At 0745 Don called CO Van Damme and advised he believes there is a wolf trapped in some ones back yard at s.?? Kamloops. CO Van Damme advised he would attend and assist. At 0750 CO Van Damme attended and went through to the porch and assessed a sickly animal, it appeared to be a wolf pup with mange in the tail and back end. The animal was pacing and appeared distressed. CO Van Damme asked the com how long the wolf had been in the back yard, the com (a hunter) stated for the past 6 hours and did not appear to be healthy. The com had kids and requested that the animal be removed and stated he would have shot the animal but being in city limits would not do that. CO Van Damme explained that hybrid wolves cannot be determined unless the skull is removed and examined. CO Van Damme asked if they had ever seen this animal in the area before, they stated no. CO Van Damme discussed with Don and it was agreed to euthanize the animal due in part to the unknown origin of the animal (wolf or wolf hybrid) it did not appear to be a hybrid pet as it had no collar and the mange would prevent it from being an indoor pet or around people. Don agreed and assisted CO Van Damme in the back yard, CO Van Damme dispatched the animal and removed it to the COS warehouse. The teeth appeared to be that of an old animal rather than a pup. Don stated that usually they would have received a request looking for a dog if lost. At 1510 CO Van Damme received a call from Don who advised a man had sent a request looking for his dog. The request stated that it was an 18 years old huskey wolf hybrid, and that the dog had bad knees and had poor eye sight and hearing, and that it was skiddish like a wolf. Don called the com and confirmed the dog was the one that was trapped in the back yard. Don gave the owner CO Van Damme cell number to call if more information requested. AT 1512 s.?? called CO Van Damme and CO Van Damme talked to s.?? described the poor condition that appeared to be mange as a skin issue based on the fact the animal was 18 years old. CO Van Damme provided details of his determination that the animal behaved like a wolf and that mange is not common in domestic dogs and that due to the risk of leaving the animal for the children and the other dogs in the area a decision to euthanize the animal was made. s.22 and CO Van Damme shared emails back and forth. Houndsman [redacted] was present with hounds upon arrival - advised had walked out the area with hounds on lead - no indication as to predator being a cougar - interest on actual track line but nothing to point to cougar. CO PARKER conducted a necropsy on the ~7 yr. old Alpaca male - large 10cm hole in flank of hind quarter, no clear hamstring injuries, bite to upper neck/side of face, heavy bruising across the hind quarter as if jaws were on either side of hamstring, carcass had been drug ~ 25' from kill site as evidenced by drag as well as blood pattern - majority of bleeding was in two spots likely from hind quarters and evisceration - organs eaten, tenderloins, portion of hind quarter and little else. At kill site hair and portions of hide were apparent on the ground - suspected pieces torn from carcass in struggle. Injuries and feeding appeared consistent with wolf. Tracks found were somewhat confusing but determined to be large canine as well. The Alpaca was in a fenced paddock with open access to pasture, was present with a large and miniature horse and a few steers. The Alpaca was a protector and owners believe it would have confronted a predator within the enclosure - likely its demise. COS set a large live trap baited with a hind quarter of the Alpaca. Four Foothold #9 traps were set on earth anchors around the carcass placed on the edge of a mature hay pile - within easy observation of the residence and owner had FA. No scents were used and strictly attractor/baited site. In order to verify the cause of death we need something a little more recent and with more detail. I have no doubt you may have a predator issue, but it is difficult to discern the type of predator i.e. post mortem feeding by non-offending wildlife vs offending wildlife. Normally what we will do when we find a carcass is measure, document and photograph the wound patterns and then skin back the hide to look for evidence of bruising or blood shot appearance. The bruising or blood shot appearance confirms the wounds were in fact made while the animal was still alive, vs post mortem scavenging activity. Page 3 of the attached Ranchers Guide gives a good breakdown of attack location on livestock by predator type. Canines usually attack the rear of the animal, Bears are massive crushing blows to the back and neck and Cougars target the neck and throat area, while using their hind legs and claws to dig into the prey for leverage. If you have any better photos we may be able to make a good guess as to the offending predator; otherwise, we are just guessing. I need something a little more to go on in order to properly assist you. In the interim you may want to purchase a Hunting Licence and the applicable species Licences (Black Bear, Cougar & Wolf Not required). There is a general open season for all 3 species in MU 7-17 Bear (2) Aug 15-Nov 15, Cougar (2) Sept 10- Mar 31 and Wolves Aug 1-Jun 30 (NBL). Note: There is no season on female Bears and Cougars in family units. If possible you may want to locate your livestock a CO LACEY noted HWCR in SP2 show - limited staff available due to A's / training. A/Sgt.
