like wine making it more expensive);
 - expand the cider producer market 100 producers paying, for example, a 12% mark-up will likely result in more revenue to the Province than a small number of producers struggling to make a profit and paying the 72% mark-up.

The land based producers are opposed to a tax break to commercial producers. The argument being that they have taken on the additional work of becoming farmers and that there should be incentive to run an agribusiness. With respect, commercial producers are also supporting agribusiness by opening new markets for fruit. As long as we are using B.C. fruit, we are supporting B.C. farmers. A distinction can easily be made between small craft producers and those large producers who are calling themselves craft. The large producers are manipulating the product by distilling the juice and adding sugar, water, fruit flavouring, grain alcohol etc. in order to be profitable. We are committed to a true craft beverage and will only use 100% fruit. Our inputs are expensive but we believe this makes a superior product.

At the outset I mentioned being anxious about how this tax will affect our new business. We have \$.22 in this enterprise

between purchasing our commercial unit and outfitting the manufacturing space. You may be asking yourself why I did this knowing the current mark-up makes it close to impossible to be profitable. First, we are passionate about this business and believe it will be good financially for our families, will create jobs and will contribute to the growing craft beverage and tourism industries in Squamish (there are currently three breweries with several more brewery applications in place as well as two additional cideries and a distillery). Next, we took a risk that the taxation model would likely change based on the modernization to the beer, wine and distilling taxation policies. I think there is good evidence to support the change in policy so that the taxation is fair in the growing cider sector. I thank you for taking the time to read my email and I would be very happy to speak to you further about this should you have any questions.

Dear David, Gala (and Tanera):

Somewhat later than planned, I'm following up on our discussions at the end of April regarding HIV criminalization, with two purposes:

- (1) I wanted to provide you with some additional material as discussed; and
- (2) I wanted to inquire about getting scheduled soon the follow-up meeting that we discussed. As you can appreciate, the window for making positive and necessary change on this front is open now, and we should not miss the opportunity to rectify a long-standing and ongoing injustice against people living with HIV.

(1) Materials

During the course of our discussion, we said that we would share with you a number of documents that would be helpful in taking up the task of improving BC's prosecutorial stance vis-à-vis allegations of HIV non-disclosure. Therefore, I am attaching the following:

- Canadian scientific consensus statement: This statement was authored by 6 leading HIV scientists in Canada (including Dr. Julio Montaner) and endorsed by more than 70 others and the Association of Medical Microbiology and Infectious Disease, and published in 2014 in the peer-reviewed Canadian Journal of Infectious Diseases and Medical Microbiology. It was written specifically because of the concern that the criminal justice system's "poor appreciation of the science" is leading to over-application of the criminal law and miscarriages of justice. It has been used in numerous cases to secure a withdrawal or reduction of charges originally laid, and as an adjunct to the testimony of scientific experts (some of them authors/endorsers of the statement) in prosecutions. Note that the scientific case for limiting the application of the criminal law has only grown stronger in the 4 years since that statement was published, given additional research studies that have reported results. I should note that, as mentioned at our meeting, next month, in conjunction with the International AIDS Conference (AIDS 2018) in Amsterdam, an updated, international scientific consensus statement, co-authored by 20 of the world's leading HIV scientists, will be released in the Journal of the International AIDS Society, with endorsement by many other scientists, UNAIDS, the International AIDS Society and the International Association of Providers in AIDS Care (IAPAC), reflecting a global consensus among key experts and agencies regarding the need to limit overly

broad HIV criminalization.

- Also attached is a **briefing note prepared recently for a ministerial roundtable held here in Ontario** with the Attorney General, representatives from some other relevant
 ministries and a number of key community stakeholders, scientific experts and HIV
 clinicians, etc. It was prepared by the Canadian HIV/AIDS Legal Network and the HIV &
 AIDS Legal Clinic Ontario (HALCO) for the Ontario Working Group on Criminal Law and
 HIV Exposure (CLHE). It provides the most current summary of the state of the law and
 prosecutions in Canada, the many concerns with the overly broad state of that law, the
 developments that have happened recently, and lays out what needs to happen next —
 including with 12 recommendations to the Province of Ontario. We submit all of those
 recommendations are also entirely relevant to all other jurisdictions in Canada, including
 BC.
- Attached is the **original report of the CLHE in Ontario**, based on consultations around the province, with numerous recommendations for the development of guidelines for prosecutors in that province it is a more detailed document providing more detailed rationale for the various recommendations. Again, much of the substance would be applicable in any province.
- I'm also attaching both the 2012 report of the UN's Global Commission on HIV and the Law (see Chapter 2 for the discussion of, and recommendations regarding, overly broad HIV criminalization), and the subsequent 2013 Guidance document from UNAIDS laying out the various scientific, medical and legal considerations about limiting overly broad HIV criminalization, which provides much more detailed guidance on translating those recommendations into law and policy.
- Let me also draw these important cases to your attention, that have been decided since the Supreme Court of Canada's 2012 ruling in *R v Mabior* (links provided below):
 - o 2 separate rulings in proceedings involving an HIV-positive teenager in Nova Scotia, not least because of their reasoned critique of the *Mabior* ruling's defects and a sensible interpretation of that decision's "realistic possibility of transmission" test for conviction:
 - R. v. J.T.C., 2013 NSPC 105 (Acquittal; unprotected sex with an undetectable viral load) (also see <u>Summary</u>)
 - R. v. J.T.C., 2013 NSPC 88 (Condom use; low viral load; critical analysis of R. v. Mabior)
 - o R. v. C.B., 2017 ONCJ 545 (CanLII) (acquittal, condomless sex with undetectable viral load)
 - o <u>R v. Thompson</u>, 2016 NSSC 134 (condom use or low viral load or no ejaculation), and then the appeal before the NS Court of Appeal correcting the error by the trial court regarding the issue of "harm": <u>R. v. Thompson</u>, 2018 NSCA 13
- Attached is the updated Ontario policy guidance issued on December 1, 2017 which was then also distributed by the Attorney General to all police services across the province. Note the highlighted portion that represents the clear statement by the Attorney General that prosecutions will not proceed in cases where the person living with HIV has a suppressed viral load for at least six months.
- You may also be interested in this recent study indicating the harmful public health impact in Ontario of overly broad HIV criminalization, including by deterring some

- people from seeking HIV testing an impact that of course flies directly in the face of efforts, in which BC has been a leader, to connect people to testing and to ARV treatment not only for their own well-being but also as a key element of effective HIV prevention.
- Lastly, I believe I shared this at the time it was published, but in case you didn't see it then, here is the link to our **op-ed in the Vancouver Sun** that appeared at the time we met outlining some of our critique of the very disappointing policy on HIV non-disclosure prosecutions issued by the BC Prosecution Service on March 1st:

As discussed, it is profoundly disappointing that the new guidance adopted by the BC Prosecution Service on March 1, 2018 doesn't even clearly state – unlike the policy in Ontario – that there will be no prosecution against a person with a suppressed viral load. But as we stated in response to the new Ontario policy last December – see attached statement – that is just one very modest (and necessary) step that must be taken in modernizing prosecutorial policies in Canada. At the very least, as discussed at our meeting, any prosecutorial guidance in every jurisdiction in Canada should reflect the recommendations in the Justice Canada report released last December, including the following:

- Consistent with the relevant SCC jurisprudence, the criminal law should not apply to persons living with HIV who have engaged in sexual activity without disclosing their status if they have maintained a suppressed viral load (i.e., under 200 copies per ml of blood), because the realistic possibility of transmission test is not met in these circumstances. A person living with HIV who takes their treatment as prescribed is acting responsibly.
- The criminal law should generally not apply to persons living with HIV who: are on treatment; are not on treatment but use condoms; or, engage only in oral sex (unless other risk factors are present and the person living with HIV is aware of those risks), because the realistic possibility of transmission test is likely not met in these circumstances.

This position is also endorsed by (what is now) more than 160 organizations from the HIV sector and beyond from across Canada, in the *Community Consensus Statement* on ending unjust HIV criminalization. We shared a copy with you at the meeting, but I attach it again here for convenience, along with an **FAQ** document that provides a bit of background about how this consensus statement came to be.

We look forward to continuing to work together to ensure revisions to BC's prosecutorial stance to better reflect science, and to better respect human rights and protect public health.

(2) Follow-up meeting

From our discussion at our meeting at the end of April, I understood that you planned to have some further discussions with the BC Prosecution Service, in light of concerns raised about the current prosecutorial policy.

We also agreed that that a follow-up meeting involving community representatives and the BC Prosecution Service would be useful. I'd like to see if we could get that scheduled as soon as possible. We had talked about June or July as possibilities for this. I'd be grateful if we could try to nail down some dates and make this happen; I'd be happy to talk with Tanera about that.

(In the meantime, I did have a bit of follow-up discussion with colleagues locally in BC who work in the HIV sector about some key stakeholders that could be brought together for this discussion, including women living with HIV, and am happy to pick up those conversations with them and facilitate that once we can nail down some options for a meeting.)

Lastly, I did want to note that we all recognized that, as Attorney General, Minister Eby has the legal authority to issue a directive to BC prosecutors should the Prosecution Service be unwilling to adopt prosecutorial guidance that he feels is satisfactory. While we appreciate that it would be much preferable for the Prosecution Service to indeed adopt a much sounder policy, we also know from history that this may be very difficult to achieve — and certainly in a timely fashion. As noted above, we don't want to miss a window of opportunity that currently exists, with an Attorney General who understands the concerns, to get sound prosecutorial policy in place. (David, for a trip down memory lane: I stumbled upon this article from 2012 in connection with the Mabior case, in which you were commenting, as Legal Network president, about the need to not prosecute people who use condoms: http://www.cbc.ca/news/canada/manitoba/supreme-court-hears-hiv-disclosure-case-1.1160825.)

I've copied my colleagues Ryan (from HALCO) and Nick (from the Legal Network) here; as you recall, they were at our meeting.

I look forward to hearing from you about how we can move quickly to ensure greater justice for people living with HIV in British Columbia.




