At 0900 CO VAN DAMME meet caller at the s.22</p> <p>s.22 At 3 km an active den site below the road was viewed, fresh pup tracks nearby, from this den there is a visual view of callers fields were the harassment took place this week. CO VAN DAMME searched area and set 4 foot traps in 3 different locations and requested caller monitor traps and check daily. Given the rough road and the limited public access no signs were placed which often attract people. caller to monitor area and if any public use is observed to immediately contact CO VAN DAMME. 2013-06-10 At 0830 Com sent CO VAN DAMME a message that the traps are being checked and that com had to touch them up due to the rain. Com stated that the wolves have moved to the north field and that they were seen near their feed lot. CO VAN DAMME requested com prep his traps and that the traps could be moved to better target the location of the wolves. Com to notify CO VAN DAMME when the traps are ready to be set. 2013-06-19 at 0900 Com called CO VAN DAMME and advised a coyote was caught yesterday and feels traps would be better served if we moved them 3 km were the wolves have been seen feeding on the dead cow. CO SPRADO set traps at site on Friday last week. CO VAN DAMME planned to set traps at new site on the 20th. 2013-06-21 At 1310 CO VAN DAMME and CO SPRADO meet caller at ranch to set more foot traps at the ranch as a result of 2 being set off and one being removed from callers 4 sets. caller re-boiled and preped his 2 traps bringing 3 traps. The wolves were seen yesterday chasing cows up the valley a couple kms. CO VAN DAMME and caller set 7 foot traps on property. CO SPRADO set 2 more foot traps and re set the 2 sprung with one that had been set from last week. A total of 12 foot traps are set on the property (2 foot traps belonging to caller). caller and rancher to check traps. 2013-07-13 At 1430 CO VAN DAMME received a txt from caller who advised a canine had been in the trap and the trap is now missing. caller believes the trap was stolen. caller also advised he had pulled all the traps. CO VAN DAMME advised he would retrieve traps from him and conclude the PWOR until wolves return and are in conflict.</p>

Narrative	<p>CO VAN DAMME received call from caller the neighboring ranch and was advised that 2 calves were killed by the same wolves that we are targetting at caller's. One wolf was shot. v advised that the neighbor is required to call ECC. ECC patched CO VAN DAME through to caller, the following were reported: - 1 calf eaten, second calf died after attack - neighbor shot male wolf during attack of calf - wolves are being seen every day by cows - they know that COS has 4 foot traps set for wolves and would like traps set on their property CO VAN DAMME advised they need to take photos of calves and attack site and send a detailed description with the RFID tag number, and other verification details to CO VAN DAMME's email to ensure a request for compensation is submitted. More traps may be possible in area but CO VAN DAMME is not available until Monday. CO VAN DAMME will enquire with other CO's to see if they area available to assist. At 1100 CO VAN DAMME provided traps and gear to CO SPRADO who will stop and verify and assist with mitigation at the coms property. 2013-06-14 @ 1210 hours, CO SPRADO attended ranch and verified calf predated and killed by wolves. CO SPRADO also set five foot hold traps (four 750's and one Braun) near attack site. 2013-06-16 11:40 - CO SPRADO completed livestock compensation verification report 2013-06-16 12:46 - C/N called to advise that either a domestic or feral cat caught in two 750's set at the log pile. CO SPRADO had a dirt hole set and a rub set adjacent to one another. C/N believes it is a domesticated cat as it was quite fat. They let it go and it walked off without any apparent broken legs. C/N indicated she thought it was caught by the two front paws. These two traps now sprung and she suggested that they possibly should be moved to another location to prevent non-target animal catch. CO SPRADO advised her that the cat should have never been there in the first place. CO SPRADO indicated that it may not be later in the week before he could attend to move and re-set the traps. C/N indicated that she is not available on Wednesday. The other three traps are fine. 2013-06-21 @ 1250 hours, CO's SPRADO and Van DAMME attended ranch with another rancher in the area. CO SPRADO pulled the two traps that were set off by the domestic cat and replaced them with two other traps and moved location. CO VAN DAMME and caller installed an additional seven traps for a total of 12 traps placed on Ranch. 2013-07-12 At 1830 CO VAN DAMME attended and pulled traps as cattle had set most traps off, 1 coyote was put down in a trap and while onsite yesterday they noticed a trap missing as there was a hole in the spot the trap was. This could have been missing for days. They searched yesterday all around and did not locate the trap or an animal. CO VAN DAMME searched location from corner property set (caller) and were unable to locate trap. It appeared a bear had stepped in trap and the bear likely pulled out as soon as he hung the drag up. We searched for 2 hrs and did not locate trap. CO VAN DAMME retrieved 6 traps, 5 need to be removed with cutters and one missing. Conclude file as no traps set.</p>

At 1030 caller called CO VAN DAMME æs cell and advised last night he had been and killed a pup wolf up ois.22 caller requested CO VAN DAMME attend with traps. At 1200 CO VAN DAMME attended the ranch and picked up. CO VAN DAMME and caller drove around range roads and located a spur road at 31 km ois.22 culvert creek crossing. In the creek a cow that had been consumed by wolves was found. No ear tag but the yearling cow was clearly eaten by wolves. caller feels the pack is 7 animals. CO VAN DAMME set 6 foot traps and marked them with a GPS. caller will continue to set traps. At 1400 CO VAN DAMME dropped caller off at ranch 2013-08-09 At 0800 caller called and left a message for CO VAN DAMME he there were 2 pup wolves in the trap this am. Both water sets. caller to reset traps in same location. CO VAN DAMME left message advised he or CO SPRADO would possibly be by in the next 2 days. At 1700 CO SPRADO and CO JONES attended site and set 4 foot traps. 11 At 1700 CO VAN DAMME and CO CHAYER attend site and view traps set. 2013-08-12 At 1300 caller called CO VAN DAMME on s.22 advised the wolves killed a cow and that it is s.22 and that he is going to sit on cow tonight and try to shoot. CO VAN DAMME advised he would attend in am. At 2100 caller called CO VAN DAMME and advised that they heard the wolves get close that every time they got close a truck would come by. No shot opportunity presented. CO VAN DAMME advised he would be on site to set more traps and do verification. CO VAN DAMME arranged with CO JONES to assist. At 0530 CO VAN DAMME load traps and return to ranch. At 0700 CO VAN DAMME meet CO JONES and caller on s.22 At 0730 CO VAN DAMME took pics of dead cow and wolf track from the night before. Canine diameter 12mm and spread measurement 45 mm. No question wolves killed cow. Drug cow 6 km and then up the s.22 to the side road that the other cow was found killed by wolves. Set another 8 traps bringing the total to 17 foot traps. One trap set near creek missing û search and locate trap û a black bear had been caught and drug it to a tree and pulled out of trap. At 1045 CO VAN DAMME left site returned to Kamloops. 2013-08-15 At 0900 caller called CO VAN DAMME and advised juvenile adult male was in the foot trap, trap re set 2013-08-16 caller provided update to CO VAN DAMME 2013-08-18 At 0900 caller called CO VAN DAMME and advised that three pup wolves were caught in foot traps. 2 males and a female. CO VAN DAMME advised he and caller would attend and deal with animals and set traps at site. At 1400 meet CO JONES in COS office advise caller we would meet him at residence. At 1500 with CO JONES meet caller all dead wolves dumped in bone yard pit at callers, CO VAN DAMME took two pup wolves to WCLEA training. At trap site, pull 7 traps that were not in effective locations and reset 6 traps. This yearling heifer died as a result of a small pack attacking (2-3 wolves based on the little amount of feeding) Old wolf tracks were observed in the snow and it was estimated that the attack occurred 12-24 hours earlier. Cow number 2 was located near the middle of the field and had no wolf feeding associated to the carcass during filed inspection. CO JONES and SANDERSON skinned the hind and the presence of antimotem bite marks and edema to the bite wounds were present throughout the hind end. This yearling would have escaped its attackers but due to the injuries after it laid down it was not able to get up and died on its side. This yearling was approximately 200 meters from the first inspected yearling. 7 foot traps were set and caller was provided direction to check traps daily. In total 2 rub sets, 2 bone sets and 2 dirt hole sets were used. 2013-03-13 16:00 JONES and Cheif LARKIN attend caller ranch to get an update on any activity and check trail camera set by JONES on the 7th of March. caller caller joins us in checking the site and explains that two of the sets were sprung on the night of the 7th. The two sets that were sprung were both dirt hole sets. One set by VanDamme at the camera site and one set by JONES to tne north west near the buildings. caller reset the foot holds on the morning of the 9th. The deer carcass that was left by officers was drug approximately 150m west into the open field. Photo evidence on the camera indicates that that dirt hole set officer</p>

	<p>VanDamme set closest to where JONES hung the camera captured a coyote tripping that set at 03:54 hrs on March 8th. Camera shows coyote activity on every day of the sets. The camera also captures three, possibly four cougars from 19:46 hrs on the 8th to 20:12 hrs on the 8th. The cougars appear to be a family group and the juvenile "kittens" appear to be approximately 15 to 17 months old. The cougars investigate the dirt hole set and seem to spend quite a lot of time around the set. If the set had not already been sprung by a coyote it is likely that the trap may have caught a cougar from that family group. No wolves are captured on the camera and no sign of wolf is found on site. The cattle carcasses are approximately 75 percent consumed and beginning to disperse. 2013-03-17 10:00 hrs. No traps tripped. Camera shows some coyotes. No wolves present on camera. 2013-03-27 17:00 hrs JONES attends site and freshens sets with lure and urine. camera shows coyote. NO wolf activity. No sign of bears in the area. Some sign of coyotes around traps. Possible track noted approximately 200 meters south of traps. Patrol of area approximately 1km to north west found wolf tracks. Discussed activities with caller on site. 2013-04-23 16:25 JONES attended the site at approximately 12:30 to investigate a statement made by caller that the Wolves may be back in the immediate area. a couple of the old carcasses had been moved and bones had been fed on. The activity looked like bear with lots of bedding activity at the carcasses. Bear scat was found in the immediate area. JONES check the camera and photos showed coyote and fox checking out the dirt hole set the camera was on but, not tripping it. No wolves on camera. JONES set another dirt hole set on the road down to the "Bull Paddock". JONES left two additional traps if caller wanted to put them in the ground. 2013-04-23 16:52 JONES attends regarding another attack on livestock by wolves. JONES verifies that that attack was wolf. An official verification was not completed or submitted as the cow has not died and no vet bills have resulted. 2013-04-25 11:30 JONES attends the caller property to install additional cameras to try and gather intel regarding the wolf activity on the caller ranch. 6 cameras in total are now set at the property. 2013-04-30 13:00 JONES attends to check cameras. No wolf activity. Three cougars captured on three different cameras on the "Bull Pasture". Same family unit that has been hanging around the area for the last couple months. Camera indicates to be Female and two male kittens. 2013-05-02 13:57 JONES and VanDamme attend site to check traps and cameras. JONES resets dirt hole set at top end of first field.
