Narrative:

2017-09-13 1300

CO DEBRUIN was briefed on file by CO POPJES during zone meeting in Squamish. CO POPJES indicated:

- RCMP on scene
- RCMP unable to haze bear family unit from area
- bear family unit across street from Cousteau International school
- RCMP requesting attendance from COS

CO DEBRUIN departed for North Vancouver.

CO DEBRUIN contacted RCMP Cpl TAYLOR en route to North Vancouver. Cpl TAYLOR stated:

- sow and single cub in fruit tree across street from schoolyard since 1200hrs, likely earlier
- sow came down once and huffed at officers and re-ascended tree
- Cousteau International to release students at 1500hrs

CO DEBRUIN advised RCMP Cpl TAYLOR:

- secure sidewalk and limit vehicle/pedestrian traffic until arrival of COS

2017-09-13 1430

CO DEBRUIN attended site and found:

- sow and cub sitting indifferently 30' up fruit tree directly across from school
- sow and cub over hanging sidewalk and powerlines
- sow was untagged apx 200 lbs
- cub was cub-of-year (COY) apx 15 lbs

CO DEBRUIN assessed surrounding area as high traffic dense residential area with no immediate escape route for sow and COY.

CO DEBRUIN did not possess equipment small enough to tranquillize COY.

CO DEBRUIN contacted SGT GRAVEL and requested extra officer with required equipment.

2017-09-13 1530

CO DEBRUIN monitored sow and COY until they descended tree onto ground in fenced backyard.

CO DEBRUIN tranquilized sow rump with pneudart dart 2 cc Zoletil with no effect after 15 minutes- possible defective dart

- CO DEBRUIN tranquilized sow rump with second pneudart dart 2 cc Zoletil successfully and sow fell asleep in corner of backyard with COY.
- CO DEBRUIN was notified that INSP SMITH was en route provide assistance ETA 1 hr
- CO DEBRUIN and RCMP attempted to capture COY at ground level by grabbing back scruff and by hand injection of Zoletil; however, COY evaded officers and re-ascended fruit tree.
- CO DEBRUIN assessed sow on ground who still had significant head movement and topped up by hand injection 1 cc Zoletil. CO DEBRUIN applied ear tag to right ear, tag 2-249 or 2249. CO DEBRUIN and RCMP carried sow to culvert trap on street.

2017-09-13 1700

- CO DEBRUIN was met by INSP SMITH who provided smaller pneudart dart 1 cc
- CO DEBRUIN tranquilized COY in rump with pneudart dart 1 cc Zoletil successfully and COY fell from fruit tree with branches softening descent to the ground
- CO DEBRUIN and INSP SMITH assessed COY at ground level, healthy male. CO DEBRUIN applied ear tag to left ear, tag 2-226 or 2226.
- CO DEBRUIN and INSP SMITH screened ground for expended pneudart dart but could not recover any.
- CO DEBRUIN carried COY to culvert trap on street and placed next to sow.
- CO DEBRUIN and INSP SMITH provided viewing public to approach and view sow and COY through culvert trap wiring.
- CO DEBURIN and INSP SMITH provided on-site education.
- CO DEBRUIN could not assess sow and COY on bear matrix. Sow and COY minimally habituated to presence of humans, feeding on natural foods in residential area without immediate escape route.
- CO DEBRUIN determined sow and COY eligible for short distance relocation.
- CO DEBRUIN transported sow and COY back to COS North Vancouver office.
- CO DEBRUIN moved sow and COY into separate cages and provided water.
- CO DEBRUIN determined that sow and COY were unfit for immediate relocation and would be kept overnight in secure compound until effects of Zoletil subsided.
- CO DEBRUIN notified SGT GRAVEL of decision. SGT GRAVEL advised that he would relocate sow and COY in morning.




