#### ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF ENVIRONMENT

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT ACT SECTION 79**

#### SPILL PREVENTION ORDER

WHEREAS Cobble Hill Holdings Ltd., Inc. No. BC0754588 ("Cobble Hill Holdings") is the owner of land legally described as Lot 23 Blocks 156, 201 and 323 Malahat District Plan VIP78459 (the "Land") located at 460 Stebbings Road near Shawnigan Lake, British Columbia, which is used as a landfill facility for contaminated soil (the "Facility") as part of a reclamation plan for a quarry site;

AND WHEREAS Permit PR-105809 issued to Cobble Hill Holdings under the *Environmental Management Act* authorizing the discharge of refuse and effluent in connection with the Facility has been suspended for non-compliance;

AND WHEREAS the contaminated soil at the Facility generates and may be expected to continue to generate leachate, which is a liquid that, in the course of passing through matter, extracts soluble or suspended solids, or any other component of the material through which it has passed ("Leachate");

AND WHEREAS the Leachate is a polluting substance that, in my opinion, is capable of causing pollution if it were to be spilled or escape onto any land or into any body of water, as it contains contaminants that are capable of substantially altering or impairing the usefulness of the environment;

AND WHEREAS I consider that the following persons (together, the "Named Parties") have possession, charge or control of the polluting substance:

- Cobble Hill Holdings Ltd., owner of the Land and Facility;
- Martin Uwe Block, Michael Kelly and Brian Martin, directors of Cobble Hill Holdings Ltd.;
- South Island Resource Management Ltd., operator of the Facility; and
- · South Island Aggregates Ltd., operator of the quarry reclamation program on the Land;

AND WHEREAS I consider it reasonable and necessary to lessen the risk of an escape or spill of the polluting substance (Leachate) to make the following Order;

NOW THEREFORE pursuant to Section 79 of the *Environmental Management Act*, I, Mary Polak, Minister of Environment, order as follows:

 The Named Parties must ensure that all Leachate generated at the Facility, including from the landfill, soil management area and wheel wash area, is collected, stored temporarily pending removal from the Facility, and transported from the Facility to an off-site facility that is authorized to treat and/or dispose of the Leachate. The collection and temporary storage of Leachate at the Facility must be carried out so as to prevent an escape or spill of Leachate into the environment.

- 2. The Named Parties must ensure that all works for the collection and temporary storage of Leachate generated at the Facility are inspected regularly and maintained in good working order, and that records of the volumes of Leachate collected, stored and transported, including the location of the authorized facility(ies) receiving the Leachate, are maintained and submitted to the director on or immediately before the 1<sup>st</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> day of each month. Submissions must be made electronically to the following email inbox: <a href="mailto:EnvironmentalCompliance@gov.bc.ca">EnvironmentalCompliance@gov.bc.ca</a>.
- 3. This Order shall take effect immediately.
- 4. In the event of a conflict between the provisions of this Order and the Pollution Prevent Order issued to Cobble Hill Holdings Ltd. on October 12, 2016, the provisions of this Order will prevail.
- 5. The Named Parties are jointly and severally responsible for fulfilling all requirements of this Order.
- 6. Nothing in this Order prevents the Ministry of Environment from taking any other action that may be taken under the *Environmental Management Act*.

Enclosed is Order ##### issued under Section 79 of the *Environmental Management Act*. Your attention is respectfully directed to the requirements outlined in the Order.

Failure to comply with the requirements of this Order is a contravention of the *Environmental Management Act* and may result in legal action. I direct your attention to Section 120(10) of the *Environmental Management Act*, which reads:

"(10) A person who contravenes an order...that is given, made or imposed under this Act by ...the minister...commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding \$300 000 or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both."

Failure to comply with the requirements of this Order may also result in an administrative penalty under the Administrative Penalties Regulation (Environmental Management Act) (B.C. Reg 133/2014) (Regulation). I direct your attention to Section 12(4) of the Regulation, which reads:

"(4) A person who fails to comply with an order under the [Environmental Management] Act is liable to an administrative penalty not exceeding \$40 000."

I also draw your attention to the Spill Reporting Regulation (B.C. Reg 263/90) and the reporting requirement in section 79(5) of the *Environmental Management Act* which provides that:

(5) If a polluting substance escapes or is spilled or waste is introduced into the environment other than as allowed or authorized by [...]

the person who had possession, charge or control of the substance or waste immediately before the escape, spill or introduction must, immediately after he or she learns of the escape, spill or introduction, report the escape, spill or introduction in accordance with the regulations.

This Order does not authorize entry upon, crossing over, or use for any purpose of private or crown lands or works, unless and except as authorized by the owner of such lands or works. The responsibility for obtaining such authority rests with you. It is also your responsibility to ensure that all activities are carried out with due regard for the rights of third parties, and comply with other applicable legislation that may be in force, including applicable local government bylaws.

The Parties are notified that the Province intends to publish on the Ministry of Environment website the entirety of any Regulatory Document provided that:

- (a) the Province will provide written notice to the parties of its intent to publish the Regulatory Documents at least [14] days prior to publication,
- (b) the Province will not publish any information what could not, if it were subject to a request under section 5 of FOIPPA, be disclosed under the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*, R.S.B.C. 1996, c. 165 as amended from time to time.

Please be advised that the Ministry intends to publish the Order on the provincial government website within 7 days.

Dear Mary Polak, Re: Contaminated soil disposal

I've just read your letter to Cobble Hill Holdings Ltd. and others regarding the above and find it unbelievable that this history of unacceptable permit violations could continue over the years right here in B.C. This is only expected in third world countries.

Another similar permit Application being reviewed by your Ministry is Uplands Excavating Ltd.'s proposal to landfill contaminated soil plus construction & demolition waste in their sand and gravel pit in Campbell River.

After all the violations and financial costs associated with Cobble Hill Holdings at Shawnigan Lake, surely these problems need to be avoided in the future. The Uplands Excavating Ltd.'s property is situated on a large sand and gravel High Vulnerability Aquifer Class 11A. It is also in the Campbell River/Quinsam River watersheds. With the potential to contaminate the City of Campbell River's drinking water on one side and the ephemeral tributaries that feed into the water for the Quinsam Salmon Hatchery on the other side it is impossible to find a worst place for a contaminated soil dump site.

Although the Reclamation and Environmental Protection Handbook for Sand, Gravel and Quarry Operations in British Columbia 1995 states "Due to the porous nature of sand and gravel deposits, the use of pits and quarries as disposal sites is generally not permitted, since wastes can easily contaminate groundwater sources, surface water and soil" there are no regulations regarding this.

It is obvious that owners of sand and gravel pits are not operating according to the Handbook so I am writing to implore you to bring in a regulation to deny permits for these Applications to landfill contaminated soil etc. so close to drinking water sources.

I realize that these operations also require a permit (or permit amendment) from the Ministry of Energy & Mines but understand that the Ministry of Environment is responsible for the technical review and consequential issue or refusal of a MOE permit.

It seems to me that it is an opportune time for this regulation, after yet another turn, this time by the Supreme Court of B.C., in the Shawnigan Lake issue, and before it becomes an election issue.

## Re: Cancellation of Permit PR 105809

Pursuant to section 18(3)(c) of the *Environmental Management Act* [SBC 2003], c. 53 (the "**Act**"), I am cancelling Permit PR-105809 (the "**Permit**") held by Cobble Hill Holdings Ltd. (the "**Permitee**") for failure to comply with the terms of the Permit. In particular, by permit amendments made June 21, 2016, you were required to provide an updated security in the form of an irrevocable letter of credit by July 29, 2016. By my letter of January 27, 2017, I made clear my intention to cancel the Permit if the Director did not receive all of the listed items by February 20, 2017, including updated security in the form of an irrevocable letter of credit.

This security is in large measure intended to deal with closure and post closure activities that are necessary to deal with contaminated soil that has already been discharged at the site.

I have considered your letter of February 20, 2017, stating that you are currently unable to provide security because of insufficient finances. You propose instead a 15 business day delay to arrange financing and then propose that financing would only be provided conditional on lifting the suspension.

I have decided that this is not acceptable for several reasons:

- The Permittee was invited to make submissions on the cancellation of the Permit within ten business days of my January 27, letter. However, there was no request for a delay in the deadline for security until your letter of February 20.
- The Permittee has demonstrated a pattern of making minimal or no effort to come into compliance until threatened with actions such as permit cancellation. The Permittee has previously raised inability to pay for required measures, but has been able to pay when faced with permit cancellation.

- The complete-inadequacy of the cost estimates contained in the closure plan report submitted December 19, 2016- suggest an attempt to avoid payment of additional security.

In other circumstances, I might be swayed by an argument that a permittee requires more time to be able to come into compliance with a permit requirement, but given the past pattern of non-compliance and delayed compliance I am not swayed. However, in light of the above, the continued failure to comply with security requirements is not acceptable.

The cancellation of the Permit is effective immediately.

In accordance with section 18(6) of the Act, a permit that is cancelled is not a valid and subsisting permit or approval.

I write further to the decision of the Minister of Environment dated February XX, 2017 to cancel Permit PR105809 (the "Permit") held by Cobble Hill Holdings Ltd. (the "Permittee") for failure to comply with the terms of the Permit.

This it to advise you that the Minister is considering amending the attached Spill Prevention Order ("SPO") that was issued to you on January 27, 2017. Specifically, the Minister is considering amending the SPO to:

- Require updating the Cobble Hill Landfill Closure Plan Report Dated February 2017\_to remove references to new contaminated soil being accepted at the site, and correction of any deficiencies identified by staff;
- Require: permanent closure of the landfill; inspection, operation and maintenance of the closure works during the post-closure period; and monitoring during the post-closure period, in accordance with the approved Closure Plan; and
- Require other measures that I consider reasonable and necessary.

Any movement of contaminated soil necessary for quarrying or excavation would require an authorization under the *Environmental Management Act*.

I will consider any comments that you may have in relation to an amendment to the SPO that I receive within five business days of service of this letter.

Please also be advised of our intention to publish:

- Cobble Hill Holdings Ltd. letter of February 20, 2017;
- The Addendum Review of Contact and Non-Contact Water Management Systems marked confidential and dated 20 February 2017; and
- The Cobble Hill Landfill Closure Plan Report Dated February 2017.
