Dear Hon. George Heyman, Minister, Environment and Climate Change Strategy

Congratulations on your Cabinet and Ministerial appointment.

I am writing with respect to the NDP-Green commitment to send Site C for review. Attached is a note outlining problems with the Site C approval process, its high cost, dreadful environmental impact, lack of concern with ongoing First Nations court actions and Treaty rights, and a plethora of alternatives - all with little or no impact, at far less cost, especially electricity conservation.

There are many opportunities for re-assigning Site C workers, both if the project were to be "paused" during a review, to save in the order of \$2 million per day, and when finally terminated. There are jobs for everyone now working at Site C as the report shows in Section 3. This would be doing beneficial conservation and other work instead of destroying a valuable valley and river.

Fear-mongering about "job loss" by unions, media and others is totally misleading.

Your Ministry has a unique opportunity to work with the Peace River community, to help train Site C workers in environmentally-friendly energy conservation, a relatively simple task, and other environmental related energy work outlined, whether it is more energy efficient housing, or renewable energy such as solar, wind or geothermal.

One option for the "workers camp" is to co-develop a "Centre of Excellence" with UNBC for a multidisciplinary education, research and business incubation facility. This would include environmental sciences, horticultural and agricultural centre, "Low-energy high-latitude building research", and renewable energy centre. We hope that you would like to explore such opportunities for adding intellectual property concepts to such a facility, and further discuss and develop some of the ideas outlined in the note.

We also hope that you and other ministers will make a cabinet decision to "Stop Site C" once the review

clearly shows that the project should not proceed.

Alternatively, and preferably, by replacing the BC Hydro directors, and senior executives, your government can change BC Hydro from being a "builder" to being a "facilitator" - the new direction from progressive utilities. You can enable BC Hydro to perform an "internal review", determine the lack of demand, markets, high cost of the project and internally "pause" or cancel Site C, immediately, since it is not in the Public Interest.
