APPENDIX A TERMS OF PERMIT

PERMIT SU16-229857

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS:

- The permit holder must maintain an accurate up to date record of the wildlife hunted, trapped or killed under the permit, which includes the following information:
 - a) the common name of the wildlife;
 - b) the location where the wildlife was taken;
 - c) the date the wildlife was hunted, trapped or killed;
 - d) the sex and age class of the wildlife taken;
 - e) the bands or tags on the wildlife;
 - f) a description of all nests, dams or other structures destroyed or removed

NOTE: A blank reporting form (Appendix D) is attached to the end of this permit for your convenience.

- The permit holder must submit the original record referred to in paragraph 1 to FrontCounter BC within 21 days after the expiry of the permit.
- 3. The permit holder must produce a copy of the record referred to in paragraph 1 on the demand of an officer.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

- 1. The permit holder must comply with all laws applicable to the activities carried out under this permit.
- The permit holder MUST display this permit prominently on the vehicle being used when conducting the activities authorized by the permit.
- 3. The permit holder may only possess a loaded firearm in or on the motor vehicle when the vehicle is stationary and the motor is shut off.
- 4. Permit holder MUST submit a Notification under Section 9 of the Water Act to the Regional Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations office prior to the removal of any dam. This notification can be accessed by going to (http://www.env.gov.bc.ca/wsd/water_rights/licence_application/section9/index.html)
- 5. The permit holder must hold either a valid British Columbia trapping or hunting licence, or utilize a British Columbia licenced trapper (such as the local registered trapline owner) or a person with a valid British Columbia hunting licence.
- 6. The permit holder must be a graduate of the Trapper Education Program of B.C. and lawfully licensed to trap in the South Coast Region.
- Capture and handling of specimens to be in accordance with the Standards for Live Animal Capture and Handling Guidelines established by the Ministry of Environment.

- 8. The use of lawful and humane, lethal trapping methods are preferred by the Ministry of Forests, Lands & Natural Resource Operations, but where live trapping operations are conducted at the specific insistence of the property owner or manager, and are employed subject to the professional discretion of the permit holder, the following conditions apply:
 - (a) Live traps of cage construction may be used for raccoons, mink, weasel, skunk, otters or squirrels, and:
 - (b) Bailey or Hancock style live traps may be used to live trap beaver or river otter.
 - (c) All animals that are live captured may not be kept in captivity for more than thirty-six (36) hours, and must be fed, watered and humanely treated and cared for during that time.
 - (d) Transport to the nearest location for euthanizing so as to not offend the public, must be conducted in a way and manner that subjects the animal to the least possible stress and discomfort.

APPENDIX A TERMS OF PERMIT

PERMIT SU16-229857

- 9. Use of the following traps is permitted within 200m of residences to trap Appendix C species, as described in rationale and background:
 - (a) Belisle Foot Snare;
 - (b) Collarum device;
 - (c) Clamshell traps;
 - (d) Live traps of cage construction.
- 10. Use of killing snares to trap beavers in close proximity to buildings and human habitations or in locations where another trapping method or trap style may be unacceptably dangerous to domestic animals, pets or a threat to human safety.
- 11. Use of shotguns, 20 ga. or larger, may be used with size 2 shot or larger to shoot and dispatch coyotes.
- 12. Use of electronic calls to control nuisance animals is permitted where other methods are judged professionally to not be possible or practical to protect domestic animals, pets, and ensure human safety.
- 13. Other than the above, the permit holder must comply with all provisions of the Trapping Regulations (as described in the current and applicable B.C. Hunting and Trapping Regulations Synopsis).
- 14. The permit holder must take all reasonably necessary steps to ensure that public safety is not jeopardized and fish or wildlife habitat is not damaged by any action taken under authority of this permit.
- 15. No removal of dams from active beaver sites from September 15th to April 15th to minimize suffering of beaver. Dams may be removed ONLY if all beaver using dam have been lawfully removed.
- 16. The permit holder must ensure that the wildlife are treated in a humane manner, and are not subjected to any unnecessary harm or suffering.
- 17. No kill trapping of beavers, muskrats, or river otters is authorized between May 1st and August 15th to protect breeding females and family units. Should trapping of problem wildlife be necessary on an emergency basis, only live trapping methods are permitted during the May 1st to August 15th period. Live trapped lactating wildlife (adult females) must be immediately released on site. Non-lactating wildlife (males and sub-adults) must be immediately euthanized or immediately removed to a location as close as possible and from public view, for humane euthanizing.
- 18. Any live trapped wildlife, other than river otters, or other nuisance wildlife specifically trapped under separate permit or by ministry direction and approval must either be released on site (within 500 m of capture location) or humanely euthanized.
- Live capture, transport and live release river otters only on a site-specific basis under specific direction of MFLNRO advice for each case. Please contact (604) 586-4400 for this specific direction.
- 20. Wildlife wounded but not killed must be reported to the Conservation Office Service (1-877-952-7277) as soon as possible.
- 21. All wildlife and wildlife parts hunted, trapped or killed at a time not within the open season remain the property of the Province of British Columbia. The permit holder may not sell, trade or give away wildlife hunted, trapped or killed at a time not within the open season, except as authorized by permit.

PROHIBITED TRAPPING CONDITIONS:

The use of the **Belisle Foot Snare** is permitted within 200m of residences to trap covotes.

- 1. Use of the CDR7.5 Trap and MB750 traps is permitted at the locations authorized under this permit.
- Use of killing snares to trap beavers in close proximity to buildings and human habitations or in locations where another trapping method or trap style may be unacceptably dangerous to domestic animals, pets or a threat to human safety.
- 3. Use of shotguns, 20 ga. or larger, may be used with size 2 shot or larger to shoot and dispatch coyotes.

APPENDIX B ADVISORY

PERMIT SU16-229857

GENERAL

- It is the permit holder's responsibility to be aware of all applicable laws and the limits of this permit. For example, this permit does not give the permit holder authority to access or travel though any private land without permission from the landowner.
- The Province is not liable for any illness contracted through wildlife handling. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to inform themselves of possible health hazards, and to ensure that all reasonably necessary safety measures are undertaken.
- If applicable, the permit holder is responsible for renewing his or her own permit. The issuer is not obliged to send a reminder notice.

LEGISLATION

Here are some, but not all, relevant excerpts from the Wildlife Act:

Property in Wildlife

- 2 (3) A person who lawfully kills wildlife and complies with all applicable provisions of this Act and the regulations acquires the right of property in that wildlife.
- **2** (4) If a person by accident or for the protection of life or property kills wildlife, that wildlife, despite subsection (3), remains the property of the government.
- 2 (5) Despite anything in this Act, no right of action lies, and no right of compensation exists, against the government for death, personal injury or property damage caused by
 - a) wildlife, or
 - b) an animal that escapes or is released from captivity or is abandoned

in British Columbia

Hunting and licences

- 11 (1) A person who hunts wildlife commits an offence unless the person holds all of the following:
 - a) a hunting licence issued to the person under this Act;
 - b) any limited entry hunting authorization that is required by regulation;
 - c) any other licence that is required by regulation;
 - d) any other permit that is required by regulation
- 11 (8) A person commits an offence if the person traps fur bearing animals unless he or she holds a trapping licence.

Trafficking in wildlife

22 A person who traffics live wildlife or wildlife meat, except as authorized by regulation or a permit, commits an offence.

APPENDIX B ADVISORY

PERMIT SU16-229857

Documents not transferable

81 Except as authorized by regulation or as otherwise provided under this Act, a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization is not transferable, and a person commits an offence if the person

- a) allows his or her licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization to be used by another person, or
- b) uses another person's licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization.

Failure to pay fine

- 85 (1) This section applies if a person
 - a) fails to pay, within the time required by law, a fine imposed as a result of the person's conviction for an offence under this Act or the *Firearm Act*, and
 - b) has been served with notice of this section.
- (2) In the circumstances referred to in subsection (1),
 - a) the person's right to apply for or obtain a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization under this Act is suspended immediately and automatically on the failure to pay the fine,
 - b) all licences, permits and limited entry hunting authorizations issued to that person under this Act are cancelled immediately and automatically on the failure to pay the fine, and
 - c) the person commits an offence if, before that fine is paid, the person
 - i) applies for, or in any way obtains, a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization under this Act, or
 - ii) does anything for which a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization under this Act is required.

Production of licence or permit

97 If a person who is required to hold a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization issued under this Act

- a) fails to produce it for inspection to an officer on request, or
- b) fails or refuses to state his or her name and address to an officer on request,

the person commits an offence.

REGULATIONS

This excerpt from the **Permit Regulation**, made under the Wildlife Act, is relevant:

8 A person who holds a permit under the Act or the Permit Regulation commits an offence if he or she fails to comply with a term of the permit.

APPENDIX D SPECIFICATIONS FOR BEAVER DAM REMOVAL

PERMIT SU16-229857

1. Use Beaver Dam Best Management Practices:

http://www.env.gov.bc.ca/wld/documents/bmp/iswstdsbpsmarch2004.pdf (See Section 7.6.3 therein)

- 2. The removal of the dam(s) must be completed in a controlled manner and undertaken in a series of 20 cm drops in dam height. After each drop in dam height, the subsequent water level and sediment plume must be allowed to stabilize prior to the next level drop, thereby allowing for a controlled breach and controlled flows downstream
- 3. When the water level in the reservoir has been lowered to the extent that no undue scour of the stream channel will occur, the dam may then be breached and the dam debris removed with mechanical equipment or by hand.
- All waters users in downstream areas of the stream must be notified prior to the removal of the beaver dam.
- 5. All material excavated from the dam(s) must be sidecast/removed from the area in such a manner that it is prevented from re-entering the watercourse.
- 6. Machinery (where used) must be free of excess oil and grease and have no hydraulic fluid leaks; only the digging bucket from the machinery arm may enter any watercourse.
- 7. Care must be exercised during all phases of removal of the dam(s) to minimized sediment introduction to any watercourse.
- 8. All reasonable care must be exercised to avoid damaging any land, works, trees, stream banks or other property. The permit holder must make full compensation to the owners for any damage resulting from the removal of any beaver dam(s).
- 9. Written permission for access to or travel through any private land must be obtained from all property owners prior to beginning any dam removal.
- 10. Where there is a series of dams, only one dam at a time may be removed. The permit holder will begin with the most downstream dam and progress upstream.
- 11. Other methods to reduce or eliminate flooding problems caused by beavers should also be considered. These can include installation of beaver stops, fencing, or snorkel devices.
