Hello David, Gala and Tanera:

I've just received this letter from the BC Prosecution Service in response to my email to your office of June 15, 2018, following up on our meeting at the end of April and supplying additional information.

When we met at the end of April, our discussion included the possibility of arranging a meeting with the BC Prosecution Service to discuss potential revisions to their policy on prosecution on HIV non-disclosure cases, as released on March 1, 2018. To that end, in my email of June 15th, I had suggested some possible dates in July. In response, you had indicated (in an email reply on June 20th) that at your end "We will get started on organizing a follow up meeting that includes the BC Prosecution Service as soon as possible. My colleague Tanera will be in touch about this to determine dates that work for you."

I was actually about to follow up on this exchange to see if any progress had been made on identifying a possible date for such a meeting, when I received this message and attached letter below.

However, the attached letter makes it clear that the BC Prosecution Service is uninterested in such a meeting.

Therefore, I'd like to set up a call to discuss what the next steps might be. Since that apparently doesn't involve coordinating schedules with the BC Prosecution Service, I

hope it might be easier to get this scheduled fairly soon. I wonder if, David and Gala, you have time for a call on any of the following:

July 9 – anytime between 9 am and 5 pm PDT

July 11 – anytime between 9 am and 2 pm PDT

July 12 – anytime between 9 am and 5 pm PDT

July 13 – anytime between 9 am and 5 pm PDT

July 18 – anytime between 9 am and 5 pm PDT

Let's settle on a date and time if one of the above could work for you, and once it's settled, I'll probably ask my colleagues Ryan (from the HIV & AIDS Legal Clinic Ontario) and Nicholas (from the Legal Network), both of whom were at our in-person meeting, to join us.

Thanks for considering the request, and I hope to hear from you soon.

dear minister, once again i am writing you to take a leadership role as BC's AG, in modernizing prosecution guidelines vis a vis disclosure of HIV status to the current scientific evidentiary consensus of which i know you are aware. this evening i am reaching out to you in response to an evening i spent this week learning about the "Reflecting Back" project that has been funded by the Vancouver Foundation. this is an oral history project that has been underway in Vancouver and is now expanding to Victoria. it is an attempt to (re) collect the history of the AIDS epidemic before those of us who are long term survivors are dead. the room was filled with men and women who have managed to survive while burying scores of friends and families. all the while we have been subject to the stigma and discrimination that comes with our positive status. many of us were guinea pigs of salvage therapy research that has both kept us alive and led to the early release of potentially life saving medications including those pertaining to HIV, breast cancer and other life threatening health challenges . i personally am alive to write you as i was s.22 in the salvage therapeutic release of Crixivan on november 1, 1995. while it kept me alive and formed the foundation of HAART , the unknown side effects were often severe. i was taken off the Crixivan combination and moved to an early release of Sustiva which again suppressed the HIV but put me into a black hole depression for 6 months s.22

while great strides have been made in reducing HIV related stigma, it is unfortunate that me and my peers who helped revolutionize the availability of medications across the broad spectrum of illness are still being stigmatized by having to disclose our HIV+ status despite our clinically proven inability to pass the infection.s.22

while i appreciate your interest in having your prosecution service take the lead in this turn toward scientific based guidelines, i am not convinced you or we have the leisure to wait for that day. for years while the evidence has built up, they have remained with the long out of date standard. your government is vulnerable. the resignation of a Nanaimo area NDP MLA to run for mayor threatens your government as does Dr Weaver's indication that he may be voting against an upcoming piece of legislation that could also topple your coalition.

while it is true that if you make this change, a new government could repeal it and go back to the unnecessary demonization of those of us who live responsibly, i would prefer to see them attempt to do this after you take the "high" road. i believe all of us in the room this week and the thousands of HAART adherent individuals with a chronic and manageable condition would be at the front of the protest line. too many of us have died; too many of those who aided us while the world turned it's back especially those in the women's community and too many of the surviving parents, family and friends of the

departed would hopefully revive the strategies of organizations like ACT UP and take action.

your unwillingness to act despite my sincere belief that you stand with us is stigma and discrimination towards a community that has endured this abuse for too long, is our reality today. i urge you to move now towards embracing the science of transmission in the prosecution guidelines. while there are many issues involved in the revision of these guidelines, this issue has the power of having scientific fact behind it. the time is now.

Subject: following up regarding HIV criminalization and prosecutorial guidance in BC

Dear David, Gala (and Tanera):

Somewhat later than planned, I'm following up on our discussions at the end of April regarding HIV criminalization, with two purposes:

(1) I wanted to provide you with some additional material as discussed; and

(2) I wanted to inquire about getting scheduled soon the follow-up meeting that we discussed. As you can appreciate, the window for making positive and necessary change on this front is open now, and we should not miss the opportunity to rectify a long-standing and ongoing injustice against people living with HIV.

During the course of our discussion, we said that we would share with you a number of documents that would be helpful in taking up the task of improving BC's prosecutorial stance vis-à-vis allegations of HIV non-disclosure. Therefore, I am attaching the following:

<!--[if !supportLists]--> <!--[endif]-->**Canadian scientific**

consensus statement: This statement was authored by 6 leading HIV scientists in Canada (including Dr. Julio Montaner) and endorsed by more than 70 others and the Association of Medical Microbiology and Infectious Disease, and published in 2014 in the peer-reviewed *Canadian Journal of Infectious Diseases and Medical Microbiology*. It was written specifically because of the concern that the criminal justice system's "poor appreciation of the science" is leading to over-application of the criminal law and miscarriages of justice. It has been used in numerous cases to secure a withdrawal or reduction of charges originally laid, and as an adjunct to the testimony of scientific experts (some of them authors/endorsers of the statement) in prosecutions. Note that the scientific case for limiting the application of the criminal law has only grown stronger in the 4 years since that statement was published, given additional research studies that have reported results. *I should note that, as mentioned at our meeting, next month, in conjunction with the International AIDS Conference (AIDS 2018) in Amsterdam, an updated, international scientific consensus statement, co-authored by 20 of the world's leading HIV scientists, will be released in the Journal of the International AIDS Society, with endorsement by many other scientists, UNAIDS, the International AIDS Society and the International Association of Providers in AIDS Care (IAPAC), reflecting a global consensus among key experts and agencies regarding the need to limit overly broad HIV*

criminalization.

<!--[if !supportLists]--> <!--[endif]-->Also attached is a **briefing note prepared recently for a ministerial roundtable held here in Ontario** with the Attorney General, representatives from some other relevant ministries and a number of key community stakeholders, scientific experts and HIV clinicians, etc. It was prepared by the Canadian HIV/AIDS Legal Network and the HIV & AIDS Legal Clinic Ontario (HALCO) for the Ontario Working Group on Criminal Law and HIV Exposure (CLHE). It provides the most current summary of the state of the law and prosecutions in Canada, the many concerns with the overly broad state of that law, the developments that have happened recently, and lays out what needs to happen next – including with 12 recommendations to the Province of Ontario. We submit all of those recommendations are also entirely relevant to all other jurisdictions in Canada, including BC.

<!--[if !supportLists]--> <!--[endif]-->Attached is the **original report of the CLHE in Ontario**, based on consultations around the province, with numerous recommendations for the development of guidelines for prosecutors in that province – it is a more detailed document providing more detailed rationale for the various recommendations. Again, much of the substance would be applicable in any province.

<!--[if !supportLists]--> <!--[endif]-->I’m also attaching both the **2012 report of the UN’s Global Commission on HIV and the Law** (see Chapter 2 for the discussion of, and recommendations regarding, overly broad HIV criminalization), and the subsequent **2013 Guidance document from UNAIDS** laying out the various scientific, medical and legal considerations about limiting overly broad HIV criminalization, which provides much more detailed guidance on translating those recommendations into law and policy.

<!--[if !supportLists]-->- <!--[endif]-->Attached is the **updated Ontario policy guidance** issued on December 1, 2017 – which was then also distributed by the Attorney General to all police services across the province. Note the highlighted portion that represents the clear statement by the Attorney General that prosecutions will not proceed in cases where the person living with HIV has a suppressed viral load for at least six months.

<!--[if !supportLists]-->- <!--[endif]-->You may also be interested in this recent **study indicating the harmful public health impact** in Ontario of overly broad HIV criminalization, including by deterring some people from seeking HIV testing – an impact that of course flies directly in the face of efforts, in which BC has been a leader, to connect people to testing and to ARV treatment not only for their own well-being but also as a key element of effective HIV prevention.

<!--[if !supportLists]-->- <!--[endif]-->Lastly, I believe I shared this at the time it was published, but in case you didn’t see it then, here is the link to our **op-ed in the Vancouver Sun** that appeared at the time we met outlining some of our critique of the very disappointing policy on HIV non-disclosure prosecutions issued by the BC Prosecution Service on March 1st:

As discussed, it is profoundly disappointing that the new guidance adopted by the BC Prosecution Service on March 1, 2018 doesn't even clearly state – unlike the policy in Ontario – that there will be no prosecution against a person with a suppressed viral load. But as we stated in response to the new Ontario policy last December – see attached statement – that is just one very modest (and necessary) step that must be taken in modernizing prosecutorial policies in Canada. At the very least, as discussed at our meeting, any prosecutorial guidance in every jurisdiction in Canada should reflect the recommendations in the Justice Canada report released last December, including the following:

<!--[if !supportLists]--> ■ <!--[endif]-->Consistent with the relevant SCC jurisprudence, the criminal law should not apply to persons living with HIV who have engaged in sexual activity without disclosing their status if they have maintained a **suppressed viral load** (i.e., under 200 copies per ml of blood), because the realistic possibility of transmission test is not met in these circumstances. A person living with HIV who takes their treatment as prescribed is acting responsibly.

<!--[if !supportLists]--> ■ <!--[endif]-->The criminal law should generally not apply to persons living with HIV who: are **on treatment**; are not on treatment but use **condoms**; or, **engage only in oral sex** (unless other risk factors are present and the person living with HIV is aware of those risks), because the realistic

possibility of transmission test is likely not met in these circumstances.

This position is also endorsed by (what is now) more than 160 organizations from the HIV sector and beyond from across Canada, in the **Community Consensus Statement** on ending unjust HIV criminalization. We shared a copy with you at the meeting, but I attach it again here for convenience, along with an **FAQ** document that provides a bit of background about how this consensus statement came to be. We look forward to continuing to work together to ensure revisions to BC's prosecutorial stance to better reflect science, and to better respect human rights and protect public health.

(2) Follow-up meeting

From our discussion at our meeting at the end of April, I understood that you planned to have some further discussions with the BC Prosecution Service, in light of concerns raised about the current prosecutorial policy.

We also agreed that that a follow-up meeting involving community representatives and the BC Prosecution Service would be useful. I'd like to see if we could get that scheduled as soon as possible. We had talked about June or July as possibilities for this. I'd be grateful if we could try to nail down some dates and make this happen; I'd be happy to talk with Tanera about that.

(In the meantime, I did have a bit of follow-up discussion with colleagues locally in BC who work in the HIV sector about some key stakeholders that could be brought together for this discussion, including women living with HIV, and am happy to pick up those conversations with them and facilitate that once we can nail down some options for a meeting.)

Lastly, I did want to note that we all recognized that, as Attorney General, Minister Eby has the legal authority to issue a directive to BC prosecutors should the Prosecution Service be unwilling to adopt prosecutorial guidance that he feels is satisfactory. While we appreciate that it would be much preferable for the Prosecution Service to indeed adopt a much sounder policy, we also know from history that this may be very difficult to achieve – and certainly in a timely fashion. As noted above, we don't want to miss a window of opportunity that currently exists, with an Attorney General who understands the concerns, to get sound prosecutorial policy in place. (David, for a trip down memory lane: I stumbled upon this article from 2012 in connection with the Mabior case, in which you were commenting, as Legal Network president, about the need to not prosecute people who use condoms:

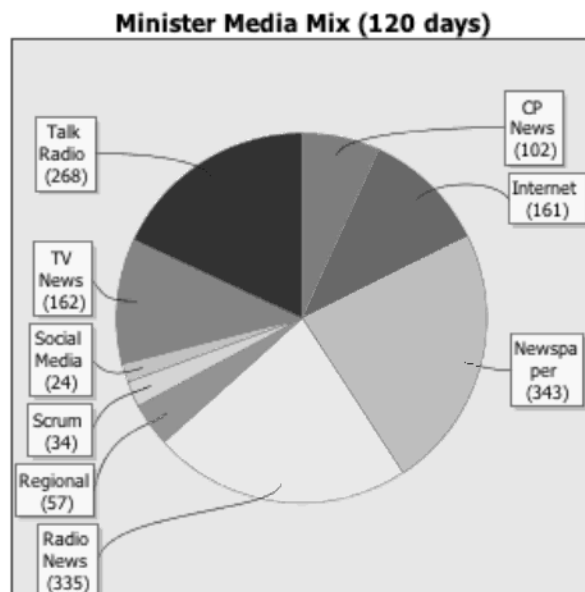

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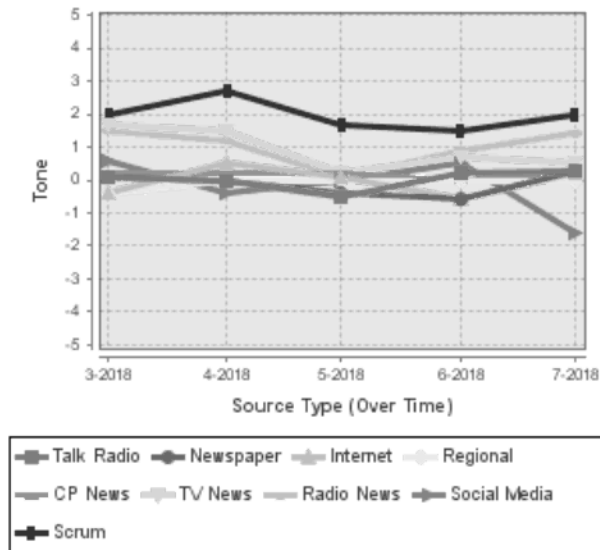

The reporter is working on a story about the Online Divorce Assistant and would like to know (questions below):

Recommendation – Provide background

1) Why did the government decide to start this online tool?

- **Paperwork for initiating a divorce is often filled out incorrectly resulting in multiple trips to the registry.**
- **The ODA will help guide users through the process to initiate an uncontested divorce, where no children are involved.**
- **The service is also intended to help reduce the stress on couples seeking a divorce.**

2) How does the government feel the tool will help speed up issues in the family court arena, which can be fairly fraught with delays?

- **At this time the ODA is only available to British Columbians without children who want to file for an uncontested divorce.**
- **With fewer incorrect forms being filed, users won't have to keep going to the registry.**
- **Government is looking at expanding the service to include joint filing divorces in cases that involve children.**
- **We will be monitoring the use of the system closely over the next few months to get feedback from users.**

3) The tool offers a very quick resolution process. Are there any concerns it may lead to more complicated issues not being addressed properly?

- **The service does not offer any type of resolution process.**
- **It is designed to assist users complete the necessary forms to initiate an uncontested**

divorce where there are no children involved. The legal process when filing for a divorce has not changed.

4) Are there any other areas of the justice system that the government is considering using similar tools for?

- **The ODA service is the first of its kind in B.C. and will provide the foundation for other service oriented initiatives aimed at improving services to the public.**
- **Government is currently looking at other services that could benefit from this new type of approach. You can expect more announcements in the future.**

Great Canadian sent the reporter a statement over the weekend stating that they did not register the partnership as it did not require registration with GPEB or any other BC-related gaming regulatory body. However, during the reporter's interview with Minister Eby on Friday, the minister said that there are no exceptions in cases like this and any business or investments made by Great Canadian should have been registered and vetted.

The reporter would like a comment or statement from Minister Eby on what he thinks of this recent update.

Background

REQUEST:

Sam Cooper is publishing a story next week on how the Great Canadian Gaming Corporation might not have properly registered a partnership for vetting with its casino cruise in Asia. Great Canadian allegedly partnered with Cheng Yu-Tung on a casino cruise in 2001. However, there are no records showing that Great Canadian partnered with Cheng or that this was registered for the regular vetting process for "suitable partners" tied to BCLC. In response, Global is putting together a TV version of the story that would air the same day Sam's story publishes (either Monday or Tuesday).

The reporter would like to schedule a pre-taped on-camera interview with Minister Eby tomorrow to discuss Sam's story and potential actions the minister might take in response. The interview would be 5-8 minutes long. The reporter is available to conduct the interview any time tomorrow between 11 a.m. and 4 p.m. Global is able to send a camera to the minister's location.

The exact quotes from the minister that the reporter is referencing is:

"It's critically important that the regulator have a full set of information in order to be able to do the job of ensuring there's no affiliation with people involved in organized crime or in shady dealing. Any service provider, whether its Great Canadian or anyone else, needs to register all business dealings with the regulator so they can be checked out."

GPEB advises that the section in red incorrect – service providers typically only report substantial business dealings that relate to gaming. Many businesses have both gaming and non-gaming interests.

Recommendation – provide statement from Minister David Eby

"For clarification, any service provider needs to notify the Gaming Policy and Enforcement Branch (GPEB) of any gambling-related business that may have a material impact on gambling services within B.C. The case in question is from more than 15 years ago, before the Gaming Control Act was enacted in 2002. Today, all companies that operate in the gambling industry within B.C. must be registered by GPEB, without exception. GPEB does not have legal authority to register companies that are not conducting gambling business in B.C."

We thought it would be beneficial to connect with you as it has been over seven months since we met with David Eby, on January 10th.

If you recall at the meeting the A.G. understood both issues with our public access of blind people and their guide dogs and the unnecessary punitive provincial registration.

Given this support, we desperately need Mr. Eby's leadership to resolve this protracted impasse.

Along with David Merner a three page letter, backed by the A.G., was drawn up after a three month detailed discussion. The letter focused on 4 main points and reflected the combined efforts, including some compromises from blind Canadians, to provide a concise and accurate scenario of the problems and solutions to bring us equality of access.

After everyone was in agreement at our meeting we understood the process was to forward the letter to Mike Farnworth's and Claire Trevena's Ministries. We entered into this process on the expectation that the main punitive issues could be quickly and easily corrected. To date the designated staff member, Linda Canham, has given little feedback to our requests regarding any progress. Months on we are not even sure whether the Ministers and their heads of staff are even aware of the letter. In view of the history related to our protracted journey to attain equality of public access we suspect the intermediaries could be tampering with the letter's content. These are the same civil servants who ignored both the NDP critics and our advice over the revised legislation in 2015. As a result many blind people and others have no protection from illegal and discriminatory barriers. Many blind people are still encountering barriers and registration issues, including on BC Ferries, etc.

We are just asking to be treated the same as everyone else, as the law intended, which as both Davids agreed, is absolutely understandable.

If necessary we would be quite willing to meet again with the A.G.

I am responding to your emails of May 14, June 3 and 22, and July 5, 2018, in which you outline your ongoing concerns about the approach to HIV non-disclosure cases in British Columbia.

It was a pleasure to meet you and hear first-hand your concerns at the reception in June. Thank you for sharing your story with me. As you know, in my role as a Member of the Legislative Assembly and Attorney General, I take an active interest in issues that impact the daily lives of British Columbians.

While I cannot comment on the actions and decisions taken by the federal government or other jurisdictions in regard to this matter, I can provide you with information about the approach taken in British Columbia.

The BC Prosecution Service (BCPS) is responsible for the conduct and supervision of criminal prosecutions and appeals in British Columbia, including the creation of criminal justice policy. As a general rule, the Attorney General does not involve himself in the administration of the criminal justice system or the operations of BCPS, which handles all prosecution functions on the Attorney General's behalf.

As you may know, in British Columbia, when the police conclude a criminal investigation, they have the discretion to submit a Report to Crown Counsel to the BCPS for a determination on whether its charge assessment standard is met. If charges are approved, a prosecution is initiated. Unlike most other jurisdictions in Canada, in British Columbia it is Crown Counsel, not the police, who decide whether someone will be charged.

In completing a charge assessment, Crown Counsel within the BCPS are guided by the policy Charge Assessment Guidelines ([CHA 1](#)) and must impartially assess the investigative file that is brought to them, carefully balancing all relevant factors in light of the available evidence, the governing *Criminal Code* provisions (as informed by the relevant case law), and their assessment of the public interest as agents for the Attorney General of British Columbia. On March 1, 2018, the BCPS implemented a revised Crown Counsel Policy Manual after a comprehensive review in which each policy was examined for consistency, relevance, usefulness and conformity with current law and legal practice. The revised BCPS policy Sexual Transmission, or Realistic Possibility of Transmission, of HIV ([SEX 2](#)) provides guidance to Crown Counsel at all stages of their involvement in an HIV non-disclosure file, from charge assessment to sentencing. I encourage you to review the [SEX 2](#) policy, as it does address several of the concerns outlined in your email.

To assist Crown Counsel in conducting charge assessments on cases involving non-disclosure of HIV status, the BCPS has a designated lawyer with particular expertise in both the law relating to non-disclosure of HIV status and the current medical science. This Crown Counsel

acts as a resource for other lawyers, helping to ensure that only appropriate charges that meet the current legal, evidentiary, and public interest tests for charge approval proceed.

You may also find it useful to know that the BCPS reviews its prosecution policies on an ongoing basis so that they accurately reflect developments in Canadian criminal law, respond appropriately to emerging trends or community needs, and reasonably balance individual rights with societal interests. When reviewing policies and assessing the need for amendments, the BCPS is informed by, and remains mindful of, other developments relevant to the administration of justice.

However, the role of the BCPS requires it to interpret and apply the criminal law, as codified by the federal government and interpreted by the Supreme Court of Canada. Given the governing provisions of the *Criminal Code* and the Supreme Court of Canada's decision in *R. v. Mabior*, the BCPS created the above noted policy to address the evolving medical scientific evidence, apply the law in a fair and consistent manner, and work within the current legal framework.

Under the *Crown Counsel Act*, the Prosecution Service operates independently of the Attorney General. The purpose for this separation is to ensure that there is no inappropriate political interference in specific prosecutions or in decisions by the independent prosecution service. While the Attorney General has a limited power to direct the prosecution service about *specific cases or issues*, any such direction must be in writing and must be published in the BC Gazette. This power is rarely used.

I understand and appreciate that this is an important issue that requires input and discussion from multiple entities and individuals.

The likelihood of anyone living with HIV who has an undetectable viral load passing the virus on to a sexual partner is scientifically equivalent to zero, [researchers confirmed at the 22nd International AIDS Conference \(AIDS 2018\) in Amsterdam today.](#)

Final results from the PARTNER study were presented this morning at a press conference. [Results originally announced in 2014](#) from the first phase, PARTNER 1, already indicated that 'Undetectable = Untransmittable' (U=U). However, the statistical certainty of this result was not quite as convincing in the case of gay men, or for anal sex, as it was for vaginal sex.

Results from PARTNER 2, the second phase, which only recruited gay couples, were presented today. The results indicate, in the words of the researchers, "A precise rate of within-couple transmission of zero" for gay men as well as for heterosexuals.

The PARTNER study recruited HIV serodiscordant couples (one partner living with HIV, one partner HIV negative) in 14 European countries. The study found no transmissions between gay couples where the partner living with HIV had a viral load under 200 copies/ml – even though there were nearly 77,000 acts of condomless sex between them.

PARTNER 2 tells us that U=U holds just as strongly for gay men (and for anal sex) as for heterosexuals.

Information from TNRD's Director of Development Services:

Dear Becky,

In regards to the property below in Pritchard. We are very much aware of the issues of this case and its history. And we have had approx. a dozen enforcement files in this subdivision of Pritchard over the past 5 years. We have even take legal action on some of them.

However our unsightly premises bylaw *only* deals with visible accumulation of rubbish, derelict vehicles, or junk on the exterior area of a private property. The TNRD bylaw gives us no authority over yard (i.e. lawn) maintenance and I have to say - given 46,000 sq km it would be a challenging task especially as it can be subjective. In respect to the condition or maintenance of a building, similarly the unsightly premises bylaw and the building bylaw provide us no authority to compel maintenance. I am not even sure that this is something allowed a regional district under the Local Government Act. Municipalities have a good deal more authority in that respect under the Community Charter. In terms of pests such as rats, it is a IHA power but they will only take on a complaint if it reaches the threshold of a broad public health hazard.

Granted, this is not good news for s.22 and the neighbours. Dave N. [bylaw offices] is aware of the issues here. Sometimes if he sees a window for an owner to voluntarily take action (even when we have no legal authority) he sometimes prevails upon a landowner to take action. Not sure if this is the case here.

First off, Mel, s.22

I'm hoping this time around we can get somewhere with this piece of property next to me.

I've contacted Mr. Stone and Mr. Rothenburger a year or two ago, but not much came out of those communications. I've been told that s.22 has been able to get something done about the property in the past through the federal government so I'm adding her into the discussion as well.

Attached is the land title from the piece of property with the address of s.22 in Pritchard. As it states, s.22 s.22 is the administrator of the estate of s.22 who passed away I gather a year before we bought our property at s.22 s.22

The problems I've run into are this: 1. s.22 no longer lives at the address listed in the title. 2. none of his family are willing to talk to me about the situation. 3. I gather from talking to the community out here and those who knew s.2 that s.2 was s.22 has no ties to his extended family here. I also gather from those out here (uncorroborated that is) that he currently resides in s.22 down on the coast s.22 I've spoken to my RCMP s.2 as well as a realtor friend of mine and they both tell me that this title does not name s.22 as the owner. He is listed only as an administrator, as in the guy who is supposed to decide who gets what. For whatever reason, this has not been done, as the property sits vacant, decaying and severely overgrown. It's getting to the point where I am very concerned about the fire risks it poses to my house and those of my neighbours. This is most concerning in the spring and fall as the grass dries out and can burn very easily. It also creates quite the breeding ground for mice and other rodents, which attracts a lot of predators, stray cats, and causes them all to seek warmer locations when the cool weather hits (our house namely).

Something needs to be done about it. One of my neighbours and I are willing to do the cleaning ourselves, but we are wary of the legalities that this might pose. What would be nice is if this property would be able to come out of it's apparent limbo and be purchased by myself, a neighbour or new owner.

I would love to see the entire thing cleaned up and the trailer removed, but that may be an impossible task.

Any of you able to help? I know Mel said that the TNRD's unsightly premises bylaw does not apply to this case, but I personally think that is more TNRD just trying to wash it's hands free of the situation and not doing their job which is to manage the situation.

I thought I'd send this along as an addition to the note about patio fees which went to the Minister. I initially answered the question related to temporary extensions, but I think it might be useful to include the fees for a permanent patio addition as well so that Minister has the full scope of our fees for this item.

A patio can be added in a couple of different ways:

1. The first is a temporary extension – this is where a patio may already be built, and an applicant wants to expand it for an event. If the patio is part of a restaurant with a Food Primary (FP) licence, the fee is \$110. If the patio is part of an establishment with a Liquor Primary (LP) licence, the fee is \$330. The difference between the two is that local government must be involved in extending a LP licence.
2. If the establishment either doesn't have a patio, or would like to build onto one as a permanent addition, it's a structural application. Those are \$440, whether the establishment is either FP or LP.

If there is anything else you need, please let me know.

I hesitated on the briefing re our fees for structural (patio) applications as I wasn't sure what specific category they fall into.

I wanted to follow up because they are less than I thought: \$110 for a Food Primary and \$330 for a Liquor Primary.

As previously noted, the system can not run reports by type of complaint

or conduct being investigated, type of enforcement action or entity subject to enforcement action. Which companies were subject to compliance action over that time period, and how many times? Answered above.

What is the follow-up procedure to ensure that compliance action is followed?

The compliance and enforcement approach utilized is one of progressive enforcement, ranging from education to more formal sanctions. Security Programs Division has a number of Compliance and Enforcement inspectors in the province that follow up on compliance issues in the field.

Why are the specifics of an investigation and compliance action not releasable? What do you mean by “privacy reasons”? Are you referring to the privacy of the companies themselves?

Any investigation or enforcement action led by Security Programs Division in respect of an individual constitutes personal information under the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*. A formal Freedom of Information (FOI) request could be made if desired.

If a licensed security guard is found to have used unnecessary force, does that trigger a criminal investigation? Why or why not?

As the regulator of security workers and businesses, the Registrar, Security Services does not conduct criminal investigations. A citizen can make a complaint to the police about a use of force incident, and the police will determine whether criminal investigation is warranted in the circumstances.

Staff have provided the following on liquor and movie theatres.

- Historically, the Liquor Control and Licensing Act required the primary purpose of a liquor-primary establishment to be “beverage service, entertainment or hospitality” and specifically prohibited granting a liquor-primary licence to a number of establishments including a (movie) theatre as defined in the Motion Picture Act
- As of January 23, 2017, any business may apply for a liquor-primary licence, including movie theatres
- Currently, movie theatre policy permits minors in the lobby only or in theatre seating areas that are not serving liquor
- A key consideration with this policy has always been that entertainment offered by movie theatres generally attracts a large number of youth, meaning these establishments are often frequented by minors
- The rationale for this restriction is because unlike most venues which are well lit during liquor service, movie theatres are dark. This makes it difficult for staff to check identification and monitor and control the consumption of liquor during the movie
- The restriction around minors in movie theatres is imposed by the General Manager through the terms and conditions of the licence; any change to this policy could be accomplished by amending the terms and conditions
