**Issue:** The next iteration of the British Columbia Building Code to make new buildings more accessible for all people.

### **Key Messages:**

- The Attorney General and Minister Responsible for Housing, the Parliamentary Secretary, and the Accessibility Secretariat are committed and working closely to make new buildings more accessible for all people and support the Province's goal to build a better B.C. for people with disabilities.
- We are currently working to ensure that the next iteration of the British Columbia Building Code includes changes that will make new buildings more accessible for all people in an effective and timely manner that is also harmonized with emerging national building codes and standards.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

- The Province has committed, through the Canadian Free Trade Agreement's Regulatory Reconciliation Cooperation Table Agreement, to reducing building code variations to achieve consistent codes and standards throughout Canada.
- The British Columbia Building Code (BCBC) is based substantively on the model National Building Code (NBC). The NBC is updated approximately every five years and B.C. adopts most of the requirements into subsequent editions of the BCBC.
- Historically, B.C. has demonstrated leadership in accessibility by establishing requirements for new construction and renovations that exceed the NBC.
- The current (2018) BCBC accessibility requirements are based on the 2015 NBC with some improvements to achieve a greater level of access. Many of B.C.'s accessibility requirements preceded and vary from the NBC. Some examples of B.C. variations include requiring elevators in more buildings, requiring more universal accessible washrooms, and construction requirements for adaptable dwelling units.

 The BCBC and the NBC allow the Canadian Standards Association (CSA) B651 "Accessible Design for the Built Environment" standard as an optional compliance path for design of certain applications.

 The CSA is developing a new Accessible Housing standard (B652). Ministry staff as well as Rick Hansen Foundation (RHF) staff are participating on the technical committee to support its development.

### Rick Hansen Foundation Accessibility Certification program

- The Rick Hansen Foundation Accessibility Certification program (RHFAC) is a rating system that measures the accessibility of buildings and sites. It promotes increased access through the adoption of universal design principles.
  - RHFAC defines universal design as the design of products and environments to be useable by all people, to the greatest extent possible, without the need for adaptation or specialized design.
- A 2020 RHFAC Cost Comparison Study<sup>1</sup> compared RHFAC requirements to the NBC and the Ontario Building Code (OBC) which were each used as baselines.
  - The RHFAC percentage scoring system<sup>2</sup> assigned a baseline score of 35 per cent to the NBC and of 42 per cent to the OBC.
  - Applying no cost RHFAC requirements at the design stage resulted in a score of 70 per cent for the NBC and 74 per cent for the OBC.
    - No cost design items could include direct paths of travel, selecting flooring finishing that allow for ease of movement of wheeled mobility devices, and lighting design to reduce glare and shadows.
  - For a 1 per cent construction cost increase, both NBC and OBC buildings received a score of 80 per cent which the rating system considers Accessibility Certified Gold.
  - For a 6.4 per cent (NBC) and 6.1 per cent (OBC) construction cost increase, buildings could achieve a score of 100 per cent.
  - Buildings constructed to the BCBC or the CSA B651 standard were not evaluated as part of the study; however, there are many similarities between the three codes and the CSA standard.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

- The Building and Safety Standards Branch (BSSB) is working with the National Research Council to finalize the NBC 2020 on which the next edition of the BCBC will be based. This next edition of the BCBC will include changes to make buildings more accessible.
- BSSB is collaborating with the National Research Council, Accessibility Standards Canada, and the Canadian Standards Association on new accessibility requirements for adoption in future national and provincial building codes. These changes are

anticipated to be included in subsequent revisions to the BCBC, which are typically enacted on an annual basis.

- The RHF also participates in national codes and standards development. The RHF's experience and expertise with industry best practices help advance accessible design and construction requirements.
- The RHFAC helps build awareness of accessibility in the built environment and helps market transformation.
- Ministry staff in BSSB are reviewing the RHFAC program to help inform further development of the BCBC.
- The RHFAC rating system is unlike a building code which is strictly a design and
  construction standard. It is a measurement system for user experience of furnished
  and operational spaces, including spaces building codes don't regulate such as
  playgrounds. It can be applied at the design stage and inform the design but can
  also be used to measure accessibility of existing spaces.

#### **INDIGENOUS PEOPLES CONSIDERATIONS:**

- Across Canada, disability prevalence is higher among Indigenous people:
   36 per cent of Indigenous women and 26 per cent of Indigenous men report having a disability (excludes persons on reserves).<sup>3</sup>
- BSSB will work with the Parliamentary Secretary and the Accessibility Secretariat to conduct coordinated and inclusive engagements and seek input from Indigenous Peoples in B.C.

#### **GBA+ OR DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION IMPLICATIONS:**

- Accessibility is an essential element of everyday life for more than half a million British Columbians (24.7 per cent). In B.C., a higher proportion of women (26.5 per cent) report living with a disability than men (22.9 per cent).
- BSSB will work closely with the Parliamentary Secretary and the Accessibility Secretariat to conduct coordinated and inclusive engagements with the accessibility community, code users, and members of the public.

**Issue:** The next iteration of the British Columbia Building Code to make new buildings more accessible for all people.

#### **Key Messages:**

- The Attorney General and Minister Responsible for Housing, the Parliamentary Secretary, and the Accessibility Secretariat are committed and working closely to make new buildings more accessible for all people and support the Province's goal to build a better B.C. for people with disabilities.
- We are currently working to ensure that the next iteration of the British Columbia Building Code includes changes that will make new buildings more accessible for all people in an effective and timely manner that is also harmonized with emerging national building codes and standards.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

- The Province has committed, through the Canadian Free Trade Agreement's Regulatory Reconciliation Cooperation Table Agreement, to reducing building code variations to achieve consistent codes and standards throughout Canada.
- The British Columbia Building Code (BCBC) is based substantively on the model National Building Code (NBC). The NBC is updated approximately every five years and B.C. adopts most of the requirements into subsequent editions of the BCBC.
- Historically, B.C. has demonstrated leadership in accessibility by establishing requirements for new construction and renovations that exceed the NBC.
- The current (2018) BCBC accessibility requirements are based on the 2015 NBC with some improvements to achieve a greater level of access. Many of B.C.'s accessibility requirements preceded and vary from the NBC. Some examples of B.C. variations include requiring elevators in more buildings, requiring more universal accessible washrooms, and construction requirements for adaptable dwelling units.

The BCBC and the NBC allow the Canadian Standards Association (CSA) B651
"Accessible Design for the Built Environment" standard as an optional compliance
path for design of certain applications.

 The CSA is developing a new Accessible Housing standard (B652). Ministry staff as well as Rick Hansen Foundation (RHF) staff are participating on the technical committee to support its development.

#### Rick Hansen Foundation Accessibility Certification program

- The Rick Hansen Foundation Accessibility Certification program (RHFAC) is a rating system that measures the accessibility of buildings and sites. It promotes increased access through the adoption of universal design principles.
  - RHFAC defines universal design as the design of products and environments to be useable by all people, to the greatest extent possible, without the need for adaptation or specialized design.
- A 2020 RHFAC Cost Comparison Study<sup>1</sup> compared RHFAC requirements to the NBC and the Ontario Building Code (OBC) which were each used as baselines.
  - The RHFAC percentage scoring system<sup>2</sup> assigned a baseline score of 35 per cent to the NBC and of 42 per cent to the OBC.
  - Applying no cost RHFAC requirements at the design stage resulted in a score of 70 per cent for the NBC and 74 per cent for the OBC.
    - No cost design items could include direct paths of travel, selecting flooring finishing that allow for ease of movement of wheeled mobility devices, and lighting design to reduce glare and shadows.
  - For a 1 per cent construction cost increase, both NBC and OBC buildings received a score of 80 per cent which the rating system considers Accessibility Certified Gold.
  - For a 6.4 per cent (NBC) and 6.1 per cent (OBC) construction cost increase, buildings could achieve a score of 100 per cent.
  - Buildings constructed to the BCBC or the CSA B651 standard were not evaluated as part of the study; however, there are many similarities between the three codes and the CSA standard.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

- The Building and Safety Standards Branch (BSSB) is working with the National Research Council to finalize the NBC 2020 on which the next edition of the BCBC will be based. This next edition of the BCBC will include changes to make buildings more accessible.
- BSSB is collaborating with the National Research Council, Accessibility Standards
  Canada, and the Canadian Standards Association on new accessibility requirements
  for adoption in future national and provincial building codes. These changes are

anticipated to be included in subsequent revisions to the BCBC, which are typically enacted on an annual basis.

- The RHF also participates in national codes and standards development. The RHF's experience and expertise with industry best practices help advance accessible design and construction requirements.
- The RHFAC helps build awareness of accessibility in the built environment and helps market transformation.
- Ministry staff in BSSB are reviewing the RHFAC program to help inform further development of the BCBC.
- The RHFAC rating system is unlike a building code which is strictly a design and
  construction standard. It is a measurement system for user experience of furnished
  and operational spaces, including spaces building codes don't regulate such as
  playgrounds. It can be applied at the design stage and inform the design but can
  also be used to measure accessibility of existing spaces.

#### **INDIGENOUS PEOPLES CONSIDERATIONS:**

- Across Canada, disability prevalence is higher among Indigenous people:
   36 per cent of Indigenous women and 26 per cent of Indigenous men report having a disability (excludes persons on reserves).<sup>3</sup>
- BSSB will work with the Parliamentary Secretary and the Accessibility Secretariat to conduct coordinated and inclusive engagements and seek input from Indigenous Peoples in B.C.

#### **GBA+ OR DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION IMPLICATIONS:**

- Accessibility is an essential element of everyday life for more than half a million British Columbians (24.7 per cent). In B.C., a higher proportion of women (26.5 per cent) report living with a disability than men (22.9 per cent).
- BSSB will work closely with the Parliamentary Secretary and the Accessibility Secretariat to conduct coordinated and inclusive engagements with the accessibility community, code users, and members of the public.

**Issue:** The next iteration of the British Columbia Building Code to make new buildings more accessible for all people.

# **Key Messages:**

- The Attorney General and Minister Responsible for Housing, the Parliamentary Secretary, and the Accessibility Secretariat are committed and working closely to make new buildings more accessible for all people and support the Province's goal to build a better B.C. for people with disabilities.
- We are currently working to ensure that the next iteration of the British Columbia Building Code includes changes that will make new buildings more accessible for all people in an effective and timely manner that is also harmonized with emerging national building codes and standards.

# **BACKGROUND:**

- The Province has committed, through the Canadian Free Trade Agreement's Regulatory Reconciliation Cooperation Table Agreement, to reducing building code variations to achieve consistent codes and standards throughout Canada.
- The British Columbia Building Code (BCBC) is based substantively on the model National Building Code (NBC). The NBC is updated approximately every five years and B.C. adopts most of the requirements into subsequent editions of the BCBC.
- Historically, B.C. has demonstrated leadership in accessibility by establishing requirements for new construction and renovations that exceed the NBC.
- The current (2018) BCBC accessibility requirements are based on the 2015 NBC with some improvements to achieve a greater level of access. Many of B.C.'s accessibility requirements preceded and vary from the NBC. Some examples of B.C. variations include requiring elevators in more buildings, requiring more universal accessible washrooms, and construction requirements for adaptable dwelling units.

The BCBC and the NBC allow the Canadian Standards Association (CSA) B651
"Accessible Design for the Built Environment" standard as an optional compliance
path for design of certain applications.

 The CSA is developing a new Accessible Housing standard (B652). Ministry staff as well as Rick Hansen Foundation (RHF) staff are participating on the technical committee to support its development.

# Rick Hansen Foundation Accessibility Certification program

- The Rick Hansen Foundation Accessibility Certification program (RHFAC) is a rating system that measures the accessibility of buildings and sites. It promotes increased access through the adoption of universal design principles.
  - o RHFAC defines universal design as the design of products and environments to be useable by all people, to the greatest extent possible, without the need for adaptation or specialized design.
- A 2020 RHFAC Cost Comparison Study<sup>1</sup> compared RHFAC requirements to the NBC and the Ontario Building Code (OBC) which were each used as baselines.
  - o The RHFAC percentage scoring system<sup>2</sup> assigned a baseline score of 35 per cent to the NBC and of 42 per cent to the OBC.
  - Applying no cost RHFAC requirements at the design stage resulted in a score of 70 per cent for the NBC and 74 per cent for the OBC.
    - No cost design items could include direct paths of travel, selecting flooring finishing that allow for ease of movement of wheeled mobility devices, and lighting design to reduce glare and shadows.
  - For a 1 per cent construction cost increase, both NBC and OBC buildings received a score of 80 per cent which the rating system considers Accessibility Certified Gold.
  - o For a 6.4 per cent (NBC) and 6.1 per cent (OBC) construction cost increase, buildings could achieve a score of 100 per cent.
  - o Buildings constructed to the BCBC or the CSA B651 standard were not evaluated as part of the study; however, there are many similarities between the three codes and the CSA standard.

# **DISCUSSION:**

- The Building and Safety Standards Branch (BSSB) is working with the National Research Council to finalize the NBC 2020 on which the next edition of the BCBC will be based. This next edition of the BCBC will include changes to make buildings more accessible.
- BSSB is collaborating with the National Research Council, Accessibility Standards
  Canada, and the Canadian Standards Association on new accessibility requirements
  for adoption in future national and provincial building codes. These changes are

anticipated to be included in subsequent revisions to the BCBC, which are typically enacted on an annual basis.

- The RHF also participates in national codes and standards development. The RHF's experience and expertise with industry best practices help advance accessible design and construction requirements.
- The RHFAC helps build awareness of accessibility in the built environment and helps market transformation.
- Ministry staff in BSSB are reviewing the RHFAC program to help inform further development of the BCBC.
- The RHFAC rating system is unlike a building code which is strictly a design and
  construction standard. It is a measurement system for user experience of furnished
  and operational spaces, including spaces building codes don't regulate such as
  playgrounds. It can be applied at the design stage and inform the design but can
  also be used to measure accessibility of existing spaces.

# **INDIGENOUS PEOPLES CONSIDERATIONS:**

- Across Canada, disability prevalence is higher among Indigenous people:
   36 per cent of Indigenous women and 26 per cent of Indigenous men report having a disability (excludes persons on reserves).<sup>3</sup>
- BSSB will work with the Parliamentary Secretary and the Accessibility Secretariat to conduct coordinated and inclusive engagements and seek input from Indigenous Peoples in B.C.

# **GBA+ OR DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION IMPLICATIONS:**

- Accessibility is an essential element of everyday life for more than half a million British Columbians (24.7 per cent). In B.C., a higher proportion of women (26.5 per cent) report living with a disability than men (22.9 per cent).
- BSSB will work closely with the Parliamentary Secretary and the Accessibility Secretariat to conduct coordinated and inclusive engagements with the accessibility community, code users, and members of the public.

# Shayne Ramsay, CEO

# MINISTRY OF ATTORNEY GENERAL BC HOUSING MEETING BRIEFING NOTE

**PURPOSE:** MEETING Note for Parliamentary Secretary Dan Coulter

Meeting with: SAFERhome Standards Society

#### Issue:

SAFERhome is interested in having BC Housing certify all new buildings BC Housing builds and make their training a requirement for residential builders.

# **Key Messages:**

- BC Housing incorporates most of SAFERhome's standards into the BC Housing Design Guidelines and Construction Standards.
- BC Housing will work with SAFERhome to set up SAFERhome training through continuing professional development credits for builders, and to develop a Builder Insight Bulletin on the topic for builders.

# **BACKGROUND:**

# BC Housing's Design Guidelines and Construction Standards

The <u>BC Housing's Design Guidelines and Construction Standards</u> (Guidelines) apply to affordable housing projects whose capital and/or operating budgets are funded or financed by BC Housing.

The Guidelines recognize the need for accessible design criteria while constructing new buildings, conversions, and renovations that allow people with disabilities to live independently in the community. These include:

- All areas of the site and all parts of the building intended for tenant use must be
  accessible to people with disabilities and shall be designed to consider the safety
  of people of all ages and degrees of abilities;
- 5 per cent of units should be fully wheelchair accessible in new developments, in addition to adaptable units;
- All suites in senior buildings should be designed as adaptable units

The Guidelines meet or exceed BC Building Code (Code) requirements and adopt best practices from industry such as CSA B651 Accessible Design for the Built Environment, and the SAFERhome Standards Manual. Though the Code also references CSA B651, it does not adopt all of its standards because the CSA standard applies beyond the building and into the building site, which is generally not regulated by the Code. For a comparison between the BC Building Code and BC Housing's Design Guidelines and Construction Standards, please see Attachment 1.

# Rick Hansen Foundation Accessibility Certification program

The Rick Hansen Foundation Accessibility Certification program is a rating system for the accessibility of existing buildings, not a construction standard like SAFERhomes. Buildings that achieve certification must have a high degree of accessibility. The program is based on the CSA B651 standard that is also referenced in the BC Building Code and some parts of which are incorporated in BC Housing's Design Guidelines and Construction Standards.

# Cost of Accessible or Adaptable Units

BC Housing does not have a costing analysis of units that are built accessible or adaptable as cost is not looked at on a unit by unit basis. Rather, BC Housing looks at cost as part of the overall design for a building. Thus, achieving the 5 per cent accessible units (or all adaptable units in the case of seniors developments) is part of the overall cost.

The SAFERhome website states that, in general, a new 2,600 square foot home would be an additional \$1,100 of building cost to incorporate the whole SAFERhome program.

One recent study on the Rick Hansen Foundation Accessibility Certification program identified many gains that could be made at the planning and design stage at no cost (scoring a 70-74 per cent rating). For a 1 per cent cost increase, the building could reach Accessibility Certified Gold, which is a score of 80 per cent. For a cost increase of 6.1-6.4 per cent, buildings could achieve a score of 100 per cent.

Costs and scores were estimated using the National Building Code and the Ontario Building Code as baselines.

Accessibility Requirements for National Housing Strategy Co-Investment Fund As part of the National Housing Strategy, the Government of Canada is investing \$13.2 billion through the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) Co-Investment Fund to projects across Canada that help those in greatest need, including women, children fleeing family violence, seniors, Indigenous Peoples, people with disabilities, those dealing with mental health and addictions, and Veterans and young adults. In August 2019, the Province of BC and federal government announced a \$75 million investment to support the construction of 1,500 units of affordable housing targeted to people needing supportive housing and women fleeing violence, through the Co-Investment Fund.

The Co-investment Fund has strong requirements for accessibility. The Fund requires either the entire building to be universally designed, or for 20 per cent of the units to be accessible units. Definitions of Terms can be found in Attachment 2.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

# **SAFERhome Standards Society**

The <u>SAFERhome Standards Society</u> is a national organization that promotes safe, healthy and sustainable housing standards and practices through home planning assistance, home inspection and certification programs. SAFERhome also acts as a public interest lobby group with government and industry for the adoption of SAFERhome building standards and practices. Currently there are over 1,500 homes in the Greater Vancouver area that are SAFERhome certified.

SAFERhome has 15 standards pertaining to structural and design features, electrical and telecom, and plumbing adaptability. All of their standards are within the existing provincial and national building codes. SAFERhome describes their standards as universal design.

SAFERhome is interested in having BC Housing certify all new buildings BC Housing builds and make SAFERhome training a requirement for residential builders.

BC Housing incorporates most of SAFERhome's standards into the BC Housing Design Guidelines. BC Housing has also provided SAFERhome with grants and technical support.

BC Housing will work with SAFERhome to set up SAFERhome training through continuing professional development credits for builders, and to develop a Builder Insight Bulletin on the topic for builders.

# **INDIGENOUS PEOPLES CONSIDERATIONS:**

Recognizing over representation of Indigenous peoples within the homeless population and in housing that is not adequate nor affordable, BC Housing works in partnership with Indigenous communities and organizations to help create more affordable housing and to increase self-reliance in the Indigenous housing sector.

#### Attachment 1 - Definitions of Terms

**Accessible** is a generic term that is used to mean a space, place or item is designed for use by people with disabilities. Canadian codes typically include provisions for wheelchair or other mobility device users (e.g.: space requirements for navigating and turning), those with visual impairments (e.g.: tactile warning strips on stairs), and hearing impairments (e.g.: visual alarms or strobes). The term is often used to refer to building code requirements (which also use the term "barrier-free") but is also sometimes used to include "universal design".

Adaptable Design provides the space and some structural accommodations so units can be readily made accessible. Examples are wider doors and doorways for turnaround space and backing for future installation of grab bars. The BC Building Code's "Adaptable Dwelling Units" us this principle. These dwelling units are not regarded as being accessible, rather they are more easily made accessible, when compared to typical units.

**Adaptive Design** means accessibility provisions are provided- but relates more often to adaptive technology like automatic door openers. It may also relate to furnishings or other impermanent parts of a buildings and is not typically used to refer to permanent items in buildings that are regulated by codes. The BC Building Code does require automatic door openers in some cases.

**Inclusive Design**: Is related to accessibility and universal design but focuses on the approach rather than the outcomes. An inclusive design includes a focus on people with disabilities but also focuses on people who don't have a defined or legally recognized disability but may have difficulty interacting with different spaces or environments.

**Universal Design** to some means inclusive and fully accessible. To some however, the term is a blend of adaptable design and accessible design. For example, SAFERhomes does not require a lift or grab bars to be installed, but does require structural backing so that these items can be more easily installed in future. It does, however, require light switches to be installed at an accessible height. This approach aligns with the CMHC definition of universal design.
