#### Re: Logyard Refuse Permit Amendment

Please be advised that the refuse permit PR-8294 authorizing logyard waste discharges to landfill will be amended in the near future. The amendment will be initiated internally to update permit wording and to include the following standard waste minimization conditions. These changes are in agreement with the Ministry's three "R's" policy to encourage the reduction, reuse and recycling of waste material and are consistent with the requirements of all sawmill waste discharge permits in the region.

The waste minimization requirements added to the permit will include the following:

- 1. The size of wood material deposited to landfill will be restricted to wood lengths of one (1) metre or less by December 31, 1997 or a date as otherwise agreed to.
- 2. Metal waste must be segregated and buried in a separate area of the landfill site or, as a preferred alternative, stock piled for salvage.
- 3. The permittee will be required to prepare a Waste Minimization Plan by a specified date to include;
  - a record of the type, quantity and source of the refuse disposed to landfill over the year;
  - an investigation of methods to reduce, reuse or recycle wood fibre currently deposited to landfill;
  - a site plan showing site management activities including; active areas, metals storage areas, and closed areas of the landfill site;
  - a proposed closure plan for active landfill areas;
  - · a detailed schedule for implementation of the plan.

#### 1. ADMINISTRATIVE ASPECTS

The permit amendment was initiated internally to incorporate the 1 metre wood waste restriction into the permit and to update the wording throughout.

#### 2. APPLICATION REQUEST

It is recommended that the following changes be made to the permit:

- 2.1. Add the requirement that no wood residue greater than one (1) metre in length be landfilled. This is a standard restriction incorporated into all logyard refuse permits in the region.
- 2.2. Change the Maintenance of Works and Emergency Procedures clause with a modified version which includes the requirement to notify the Regional Waste Manager upon detection of leachate and to take appropriate remedial action.
- 2.3. Add the standard Special Waste Regulation Requirements clause.
- 2.4. Delete the Segregation of Metal Waste clause as all metal waste is now salvaged and removed from the property.

- 2.5. Change the required frequency of covering from once per month to a minimum of twice per year as the wood residue component of the logyard refuse has been significantly reduced and the site is very well maintained.
- 2.6. Add the standard requirement that the waste must be separated from the groundwater by a minimum of 1.25 metres of soil and that putrescible refuse is stricted from the site
- 2.7. Add the standard combusion residue clause which requires that the ash be allowed to cool in a separate area prior to landfilling.
- 2.8. Update the Monitoring and Reporting Requirements as follows to conform with the requirements of other logyard refuse permit in the Region.
  - The Permittee shall maintain a record of the type, quantity and source of refuse deposited to the landfill site and make these records available for inspection by Pollution Prevention staff;
  - 2) The Permittee shall prepare and submit a site closure and restoration plan for areas of the landfill site which will be closed within the next year. The plan shall specify the design of the final cover material including thickness and permeability of barrier layers, site drainage, vegetative cover and erosion prevention controls as necessary.
  - 3) The Permittee shall submit an annual update of the information required above by January 31st of each year, or as otherwise instructed in writing by the Regional Waste Manager.

#### 3. HISTORY

The refuse permit was issued on May 18, 1993. The site has been very well maintained and there are no outstanding issues related to this permit.

#### 4. TECHNICAL ASPECTS

Canfor mills have received direction from their corporate office to implement waste minimization techniques in their logyard managment. The Taylor operation has also made significant progress in reducing the volume of wood residue deposited to the landfill site. Log yard wood debris is separated out and disposed of in the wood residue burner and metal banding is chopped and stored for salvage. The remaining refuse material consists mainly of bark and dirt scraped from the log yard during grooming.

#### **4.1. FEES**

According to the current Waste Management Fees Regulation, the annual permit fee will be based on:

This permit does not authorize entry upon, crossing over, or use for any purpose of private or Crown lands or works, unless and except as authorized by the owner of such lands or works. The responsibility for obtaining such authority shall rest with the Permittee.

The Permittee shall ensure that any discharge under this permit meets the requirements of other regulatory agencies including, but not restricted to, Environment Canada and the Department of Fisheries and Oceans (Canada).

An annual permit fee will be determined according to the Waste Management Fees Regulation.

The B.C. Environmental Protection Program 5 year action plan core strategy emphasizes reduction, reuse and recycling of waste materials. All sawmill operations in this region will therefore be encouraged to review log yard waste disposal practices and to investigate alternatives which are consistent with this strategy.

Contravention of any of these conditions is a violation of the Waste Management Act and may result in prosecution.

The requirements which shall be met by the Permittee are:

Specific Authorized Discharges and Related Requirements

1.1 Refuse to a landfill

(5000 m3/0/2) }

- 1.1.1 The maximum authorized rate of discharge is 20 m³/day, 5 days/week.
- 1.1.2 The characteristics of the refuse which may be discharged are those of log yard and mill yard wastes. The components of the refuse which may be discharged are waste wood, bark, scrap metal and soil. No type of refuse may be discharged unless it is specifically authorized in this permit.
- 1.1.3 The works authorized are a landfill operation located approximately as shown on the attached site plan.

#### 2. Location of the Facilities

The location of the facilities to which the discharge originates is the E½ of Section 34 and NW¼ of Section 35, Township 82, Range 18, W6M, Peace River District.

#### 3. Operational Requirements for Landfill

#### 3.1 Cover and Compaction

The Permittee shall spread and compact the refuse at least once per month. The minimum frequency of applying soil cover shall be twice per year, once following spring yard clean-up activities and again before winter snow cover. The site shall be maintained in such a way so as to prevent pooling of surface water and minimize edge erosion. The Regional Waste Manager may vary the frequency of covering when freezing conditions adversely affect normal operation or when sufficient quantities of soil material are incorporated with the waste.

Final cover shall be composed of a subsoil cover and a topsoil cap. The minimum depth of subsoil cover to be applied to the last lift of refuse shall be 0.6 metres (2 feet). The type of material that is suitable for use as subsoil cover is clean soil. A final topsoil cap of 0.2 metres (8 inches) thickness shall be placed, prepared and seeded to stimulate the development of an adequate vegetative cover.

#### 3.2 Metal Wastes

Metal wastes shall be buried at a location separate from the landfill site described in 3.1 above and/or preferably stockpiled for salvage.

#### 3.3 Specific Restrictions

- 3.3.1 No refuse shall be discharged into free standing water.
- 3.3.2 Open burning of refuse on the site is prohibited.

#### 4. Site Preparation

#### 4.1 General Requirements

Provisions of fencing, site access, vehicle safety barriers, and firebreaks, as required, shall be carried out to the satisfaction of the Regional Waste Manager. Other works, as specified by the Agricultural Land Commission, shall be carried out to their satisfaction.

#### 4.2 Surface Water Diversionary Works

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Surface water diversionary works shall be constructed and maintained to prevent surface runoff from entering the landfill area. Surface water shall be diverted in a manner that does not cause erosion or slumping of surrounding lands.

#### Maintenance of Works and Emergency Procedures

The Permittee shall inspect the pollution control works regularly and maintain them in good working order. No fires are permitted in the refuse site. Should a fire arising from spontaneous combustion or other causes be detected in the refuse site, the Permittee shall immediately extinguish the fire, and shall notify the Regional Waste Manager within 60 hours.

#### 6. Process Modifications

The Permittee shall notify the Regional Waste Manager in writing prior to implementing changes that may affect the quality and/or quantity of the discharge.

#### 7. Sampling and Monitoring Program

Although monitoring of surface and/or subsurface waters or soil is not a requirement at this time, the Permittee may be required to conduct such monitoring in the future if so directed by the Regional Waste Manager.

#### 8. Reporting

On an annual basis provide a wood utilization report for the operation including; the quantity of logs consumed, product generated, wood residue recovered, wood residue sent to burner and wood residue discharged to landfill. Values should be expressed in cubic meters or air dried metric tonnes. The report shall also include a discussion of progress toward alternative uses of woodwaste.


The wood utilization report shall be submitted annually prior to January 31 of each year for the preceding year's operation.



#### 4.4 Closure/Restoration Plan

A site closure plan for all of the landfill operations shall be submitted by May 31, 2007 to the Regional Environmental Protection office for approval. The Permittee shall maintain on file a copy of the current closure plan and this plan shall be updated as necessary. The closure plan shall include, but not be limited, to the following:

- a topographical plan showing the final elevation contours of the landfill;
- surface water diversion and drainage controls;
- design of the final cover, including thickness and permeability of barrier layers and top soil;
- drainage layers;
- vegetative cover;
- crosion prevention controls;
- · proposed use of property after closure; what alpost actord lear COSC
- based on the results of the ground water monitoring and visual monitoring, a
  plan for operation of any required pollution abatement engineering works
  such as leachate collection and treatment systems may be required;
- additional monitoring, and any other post-closure activities,
- a proposed schedule of the implementation of actions and plans.

This permit does not authorise entry upon, crossing over, or use for any purpose of private or Crown lands or works, unless and except as authorised by the owner of such lands or works. The responsibility for obtaining such authority shall rest with the permittee. This permit is issued pursuant to the provisions of the *Waste Management Act* to ensure compliance with Section 54(3) of that statute, which makes it an offence to discharge waste without proper authorisation. It is also the responsibility of the permittee to ensure that all activities conducted under this authorisation are carried out with regard to the rights of third parties, and comply with other applicable legislation that may be in force.

This decision may be appealed to the Environmental Appeal Board. Notice of the appeal must (1) be in writing, (2) include the grounds for appeal, (3) be directed by registered mail or personally delivered to the Chair, Environmental Appeal Board, 4th Floor 836 Yates Street, Victoria B.C., V8V 1X5 (4) be delivered within 30 days from the date notice of the decision is given, and (5) be accompanied by a fee of \$25, payable to the Minister of Finance and Corporate Relations.

#### AUTHORISED DISCHARGES

- This subsection applies to the discharge of refuse from a SAWMILL AND PLANERMILL. The site reference number for this discharge is E220353.
  - The maximum authorised rate of discharge is 20 m³/day, 5 days/week.
  - The components of the refuse which may be discharged are wood 1.1.2 combustion residue and log yard waste including wood residue which is no greater than one (1) metre in length,
  - The authorised works are a landfill operation, and related appurtenances 1.1.3 approximately located as shown on attached Site Plan A.

1.1.4 The location of the facilities from which the discharge originates and the location of the point of discharge is Eastern 1/2 of Section 34 and northwestern 1/4 of Section 35, Township 82, Range 18, W6M, Peace River Land District, British Columbia.

#### 2. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

#### 2.1. Maintenance of Works and Emergency Procedures

The Permittee shall inspect the authorized works regularly and maintain them in good working order,

In the event of an emergency or condition beyond the control of the Permittee, including but not limited to an unauthorized fire arising from spontaneous combustion or other causes, or the detection of leachate on the property, the Permittee shall notify the Regional Pollution Prevention office within 60 hours and take appropriate remedial action.

#### 2.2. Cover Material Application

The Permittee shall compact the refuse and apply cover material at least twice per year. A compacted lift of refuse shall not exceed a depth of 3 metres prior to application of intermediate or final cover. The site shall be maintained in such a way so as to prevent pooling of surface water and minimize edge erosion.

#### 2.3. Site Preparation and Restoration

Provisions of fencing, site access, vehicle safety barriers, surface water diversionary works, firebreaks and site restoration, as required, shall be carried out to the satisfaction of the Regional Waste Manager.

#### 2.4. Combustion Residue

The Permittee shall allow the combustion residue to cool in a separate area of the site prior to landfilling.

#### 2.5. Additional Restrictions

- 2.5.1. There shall be no open burning at the site without prior written authorization from the Regional Waste Manager.
- 2.5.2. The Permittee shall ensure that the waste is separated from the groundwater by a minimum of 1.25 metres of soil.

- 2.5.3. No waste shall be discharged into free standing water.
- 2.5.4. The discharge of domestic or putrescible waste is prohibited.

#### 2.6. Special Waste Regulation Requirements

The Permittee shall comply with all applicable provisions of the Special Waste Regulation of the Waste Management Act (B.C. Reg. 63/88). If information or data indicates that a waste specifically authorized for landfill may be designated as a Special Waste, discharge of that waste shall cease immediately; the waste shall be managed in accordance with the Special Waste Regulation; and the Pollution Prevention office shall be notified within five (5) working days. Where a conflict exists between this Permit and the Special Waste Regulation, the latter shall bake precedence.

#### 3. MONITORING REQUIREMENTS

The need for ground water and/or surface water sampling and monitoring may be required by the Regional Waste Manager and will be dependent on the results of visual monitoring as well as any other information collected by the Pollution Prevention staff in connection with the discharges.

#### 4. LANDFILL SITE MANAGEMENT AND RESTORATION

- 4.1. The Permittee shall maintain a record of the type, quantity and source of refuse deposited to the landfill site and make these records available for inspection by Pollution Prevention staff.
- 4.2. The Permittee shall prepare and submit a site closure and restoration plan for areas of the landfill site which will be closed within the next year. The plan shall specify the design of the final cover material including thickness and permeability of barrier layers, site drainage, vegetative cover and erosion prevention controls.
- 4.3. The Permittee shall submit an annual update of the information required in Subsection 4.1 and 4.2 above by January 31st of each year, or as otherwise instructed in writing by the Regional Waste Manager.



Further to our telephone conversation on August 5<sup>th</sup>, 2005 Canadian Forest Products Ltd. may commence the following site closure activities:

- Contouring; (as per the Closure Plan)
- Seeding (as per the Closure Plan)

The current Closure Plan makes no direct mention of the 5 year monitoring period past closure; this is mentioned in a document dated August 19, 2004 (from Vici Hill (MoE) to Michael Jordan). This document suggests that the 5 years monitoring will consist of annual site visits to visually check for leachate and settlement/erosion problems.

While these closure activities can take place immediately the Ministry of Environment is requesting that an amended Closure Plan be submitted as soon as possible; this amended plan must include the answers/clarifications to the previous concerns put forth by the Ministry.

Past ground water monitoring November 1998, August 2000, July 2001 & the last ground water sample taken in May 2004 have indicated declining levels of contaminants as compared to the CSR Aquatic Life Standards however, the Director may request additional ground water sampling.

Once the contouring and seeding of the site are completed and the amended Closure Plan has been received by the Ministry, Permit PR-05002 can be abandoned. To do this the Ministry will require a notice to the Director that Canadian Forest Products Ltd. wishes to abandon Permit PR -05002 (specify the effective date). There are no associated charges to abandon a permit and once Permit PR-05002 has been abandoned the associated fees are no longer applicable.

Despite the Abandonment Notice, Canadian Forest Products Ltd is bound by additional requirements that the Director may impose respecting restoration of the environment and/or the control of waste discharged or waste that continues to be discharged after abandonment. Final site preparation and restoration shall be carried out to the satisfaction of the Director.
