- Households whose rent cost is higher than their stated household income are asked for additional documentation that shows how they are meeting their rent payments. This is in order to ensure that all sources of income are included and calculated, and that any assets or investments are taken into consideration when calculating the appropriate benefit amount for the household. If a household cannot show how they are paying their rent, then they are not eligible for the program. This is a requirement for all of our income-tested rent supplement programs and is not negotiable.

Please let me know if you or the MO has any questions about this policy, and of course please let me know if you need more details about \$5.22 file. We have suggested several times previously that \$5.22 contact us directly if she has questions about what she needs to provide, as she seems to keep sending us the same incomplete information – i.e. bank statements that don't show enough income to pay rent.

- BC Housing staff tried on a number of occasions to work with solutions solutions. Solutions solutions solutions solutions are fused to the solution solutions. We offered him many options; all of which he refused. His refusals of entry have cost BC Housing thousands of dollars already in delays to the larger project.
- After refusing entry again last month, BC Housing issued a Notice to End Tenancy for breach of a material term of his tenancy agreement and the RTA. The RTB documents contain all the details.
- BC Housing did not request a 2-day order of possession, but that is what the RTB issued us. (We would never act on a 2-day order of possession, regardless. We'd work out a reasonable timeline for vacating.)
- s.22 was warned at the arbitration that his tenancy was at risk and advised that he understood. When BC Housing offered him a final chance to comply with the entry notices during the arbitration, he refused.
- Due to the nature of the breaches, BC Housing is not willing to extend
 tenancy at s.22 any further, but will contact him to offer him a unit at another
 subsidized housing development s.22. We suspect that he will decline based on
 its location, but unfortunately this is all we have to offer him.

 We are willing to give him until the end of regardless of whether he accepts the unit we offer him or not.

As requested in your conversation yesterday with the Honorable Selina Robinson and Cindy Derkatz, I have attached an update briefing on the Sicamous-to-Armstrong Rail-Trail application to the Canada-BC Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program - Rural and Northern Communities Program.

The Inter-jurisdictional Governance body and Technical Operational body has now been formally established, the Shuswap Trail Alliance has been asked to provide Secretariat support and coordination of the project management team, and a preliminary concept design (attached) was developed to initiate the process to secure funds for both the design and capital development stages of the Rail-Trail project. Some updates for you:

1) A Senior Information Officer spoke to the landlord. They're trying to get in touch with the tenants.

I spoke to the Landlord again and went over ET (early end to tenancy) applications and as discussed on Monday a hearing date for that would be after the June 3 hearing date. Also that we have made several attempts to contact the tenant by telephone with no response, and that I had also sent the tenants an email with the new participant codes for the hearing.

Here's more background from the RTB on timelines for hearings.

Applications that would fall under "emergency" and "urgent" categories are:

Emergency:

- Landlord application seeking to end a tenancy early (ET) without having to serve a notice because the situation is so serious that it would be unreasonable or unfair to wait the one month notice period to end a tenancy for cause.
- Tenant application for and order of possession for example where the landlord has illegally evicted the tenant.
- Tenant application for emergency repairs under section 33 of the Residential Tenancy Act

Urgent:

- Landlord application for an order of possession based on a notice to end tenancy that the landlord has served to the tenant
- Tenant application to dispute a notice to end tenancy
 - Any other tenant application for issues concerning the use and occupancy of the rental unit i.e. regular repairs, order for landlord to comply with the Act, loss of services or facilities

Currently the only issue we schedule as an emergency hearing is the Landlord request to End Tenancy early under section 56 of the Residential Tenancy Act.

- · An application by a landlord based on Section 56 of the Act is scheduled for an early date, the target is 4 weeks to allow for service of documents and evidence, and for the respondent to have time to respond. These hearing do not allow for other issues that the arbitrator would address.
- · Urgent matters are scheduled with a 6 week target, to allow for service of notice of hearing documents and evidence and also for the respondent to respond and possibly to make a cross application
- · Monetary (non-urgent) issues have a target hearing date of 12 weeks to allow for service of documents and evidence and also for the respondent to respond and make a cross application if they require

It is not in a Policy guideline, but the Rules of procedure (3.2) talks about evidence for the landlord application to end tenancy early and it needs to be submitted with the Application or the next day

3.2 Evidence relating to an early end to a tenancy

When a landlord is seeking an early end to the tenancy, the landlord must submit all evidence with the Application for Dispute Resolution, or, when applying using the Online Application for Dispute Resolution, the next day. All evidence to be relied on at the hearing must be served on the respondent with the Notice of Dispute Resolution Proceeding Package described in Rule 3.1.

 into the woods and approximately 20 campers went to Cumberland and settled on a private landowner's

Constituent does not agree with the appeal process of the Residential Tenancy Branch. The constituent claims to have given a 30-day eviction notice to a tenant, who ignored the time period to leave the property. According to our constituent, the tenant filed pass the 10 days period to file an appeal to the eviction. According to our constituent the tenant did not file within the 10 day time and "used an appeal that is not recognized in the Residential Tenancy Act". A date and time was given for a conference call, where they were put on hold. While on hold the constituent called the RTB and was told they would be contacted by someone. A week later the constituent received a call from the arbitrator, where they were told that the tenant is required to vacate the property on \$.22. They are not pleased with this as the day to vacate was extended to \$.22

They would like to have this individual leave before the date. Is this possible? Also, are there any new regulations put in place to protect landlords from troublesome tenants? I believe you touched on this last week.

Hello Chris.

This is further to my earlier voice message.

I work for IWAV, a non-profit society on Salt Spring who is developing rental housing in partnership with BC Housing and the CRD.

IWAV has drilled a well, secured a water license from FLNRO, and a water system construction permit from Island Health. They plan two buildings with 22+34 units of rental housing; rental tenure is secured by multiple covenants on title in favour of the Islands Trust, BC Housing and the CRD.

The BCH-CRD funding program requires an 'equity interest' to be held by BC Housing, so plans are to register a strata plan to allow transfer of ~18 units to BC Housing. All will be operated by IWAV as affordable rental under operating agreement with BC Housing. The site will remain as one parcel.

I understand that a CPCN is not required, as the water will be provided only to tenants. A couple of questions:

- 1. Is there a process to secure an exemption? (or is it merely that there is no need to apply?)
- 2. Does it matter that there will be 2 owners? (IWAV and BC Housing)

The building permit has been issued and they are ready to start construction, but we need to confirm there are no further regulatory requirements before BCH approves construction start.

Your advise would be appreciated.

Hi Eliza:

I checked with BC housing and confirmed , this is a building called s.22 in Vancouver and is owned and operated by BC Housing.

They checked s.22 and there is reference to a few complaints he has made s.22. Unfortunately, his complaints were not actionable, as tenants are permitted to have visitors and do as they wish in their own homes, as long as they are not disturbing others' quiet peace and enjoyment.

The water leak was 1 s.22and was a one-time incident. There was no damage to either unit – the leak was caught quickly and addressed right away. Dehumidifiers were provided in both units afterwards to ensure that everything dried out properly.

BCH has previously tried to explain this to s.22 and been unsuccessful, I think it would be best for the RTB to follow up with him. Part of the issue is that privacy legislation prevents BCH from sharing any details about actions they may have taken with another tenant, so he feels that they "aren't doing anything."

The last time BCH discussed the issue with him, he got very angry and stated that he believes BC Housing isn't doing anything s.22

Could you have staff from RTB give s.22a call to explain his options and rights as a tenant? (Dispute resolution?) His phone number is:

I have some background on the questions you sent to me. Also attached are summary reports from the public open houses that contain more information answering some of the most commonly heard questions.

Was this project put out for tender in a RFP (Request for Proposal) or was this done for 222 Corfield, or was Island Crisis Care Society (ICCS) simply "granted" the contract? Yes, this proposal was received in response to a request for proposals, but it was initially submitted under a different funding program. (This is not at all unusual.) Island Crisis Care Society initially submitted an expression of interest under the call for submissions to the Provincial Investment in Affordable Housing program. Their submission satisfied the necessary requirements for the PIAH call and was selected for further consideration. After further evaluation, BC Housing staff and ICCS determined that due to the targeted client group and the type of development, the proposal was better suited to the Rapid Response for Homelessness Program, which was also accepting submissions at the time. The project was ultimately approved under the Rapid Response to Housing program.

2) The Staff will be working with an extremely vulnerable mixed population. One would hope that those working with such a low barrier population would have significant training and expertise, ideally a Masters degree (or at minimum a Bachelors degree) in this given field. This concern is directed to those working the "24/7" evening and weekend hours. Are there any assurances that this is possible, for the safety and betterment of all involved?

BC Housing does not require operators to provide detailed education or employment experience for each of employees, but the organization must be able to demonstrate capacity for operating this type of housing with this type of client group – this is a key part of the evaluation and selection process. If ICCS was unable to demonstrate this capacity, they would not have been awarded the project.

3) With the challenges and issues facing many communities who currently have Supportive Housing, under the Rapid Response to Homelessness/Housing First initiative, what safeguards are in place, should the project go "sideways"? Who will be responsible, financially, to deal with any possible problems that may arise? I.e., increased policing? No hospital, so a possible increase in calls to BC Ambulance/Fire Department and/or city cleanup? Is there a contingency plan in place?

BC Housing disagrees with the statement that communities with supportive housing are facing "challenges and issues" as that is not borne out by the data. Emergencies at supportive housing developments are handled the same way they are in any other residence - by the appropriate authorities – i.e. police, fire and ambulance services as appropriate. Experience shows that emergency calls to the area typically decline after a supportive housing development opens. Please refer to the case study attached for data around this topic.

I recognize various professionals will be there, available throughout the week, this concern is directed to those working the "24/7" evening and weekend hours. - 3) With the challenges and issues facing many communities who currently have Supportive Housing, under the Rapid Response to Homelessness/Housing First initiative, what safeguards are in place, should the project go "sideways"? I had a chat with s.22 to communicate what we had discussed. She may be interested in additional health and mental health services. She indicated to me that she's receiving "limited" support from Health and Housing Services although she wasn't too clear on who those people were. She may be interested in the supportive housing registry although she indicated that she loves her current apartment (minus the disturbances) and would only consider moving as a last resort.

I'm limited in terms of my options to support this. My suggestion would be to communicate this with her case manager. Hopefully someone from the Health and Housing Services team will be able to broach the conversation of exploring additional options especially if those fall outside of the scope of what they can offer. A constituent was in the office this morning. She lives in s.22with her s.22dog.

s.22Courtenay,

The building manager verbally told her that there had been a complaint about her dog barking, and the dog had to go. She was devastated about this and tried to find out more information about the complaint, but gave up and in the end, surrendered her dog to the SPCA. She has now asked for her pet deposit back, and the landlord has told her she has to have the carpet professionally cleaned, and provide him with a receipt before she gets her deposit back. She's a senior and doesn't have the spare funds to hire someone to clean her carpet. He refused to accept the cleaning if she had it done by herself or a friend, and insists on professional carpet cleaner.

We called the RTB together in my office, and she is now aware that his actions were incorrect in that the manager did not provide her with anything in writing, but what's done is done, and she is moving on.

During our conversation with the RTB, we were told that there is nothing in the legislation regarding the premature return of the pet damage deposit, and that all damage deposits are to be returned at the end of the tenancy. However, the legislation is silent when the pet leaves prior to the end of the tenancy. Of course, we are all aware that the tenancy is with the tenant....the pet does not sign the tenancy agreement!

I don't know if this has ever been brought up to you in the past, but I did want you to be aware of this lack of direction in the legislation regarding the return of a pet deposit.
