1. WHERE HAVE THE RESIDENTS OF THE VANCOUVER ENCAMPMENT AT OPPENHEIMER PARK GONE?

- Approximately 261 people from Oppenheimer Park have now moved into new housing and are on the path to stability and longterm housing.
- While everyone will be eventually transitioned into permanent housing, some people have temporarily moved into interim housing options, including hotels and hostels with wraparound supports.
- While specific services may vary by site, all are supported by a range of primary care, mental health and substance use (MHSU) services, and overdose prevention supports.

2. WHERE HAVE THE RESIDENTS OF THE VICTORIA ENCAMPMENTS GONE?

- Approximately 344 people from Pandora Avenue and Topaz Park are now on the path to stability and long-term housing.
- While everyone will be transitioned into permanent housing, some people have temporarily moved into interim housing options including seven sites with wraparound supports.
- As of May 20, BC Housing has secured 465 temporary spaces in Victoria and they are actively working to secure more spaces.

 While specific services may vary by site, all are supported by a range of primary care, MHSU services, and overdose prevention supports.

3. HOW MANY OVERDOSE DEATHS HAVE HAPPENED AT THESE SITES?

- We recognize that people who have moved into new housing –
 either temporary or permanent may now be using drugs alone.
- As of mid-June, there have been no overdose deaths at these housing sites, however we also want to ensure that people who are living in these sites have access to the life-saving services and interventions they need.
- These include access to and use of the Lifeguard App, onsite OPS and harm reduction services such as drug checking, wellness checks, and on-call physicians to support prescribing of safe supply.
- We will continue to work with our partners and service providers
 to ensure that the services delivered address these risks and
 support the health and well-being of the people living in these
 housing sites.

4. WHAT TYPES OF WRAPAROUND SERVICES ARE BEING PROVIDED?

- While the specific services available at each site vary, all have some combination of onsite, in-reach and outreach services to provide primary care and MHSU supports to residents.
- Recognizing that people who are now living at these sites may be at an elevated risk for using substances alone, many have also established onsite overdose prevention sites and harm reduction services.
- For locations that don't have onsite OPS, all have mobile OPS and harm reduction services available.
- On-call physicians and psychiatrists are available to provide a range of health supports, including prescribing pharmaceutical alternatives for people who need it.
- The Victoria locations are serviced by an Intensive Case
 Management Team (ICMT) who has developed the COVID
 Response Ethanol Response Withdrawal Management Services
 (CREWS) which offers primary care oversight, individuals care
 planning and is available to clients on a case-by-case basis.
- For the Vancouver sites, VCH has mobilized a Clinical Outreach Support team to provide in-reach to residents which includes Nursing, Community Outreach Workers, and Social Work.
- VCH is also in the process of creating three new Intensive Housing Outreach Teams (IHOT), which will provide direct care on an

intensive, outreach basis and bridge folks into other existing health supports as needed.

SERVICES BY SITE – VANCOUVER

Howard Johnson

- The Vancouver Overdose Outreach Team (OOT) assesses individuals needing prescribing though the Risk Mitigation Guidance.
- Onsite OPS is available with staff trained through public health and in overdose response, and peers located on every floor to provide monitoring and episodic OPS protocol when needed.
- Additional in-reach services are provided by the Clinical Outreach Support Team and will be supported by the new IHOT once available.

Holiday Inn

- The Vancouver OOT assesses individuals needing prescribing though the Risk Mitigation Guidance.
- Housing Operator Phone Support protocol provided for people using drugs in their rooms.
- Further harm reduction services include drug testing strips and all staff trained in overdose response.
- Additional in-reach services are provided by the Clinical Outreach Support Team and will be supported by the new IHOT once available.

East Hastings Hostel

 The Vancouver OOT assesses individuals needing prescribing though the Risk Mitigation Guidance

- The Housing operator has also established a table for witnessed consumption outside staff office and all staff have been trained in overdose response.
- Additional in-reach services are provided from Heatley
 Community Health Centre due to proximity of the site and availability of existing Primary Care, ICMT, and MHSU to do both clinic-based and outreach services working in partnership with PHS.

Granville Hostel

- The Vancouver OOT assesses individuals needing prescribing though the Risk Mitigation Guidance
- Onsite harm reduction services include using tables, rooms, drug testing strips, and all staff have been trained in overdose response.
- Episodic OPS has been implemented and is on-going.
- Additional in-reach services are provided by the Clinical Outreach Support Team and will be supported by the new IHOT once available.

SERVICES BY SITE – VICTORIA

Howard Johnson

- Island Health is operating 40 out of 80 beds, intended for residents requiring enhanced clinical supports.
- Onsite OPS and harm reduction services 9 hours/day as of June 15, 2020, with 3 staff, education, training, inhalation and injection services, virtual support for witnessing, wellness checks for all floors and LifeGuard App.
- There are also two Peer Support Workers onsite 7 hours/day

- Additional **primary care services** are provided through the Cool
 Aid Clinic
- Additional supports include an on-call physician, psychiatry supports, pandemic prescribing, MHSU in-reach services, safer drinking education and CREWS

Travelodge site

- Onsite OPS and harm reduction services 9 hours/day with 3 staff, inhalation and injection services, wellness checks, education and supplies.

 as staff levels increase, with harm reduction staffing, inhalation

VICTORIA: Issue Overview

Background

The Province takes a Housing First approach to homelessness and encampments, prioritizing access to safe and secure housing and supported by wrap-around health, mental health, and other services. Since the COVID-19 pandemic started there has been increased concentration of people in the Pandora Street Corridor and surrounding area due to the closing of drop in centres, medical restrictions and capacity issues at shelters coupled with high level of discretion being exercised regarding bylaw enforcement to mitigate the health risks. The increased density has resulted in increased concerns about public safety, and the ability of people in these areas to maintain physical distancing, self-isolate, access sanitation and hygiene facilities and access food and shelter.

In response to the initial densification of campers in the Pandora Street Corridor, the City of Victoria, agreed to permit the development of an encampment at Topaz Park with services and supports. This encampment included a tent layout plan and a level of services, including: hygiene facilities, physical distancing of tents, basic security, food services, outreach, health and other supports. BC Housing funded a non-profit to work with the City of Vitoria to support Topaz, but it did not directly manage or oversee the effort. In addition to Topaz Park, BC Housing has been working closely with the City of Victoria over the past 6 weeks to house particularly at-risk individuals by housing people in available social housing (where there is capacity and a fit (e.g. women's housing) as well as securing temporary hotels rooms. s.13; s.15; s.16; s.17

Issue: MHSU and overdose supports for the Vancouver and Victoria encampments under

evacuation and the new spaces established to house them

SUMMARY:

On April 25, 2020, evacuation orders under the Emergency Program Act were issued to
encampments in Victoria (Pandora Avenue corridor and Topaz Avenue) and
Vancouver (Oppenheimer Park) for public safety and health risk concerns. People from the
encampments are being provided with indoor spaces and supports to move and will be
transitioned to longer-term housing as suitable spaces become available.

- The Ministries of Mental Health and Addictions, Health, Municipal Affairs and Housing, BC Housing, Island Health, Vancouver Coastal Health, and non-profit service providers are key partners in ensuring mental health and substance use supports (MHSU), including overdose prevention, are provided throughout the move and at the new interim hotel and housing sites.
- MHSU, overdose and other in-reach and on-site clinical health supports vary site-by-site and by health authority.

BACKGROUND:

Vancouver

Vancouver encampment overdose and MHSU supports

Partners: Vancouver Coastal Health, BC Housing, non-profit service providers, City of Vancouver

Oppenheimer Park:

- Key partners on site include BC Housing, Carnegie Outreach, PHS Community Services (PHS),
 Vancouver Coastal Health (VCH).
- **On-site OPS**: There is an Overdose Prevention Site located in a tent at the camp which is run by peers. Training and supplies are supported by VCH.
- Access to pharmaceutical medication to prevent withdrawal: PHS Community Services
 outreach staff have helped 31 people from the Oppenheimer Park encampment access safe-supply
 programs through telehealth physician appointments.
- Tracking of overdose incidents and clients using safe-supply is on-going.
- Off-site: There are two robust VCH Integrated Primary Care clinics near the park. VCH staff connect
 with PHS, Carnegie Outreach, and BC Housing daily to proactively plan and they have a phone
 number to call if urgent. If primary care or mental health issues arise, VCH staff either outreach to
 the park or partners will walk clients over to the clinics if needed.
- Specialized Supports: Additional supports are available as necessary including access to Integrated Primary Care, Intensive Case Management Teams, Assertive Community Treatment (AOT) or Assertive Community Treatment (ACT), COVID Assessment Team and the Overdose Outreach Team.

Victoria

Victoria encampments overdose and MHSU supports

Partners: Island Health, BC Housing, non-profit service providers

- Island Health has extended some current contracts and are providing services through a combination of on-site services and in-reach. Key partners include Peers, SOLID, AVI, Umbrella Society.
- A key challenge is the need to spread existing resources across seven new housing sites in addition to continuing to support remaining residents at Pandora and Topaz.
- Through a combination of reassignments of existing staff and a request for new resources,
 Island Health is intending to further expand staffing to provide a combination of on-site primary
 care, mental health, and harm reduction services and clinical in-reach and case management
 support.

Health Teams that service all sites (encampments and new spaces):

- MHSU and Public Health in-reach as needed (Substance Use Referral Form (SURF),
 Integrated Mobile Crisis Response Team (IMCRT), ACT, Integrated Case Management Team (ICMT),
 Street Nurse heavy focus on BCH hotels (Capital City Centre and Paul's Motor Inn). Processes still
 in development will provide crisis response, nursing care and access to addictions medicine for
 Opioid Agonist Treatment (OAT) and pandemic prescribing.
- ICMT CREWS (COVID Response Ethanol Withdrawal Management Service) aka MAP-lite limited service for high risk individuals who need to access to alcohol to avoid medical withdrawal and outcomes such as seizures.



Topaz Park (on-site) - All existing or redeployed Island Health staff, except peer contracts (AVI, PEEERS, Umbrella):

- AVI and PEERS provide two outreach staff at 7 hrs/day, 7 days/week.
- Umbrella Peers provide two outreach staff at 7 hrs/day, Monday to Friday.
- AVI is contracted to operate the on-site OPS (inhalation and injection plus HR supplies and education) daily 9am-10pm.
- Street nurse and Doctors of the World van at park few designated times/week nurses on foot only.
- 2 nurses, 8 hrs/day, 7 days/week.
- Daily pharmacy delivery from community pharmacy started Apr 20.

Pandora (on-site) - All existing or redeployed services:

- SOLID/Harbour pop up OPS daily from 1-6 pm.
