Two regulations were established that presently prohibits electric and gas powered vessels in the wetland portions and towing in the main channel. The recently advertised regulation is the last piece that was negotiated to limit vessels to a maximum 20hp in the main channel. The hp limit was increased to accommodate sufficient power for traditional hunting, trapping and fishing within the WMA. If this last regulation is enacted it will restore the original objective established almost 20 years ago.

I am writing to bring to your attention the resolute and widespread support of local stakeholders for this last component of the three part regulations designed to protect the world-renowned Columbia Wetlands Wildlife Management Area (CWWMA) while protecting local historic and common boating practices.

In 1996, Columbia Valley residents, industry, First nations and government agencies came together, agreeing that the stretch of the Columbia River and wetlands from Donald in the north to Fairmont in the south should be protected for wildlife. A Wildlife Management Area was enacted under provincial law, protecting wildlife under the BC Wildlife Act throughout the whole 180-kilometre stretch. Recreational and historical uses — fishing, hunting and trapping — would continue, but under an innovative philosophy that places wildlife and habitat values first.

In 1996, the Columbia Wetlands were designated as Wildlife Management Area (WMA, protected under the *BC Wildlife Act*). In 1997 the Province of BC enacted a regulation restricting all vehicle use (snowmobiles, all boats, jet boats, jet skis and ATVs) to 10 horsepower or less. This regulation was an important component of the provincial management strategy designed to protect the ecological integrity of this critical habitat for wildlife and migratory birds. Noise, intrusion, brood disruption and pollution associated with fast moving and large motored conveyances causes a number of negative environmental impacts, including damage to water quality and sensitive aquatic ecosystems, habitat destruction, and nest abandonment.

The regulation to restrict horsepower grew out of both the need to fulfill the mandate of the WMA to protect wildlife and their habitat and out of the public consultation processes.

In 1998, the province's jurisdiction to regulate vessels, even in local areas and for environmental reasons, was challenged in the courts. The Canadian Coast Guard became involved and argued that the provincial government could not apply restrictions to waterways such as the Columbia Wetlands as this was solely the jurisdiction of the federal government. Initially, a challenge was raised in BC Provincial Court disputing that the provincial Ministry of Environment had the ability to restrict motorized vessels on the Columbia Wetlands Wildlife Management Area.

The case was decided in the province's favor at the BC Supreme Court level. The matter was appealed to the BC Court of Appeal and was heard, November 5, 2001. In January 2002, the Court of Appeal struck down the provincial 10 hp restrictions as it pertained to vessels, but left the restriction in place on land-based conveyances, like snowmobiles and ATVs. Regulation of vessels was deemed jurisdiction of the federal government.

The Court of Appeal emphasized, in their decision summary, the following:" Nevertheless, where protection of the environment requires regulation of vessels operating in navigable waters, the Province cannot legislate. Fortunately, the existing shipping regulations do provide machinery for provincial authorities to request that the federal power be exercised." (Citation: R. v. Kupchanko Date: 20020130 2002 BCCADocket: CA026665)

Shortly after this decision, the provincial government of British Columbia partnered with a local conservation group, Wildsight, and started the application process to develop a regulation under the Canada Shipping Act.

On June 5, World Environment Day, 2005, the Columbia Wetlands, including the river, received much deserved international recognition as a Ramsar Wetland of International Importance. The largest wetland of its kind in British Columbia and protected under the BC Wildlife Act, the Columbia Wetlands qualified under all eight Ramsar Criteria, and comprise a regionally unparalleled diversity of 16 habitats, sheltering around 216 species.

On June 28, 2008, a package of amendments to the boating regulations was published in Part I of the *Canada Gazette*, containing proposed amendments to the Regulations which would control the navigation of vessels in the Columbia River and Wetlands between Fairmont Hot Springs and Donald Station (north-west of Golden), BC in order to protect environmental values. Two of these regulations became law, August 19, 2009:

Vol. 143, No. 17 — August 19, 2009 Registration SOR/2009-213 July 30, 2009 CANADA SHIPPING ACT, 2001

A year-round prohibition on the operation of power-driven vessels in the wetlands of the Columbia River.

A year-round prohibition on towing persons on water skis, surfboards or other similar equipment in the main channel of the Columbia River at any time.

The third and final portion of what was always intended to be a three-part regulation remains in limbo awaiting your signature.

Back in May of 2009, our multistakeholder group, representing provincial and local government, First Nations, Industry and broad and diverse NGOs, met with representatives of Transport Canada. At that time, the group developed the proposed regulation, to limit boating on the stretch of Columbia River within the CWWMA to vessels with motors of 20 hp or less. I attach the minutes. Yet here we are six years later with no boating regulation on the Columbia River through this fragile protected area, and this leads to negative environmental impacts.

The existing regulations, quoted above, remain difficult if not impossible to enforce while the main channel remains open to any and all boating activity, something that the majority of residents wish to see curtailed.

Over the many years this regulation has been languishing in your department, all local governments, the provincial government and area First Nations have formally resolved unequivocal support for the 20 horsepower restriction on the main channel of the Columbia River through the CWWMA. This recommended regulation was derived through compromise with many of the stakeholders preferring no motors at all.

We ask that you give the highest priority to guiding this last and most crucial portion of the regulation to completion. Local residents, local and provincial governments, First Nations, and the national and international community will meet enacting of this regulation with wide approval and acclaim.

- 4. Discuss future projects for Science Committee

- 6. Go over Accounting for 2008/09 and Budget for 2009/10
- 7. Discuss Charitable Status application
- 8. Other business including application of new members, GIS options, Biodiversity Atlas Project, Power line corridor project status, CBT conference with partners and water monitoring project.

4. Office of Boating Safety- Boating Regulation

Kevin Monahan explained the process of enacting a regulation and gave a history of the proposed regulations and took questions from the group. See attached dialogue for details of discussion.

Kevin Monahan explained what Transport Canada would like to see from this group as they have been directed to consult with the general public. They would like CWSP's assistance in designing the consultation, where and how to advertise, where and when to meet.

They would like CWESP to play a part in this consultation, would like the group to lend expertise and co-host these consultations as well as to help craft the proposal to be consulted on.

Should there be a minor or major modification to this regulatory proposal?

Gives group several options to consider, reminds them that process is applicant driven and they will support whatever the applicant asks them to. Reminds them that if it is not changed in a substantive way we would probably have a regulation in place before Christmas.

Much more discussion, many questions regarding enforcement. Who would be presenting the regulation to the public. What is best strategy to ensure compliance of general public.

Bob J gives a general overview regarding Transport Canada's attempt at a compromise and the problems involved.

He would like to distance group somewhat, wants to have vote so Transport Canada can report on result of vote by group instead of more involvement by group.

Further explanation regarding process and how much longer the process will take if we don't move forward now with a modified proposal.

Motion made by Paul Galbraith that we do not officially co-host these meetings with Transport Canada regarding the proposed boating regulation.

Seconded by Gerry Wilke

Discussion follows. This group would clearly like to see a 20 HP limit throughout the year. Most do not see any point in spending more time talking to Transport Canada and spending more time in meetings on this issue, there are a lot of other things this group would like to see done.

Suggestion that we table the motion until we have further discussion. Agreed on by both Paul G and Gerry W.

Discussion concerning whether or not we should table the motion More questions as to how long this will take if we do not sanction the proposal as stands or make a minor modification.

Much general discussion and disagreement

The government has rejected the proposal, no point on going back to them with the same proposal.

Most everyone wants to get on with other orders of business.

Motion made by Ellen Zimmerman, representing the applicant of the original regulation, that the proposed regulation be amended to allow the use of motorized vessels up to 20 HP during the seasonal restriction in the main channel from March 1 to July 15.

More discussion follows considering the wisdom of accepting the amended regulation, isn't it better to get what we want rather than a compromise that no one wants.

All we are doing is giving the government advice.

Mary Ann Emery seconded the motion

More questions as to why the original proposal was not accepted as written. The 20 HP restriction excluded jet boats, there is some problem with that, they are part of the community.

There is a problem going forward with restoration projects if there are jet boats on the river.

Point of order, there is a motion on the floor and we are not talking about the motion, it is time to vote.

Re-reading of Motion

The proposed regulation be amended to allow the use of motorized vessels up to 20 HP during the seasonal restriction in the main channel from March 1 to July 15.

Bob J. counts the votes.

The motion as read is defeated.

More discussion follows.

Paul Galbraith makes the motion to leave the main channels open to small boats up to 20 HP for all seasons and restrict all motors greater than 20 HP in all channels.

Discussion follows as to exceptions to the restrictions. There are existing exemptions in place regarding emergencies.

Nola Alt inquires about signage in sensitive areas on the river. Also wondering if Transport Canada will be helping finance signage. Transport Canada agrees to that.

Action

The proposed Vessel Operation Restriction Regulation in its entirety will not be moving forward to Canada Gazette Two. The applicant (Wildsight) will work with Transport Canada to amend the application and resubmit. We will give support to Transport Canada regarding the consultation process but will not co-host the meetings. The applicant and Transport Canada will keep group up to date with future developments.

Must meet with Irv Graham from WMA to discuss and arrange signage.

January 30, 2002, The Honourable Justice Esson, British Columbia Court of Appeal, in *Regina v. Kupchanko*, in analyzing the legal doctrines of "interjurisdictional immunity" and "concurrent jurisdiction", concluded that the provincial order in dispute did infringe upon the core of federal jurisdiction. The primary issue considered by the Court of Appeal was whether or not section 91(10) of the Constitution Act, 1867, which identifies "navigation" as an area of exclusive federal jurisdiction, prevented the province from enacting regulations to restrict the type or power of vessel which may be operated on navigable waters, even if it was to address a provincial purpose. The Honourable Justice Esson stated (para 42); "In relation to the question, I now agree with the statement of Bernier J.A., for the court, in *St.-Denis de Brompton (Municipality) v. Filteau* (1986), 59 D.L.R. (4th) 84 (Que. C.A.) at 91, that "navigation" rights can be abrogated or regulated only by the federal government". That case held a provincial statute authorizing a municipality to pass bylaws prohibiting or regulating the use of powerboats on lakes of a certain size to be *ultra vires*.

The Columbia Wetlands Stewardship Partners

The Columbia Wetlands Stewardship Partners group was formed in 2006. It is made up of over 35 groups, communities and agencies concerned with the wetlands.

The Upper Columbia River and the adjacent Columbia Wetlands will continue to function as a healthy flood-plain ecosystem with a complex biological community governed by natural fluvial and ecological processes. Human Communities will continue to benefit socially, environmentally and economically from this naturally functioning ecosystem and, in turn, the wetlands will contribute to the health and vitality of the communities in the upper Columbia River Basin. Residents in these communities will become engaged and motivated to adopt a stewardship ethic and will work collectively to demonstrate the benefits of a shared stewardship model for this important resource.

Mission Statement:

The Columbia Wetlands Stewardship Partners is made up of a diverse group of community interests, First Nations and government agencies created to develop effective stewardship and management practices for the Columbia Wetlands and the Upper Columbia River. The partnership, acting on their vision statement, will engage the general public and work with governments at all levels to implement a shared stewardship model for the management of the river and wetlands.

Mandate statement:

The mandate of the **Columbia Wetlands Stewardship Partners** is to steward the wetlands in accordance with our vision as a single system irrespective of ownership or jurisdiction and to take a pro-active stance in dealing with issues as they arise. We intend to take a positive, community and science based approach to issues related to the wetlands, and resolve issues neighbour to neighbour. The formation of this group is, in effect, local people taking responsibility for a natural landscape that they care deeply about.

Actions to Date:

- 1. The Partners, working with a range of participants, has assisted in the cleanup of several old dump sites adjacent to or in the wetlands.
- 2. The Partners have developed an adaptive science strategy and have supported several science based projects to help us develop a better understanding of how the system works and what we can do that will help to maintain natural processes in the wetlands and river.
- 3. The Partners are working with various agencies to develop better access to the river at several sites along the river.
- 4. The Partners have played a role in assisting governments to make decisions on various issues affecting the river and wetlands. There has been a decade long debate over a boating regulation for the river system and wetlands. The Partners have come up with a compromise that has been presented to government which

- basically prohibits motorized vessels and associated towing activities in the wetlands proper and its terrestrial components, and seeks to limit vessels operating in the main channels of the wetlands portion of the river to a maximum of 20hp. We await full regulatory passage.
- 5. The Partners have provided support to Wildsight Golden who has applied for funding to document the presence of invasive weeds in the system, to develop strategies for dealing with any weeds found and educate users on making sure that no invasive species are brought into the system on boats, trailers, waders, etc. The Partners have also worked with local ranchers and Gail Berg, a consulting botanist to identify plants that occur in the wetlands that are poisonous to cattle. A guide to these plants has been developed for use by ranchers.
- 6. The Partners are also looking at developing a river use guide and maps that will assist users in navigating through the system and complying with the regulations that are proposed. The first segment covering the most southerly portion of the river has been completed and may be used by accessing the link on the homepage. Further segments of the guide will be available in 2014, and linked to this website.
- 7. The Partners have secured a multi-year grant from the Regional District of East Kootenay with the goal of re-introducing the Northern Leopard Frog to the wetlands. Penny Ohanganian is working in the second year of this project and we anticipate that 2014 will indicate the initial success of this endeavour.
- 8. The Partners are in the course of revising and updating the existing bird-list for the wetlands.
- 9. The Partners are considering conducting the study respecting Burbot (Ling Cod) presence in the River System.
- 10. The Partners seek exposure and the opportunity to educate the public about their programs and activities by being present with their banners and brochures at various regional fairs such as the Windermere Scarecrow Festival.

The Partnership is also looking at other long term concerns in the wetlands:

- The system is critically dependent on natural stream flows into the system. We are
 working to identify management strategies for water flows and water quality that
 will meet the water demands of local communities and industry and maintain
 flows through the system. The Partners are participating in a basin wide water
 governance study and program that may lead to the creation of a water
 governance board.
- 2. The Partners are assisting the Ministry of Environment is resolving outstanding issues with the boundaries of the provincial Wildlife Management Area that encompasses much of the system and zero horsepower regulation has been adopted for the terrestrial portion of the WMA.
- 3. The Partners have assisted government in developing a process for reviewing applications for commercial recreation applications in the wetlands and has worked with the proponents of such concepts to adopt sustainable guidelines.
- 4. A project to identify heritage sites along the river is being developed.
- 5. The Partners are developing strategies, brochures, guides and signage to educate the public on the values of the river and wetlands through presentations and celebrations on Wetlands Day and during other local events

6. The Partners, working in conjunction with First Nations, have assisted with yearly Salmon Festivals since October 2011 which celebrates the role of salmon, past and present, in the Upper Columbia River system and seen innovative ways to bring the salmon back to the system.

Present Funding

The BC Ministry of Environment has supported the establishment of the Partners with grants of \$20,000.00 in its first two years and \$40,000 for its third year. The Columbia Basin Trust initially provided \$20,000.00 annually over the three years as a startup fund. CBT now supports specific projects meeting its criteria. 
