**Subject:** B.C. should do its own review of the TransMountain project.

**Gentlemen:**

It is imperative that B.C. remove itself from the upcoming revised N.E.B. process.

B.C. entered into an equivalency agreement with the NEB in 2010 which required B.C. to accept the NEB environmental assessment as its own. But we cannot be submitted to another flawed NEB process. Trans Mountain must be exempted from projects subject to this equivalency agreement. I understand that if there is some reason this cannot be achieved, B.C. has a 30-day exit clause which will release B.C. from this detrimental agreement with the N.E.B. Mr. Horgan - this was your statement after the court's decision:

"Establishing provincial jurisdiction is more important than ever." The people of B.C. need you to remove B.C. from the equivalency agreement and carry out a thorough, complete, and scientifically accurate assessment of the impact of the TransMountain expansion on our province's marine environment.
