- * Such as:
- a) Submitted ballots that represent persons with rights to vote- but that have chosen to not vote- with their ballots marked without their consent (by other person(s)) and submitted to Elections BC without their consent (by other persons);
- b) Submitted ballots that represent persons with rights to vote, but that do not indicate what these persons actually voted, because these ballots have been intercepted before being received by Elections BC- and "replaced" with ballots

indicating the opposite of what the person named on the ballot actually voted...

- 2) If recount(s) and or court verification of the Referendum results are needed, what procedures and safeguards will be used (previous to, during, and after voting) to ensure that recounts and court evaluations of ballots can occur and be properly conducted- based on verifiable facts (Bona-fide ballots)??
- 3) What are the reasons why the NDP have decided that the referendum is not to be conducted simultaneously with the upcoming BC municipal civic elections (on October 20-2018)??
- **4)** How is the use of a mail in ballot process justifiable, considering that it will be far more likely to be subject to malfeasance than the customary way most BCers vote: at the ballot box??

The reporter has several questions concerning the cannabis eligibility news release that was issued this afternoon. He would like to know:

- 1) Private cannabis stores have recently opened up on First Nation land near Chilliwack. What is the ministry's reaction to these stores opening early?
- 2) Will the same stores be allowed to apply for a licence once the application process begins?

Background

Recommendation - provide information on background

Private cannabis stores have recently opened up on First Nation land near Chilliwack. What is the ministry's reaction to these stores opening early?

Any cannabis retail store currently operating is illegal. It is up to local law enforcement authorities to decide whether to take action against these stores. Upon legalization, existing dispensaries will have to close, unless they obtain a licence from LCRB. However, unlicensed retailers won't be shut down overnight. We anticipate that as more legal retail stores open up across the province, enforcement activity will ramp up against illegal dispensaries that continue to operate.

A new Community Safety Unit, within the Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General, will have the authority to deal with all illegal sales outside the provincial regulatory framework. Cannabis enforcement officers will be able to enter illegal cannabis retailers without a warrant, and will be able to seize illegal product and records. They will also have the authority to impose administrative monetary penalties based on the value of illegal cannabis.

Will the same stores be allowed to apply for a licence once the application process begins?

Having operated an illegal dispensary will not, on its own, exclude applicants from being considered for a licence. All applicants will be assessed using the same evaluation criteria, including rigorous background checks and local government support. Persons who have operated dispensaries prior to legalization will not receive preferential treatment in the provincial application process.

Thank you for your questions regarding mail-in ballots for the 2018 Referendum on Electoral Reform.

Elections BC is dedicated to providing a transparent and secure voting process for British Columbians that protects the privacy of the voter and the secrecy of their ballot. Conducting referenda using mail-in ballots allows Elections BC to provide an efficient, transparent, and accessible voting experience for all eligible British Columbians.

Bill 6, given Royal Assent by the Legislative Assembly during the fall of 2017, determined voting for the 2018 Referendum on Electoral Reform would be conducted by mail-in ballot. This process was developed further in the regulation to the *Electoral Reform Referendum 2018 Act*. The voting package return period between October 22 and November 30 for the referendum provides voters with an extended voting period to receive and complete their voting packages, and participate in the democratic process. The recent 2015 Metro Vancouver Transportation and Transit Plebiscite and the 2011 HST Referendum were also conducted by mail-in ballot.

While Bill 6 was being debated in the Legislative Assembly, the Attorney General stated that the reason government chose to conduct the referendum by mail and not in conjunction with the municipal elections was to encourage voter turnout.

Elections BC's ballot package design includes safeguards to ensure that a ballot package cannot be completed or submitted by a third-party. The certification envelope containing the returned ballot includes a shared secret – the day, month and year of birth of the voter. This must be provided by the voter along with their signed certification that they are the voter named on the envelope and have not voted previously in the referendum. If a voting package is returned without this field being completed correctly, or without the signed declaration, the voting package will remain unopened. This approach was used successfully during the 2011 HST Referendum and the 2015 Metro Vancouver Transportation and Transit Plebiscite. Further, it is an offence under the *Electoral Reform Referendum 2018 Regulation* for an individual to vote when not entitled to or in another individual's name, subject to significant penalties on conviction.

Voters can mail completed ballot packages directly to Elections BC, or securely deposit them at Referendum Service Offices, or Service BC offices throughout the province. Both of these methods minimize any potential risk of a ballot package being tampered with while enroute to Elections BC. As I am sure you are also aware, tampering with mail sent via the Canada Post Corporation is a federal criminal offence, and Canada Post has established robust procedures and checks to prevent mail tampering. Further, during preparations for counting, ballots are considered based on a set of regulated criteria. Any ballots that physically differ from the official ballots provided for the referendum will not proceed to counting.

As an additional safeguard, official referendum ballots are produced on specialized printers that permits them to be read successfully during counting. A counterfeit ballot would not meet these parameters, which would result in intervention by Elections BC referendum staff.

All of the original ballots received by Elections BC during the 2018 Referendum on Electoral Reform, as well as the opened, unopened or resealed certification envelopes and secrecy sleeves will be securely stored for a retention period of one year. If a recount or court verification were required, the original ballots would be used.

Thank you for your questions regarding mail-in ballots for the 2018 Referendum on Electoral Reform.

Elections BC is dedicated to providing a transparent and secure voting process for British Columbians that protects the privacy of the voter and the secrecy of their ballot. Conducting referenda using mail-in ballots allows Elections BC to provide an efficient, transparent, and accessible voting experience for all eligible British Columbians.

Bill 6, given Royal Assent by the Legislative Assembly during the fall of 2017, determined voting for the 2018 Referendum on Electoral Reform would be conducted by mail-in ballot. This process was developed further in the regulation to the *Electoral Reform Referendum 2018 Act*. The voting package

return period between October 22 and November 30 for the referendum provides voters with an extended voting period to receive and complete their voting packages, and participate in the democratic process. The recent 2015 Metro Vancouver Transportation and Transit Plebiscite and the 2011 HST Referendum were also conducted by mail-in ballot.

While Bill 6 was being debated in the Legislative Assembly, the Attorney General stated that the reason government chose to conduct the referendum by mail and not in conjunction with the municipal elections was to encourage voter turnout.

Elections BC's ballot package design includes safeguards to ensure that a ballot package cannot be completed or submitted by a third-party. The certification envelope containing the returned ballot includes a shared secret – the day, month and year of birth of the voter. This must be provided by the voter along with their signed certification that they are the voter named on the envelope and have not voted previously in the referendum. If a voting package is returned without this field being completed correctly, or without the signed declaration, the voting package will remain unopened. This approach was used successfully during the 2011 HST Referendum and the 2015 Metro Vancouver Transportation and Transit Plebiscite. Further, it is an offence under the *Electoral Reform Referendum 2018 Regulation* for an individual to vote when not entitled to or in another individual's name, subject to significant penalties on conviction.

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As an additional safeguard, official referendum ballots are produced on specialized printers that permits them to be read successfully during counting. A counterfeit ballot would not meet these parameters, which would result in intervention by Elections BC referendum staff.

All of the original ballots received by Elections BC during the 2018 Referendum on Electoral Reform, as well as the opened, unopened or resealed certification envelopes and secrecy sleeves will be securely stored for a retention period of one year. If a recount or court verification were required, the original ballots would be used.

Dear Attorney General Eby and Ms. Mulligan:

Thank you once again for taking some time to meet with me during the CASHRA conference in Yukon a few weeks ago. I appreciated the opportunity to provide you with some insights on the important role of human rights commissions in a direct-access human rights complaints system. I am encouraged that BC will be part of ongoing initiatives to better implement and coordinate human rights protection across Canada, including at the CASHRA table. I am also encouraged that you are contemplating inclusion of promotion and inquiry functions within the Commission's governing statute.

I am writing today to follow up on our conversation about enforcement powers. As I mentioned, the Ontario Human Rights Commission (OHRC) has the power to both intervene in matters before the Human Rights Tribunal of Ontario (HRTO), and file "Commission-initiated" applications at the HRTO. I understand that you had some concerns about the new Commission becoming overly reliant on the use of such powers at the expense of its promotion role. From my perspective, however, these powers have been essential to ensuring compliance with recommendations and also in situations of persistent systemic discrimination that are not amenable to individual complaints or proactive resolution by respondents.

I am providing a few examples below to give you a sense of how the OHRC has managed to both judiciously and effectively use its enforcement powers.

- Talos v. Grand Erie Board of Education re: loss of benefits for workers aged 65 and over (see attached facta and the decision here: https://www.canlii.org/en/on/onhrt/doc/2018/2018hrto680/2018hrto680.html? resultIndex=7)
- Jahn v. Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services re: use of solitary confinement on people with mental health disabilities) (see HRTO Order on consent here: https://www.canlii.org/en/on/onhrt/doc/2018/2018hrto60/2018hrto60.html? autocompleteStr=2018%20hrto%2060&autocompletePos=1)

I trust this is helpful. I look forward to continuing to assist to strengthen BC's human rights system.

As Elections BC is a non-partisan Office of the Legislature, I cannot speak to the determinations made by the Attorney General. I would suggest you contact that Ministry if you would like further information regarding Bill 6.

I can provide you with some basic information on voter participation from recent voteby-mail events as well as the 2014 local general elections.

As mentioned in my last email, Elections BC conducted both the 2015 Metro Vancouver Transportation and Transit Plebiscite and the 2011 HST Referendum by mail-in ballot. The 2011 referendum saw a turnout of 52.66% of registered voters, with 1,613,102 of the 3,063,170 voting packages mailed-out being considered at the close of voting. During the 2015 plebiscite a similar proportion of registered voters in the Metro Vancouver area voted with a final turnout of 48.62%.

Many of the municipal and local governments report voter turnout on CivicInfo BC. The jurisdictions reporting ballots cast in the 2014 local general elections, captured on CivicInfo, averaged a 33.5% voter turnout, with the city of Surrey receiving a 31.55% turnout.

Thank you for your questions regarding mail-in ballots for the 2018 Referendum on Electoral Reform.

Elections BC is dedicated to providing a transparent and secure voting process for British Columbians that protects the privacy of the voter and the secrecy of their ballot. Conducting referenda using mail-in ballots allows Elections BC to provide an efficient, transparent, and accessible voting experience for all eligible British Columbians.

Bill 6, given Royal Assent by the Legislative Assembly during the fall of 2017, determined voting for the 2018 Referendum on Electoral Reform would be conducted by mail-in ballot. This process was developed further in the regulation to the *Electoral Reform Referendum 2018 Act*. The voting package return period between October 22 and November 30 for the referendum

provides voters with an extended voting period to receive and complete their voting packages, and participate in the democratic process. The recent 2015 Metro Vancouver Transportation and Transit Plebiscite and the 2011 HST Referendum were also conducted by mail-in ballot.

While Bill 6 was being debated in the Legislative Assembly, the Attorney General stated that the reason government chose to conduct the referendum by mail and not in conjunction with the municipal elections was to encourage voter turnout.

Elections BC's ballot package design includes safeguards to ensure that a ballot package cannot be completed or submitted by a third-party. The certification envelope containing the returned ballot includes a shared secret – the day, month and year of birth of the voter. This must be provided by the voter along with their signed certification that they are the voter named on the envelope and have not voted previously in the referendum. If a voting package is returned without this field being completed correctly, or without the signed declaration, the voting package will remain unopened. This approach was used successfully during the 2011 HST Referendum and the 2015 Metro Vancouver Transportation and Transit Plebiscite. Further, it is an offence under the *Electoral Reform Referendum 2018 Regulation* for an individual to vote when not entitled to or in another individual's name, subject to significant penalties on conviction.

Voters can mail completed ballot packages directly to Elections BC, or securely deposit them at Referendum Service Offices, or Service BC offices throughout the province. Both of these methods minimize any potential risk of a ballot package being tampered with while enroute to Elections BC. As I am sure you are also aware, tampering with mail sent via the Canada Post Corporation is a federal criminal offence, and Canada Post has established robust procedures and checks to prevent mail tampering. Further, during preparations for counting, ballots are considered based on a set of regulated criteria. Any ballots that physically differ from the official ballots provided for the referendum will not proceed to counting.

As an additional safeguard, official referendum ballots are produced on specialized printers that permits them to be read successfully during counting. A counterfeit ballot would not meet these parameters, which would result in intervention by Elections BC referendum staff.

All of the original ballots received by Elections BC during the 2018 Referendum on Electoral Reform, as well as the opened, unopened or resealed certification envelopes and secrecy sleeves will be securely stored for a retention period of one year. If a recount or court verification were required, the original ballots would be used.

The reporter is writing an article on the MOU recently announced between Canopy Growth and the BC LDB. Questions below. The reporter will accept background information.

Recommendation - provide information on background

- 1) Why Canopy?
 - The LDB is committed to being as inclusive of as many licensed producers (LPs) as possible, and will engage with any federally licensed producer that is able to provide appropriate supply of quality cannabis product.
 - All LPs that the LDB entered into MOUs with demonstrated that they could provide appropriate supply of cannabis product at the time of legalization, and were subject to the same negotiations and criteria.
- 2) What boxes needed to be checked in establishing a partnership of this kind (i.e. what were the criteria that were non-negotiable for Minister Eby)?
 - In order to engage with the LDB as a supplier of non-medical cannabis, licensed producers were required to hold a cultivation licence, with intent to secure a sales licence prior to legalization, and be able to demonstrate product availability, assortment, and pricing that fit into the LDB's model to meet the needs of the B.C retail market.
- 3) There have been concerns that there will be a run on cannabis as soon as legalization occurs, resulting in an inability of LPs to keep up with demand in the months following Oct. 17th. Is this a concern for the AG's office? And was this a consideration in establishing the partnership with Canopy?
 - The LDB is planning to procure cannabis product in three month increments based on the number of retail stores that are anticipated to be operating at the time of legalization.
 - The LDB will continually update its forecasting and work with LPs across B.C. and Canada to ensure there is adequate supply to meet the needs of the province and will replenish as necessary.
- 4) Dozens of small-to-medium-sized (still illicit) cannabis producers have been frustrated by a lack of any kind of framework to enter into

legal distribution in B.C./Canada. While this process is not the purview of AG Eby's office, these growers are his constituents, and fear that favouring large-scale LPs like Canopy will both fail to take advantage of the economic diversity provided by smaller cannabis producers who can offer "artisanal" products and services, and have the knock-on effect of perpetuating black market sales within communities of consumers who might shy away from purchasing cannabis from large corporations. Moreover, they say the framework for market entry -- managed by Health Canada -- is simply unfair, in terms of its disposition to the success of big business. Does Attorney General Eby have a plan for these smaller producers? Or to lobby Health Canada to create more robust channels for their participation in the legal cannabis market?

- During consultations with the Government of Canada, B.C. requested they consider a micro-cultivation license within their proposed legislation to facilitate the participation of small-scale producers in the legal cannabis industry.
- In March, the federal government released a series of regulatory proposals that includes:
 - A micro-cultivation licence that will authorize the cultivation of a plant canopy area no more than 200 square metres (approximately 2,150 square feet); and
 - A micro-processing licence that will authorize the processing of no more than 600 kilograms of dried cannabis (or equivalent) per year, or the entire output of a single micro-cultivation licence.
- Micro-processors can engage with the LDB the same way as any licensed producer, as long as they hold the relevant federal licences.
- The LDB is committed to an open market and will continually review its product assortment going forward and beyond legalization to be as inclusive of any licensed producer, both big and small.
- The LDB has developed its product assortment with the key aim of being as competitive with the illicit market as possible. The strains available to retailers and online customers range in quality, from value to ultra-premium, all at competitive prices.
- 5) There is some concern amongst small-scale cannabis producers that the current licensing channel for cannabis microprocessors forces them into agreements with companies like Canopy by requiring that they have a full-time staff member with a masters

degree in chemistry. For many small growers, this is an expense they can't afford, and they feel as though their only option is to enter into an agreement with an LP as a wholesaler, limiting their ability to grow, and/or profit in a meaningful way from their current production.

- This question should be referred to the federal government.
- 6) I've heard from some of those growers who feel it's unusual for a provincial government to announce partnerships with such large business interests in an emerging market when a clear pathway to that same market for small business (which comprises more than half private sector employment in BC) has not yet been made clear. They've also pointed out that some of the LPs on the list supplied by the BCLDB do not yet have distribution licenses.
 - The MOUs announced yesterday form the basis for supplier agreements which will be conditional on the producer having all the licenses required in place before we purchase product.
 - The LDB would have signed an MOU where we had reason to believe the producer would have that in place before go-live.
 If the applicable licenses are not in place, we will not buy product.
 - The LDB has entered into agreements with both large and small producers, from across the country to ensure equal opportunity for all licensed producers to enter the retail market.

In September of 2017, the Province (represented by the ministries of Attorney General and Public Safety and Solicitor General) signed the attached Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Aboriginal Justice Council (AJC) to jointly develop an Indigenous Justice Strategy (IJS) in recognition that improvements need to be made to the way in which the justice system interacts with Indigenous people. The MOU set a 2 year time frame to develop the strategy and plan for its implementation. Under the MOU, government provided the AJC with \$400,000 in capacity funding to assist their participation in the development of the strategy.

The focus of the strategy is to be as follows:

- <!--[if !supportLists]-->1. <!--[endif]-->Reconciliation with Indigenous people;
- <!--[if !supportLists]-->2. <!--[endif]-->Decreasing the overrepresentation of Indigenous people in the justice system;

- <!--[if !supportLists]-->4. <!--[endif]-->Addressing violence against Indigenous people, especially women and girls;
- <!--[if !supportLists]-->5. <!--[endif]--

- >Engagement with Indigenous communities and organizations in a respectful and culturally appropriate manner;
- <!--[if !supportLists]-->6. <!--[endif]-->Improved access to justice services by Indigenous people; and,
- <!--[if !supportLists]-->7. <!--[endif]-->Designing services that provide Indigenous people with culturally relevant, flexible and user-focused processes.

The parties also recognized that movement on some items were more urgent, so the MOU identifies that actions to improve justice system outcomes for Indigenous people need to be taken prior to the finalization of the IJS. Given that recognition, the parties have agreed on the following priority action areas.

- 1. Development of the Indigenous Justice Strategy (overarching initiative)
- 2. Indigenous Justice Centres
- 3. Gladue
- 4. Diversion/Alternatives to Criminal, Youth, Family Courts
- 5. Reduce Administration of Justice Charges, Sentences, Jail Time
- 6. First Nations Courts Expansion
- 7. Develop Incarceration Supports for Indigenous Prisoners/Families

With respect specifically to Gladue – the issue is being addressed on multiple fronts.

- Government has increased funding this fiscal year to LSS to allow them to increase the number of Gladue reports they can produce. Last year they were able to produce 131 reports; the target for this fiscal is 250 300 which is an increase of approximately 100% over the previous year. The money LSS has received is not a specific amount for Gladue reports, rather it is a broader envelope of funding within which there is funding for more reports.
- In addition, government has allocated \$700,000 this year to engage the AJC and justice system partners in

business process mapping of the current process, policy development, and explorations of options to assist advocates or others in identifying Gladue information for the court.

It is a key principle in the Indigenous Justice Strategy to effect justice system change in partnership with Indigenous people. We have increased funding to improve the existing system while we work with Indigenous people and organizations to improve over the medium and longer term.

In the spirit of reconciliation and improving the experiences of Indigenous people with the justice system, government is working diligently with our Indigenous partners to address the issues that are agreed priorities.

LDB employees have expressed concerns about recent media reports where business people remotely connected to cannabis are being turned back, or banned from entering the United States. Many are turning to managers and seniors leaders for guidance on how to disclose their employer information if asked. LDB executive has been in discussions with the Cannabis Secretariat and AG's Ministry and learned other arms of government are facing similar issues.

LDB has prepared the employee message (below) and key messages for external use, in response to Executive Management Committee feedback. Please review for concerns. LDB would like to distribute to employees tomorrow (Wednesday). It has been approved by LDB and Cannabis Secretariat and is also with PSSG MO for review.

EMPLOYEE MESSAGE

Good morning,

Over the past several days and weeks there have been reports in the media about people who work in the cannabis industry – directly and indirectly – facing problems or barriers as they cross the border from Canada into the United States (US). Despite the pending legalization of non-medical cannabis in Canada, and its legal status in states such as Washington and Colorado, cannabis remains an illegal substance federally in the United States.

The incidents reported in the media and their potential repercussions are of significant concern to us at the LDB. Many of us are traveling to the US with our families this

summer, or enjoy shopping south of the border on a regular basis, and want to continue doing so while feeling safe and secure.

Representatives from the provincial government have escalated their concerns to the appropriate representatives of the federal government. The Government of Canada is currently in discussions with its U.S. counterparts on these matters. We will keep you updated as information becomes available as we continue working to add cannabis to our line of business.

Great Canadian sent the reporter a statement over the weekend stating that they did not register the partnership as it did not require registration with GPEB or any other BC-related gaming regulatory body. However, during the reporter's interview with Minister Eby on Friday, the minister said that there are no exceptions in cases like this and any business or investments made by Great Canadian should have been registered and vetted.

The reporter would like a comment or statement from Minister Eby on what he thinks of this recent update.

Background

REQUEST:

Sam Cooper is publishing a story next week on how the Great Canadian Gaming Corporation might not have properly registered a partnership for vetting with its casino cruise in Asia. Great Canadian allegedly partnered with Cheng Yu-Tung on a casino cruise in 2001. However, there are no records showing that Great Canadian partnered with Cheng or that this was registered for the regular vetting process for "suitable partners" tied to BCLC. In response, Global is putting together a TV version of the story that would air the same day Sam's story publishes (either Monday or Tuesday).

The reporter would like to schedule a pre-taped on-camera interview with Minister Eby tomorrow to discuss Sam's story and potential actions the minister might take in response. The interview would be 5-8 minutes long. The reporter is available to conduct the interview any time tomorrow between 11 a.m. and 4 p.m. Global is able to send a camera to the minister's location.

The exact quotes from the minister that the reporter is referencing is: "It's critically important that the regulator have a full set of information in order to be able to do the job of ensuring there's no affiliation with people involved in organized crime or in shady dealing. <u>Any service provider</u>, whether its Great Canadian or anyone else, <u>needs to register all business dealings with the regulator</u> so they can be checked out."

GPEB advises that the section in red incorrect – service providers typically only report substantial business dealings that relate to gaming. Many businesses have both gaming and non-gaming interests.

Recommendation – provide statement from Minister David Eby

"For clarification, any service provider needs to notify the Gaming Policy and Enforcement Branch (GPEB) of any gambling-related business that may have a material impact on gambling services within B.C. The case in question is from more than 15 years ago, before the Gaming Control Act was enacted in 2002. Today, all companies that operate in the gambling industry within B.C. must be registered by GPEB, without exception. GPEB does not have legal authority to register companies that are not conducting gambling business in B.C."

"Regulation drafting is underway. As part of the process, we are consulting key stakeholders, including medical professionals.

"I have met with the Trial Lawyers Association of BC to discuss their recommendations and, in doing so, I re-confirmed government's stated intention to narrow the definition of minor injury (recommendation #2). Hi Derrick,

This has come to a positive resolution. ICBC's Director of Driver Licensing Customer Service has now talked to the customer and the conversation went very well. She said that she understands that mistakes happen and appreciated that ICBC reached out to her directly and provided an apology and an explanation. ICBC let her know that they will going to express courier her photo cards to her and follow up to ensure they have arrived.

For reference, here is more background info and a summary of the issue from ICBC. They are also preparing an issues note, which we will share once ready.

Background:

• Digital photo images taken at DLOs are key in helping us establish

- the identity of our customers.
- In addition to ICBC, public agencies such as law enforcement and airports, thousands of private businesses rely on the security features and integrity of the information that appears on our photo cards
- ICBC's policy when capturing images is to balance complying with regulatory provisions and respecting individual rights.
- As one of our security features we use facial recognition technology to aid in reducing identity fraud and theft and enhance security for our photo cards. Headwear in some cases can interfere with the effectiveness of facial recognition technology.
- ICBC affirms our customers' right to accommodation regarding their religious expression.
- Human Rights precedent has defined that applicants may wear head covering that does not interfere with FRT as long as it is worn in conjunction with religious practice, or is needed as a result of medical treatment.

Summary of issue:

- The customer visited the **s.22** on June 29 to renew her driver's licence and BC Services card.
- She was wearing a hijab. The Customer Service Representative (CRS) asked it was being worn for religious reason and the customer said yes.
- If the customer is wearing head covering that is unfamiliar the procedure is for the CRS to take the photo and ask additional clarifying questions.
- During this process the CSR started to complete an online form that is used when the headwear is unfamiliar.
- When "Head Covering" is clicked online it prompts the CSR to ask three specific questions:
 - `What is your religion or religious belief?
 - What is the religious significance of your head covering?
 - What religious obstacle or consequence will flow from a requirement that you be photographed without your religious head covering?
- In this case, the CSR selected "Other" and therefore did not prompt the 3 questions, however the CRS did ask the customer if the head covering worn was for religious purposes, the customer confirmed this was the case and the CSR noted this in two DL note systems and

on the web form.

- The form triggered a review by ICBC's Driver Licensing Integrity &
 Oversight department who then sent the customer a letter asking
 that she come into a driver licensing office to complete the
 questions.
- That was done and is where the customer raised this issue.
- The use of the DL photo with the headwear was approved.
- ICBC's Director of Driver Licensing Customer Service will be contacting and apologizing to the customer today and informing her that her DL photo has been approved.
- ICBC is reviewing the procedures for clarity for all employees serving customers wearing head covering that may be associated with religious belief.

The ministry does not track how many Gladue reports are requested province wide. The Legal Services Society is the primary agency that funds the preparation of Gladue reports and could likely respond to the question as to how many requests they have received and processed for funding.

Prior to 2018, the funding that the Legal Services Society (LSS) has had for the
preparation of Gladue reports for legal aid clients was provided by the Law
Foundation. Until this year, LSS has worked to produce the number of Gladue
reports that its budget could allow. Moving forward, government has
supplemented that funding. We increased capacity to produce 250-300 formal
Gladue reports during the 2018/19 fiscal year, an increase of approximately
100% from the number that LSS was able to produce in 2017/18.

The producer would like to know B.C.'s policy on importing beer from Alberta. The producer has spoken with several Alberta breweries who say it's difficult to get their products on B.C. shelves.

Background – We have received similar requests in the past and used the below response. LDB confirmed that it is still accurate.

Recommendation – Provide background

- All manufacturers that wish to sell their product in British Columbia must have it registered with the Liquor Distribution Branch (LDB). More information about the product registration process can be found here.
- Once a product is registered with the LDB, it is available for purchase via wholesale by individual Licensee Retail Stores (private liquor stores) or government BC Liquor Stores if they choose to do so.
- The LDB is not involved in the purchasing decisions made by private liquor stores on which products they choose to buy.
- Category managers for BC Liquor Stores decide which products government retail stores will sell. Manufacturers that wish to have their product sold in BC Liquor Stores must submit a listing application. Here's the process:
 - Manufacturer/agent submits listing application
 - Application is assessed based on a number of factors, including:
 - Does the product add anything to the selection we currently carry in that category

- Does it align with what our customers are looking for
- Quality, value, accolades, market demand
- New or niche product
- Packaging and format appropriate for style
- Reliability of supply and supplier performance
- Adherence to LDB corporate social responsibility standards
- Category manager makes a recommendation
- Director of merchandising reviews the recommendation
- Applicant is notified via a letter approving or denying the application with a brief explanation
- We also have a local market program whereby store managers are allowed to select a small assortment of craft beer that they feel is representative of their region/community.
- There is no cost to apply for product registration or listing with the LDB, nor does the criteria for approval change based on where it originates.
