Hello,

My animal welfare legislative proposal is based from s.22
s.22

s.22 has kindly provided me a draft of their 20 page legislative proposal last summer. This is drafted in partnership with all parties. This can be the basis of my legislative proposal.

My own research has calculated there are over 6 million dogs killed in shelters and owner-directed. Though British Columbia does not see such high kills (for example, just one rescue in Kern County, CA, killed over 30,000 dogs in 2017. The numbers in our province are considerably much lower, but the suffering of dogs is still measurable on both numbers and emotionally. And needlessly.

=====

Essentially, animal welfare in British Columbia could be improved and expanded:

1. Mandatory spay and neuter of all dogs, except for legitimate breeders. Costs of owning a pet should be considered before adopting one. There is no reason to have an intact dog other than to breed them.

2. License all breeders, regardless. Facility inspections. Complaint process.

3. Require owners, when licensing their dogs, to take a (proposed) online dog/pet ownership test (yearly or bi-yearly). This would be an easy test which reviews the do's and don'ts of owning a dog. Care and custody. Basic training tips/questions. How to spot animal abuse and backyard breeders. Spotting animal abuse. Supervision of dogs and children. Watching for signs of stress...critics will complain about the costs, small fees, burden...but the reality is that owning any dog requires responsible and moral ownership...as you have read often in the news, some dogs poorly trained or neglected by owners have attacked people and other dogs. Giving people basic tests will help to reinforce responsibility...reduce the amount of dog attacks through responsible and cognizant ownership...and improve society's perspective on healthy dog ownership...we require people to go through extensive graduated driver licensing, yet dogs have the potential to adversely affect people and social opinions whenever there is a dog attack.

4. All dogs to be microchipped (within 6 months of ownership) so the entire history of the dog can be traced...so any signs of abuse can be traced historically...and animal abusers can be put on a watchlist (similar to the FBI now placing all animal abusers on their watchlist as of 2017):

5. Rescue organizations to register and pay a scaled annual licensing fee. Because a rescue in Vancouver often transports their adopted rescues to families throughout British Columbia and into the other Canadian provinces. A majority of rescued dogs come from outside of Canada. So a microchipped dog adopted from a licensed rescue in British Columbia can be traced, in the event there is abuse/neglect resulting.

6. Educate...Dogs may be animals, but studies are showing they possess a complex nervous system. They experience base emotions. They possess emotional status. They experience pain.

7. Educating elementary children. Studies consistently prove that increasing both social and animal awareness in children at a young age not only prevents animal abuse, but also reduces the percentage of those (potential) animal abusers from turning to domestic violence. I suggest between the grades of 5 - 7.

With empathy and education, we can improve our societal perspective that dogs (and cats) are more than a commodity to buy from Craigslist. It's recognizing that we are responsible for each dog. These are simple and yet can vastly improve our overall perception of interactions.

She is well-known in Hollywood for being one of the first, in the 1990's, to go (accompanied by police) into gang neighborhoods in LA, to rescue pitbulls from dog fighting rings. Dear Mr. Belenkie,

In regards to the below request that was sent to us by the City of Chilliwack, there is no type of

liquor licence that allows self-service liquor nor can liquor be purchased under an honour system. Should you wish to offer liquor service at the municipal hall, the Village of Belcarra may apply for a liquor primary licence in order to offer liquor service as follows:

- Liquor may only be available from a dedicated service area that is staffed whenever liquor service is available;
- A variety of hot or cold snacks, pre-made or made on-site, must be available at all times liquor service is available;
- Liquor must be locked up, regardless if the floor is locked or not, when liquor service is not available;
- Minimum price standards require beer to be sold at \$0.25 per ounce or \$3 per 355 ml can or \$3 per 12 ounce bottle.

Dear Mr. Belenkie,

In regards to the below request that was sent to us by the City of Chilliwack, there is no type of liquor licence that allows self-service liquor nor can liquor be purchased under an honour system. Should you wish to offer liquor service at the municipal hall, the Village of Belcarra may apply for a liquor primary licence in order to offer liquor service as follows:

- Liquor may only be available from a dedicated service area that is staffed whenever liquor service is available;
- A variety of hot or cold snacks, pre-made or made on-site, must be available at all times liquor service is available;
- Liquor must be locked up, regardless if the floor is locked or not, when liquor service is not available;
- Minimum price standards require beer to be sold at \$0.25 per ounce or \$3 per 355 ml can or \$3 per 12 ounce bottle.

Essentially, animal welfare in British Columbia could be improved and expanded:

1. Mandatory spay and neuter of all dogs, except for legitimate breeders. Costs of owning a pet should be considered before adopting one. There is no reason to have an intact dog other than to breed them.
2. License all breeders, regardless. Facility inspections. Complaint process.
3. Require owners, when licensing their dogs, to take a (proposed) online dog/pet ownership test (yearly or bi-yearly). This would be an easy test which reviews the do's and don'ts of owning a dog. Care and custody. Basic training tips/questions. How to spot animal abuse and backyard breeders. Spotting animal abuse. Supervision of dogs and children. Watching for signs of stress...critics will complain about the costs, small fees, burden...but the reality is that owning any dog requires responsible and moral ownership...as you have read often in the news, some dogs poorly trained or neglected by owners have attacked people and other dogs. Studies consistently prove that increasing both social and animal awareness in children at a young age not only prevents animal abuse, but also reduces the percentage of those (potential) animal abusers from turning to domestic violence. I suggest between the grades of 5 - 7.







Dear Mr. Belenkie,

In regards to the below request that was sent to us by the City of Chilliwack, there is no type of liquor licence that allows self-service liquor nor can liquor be purchased under an honour system. Should you wish to offer liquor service at the municipal hall, the Village of Belcarra may apply for a liquor primary licence in order to offer liquor service as follows:

- Liquor may only be available from a dedicated service area that is staffed whenever liquor

service is available;

- A variety of hot or cold snacks, pre-made or made on-site, must be available at all times liquor service is available;
- Liquor must be locked up, regardless if the floor is locked or not, when liquor service is not available;
- Minimum price standards require beer to be sold at \$0.25 per ounce or \$3 per 355 ml can or \$3 per 12 ounce bottle.

Good afternoon,

Attached is a consent form from our constituent, s.22 who is having issues with an ICBC claim. s.22 fell behind her ICBC payment and as of March 22, 2018 owed s.22. s.22 spoke to the credit department and made them aware of her situation and they gave her 60 days to pay s.22. Unfortunately now the total is s.22 with interest. She has been in contact with Ryan Wesnoski from ICBC. She is a senior within our constituency and has been unable to come with a loan to pay for this ICBC claim.

We have been corresponding with our contact from ICBC, Debby Raffard. Debby explained that this type of debt is "refuse to issue" type debt, meaning it has to be paid in full before any transactions are allowed for insurance and/or driver's licences. ICBC's right to refuse insurance and driver's licence transactions is set out in legislation, found in Section 26 of the *Motor Vehicle Act* and Section 93.1 of the *Insurance (Vehicle) Act*.

When s.22 contacted ICBC Account Services on October 24, 2018 and spoke with the supervisor, Ryan, he advised her he could make an exception based on medical hardship. He explained he could authorize the renewal of her driver's licence for a down payment of 50 per cent of the debt, if she was able to provide a letter from her doctor stating she needed her driver's licence for medical reasons. The balance of the debt would need to be paid within 60 days. He further explained she would not be able to purchase any more insurance until the debt was paid in full. Although ICBC typically will not authorize any transactions until payment plan debt is paid in full, the supervisor was willing to make an exception for s.22 taking into consideration her situation.

Debby requested a further review by the manager of Account Services, to confirm that this is the best offer that can be extended to s.22 . However, s.22 is unhappy with what is being offered and would like to take further action. Is there a possibility that your office is able to aid her as ICBC falls under your jurisdiction?

He is aware we are not able to provide timelines for SPD process – this has been previously communicated to him. [*note: we were told that Mr. Raiser reached out to SPD (end of Nov) and heard from them as to where he is at in their process*]

The update below was provided to us by Jason. Let us know if you have any questions:

- Representatives from various BC Ministries and agencies, including ICBC, Health, CITZ, SDPR, Vital Stats and HIBC, most recently met on December 13 to continue discussions on identifying potential solutions for removing barriers to BC's secondary ID attestation processes for vulnerable citizens (e.g., homeless).
- Focusing on addressing identified barriers to obtaining secondary ID supports

the current BCSC program goals of encouraging all citizens that are physically able to attend a BC driver licensing office, including homeless and other vulnerable BC groups, to obtain a photo BC Services Card.

- Obtaining a photo BC credential helps support these more vulnerable individuals in accessing needed services and support (e.g., opening a bank account) and helps reduce the risk of impersonation fraud (e.g., health care access).
- Solutions are specifically being explored for the following identified barriers to the ICBC and SPRD secondary ID attestation processes:
 - ICBC and SDPR process attester requirements;
 - ICBC residential address requirements;
 - SDPR customer identity confirmation tools.
- Following the Dec 13 meeting, government representatives will review the identified barrier resolution options with their Ministry/agency folks and re-convene as a group in mid-January in an effort to build a set of consensus-based recommendations
- These recommendations will be compiled into a decision note for leadership review and support before sharing with BC's non-profit/advocacy groups (e.g., First United, Carnegie, Kettle Society) to ensure the recommended solutions effectively address the identified concerns
- Based on this feedback, the government partnership will either proceed with implementation activities or present an updated proposal to government to conduct a more comprehensive ID access review process for BC's vulnerable populations.

Hello Mr. Simons,

A few years ago the DMV revoked my driver's license because they found out I have sleep apnea. They took this action despite nothing in my driving history suggesting I have any trouble staying awake. In fact, during the ten years I worked as a s.22 I never fell asleep s.22 even when I was far from well-rested when beginning the trip. I also had no trouble staying awake during my recent s.22 The DMV claims that it treats every case on an individual basis, but that is clearly a lie as they never responded to my attempts to communicate with them.

Long story short - I have been using a borrowed CPAP machine for some time and, with the assistance of my doctor, finally got my license back just recently. As you can well imagine, I was stunned that I could lose my license for no good reason while even drunk drivers and people who cause fatal accidents can retain theirs. The problem now is that I am in an unacceptable relationship with the DMV. Their intention is to revoke my license again if they should discover I'm not using a CPAP machine on a regular basis. In addition, these machines cost thousands of dollars, which I cannot afford as SunLife only covers a small portion of that expense, and I'm being pressured to return my borrowed machine. I believe the DMV should have to pay for it if they insist on my using it, considering that there is nothing in my driving history to suggest I have any difficulty staying awake when I'm driving. Other than that, there are three significant points to consider:

1) Thousands of BC drivers have undiagnosed sleep apnea. Nevertheless, the DMV does not compel anyone to undergo a sleep test unless they have specific reason to suspect a driver does have sleep apnea. This normally occurs when the DMV receives a medical report from a doctor indicating the patient has this condition. The only way the doctor knows is due to being informed by the patient. I had a problem with chronic fatigue that I suspected might be the result of having sleep apnea, which my wife suspected I did have. So my doctor arranged a sleep test, which confirmed that I do have sleep apnea. But it also turned out that it wasn't the cause of my chronic fatigue, which disappeared after s.22 I explained this to the DMV in detail, but they didn't even acknowledge receipt of my communication, much less respond to it. Anyway, this selective enforcement is completely unacceptable, especially

considering that probably damn near everyone who snores has sleep apnea.

2) The notion that one should have to fear discussing health issues with one's doctor because it might lead to unjustified punishment in some auxiliary fashion is unacceptable. And even more unacceptable is the notion that one is being selectively punished due to providing voluntary information in a matter unrelated to the action of driving a vehicle.

3) When my license was first revoked, Mr. Simons apparently believed that having a form letter sent to me from the Minister of Justice, a letter that did not specifically address my complaint, constituted sufficient assistance from his office. It did not. In fact, I would like to personally meet with the Attorney General to discuss, among other things, the possibility that the DMV's behavior violates section 6 of the *Charter of Rights and Freedoms*, as it ruined my ability to continue receiving income as a professional driver. I would also like to learn how the DMV was ever permitted to abuse its power in this fashion, punishing safe drivers more severely than dangerous drivers are punished, even to the extent of repeated drunk driving offenders, for example, being allowed to retain their driving privileges, while a safe driver such as me has to spend the rest of his life worrying about losing his license again despite a pristine driving record.

Attached is a consent form from our constituent, **s.22** is having issues with an ICBC claim. **s.22** fell behind her ICBC payment and as of March 22, 2018 owed **s.22** spoke to the credit department and made them aware of her situation and they gave her 60 days to pay **s.22** Unfortunately now the total is **s.22** with interest. She has been in contact with Ryan Wesnoski from ICBC. She is a senior within our constituency and has been unable to come with a loan to pay for this ICBC claim.

We have been corresponding with our contact from ICBC, Debby Raffard. Debby explained that this type of debt is "refuse to issue" type debt, meaning it has to be paid in full before any transactions are allowed for insurance and/or driver's licences. ICBC's right to refuse insurance and driver's licence transactions is set out in legislation, found in Section 26 of the *Motor Vehicle Act* and Section 93.1 of the *Insurance (Vehicle) Act*.

When **s.22** contacted ICBC Account Services on October 24, 2018 and spoke with the

supervisor, Ryan, he advised her he could make an exception based on medical hardship. He explained he could authorize the renewal of her driver's licence for a down payment of 50 per cent of the debt, if she was able to provide a letter from her doctor stating she needed her driver's licence for medical reasons. The balance of the debt would need to be paid within 60 days. He further explained she would not be able to purchase any more insurance until the debt was paid in full. Although ICBC typically will not authorize any transactions until payment plan debt is paid in full, the supervisor was willing to make an exception for s.22 taking into consideration her situation.

Debby requested a further review by the manager of Account Services, to confirm that this is the best offer that can be extended to s.22. However, s.22 is unhappy with what is being offered and would like to take further action. Is there a possibility that your office is able to aid her as ICBC falls under your jurisdiction?

In retrospect, the questions we asked you were not clear enough due to the emotional toll I was under, as I explained to you. In any case, I would like to frame and pinpoint our questions more clearly here: we visited Mr. David Eby's office last Friday, hoping to see Mr. Eby as the Attorney General (*not an MLA for Point Grey) and to see if he can help to look into whether the Crown Counsel's office is looking into s.22 case, if yes, where they are at, and if not, why no? Would you be able to look into this for us, if not, can you make an appointment for us with Mr. Eby?

I would like to clarify that the purpose of our visit last Friday was NOT to complain about a specific police officer or police conducts in general to Mr. Eby: we knew there was a different channel for that complaint and was planning to pursue it. The focus of our visit to Mr. Eby's office was about the Crown Counsel following two appointments at Access Pro Bono. Specifically, after our first appointment with an Access Pro Bono lawyer on Dec 14, 2018, she called the Crown Counsel's office on Dec 17, 2018 and requested them to look into s.22 case, which they agreed; but during our second appointment with Access Pro Bono on Jan 11, 2019, the Crown Counsel's office informed the lawyer that they had zero information about s.22 case, not at all. This update from the Crown Counsel's office led us to Mr. Eby's office.

Therefore, we would appreciate very much if you can advise whether Mr. Eby's office can look into whether the Crown Counsel's office is, or will be, looking into s.22 case; it would be appreciated if you can also advise what we can expect from the Crown Counsel's office.

Good day, I am looking for some information on what the current government is doing help small business in this province. At this point I am finding that small businesses, like mine, are being hit hard with extra taxes and other costs that will lead to layoffs and possibly companies shutting down.

I am speaking mostly of the new health tax the NDP government has implemented. It doesn't take very many employees to hit the 500,000.00 threshold. It will potentially cost our company more than our net earnings last year which will not allow our business to hire and train new or current workers or maintain/ improve our company or make a difference in our community. We will have to cut back on other benefits and or lay-off one or more employees. The tax rules also will be

combining two independent companies simply because the owners are the same. This will impact the general tax base of British Columbia.

My company is an autobody repair facility and with the recent changes to ICBC we are getting hit hard. The previous gov did an in-depth audit of industry and found that we needed to get a raise due to the extra administration passed on to us plus other costs increases including new safety requirements for repairs to newer cars. (the newer cars have features that require us to have new specialized training & equipment for our technicians) We are required to write the estimate and follow strict repair guidelines while keeping ICBC informed and getting permission for every step. Unfortunately we also are being challenged from people who do not have industry training in current repairs. We have requirements from the corporation on yearly training, tools and equipment to do their work but we are not compensated for those expenses and other shops not following those standards make the same without penalty.

In case you are unaware the average estimate takes about 20 mins to write the initial estimate (for an uncomplicated claim, taking all photos getting information from the customer etc) plus throughout the repair process another 30-45 mins over the length of repair to order and receive parts make calls to customer and adjuster then another 20-30mins to finalize the paperwork to submit to the ins company. This is only for a basic claim we need to add more time if the customer needs a rental car during the repair process or if there is backordered parts. We are required to do used part searches and use recycled parts to bring to replacement part cost down often those parts do not fit well so we need to send them back and order a new part. We also spend a great deal of time waiting for authorization to move forward with the repair from the ins company. All of these administration costs are unpaid by the insurance company.

One of the reasons I bring up the ICBC issue is the fact that government has allowed ICBC to essentially freeze our labour rates but everything else has increased. Our rate paid from ICBC is \$73.41/ hr technicians on average make \$30-35 per hour that leaves aprox 40-45/hr to cover the cost of an estimator (25/hr low end) misc support staff & apprentices/hydro/ins/utilities/mortgage or rent/taxes/administration/training & wcb not to mention other sundry items. If we were in a free market situation we could adjust our rates to reflect real cost of doing business but ICBC being a monopoly sets the rates and has not made adjustments in years. In the general retail market one company will have to raise their prices because they have more employees than the competitor and it will ultimately cost them customers and will financially damage their business. I don't believe these issues have been addressed and you need to be informed as to the real world situation that is happening.

So as you continue to add more and more fees and taxes raising rates in utilities and ins premiums it is crippling the average company. The average working family in BC are going to be worse off financially. I look forward to your responses and an opportunity to discuss small business issues in our province.

Hello Mr. Simons,

A few years ago the DMV revoked my driver's license because they found out I have sleep apnea. They took this action despite nothing in my driving history suggesting I have any trouble staying awake. In fact, during the ten years I worked as a s.22 I never fell asleep s.22 even when I was far from well-rested when beginning the trip. I also had no trouble staying awake during my recent s.22 The DMV claims that it treats every case on an individual basis, but that is clearly a lie as they never responded to my attempts to communicate with them.

Long story short - I have been using a borrowed CPAP machine for some time and, with the assistance of my doctor, finally got my license back just recently. As you can well imagine, I was stunned that I could lose my license for no good reason while even drunk drivers and people who cause fatal accidents can retain theirs. The problem now is that I am in an unacceptable relationship with the DMV. Their intention is to revoke my license again if they should discover I'm not using a CPAP machine on a regular basis. In addition, these machines cost thousands of dollars, which I cannot afford as SunLife only covers a small portion of that expense, and I'm being pressured to return my borrowed machine. I believe the DMV should have to pay for it if they insist on my using it, considering that there is nothing in my driving history to suggest I have any difficulty staying awake when I'm driving. Other than that, there are three significant points to consider:

- 1) Thousands of BC drivers have undiagnosed sleep apnea. Nevertheless, the DMV does not compel anyone to undergo a sleep test unless they have specific reason to suspect a driver does have sleep apnea. This normally occurs when the DMV receives a medical report from a doctor indicating the patient has this condition. The only way the doctor knows is due to being informed by the patient. I had a problem with chronic fatigue that I suspected might be the result of having sleep apnea, which my wife suspected I did have. So my doctor arranged a sleep test, which confirmed that I do have sleep apnea. But it also turned out that it wasn't the cause of my chronic fatigue, which disappeared s.22 I explained this to the DMV in detail, but they didn't even acknowledge receipt of my communication, much less respond to it. Anyway, this selective enforcement is completely unacceptable, especially considering that probably damn near everyone who snores has sleep apnea.
- 2) The notion that one should have to fear discussing health issues with one's doctor because it might lead to unjustified punishment in some auxiliary fashion is unacceptable. And even more unacceptable is the notion that one is being selectively punished due to providing voluntary information in a matter unrelated to the action of driving a vehicle.
- 3) When my license was first revoked, Mr. Simons apparently believed that having a form letter sent to me from the Minister of Justice, a letter that did not specifically address my complaint, constituted sufficient assistance from his office. It did not. In fact, I would like to

personally meet with the Attorney General to discuss, among other things, the possibility that the DMV's behavior violates section 6 of the *Charter of Rights and Freedoms*, as it ruined my ability to continue receiving income as a professional driver. I would also like to learn how the DMV was ever permitted to abuse its power in this fashion, punishing safe drivers more severely than dangerous drivers are punished, even to the extent of repeated drunk driving offenders, for example, being allowed to retain their driving privileges, while a safe driver such as me has to spend the rest of his life worrying about losing his license again despite a pristine driving record.

Subject: Small Business unfairly hit by Health Tax Cost

Importance: High

Good day, I am looking for some information on what the current government is doing help small business in this province. At this point I am finding that small businesses, like mine, are being hit hard with extra taxes and other costs that will lead to layoffs and possibly companies shutting down.

I am speaking mostly of the new health tax the NDP government has implemented. It doesn't take very many employees to hit the 500,000.00 threshold. It will potentially cost our company more than our net earnings last year which will not allow our business to hire and train new or current workers or maintain/ improve our company or make a difference in our community. We will have to cut back on other benefits and or lay-off one or more employees. The tax rules also will be combining two independent companies simply because the owners are the same. This will impact the general tax base of British Columbia.

My company is an autobody repair facility and with the recent changes to ICBC we are getting hit hard. The previous gov did an in-depth audit of industry and found that we needed to get a raise due to the extra administration passed on to us plus other costs increases including new safety requirements for repairs to newer cars. (the newer cars have features that require us to have new specialized training & equipment for our technicians) We are required to write the estimate and follow strict repair guidelines while keeping ICBC informed and getting permission for every step.

Unfortunately we also are being challenged from people who do not have industry training in current repairs. We have requirements from the corporation on yearly training, tools and equipment to do their work but we are not compensated for those expenses and other shops not following those standards make the same without penalty.

In case you are unaware the average estimate takes about 20 mins to write the initial estimate (for an uncomplicated claim, taking all photos getting information from the customer etc) plus throughout the repair process another 30-45 mins over the length of repair to order and receive parts make calls to customer and adjuster then another 20-30mins to finalize the paperwork to submit to the ins company. This is only for a basic claim we need to add more time if the customer needs a rental car during the repair process or if there is backordered parts. We are required to do used part searches and use recycled parts to bring to replacement part cost down often those parts do not fit well so we need to send them back and order a new part. We also spend a great deal of time waiting for authorization to move forward with the repair from the ins company. All of these administration costs are unpaid by the insurance company.

One of the reasons I bring up the ICBC issue is the fact that government has allowed ICBC to essentially freeze our labour rates but everything else has increased. Our rate paid from ICBC is \$73.41/ hr technicians on average make \$30-35 per hour that leaves aprox 40-45/hr to cover the cost of an estimator (25/hr low end) misc support staff & apprentices/hydro/ins/utilities/mortgage or rent/taxes/administration/training & wcb not to mention other sundry items. If we were in a free market situation we could adjust our rates to reflect real cost of doing business but ICBC being a monopoly sets the rates and has not made adjustments in years. In the general retail market one company will have to raise their prices because they have more employees than the competitor and it will ultimately cost them customers and will financially damage their business. I don't believe these issues have been addressed and you need to be informed as to the real world situation that is happening.

So as you continue to add more and more fees and taxes raising rates in utilities and ins premiums it is crippling the average company. The average working family in BC are going to be worse off financially. I look forward to your responses and an opportunity to discuss small business issues in our province.

Some notes I took during the meeting include:

Co-op issue

70 unit, federally run, half subsidized by BC Housing

The individuals who have come to us feel their co-op is in a place of disrepair and is being controlled by a "dictatorship". There is not a fair vote to elect board members and for the most part members who will represent are pre-selected. This individual is controlling who gets access to units as well who gets upgraded rather than following a waitlist format. This can also be seen by the example that a woman with three children has been on the waiting list for three years to have a bigger place, and yet is constantly passed by people lower on the list than her. When individuals ask about his process or any of his activities they are threatened with violence and are bullied. This has included name calling, tire slashing, threatening letters, and as well physical altercations. When anyone tries to go above him to the management company CO-HO they are redirected back to the president (dictator). Every individual asked says they are unable to help. They are scared for their safety and do not feel capable of hiring legal assistance.

There has been:

- Verbal bullying
- Physical Assault
- Tire slashing
- and more

They are looking for an audit, communication with BC Housing, MP, and legal aid.

Good day, I am looking for some information on what the current government is doing help small business in this province. At this point I am finding that small businesses, like mine, are being hit hard with extra taxes and other costs that will lead to layoffs and possibly companies shutting down.

I am speaking mostly of the new health tax the NDP government has implemented. It doesn't take very many employees to hit the 500,000.00 threshold. It will potentially cost our company more than our net earnings last year which will not allow our business to hire and train new or current workers or maintain/ improve our company or make a difference in our community. We will have to cut back on other benefits and or lay-off one or more employees. The tax rules also will be combining two independent companies simply because the owners are the same. This will impact

the general tax base of British Columbia.

My company is an autobody repair facility and with the recent changes to ICBC we are getting hit hard. The previous gov did an in-depth audit of industry and found that we needed to get a raise due to the extra administration passed on to us plus other costs increases including new safety requirements for repairs to newer cars. (the newer cars have features that require us to have new specialized training & equipment for our technicians) We are required to write the estimate and follow strict repair guidelines while keeping ICBC informed and getting permission for every step. Unfortunately we also are being challenged from people who do not have industry training in current repairs. We have requirements from the corporation on yearly training, tools and equipment to do their work but we are not compensated for those expenses and other shops not following those standards make the same without penalty.

In case you are unaware the average estimate takes about 20 mins to write the initial estimate (for an uncomplicated claim, taking all photos getting information from the customer etc) plus throughout the repair process another 30-45 mins over the length of repair to order and receive parts make calls to customer and adjuster then another 20-30mins to finalize the paperwork to submit to the ins company. This is only for a basic claim we need to add more time if the customer needs a rental car during the repair process or if there is backordered parts. We are required to do used part searches and use recycled parts to bring to replacement part cost down often those parts do not fit well so we need to send them back and order a new part. We also spend a great deal of time waiting for authorization to move forward with the repair from the ins company. All of these administration costs are unpaid by the insurance company.

One of the reasons I bring up the ICBC issue is the fact that government has allowed ICBC to essentially freeze our labour rates but everything else has increased. Our rate paid from ICBC is \$73.41/ hr technicians on average make \$30-35 per hour that leaves aprox 40-45/hr to cover the cost of an estimator (25/hr low end) misc support staff & apprentices/hydro/ins/utilities/mortgage or rent/taxes/administration/training & wcb not to mention other sundry items. If we were in a free market situation we could adjust our rates to reflect real cost of doing business but ICBC being a monopoly sets the rates and has not made adjustments in years. In the general retail market one company will have to raise their prices because they have more employees than the competitor and it will ultimately cost them customers and will financially damage their business. I don't believe these issues have been addressed and you need to be informed as to the real world situation that is happening.

So as you continue to add more and more fees and taxes raising rates in utilities and ins premiums it is crippling the average company. The average working family in BC are going to be worse off financially. I look forward to your responses and an opportunity to discuss small business issues in our province.

I've followed up further with our licensing department to see if an exception could be made and was advised there are still some outstanding issues. The biggest hurdle is that s.22 I has no primary ID. Does s.22 still have her old Record of Landing in Canada from 1976 (IMM 1000)? If so, this may be able to act as primary ID.

I have copied the details from the department that conducts the identity proofing process below, which may help you understand what ICBC requires as part of that process before we can look at the next steps/exceptions. The information highlighted in yellow is the missing or unknown information. Having the details and linking documents would help us move forward with options.

Hi Michelle and Natasha,

ICBC reports to the Ministry of Attorney General. I have copied Minister Eby's Executive Assistant for your convenience.

As you may know, ICBC has the responsibility for identity proofing individuals on behalf of the Province prior to issuing government-issued photo identification cards. I've provided the link here for you to the "[Evidence of Identity Standards](#)" adopted by the Office of the Chief Information Officer in British Columbia in 2010. These are the standards used by ICBC to meet our identity proofing responsibilities on behalf of the Province. https://www2.gov.bc.ca/assets/gov/government/services-for-government-and-broader-public-sector/information-technology-services/standards-files/evidence_of_identity_standard.pdf

Page 16 of document in the link above, begins to describe the importance of 'Foundation Identity Credentials' and evidence required for Foundation identity credentials in British Columbia. In the case of the Verification of Status document issued by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada, it is not considered an acceptable document for identity proofing purposes because it does not contain a photo, and there are no security features that can be scrutinized or authenticated at the point of service. It is a black and white document and it advises that it is purely a snap shot in time. The easiest way to mask an alteration or enable a counterfeit document is black print on non-secure commercially available substrate (i.e. white paper).

In the case of issuing provincial government photo identification, for an individual not born in Canada, the federal government becomes the issuer of the 'foundation' (primary) identity document. This gives ICBC the assurance that the jurisdictional document has been scrutinized and authenticated and that a subsequent document has been issued. That relieves ICBC of the responsibility of authenticating jurisdictional documents at points of service. ICBC does not accept jurisdictional birth certificates from any other country as primary identification. Reason being, for example, the U.S. alone has several hundred formats for birth certificates with varying levels of security. ICBC cannot with any confidence authenticate jurisdictional birth certificates; however, jurisdictional birth certificates are considered acceptable secondary identification.

ICBC has also never identity proofed s.22 previously, so there isn't an ability for her to fall within one of our exception processes. I believe she may have a non-photo BC Services Card issued by Health Insurance BC. If she has any of the following, ICBC would be happy to look into her situation and see what we can do for her:

- Scans of any identity related documents she does have possess of
- Scan of her original Canadian immigration landing document from when she first landed in Canada
- Scan of something containing a photo of her (perhaps an old passport, or some other photo card she may have)

Please let me know if she has any of the above and we'd be happy to look further.

- s.22 I is seeking photo ID. The attached document, prepared by her caregivers shows the issues and challenges they've faced.
- What we need to clarify together now is: **Can a Verification of Status document from IRCC be accepted by ICBC as primary ID?**
- Connie (ICBC) has pointed out that: part of the problem may be that on IRCC's website, it specifies that a Verification of Status document "cannot be used for travel and is not an identity document". Here's the [link](#) for that info.
- Natasha (Office of Pamela Goldsmith-Jones, M.P) can you please check on the accuracy of the info above and find out how it pertains to ICBC primary ID sources?
- It's possible that that is out of date information since, as Natasha points out: confusion stems from the fact that ICBC lists "Permanent Resident card (previously Canadian record of landing)" as an acceptable form of primary ID. s.22 has a Verification of Status document from IRCC and that (as the below link states) can be used as a "record of landing or confirmation of permanent residence" (<http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/helpcentre/answer.asp?qnum=564&top=12>).

Hello Mr. Simons,

A few years ago the DMV revoked my driver's license because they found out I have sleep apnea. They took this action despite nothing in my driving history suggesting I have any

trouble staying awake. In fact, during the ten years I worked as a ^{s.22} I never fell asleep at the ^{s.22} even when I was far from well-rested when beginning the trip. I also had no trouble staying awake during my recent ^{s.22} The DMV claims that it treats every case on an individual basis, but that is clearly a lie as they never responded to my attempts to communicate with them.

Long story short - I have been using a borrowed CPAP machine for some time and, with the assistance of my doctor, finally got my license back just recently. As you can well imagine, I was stunned that I could lose my license for no good reason while even drunk drivers and people who cause fatal accidents can retain theirs. The problem now is that I am in an unacceptable relationship with the DMV. Their intention is to revoke my license again if they should discover I'm not using a CPAP machine on a regular basis. In addition, these machines cost thousands of dollars, which I cannot afford as SunLife only covers a small portion of that expense, and I'm being pressured to return my borrowed machine. I believe the DMV should have to pay for it if they insist on my using it, considering that there is nothing in my driving history to suggest I have any difficulty staying awake when I'm driving. Other than that, there are three significant points to consider:

- 1) Thousands of BC drivers have undiagnosed sleep apnea. Nevertheless, the DMV does not compel anyone to undergo a sleep test unless they have specific reason to suspect a driver does have sleep apnea. This normally occurs when the DMV receives a medical report from a doctor indicating the patient has this condition. The only way the doctor knows is due to being informed by the patient. I had a problem with chronic fatigue that I suspected might be the result of having sleep apnea, which my wife suspected I did have. So my doctor arranged a sleep test, which confirmed that I do have sleep apnea. But it also turned out that it wasn't the cause of my chronic fatigue, which disappeared ^{s.22} I explained this to the DMV in detail, but they didn't even acknowledge receipt of my communication, much less respond to it. Anyway, this selective enforcement is completely unacceptable, especially considering that probably damn near everyone who snores has sleep apnea.
- 2) The notion that one should have to fear discussing health issues with one's doctor because it might lead to unjustified punishment in some auxiliary fashion is unacceptable. And even more unacceptable is the notion that one is being selectively punished due to providing voluntary information in a matter unrelated to the action of driving a vehicle.
- 3) When my license was first revoked, Mr. Simons apparently believed that having a form letter sent to me from the Minister of Justice, a letter that did not specifically address my complaint, constituted sufficient assistance from his office. It did not. In fact, I would like to personally meet with the Attorney General to discuss, among other things, the possibility that the DMV's behavior violates section 6 of the *Charter of Rights and Freedoms*, as it ruined my ability to continue receiving income as a professional driver. I would also like to learn how the DMV was ever permitted to abuse its power in this fashion, punishing safe drivers more severely than dangerous drivers are punished, even to the extent of repeated drunk driving offenders, for example, being allowed to retain their driving privileges, while a safe driver such as me has to spend the rest of his life worrying about losing his license again despite a pristine driving record.



Good afternoon,

Attached is a consent form from our constituent, s.22 is having issues with an ICBC claim. s.22 was earning s.22 a month on CPP and fell behind her ICBC payment and as of March 22, 2018 owed s.22 . Julia spoke to the credit department and made them aware of her situation and they gave her 60 days to pay s.22 . Unfortunately now the total is s.22 s.22 with interest. She has been in contact with Ryan Wesnoski from ICBC. She is a senior within our constituency and has been unable to come with a loan to pay for this ICBC claim.

We have been corresponding with our contact from ICBC, Debby Raffard. Debby explained that this type of debt is “refuse to issue” type debt, meaning it has to be paid in full before any transactions are allowed for insurance and/or driver’s licences. ICBC’s right to refuse insurance and driver’s licence transactions is set out in legislation, found in Section 26 of the *Motor Vehicle Act* and Section 93.1 of the *Insurance (Vehicle) Act*.

When s.22 contacted ICBC Account Services on October 24, 2018 and spoke with the supervisor, Ryan, he advised her he could make an exception based on medical hardship. He explained he could authorize the renewal of her driver’s licence for a down payment of 50 per cent of the debt, if she was able to provide a letter from her doctor stating she needed her driver’s licence for medical reasons. The balance of the debt would need to be paid within 60 days. He further explained she would not be able to purchase any more insurance until the debt was paid in full. Although ICBC typically will not authorize any transactions until payment plan debt is paid in full, the supervisor was willing to make an exception for s.22 , taking into consideration her situation.

Debby requested a further review by the manager of Account Services, to confirm that this is the best offer that can be extended to s.22 . However, s.22 is unhappy with what is being offered and would like to take further action. Is there a possibility that your office is able to aid her as ICBC falls under your jurisdiction?

Hello, Mr. Premier,

I am a Canadian ex-military officer who proudly served this country for 21 years. I have a severe disability due to this service. I am also one of your constituents, living in Langford.

I now run the first nonprofit veterans' brewing company in Canada. Our first beer, which is called Victory Ale, commemorates the end of World War I and the sacrifices that Canadians made in that war. Our beer quality is amazing, and our cause is so strong that people are taking notice after only seven months. Even the Langford mayor is very keen on our project.

Our Mission is to brew beer, currently on contract, and to take a substantial portion of the proceeds and donate them to veterans' programs. The current laws, business culture, and taxes make this extremely challenging. We haven't got close to paying our expenses but we have made a donation to a homeless veterans' shelter (it's pretty disgusting that those who served are on the street). We aim to have our own brewery one day, but being able to do contract brewing lets us slowly 'save' for our own equipment.

I have learned that the LCRB is now considering making a law change which will make it impossible for us to get a liquor manufacturing license. Our plan, under the existing laws, is to get a small brewery (100L) and then be eligible for the license. We would have to contract the remaining beer through another brewery. The LCRB is considering establishing a minimum volume to qualify for this license. Since we are a nonprofit organization, currently using personal funds to bootstrap this venture, being forced to spend hundreds of thousands of dollars on major brewing equipment (to produce a high volume) will cause us to close down and is downright unfair as most business in this industry is dictated by the big brewing companies.

Furthermore, a nonprofit can apply to have some taxes rebated on expenses so why must I also pay a provincial liquor mark up tax as well as a federal tax on the beer we produce? The amount paid in taxes is more than I make! The customer also pays provincial and federal tax on each beer they consume. The margins in this industry are ridiculously low, and trying to use some of this margin for donations is next to impossible. I want to ask for the taxes returned to me that are paid for liquor produced for my worthy cause.

I would really appreciate speaking with you and getting your support if only to prevent the change in provincial liquor laws which will force us out of business.

The margins in this industry are ridiculously low, and trying to use some of this margin for donations is next to impossible. I want to ask for the taxes returned to me that are paid for liquor produced for my worthy cause.

- Driver Medical Fitness Program Adjudicators and Nurse Case Managers use the medical standards set out by the Canadian Council of Motor Transport Administrators, to establish the medical fitness to drive for individuals holding, or applying for, a BC driver's licence.

These standards are as follows:

- Treated Obstructive Sleep Apnea (OSA) is subject to annual medical review by the licensing agency for all Class 1, 2, 3 and 4 driver licence holders.

All drivers eligible for a licence if they:

- have untreated obstructive sleep apnea with an AHI < 20 (*AHI is an objective measure of sleep apnea severity established by the American Academy of Sleep Medicine*), and have no daytime sleepiness; or,
 - have OSA that is treated successfully; however,
 - may not operate any class of vehicle if has experienced a crash associated with falling asleep or reports excessive sleepiness while driving until the sleep disorder has been treated successfully.
- The majority of studies indicate that individuals with OSA have a 2 to 4 times greater risk for a crash, and the crashes result in more severe injuries.
 - Even without having experienced a crash, severe sleep apnea has been identified as a factor that increases crash risk.
 - Continuous Positive Airway Pressure (CPAP) is the most effective treatment for OSA, and the only one which has been shown to reduce the risk of motor vehicle crashes.





My name is s.22 I had the privilege to work with seniors in community centre's and retirement homes for approximately s.22 in trying to keep them physically and mentally engaged by introducing the Xbox Kinect motion-controlled gaming system and using games such as bowling, table tennis, and dancing games to do so. The response was overwhelmingly positive.

After a while, I then decided to introduce a few different driving games using a steering wheel and pedals to see what the feedback would be, and it became totally obvious to me the positive impact that it had. One of the residents was 81-years old at the time and was thinking about trying to renew his drivers licence but was being told by his family not to. Well after playing one of the driving games for no more than 30 minutes that I had brought in, much more sim oriented than racing game, he got up and said, "I think my family is right." That to me was simply more proof of what I've honestly felt inside for at least the last 10 years. That video driving games, the right ones, can be used as an evaluation tool in helping to determine if a person should have a driver's licence or at least be monitored as a potential danger. As a side note, I was also a s.22

I'd love to have the opportunity to meet with you and show you one of the games that I have in mind that could potentially be used at ICBC licensing offices around the lower mainland as an evaluation tool. Reaction speed, visual acuity, and spatial awareness are vital factors when it comes to being able to avoid collisions, and I truly believe that I've found a very simple reaction-based driving game that could be used to help save lives and a whole lot of money in damage claims. years old at the time and was thinking about trying to renew his drivers licence but was being told by his family not to. Well after playing one of the driving games for no more than 30 minutes that I had brought in, much more sim oriented than racing game, he got up and said, "I think my family is right." That to me was simply more proof of what I've honestly felt inside for at least the last 10 years. That video driving games, the right ones, can be used as an evaluation tool in helping to determine if a person should have a driver's licence or at least be monitored as a potential danger. As a side note, I was also a

Reaction speed, visual acuity, and spatial awareness are vital factors when it comes to being able to avoid collisions, and I truly believe that I've found a very simple reaction-based driving game that could be used to help save lives and a whole lot of money in damage claims. This is a link to a study that was done in the UK as to the main factors in collisions and it clearly shows that driver error/reaction tops the list.
