"Raising capital in the Chinese market helps to strengthen our international trade and financial profile," James said. "Diversifying our financial, trade, and export relationships can translate into jobs here at home for B.C. businesses."

A Panda bond is a colloquial term used for a bond that raises funds in Renminbi (RMB) denominations from onshore Chinese investors. The Province is issuing a three-year bond for RMB 1 billion, or about C\$192.5 million, with the final coupon to be set in the early morning hours of Nov. 22, 2017.

B.C. is the first foreign government to establish a Panda bond program. In 2015, the Province received approval for a 6 billion RMB program, including preapproved conditions on subsequent bonds to a maximum of 3 billion RMB each, and terms of up to 10 years. The program expires on Dec. 3, 2017.

The joint lead managers for the bond will be the Bank of China and HSBC, which were the leads on the Province's first Panda bond.

Quick Facts:

- * In the first three quarters of 2017, exports to mainland China from British Columbia grew by 12.7%.
- * In the same period, exports to Hong Kong from British Columbia grew by 14.6%.
- * In 2016, some of B.C.'s key exports to China include agrifood and seafood products, lumber exports, copper and coal.
- * In addition to growing B.C.'s natural resources and agrifood sectors, the Government of B.C. will help to diversify B.C. exports to Asia and China by focusing on technology and innovation in sub-sectors that include digital media and information and communications technology; clean technology; life sciences; aerospace and ocean technologies.

One note from Levin from yesterday that AG could be asked and why I left the last paragraph in: Note to AG: experts told me that the AG could recognize that such fraud is a predicate offense to money laundering and therefore all of it is proceeds of crime uncollected and pursue accordingly.

"If it is true that only two percent of \$510 million in fines have been collected since 2008, then this is completely unacceptable.

"The BCSC is an independent regulator that is arms-length from government and my colleague the Minister of Finance has encouraged them to bring forward proposals on how they will collect the remainder of these fines under the BC Securities Act.

"As Attorney General, I am committed to working with my cabinet colleagues and the BC Securities Commissioner to find ways to address this matter immediately. This will also include consulting with regulators, prosecutors, and other law enforcement regarding possible avenues and resources available for enforcement purposes.

"I have also hired Peter German to conduct an independent review of British Columbia's anti-money-laundering policies and practices in relation to B.C. casinos. I have asked him specifically to identify any issues connected with any particular crimes, or specific areas of our economy. I am confident he will conduct a thorough and prompt review. I have instructed him to keep me informed of urgent matters as they arise so we can act on them immediately."

"This apparent lack of accountability for criminals that have ruined the lives of many vulnerable British Columbians through financial fraud is part of a disturbing picture emerging of the previous government's indifference to BC's growing reputation as a haven for white collar crime and money laundering.

"As Attorney General, I've been faced with addressing serious and credible allegations of organized crime using BC casinos as a laundromat to wash hundreds of millions of dollars over a period of years, unlimited political donations flowing in to provincial politicians from around the world, and a hidden \$900m deficit at a publicly owned company.

"My colleague the Finance Minister has had to grapple with the fact that we don't actually know who owns almost half of the most valuable residential properties in Vancouver under our current land title and corporate registry systems, provincial financial subsidies being paid to a firm named as a trans-national criminal organization by the United States government, and now, reports that the Securities Commission doesn't have the resources or ability to enforce penalties related to white collar crime.

We're rolling up our sleeves to correct this disturbing trend, and we have a lot of work ahead of us. To address some of these issues we have:

- Passed legislation reforming political donations, banning donations unions and corporations, as well as donations from outside the province, and limiting donations from individuals to \$1200
- Launched an independent investigation by a former senior RCMP officer into allegations of transnational money laundering at BC casinos
- Cancelled the "Advantage BC" program that, among other things, paid public subsidies to PacNet, an international firm described as a "Trans national criminal organization" by the Obama Administration
- Exposed to the public a previously undisclosed \$900m deficit at the publicly owned auto insurer ICBC and launched an internal review to reform the company.
- Initiated a review of the Securities Commission to implement reforms to increase collection of penalties and proceeds of crime.

Distracted driving technology pilots for British Columbians

With insurance rates in B.C. under escalating pressure from the rapidly increasing number of crashes occurring on our roads, the provincial government, ICBC and police are launching two pilots to explore how technology can help combat distracted driving in our province.

Phone apps paired with telematics on B.C. roads

The first pilot – a partnership between government and ICBC – will include up to 200 customers using phone apps paired with telematics. Telematic technology involves fitting a vehicle with a small device that communicates with an app installed on the driver's cellphone. The app works to block the use of a handheld device when the in-vehicle technology senses that the vehicle is being driven.

The combination of telematics with phone apps typically has allowed insurers to collect driving behaviour data, such as kilometres travelled and average speed. However for this pilot ICBC is interested in the user's experience with telematics in their vehicle. Findings from the pilots will be used to inform future decisions around distracted driving prevention and enforcement, as well as changes to improve the fairness of how insurance rates are set.

In the coming weeks ICBC will confirm two to three vendors whose technology will be used during the pilot, which is set to launch in January with results prepared in the spring of 2018. The technology to be used in the pilot was determined to be the most promising based on a review of submissions from a Request for Information ICBC issued in the spring.

For the pilot, ICBC will recruit volunteers from its customer advisory panel. Customers are encouraged to join ICBC's customer advisory panel through icbc.com for an opportunity to participate in this pilot and future e-surveys to share opinions about ICBC products, services and policies. ICBC is looking for participants ages 19 years and up, from all across B.C.

Police test Bluetooth-enabled distracted driving scope

Government and ICBC will also be working in partnership with police to conduct an additional pilot to test a new distracted driving enforcement technology beginning in the spring of 2018. A Bluetooth-enabled scope will be the latest tool police will have onhand to capture distracted driving. Units will be tested by police in varying weather and traffic conditions for usability and effectiveness. The scope will capture an image and then send it via a secured and instant method to other officers in the immediate area. That officer will then have the ability to show the image to the distracted driver.

These pilots are some of the many actions that government, ICBC and B.C. police are taking to reduce crashes caused by distracted driving.

Government is working with our legal counsel to review the suit filed by Great Canadian Gaming Corporation (GCGC) to BC Supreme Court on Thurs., Nov. 9, 2017. In terms of the release of information, the government will defend and act on the public's right to—as—have full information as is legally possible on the alleged money laundering connected to B.C.'s gaming industry. Counsel for GCGC appeared in court today and the application injunction was adjourned generally. It would be inappropriate for the government to comment further until the matter is resolved.

The B.C. casino industry is currently the subject of an independent review being conducted by Peter German who has been appointed by the Attorney General.

The city says the event cannot be approve due to zoning laws. The reporter would like to clarify with LCLB why the event was actually cancelled.

Background: LCLB does not work directly with the local government on these applications, but if the event is large enough, the SEP will go to local police for their approval. This SEP was approved by LCLB but not issued because the application fee was not paid and the licensed establishment where the SEP was to take place had not applied to temporarily delicence to allow for the SEP. There were also local concerns that are outside LCLB's prevue.

The reporter has the following questions about the electoral reform engagement:

Recommendation - Provide on background from Ministry of Attorney General

Q1: Did the members of the panel of academic advisers provide their feedback in writing? If the Attorney General did not approve or sign off on the questions, who in the ministry did so?

 Ministry staff developed the questionnaire and submitted it to academic experts for review and input. Ministry staff then assessed all input and presented the questionnaire to the Attorney General for approval. Expert feedback was provided in writing to ministry staff.

Q2: Will the data collected from the survey be made public - how many answered, what were the numbers on each response and so forth - so it would be possible to gauge the level of support on each issue?

• The report will include a summary of what was heard throughout the consultation. The public engagement – including the questionnaire and the open-fields it includes to gather general commentary – is designed to stimulate consideration and gather input on many topics, including the values British Columbians hold for how ballots are structured, representatives are elected and governments are run. The questionnaire is designed to capture input on various voting systems used in B.C. and elsewhere in the world, and was informed by the design of other surveys, such as the Canadian Election Study, sponsored in part by Elections Canada.

Q3: The minister said that others will be consulted. Who will select those to be consulted, who will do the consultations, and how will that information be assembled and summarized?

- The online panel mentioned at the Nov. 23 media event is an additional method that Government's Citizen's Engagement unit uses to ensure it hears the views of British Columbians.
- The Ipsos Online panel will be made up of about 1000 citizens from around the province of varying age, gender and ethnicity who will respond to the questionnaire to ensure government hears the views and perspectives of people beyond just those who have chosen to take the questionnaire. The panel helps ensure that survey samples accurately reflect the makeup of the broader population based on Census and other reliable data.
- The panel will be administered by Ipsos through government's Citizen's Engagement team.
- This process is standard for many government public engagements.

Q4: Who will assemble the data, draw conclusions, and draft the final report to Cabinet on the public feedback?

- Government's Citizen's Engagement team will coordinate the preparation of the initial analysis of input gathered through the questionnaire, the questionnaire's open-commentary sections, and from submissions emailed by stakeholder groups, academics and citizens.
- A summary report will be provided to the Ministry of Attorney General for compilation in a report with recommendations, which will be presented to the Attorney General.
- The Attorney General will review and approve the final report and recommendations, which will be made available to the public and presented to Cabinet for debate and decision.
- The Attorney General will recuse himself from Cabinet debate and decision regarding the referendum.
- British Columbians will have the final say when they vote in the fall 2018 referendum.

Q5: Will the final report be independently vetted before it is submitted to Cabinet?

The group received a letter from the Laxgalts'ap First Nation saying that the RCMP and Gaming BC have been monitoring social media and saw that this group was holding a fundraiser without a licence, so the group cancelled it. The fundraiser was for a basketball team to go south for a tournament.

Questions:

- What is the threshold for a community fundraiser turning into a gambling event and needing a licence? When does a local fundraiser become a local or provincial government concern?
- Is there a limit to how much can be fundraised by a group like this?
- What makes the local government get involved in community activities like this?
- What do community groups have to do to abide by government rules?

Recommendation: provide on background from Ministry

What is the threshold for a community fundraiser turning into a gambling event and needing a licence? When does a local fundraiser become a local or provincial government concern? What makes the local government get involved in community activities like this?

- Any time an organization or individual wishes to fundraise through a
 gambling event, they require a licence from the Gaming Policy and
 Enforcement Branch (GPEB). An event with gambling involves prizes, games
 of chance and consideration (payment to play). Chase the Ace events are
 considered gambling events.
- Fundraising that does not involve gambling is not regulated by GPEB.
- Chase the Ace is not currently permitted in B.C. because it does not meet the
 requirements of B.C.'s Standard Procedures for Ticket Raffles. These
 standard procedures are in place to ensure raffles are conducted lawfully
 and with integrity, and to protect the raffle licensee and raffle participants.

•

- Government is considering whether to implement Chase the Ace style draws in B.C.
- GEPB is aware of a number of the Chase the Ace events that are occurring
 across the province illegally. The branch has been reaching out to the
 organizations to ask them to stop operating these events and to support
 them in determining what they can do to fundraise legally.
- Questions about local government process or involvement as it relates to gambling should be directed to the local government, or local RCMP.

Is there a limit to how much can be fundraised by a group like this? What do community groups have to do to abide by government rules?

- An organization planning to hold a gambling event to fundraise for the purpose of benefiting the broader community may be eligible for either a Class A, B, or D gambling event licence.
- The class of licence needed for a specific event depends on how the
 organization is structured, how much money is expected to be raised, the
 value of the prizes and the price of tickets. Class A licences are issued to
 organizations with gross revenue over \$20,000, Class B licenses are issued to
 organizations with gross revenue under \$20,000, and Class D licenses are
 issued to organizations with gross revenue under \$5,000.

The group received a letter from the Laxgalts'ap First Nation saying that the RCMP and Gaming BC have been monitoring social media and saw that this group was holding a fundraiser without a licence, so the group cancelled it. The fundraiser was for a basketball team to go south for a tournament.

Recommendation: provide on background from Ministry

- Q) What is the threshold for a community fundraiser turning into a gambling event and needing a licence? When does a local fundraiser become a local or provincial government concern? What makes the local government get involved in community activities like this?
 - Any time an organization or individual wishes to fundraise through a gambling event, they require a licence from the Gaming Policy and Enforcement Branch (GPEB). An event with gambling involves prizes, games of chance and consideration (payment to play).
 Chase the Ace events are considered gambling events.
 - Fundraising that does not involve gambling is not regulated by GPEB.
 - Chase the Ace is not currently permitted in B.C. because it does not meet the
 requirements of B.C.'s Standard Procedures for Ticket Raffles. These standard procedures
 are in place to ensure raffles are conducted lawfully and with integrity, and to protect the
 raffle licensee and raffle participants.
 - Government is considering whether to implement Chase the Ace style draws in B.C.
 - GEPB is aware of a number of the Chase the Ace events that are occurring across the
 province illegally. The branch has been reaching out to the organizations to ask them to
 stop operating these events and to support them in determining what they can do to
 fundraise legally.
 - Questions about local government process or involvement as it relates to gambling should be directed to the local government, or local RCMP.

Q) Is there a limit to how much can be fundraised by a group like this? What do community groups

have to do to abide by government rules?

- An organization planning to hold a gambling event to fundraise for the purpose of benefiting the broader community may be eligible for either a Class A, B, or D gambling event licence.
- The class of licence needed for a specific event depends on how the organization is structured, how much money is expected to be raised, the value of the prizes and the price of tickets. Class A licences are issued to organizations with gross revenue over \$20,000, Class B licenses are issued to organizations with gross revenue under \$20,000, and Class D licenses are issued to organizations with gross revenue under \$5,000.

Minister Darcy,

My name is Francesca Marzari. We met many years ago when you were running to be our candidate in Vancouver Fairview. Much has changed since then, including the exciting creation of a Ministry of Mental Health and Addictions, and your appointment as its Minister.s.22

As for me, I am still very much involved in the work of West Coast LEAF (I was president of this organization for a few years) and I am now on the Government Relations Committee of the Canadian Bar Association, BC Branch (CBA BC). It is in the latter capacity that I write to you to request a meeting to discuss legal aid with you.

The expansion of the legal aid program and its proper funding is not just an issue for the justice system. For many individuals with mental health and addictions issues, accessing the criminal court is not the problem, but finding justice is. Those members of our criminal defence bar willing to work within our entirely underfunded legal aid system are on the front lines of a crisis, and they are falling fast. I am not one of these lawyers (I act for local governments-a passion of my mother's as well) but I know that those who continue to do legal aid work do so only because they are passionate about ensuring that those who cannot afford legal counsel receive the advocacy they require. The number of hours and the hourly rate allocated for this work through legal aid (increased only once since 1991) does not come close to what is actually required to properly represent most of these individuals, and the system is not sustainable.

Legal aid child protection, criminal and family law clients are disproportionately First Nations as a result of poverty and other circumstances. Over 70% of family law clients are women. Many legal aid clients have mental health and addictions issues. Any strategy designed to address inequality, poverty, mental illness and addiction needs to also consider how these individuals interact with our justice system, and ensure that there is someone there advocating for them to get into rehabilitation programs, to have their First Nations culture and history recognized and considered, to find restorative justice solutions, and to support women and their children.

I would truly appreciate an opportunity to meet with you to discuss these priorities in the next few weeks. You can reach me at the above email address, at the office below, or on my cell ats.22

Government to undertake in-depth file review to identify waste and overbilling, find savings at ICBC

VICTORIA – The Government of B.C. has selected PwC Canada to lead an operational review of ICBC to identify waste, ways to prevent fraud and overbilling, and identify opportunities for business reform at the crown corporation. The review includes selecting 100 random files for a comprehensive review, similar to a financial audit, but directed at business practices and aimed at cutting out waste, overbilling, and poor cost controls.

"This is one of the many actions we are taking so that the people of B.C. can have confidence in and continue to benefit from ICBC, one of our most important public assets," said Attorney General David Eby. "Surprisingly, this is the first review of ICBC we're aware of that directs the reviewers to talk to front line employees about where they see waste, fraud, overbilling, or other opportunities for reform. We are leaving no stone unturned in this review."

Following a competitive process, PwC Canada was selected to conduct an evidence-based operational review of ICBC to identify opportunities to reduce costs at the insurer, which lost almost half a billion dollars last year. Any recommendations PwC Canada makes in these areas are also to consider how to maintain or improve the quality of service levels for ICBC's customers.

"The ICBC board and all senior management are committed to working alongside government to make sure action is taken as quickly as possible to bring about long-term, sustainable improvements at ICBC," said ICBC board chair Joy MacPhail. "The resulting solutions we want to see must be focused on striking the balance between relieving the cost pressures on ICBC while ensuring improved services and affordable rates for all British Columbians."

In conducting this review, PwC Canada will look at all previous reports and recommendations related to the financial management and reporting of ICBC from the last five years, and will review approaches in other jurisdictions and segments within the insurance industry related to ICBC's various business lines.

"ICBC will not be back on the road to financial sustainability or in a position to provide affordable rates to British Columbians without major changes at every level. These are changes that the previous administration was afraid to confront, and now ratepayers are on the hook for losses in the hundreds of millions of dollars," said Eby. "We must act urgently, because major rate increases are not an option."

A final report will be submitted to Government in early 2018. The report will be made public at that time.

Government to participate in NEB hearing regarding City of Burnaby

VICTORIA – The government will appear before the National Energy Board (NEB) on constitutional issues relating to Trans Mountain work at the Burnaby and Westridge Marine Terminals. Trans Mountain is asking the NEB to approve commencement of terminal work notwithstanding Trans Mountain has not obtained preliminary plan approvals under Burnaby's zoning bylaw or a tree cutting permit under Burnaby's tree bylaw, as currently required by conditions on federal approvals of the project.

"While this is a direct matter between the company and the City of Burnaby, the constitutional issues raised may result in restricting the B.C.'s involvement in defending provincial interests in the future," said Attorney General David Eby. "That is why we have advised the NEB that the Province of B.C. will be participating in this hearing."

Thomas Berger, QC, on behalf of the government,-has asked the NEB to dismiss outright Trans Mountain's suggestion of abridged timelines for future applications by Trans Mountain to challenge decisions of municipalities and the Province in relation to permits for the project. This position is taken to ensure the Province has adequate opportunity to defend its decisions in future.

"We have been clear and consistent that we will use every tool available to defend B.C.'s coast; and that is what we're doing", said Environment Minister George Heyman. "One of our first steps was to appear as interveners in the Federal Court of Appeal hearing. We've also passed initial regulations to increase responsibility, transparency and accountability for those who move potentially dangerous liquid petroleum products through our province. We will continue to pursue ways to defend the interests of British Columbians against this unnecessary project".

A date for the NEB hearing has not yet been set.



Officials have projected it, and the amount is \$8.6 billion over that period of time.

"These changes reflect our commitment to make B.C. better for farmers and food and beverage makers," said Minister of Agriculture Lana Popham. "We have heard loud and clear from local governments, the B.C. Chamber of Commerce and industry that these changes were needed to make things fair and equitable, and to support opportunities for growth in B.C. agriculture."

The updated regulation results in all alcohol producers operating in the ALR being required to at a minimum, source at least 50% of the primary farm product used in their alcohol (grapes for wine, barley for beer) from their and other B.C. farms, which could create demand for more B.C. barley, honey, and grains.

"These changes reflect our commitment to make B.C. better for farmers and food and beverage makers," said Minister of Agriculture Lana Popham. "We have heard loud and clear from local governments, the B.C. Chamber of Commerce and industry that these changes were needed to make things fair and equitable, and to support opportunities for growth in B.C. agriculture."

The updated regulation results in all alcohol producers operating in the ALR being required to at a minimum, source at least 50% of the primary farm product used in their alcohol (grapes for wine, barley for beer) from their and other B.C. farms, which could create demand for more B.C. barley, honey, and grains.



As a follow-up to my earlier email, I thought it would be helpful to provide you with our research on Site C.

In addition to the 5 reports available on our website, our team has made 5 submissions to the BCUC Site C Inquiry (available at http://www.sitecinquiry.com/submissions-and-comments/), all of which indicate that Site C is significantly more expensive than the alternatives (notably wind and solar).

Our research also indicates that Site C is not "cleaner" or "greener" than the alternatives. Specifically: our research finds that the alternative portfolio (which includes wind energy) presented by BC Hydro would produce no more greenhouse gas emissions than the Site C project while having significantly lower environmental impacts. (https://watergovernance.ca/files/2017/03/Report-4-Site-C-Comparative-GHG-analysis.pdf)

Our report finds that the alternative portfolio (which includes wind energy) presented by BC Hydro would produce no more greenhouse gas emissions than the Site C project while having significantly lower environmental impacts.

An earlier report we did compared Site C's environmental impacts (as determined by the Joint Review Panel) to all other projects ever approved under the history of the Canadian Environmental Assessment Act. That analysis found that Site C had the highest number of impacts since the inception of CEAA (1992). This includes impacts on dozens of species, aquatics, vegetation, wildlife, Aboriginal use of lands and resources, and cultural heritage.

Why is this significant? You may remember that the previous government stated that the unprecedented

number of significant adverse environmental effects from Site C was justifiable, in part, because the project delivers energy and capacity at lower GHG emissions than the available alternatives. Our analysis indicates this is not the case. In summary, the Site C Project is not "cleaner" or "greener" than the alternatives.

Our analysis uses data prepared by BC Hydro and compares the difference in greenhouse gas emissions between the Site C Project and an optimization of an Alternative Portfolio initially put forward by BC Hydro (which includes wind energy). The difference in lifecycle greenhouse emissions is estimated to be significantly less than 1% of BC's current emissions.

Note: the Joint Review Panel commissioned by the federal and provincial governments to conduct an environmental assessment of the Site C Project was not able to conduct a comparative analysis of greenhouse gas emissions because of limited time and resources. Our report thus fills an important information gap.

Our report also questions the potential for exporting Site C energy to Alberta. The relatively high cost of Site C energy (compared to other renewables such as wind and solar) is likely dampen export opportunities, particularly given the rapidly declining cost of other renewables. Site C is simply too expensive when compared with cheaper alternatives that Alberta is now pursuing, including wind and solar.

The report was independently reviewed by leading academics: Dr. Arthur Fredeen (UNBC) and Dr. Norman Mousseau (Université de Montreal).
