Narrative	<p>1353hrs- STARK briefed by ECC that a child has been reportedly nipped by the orphan bear cub. 1411hrs- STARK arrives at scene. STARK immediately observes a bear cub laying against the fence of a townhouse complex with approx.20 youth surrounding him. STARK deploys the siren and scares the cub up the tree. 1425hrs- STARK shoots dart into the cubs butt. After 15 minutes STARK observed no reaction to the drugs. 1449hrs- STARK shoots another dart into the bear. The dart fell out of the bear but was in long enough for the drugs to go into the bear. STARK still observes no response to the drugs. STARK called CO SYER to ask for assistance. There was a group of close to 40 people surrounding and it was no longer manageable to have one CO there. STARK called Sgt. GRAVEL and Sgt. HUNTER and got approval for CO SYER to attend. SYER called RCMP as well for crowd control. While waiting for CO SYER, CO STARK spoke with the people. It was determined the cub had been around for about a week. The children had been petting and feeding the bear. The bear ate everything from plain bread to pizza. The kids would walk right up to the cub and pet it. It is also believed one family was letting the bear into their house. When RCMP arrived CO STARK went to get more information on the child that had been nipped. One of the residents was so horrified on how the kids were treating the bear that she recorded it and got the child being nipped on video. I watched the video and determined there was no injury. The child was petting the bear when it happened. 1553hrs- CO SYER arrives and shoots a dart into the cub. Cub still not effected by the drugs. 1616hrs- CO SYER shoots another dart into the cub 1618hrs- bear drops out of tree asleep 1709hrs- CO STARK tops up the bear in the back of the truck and leave the scene 2058hrs- CO STARK shoots the cub and disposes of the body off the s. 15 Cub was killed due to the behaviour of the children. CO SYER and CO STARK gathered the community together in the complex and spoke to them and explained that their behaviour is why the bear cub has to die. Their reaction was extremely disheartening- they were very interested in how the bear was getting killed and what we were going to do with the carcass.</p>

Narrative	2017-08-31 20:00 CO's in area attended property, the family unit of sow and 2 cubs were now across the street foraging in a residential area, the bears were followed by truck across 2 more streets and through two more residential yards, CO's could drive the patrol truck to within 10m of bears which were not effected by human presence, the bears were observed passing along side house and through carparks during busy day light hours with a large number of people directly in area, CO's followed the bears into a vacant lot and approached on foot within 10m with no reaction, the bears were determined to be a public safety risk due to abnormal uncharacteristic behaviour with no fear of humans and being conditioned to human food sources-fruit trees. For the past 2 weeks CO's responded several times to move bears out of yards, numerous complaints received included the bears being within close proximity to people, surprise encounters of bears near residences, garages and children playing in yards thus causing a serious concern for human safety. The bears were not considered to be good candidates for relocation or rehabilitation.CO's euthanized the young sow first which was small in size and euthanized the 2 young of year cubs in a tree. CO's spoke with the nearby residents who approached and explained the actions taken. The vast majority were familiar with the bears presence for the last several weeks and supported the COS action. Mgr told CO Butcher bears have been around a few weeks, no fear. Trailer resident behind apple tree property said she banged pots couple noghts ago, sow showed no interest. Butcher/Phillips could grt within 5 feet of cubs in tree, they showed no interest, sow up tree also did not exhibit any concern we were so close to cubs. Obviously seriously habituated family unit, could not simply drive away and permit them to come back into trailer court. Mgr agreed to get rid of this tree but said there were "50-70" other apple trees in the court. Butcher dispatched all three bears, 3 shots. Residents came out after hearing shots, phones recording.

CO HARRIS contacted the COM to explain what was being done with the file. COM was very very distraught regarding the bear cubs. COM stated that she believed these cubs to be six months old and that they would die with out there mother. COM stated that she was unable to have children and that these bear cubs were her children, and all animal babies were her children. COM begged CO HARRIS to retrieve the cubs and have Parks release them to Northern lights wildlife society. CO HARRIS explained that he understood how upset she was but in this matter Bc Parks manages their own bears and they would be dealing with this issue. COM stated she wanted numbers for BC PARKS supervisors so she could complain. CO HARRIS explained that he did not have those numbers on hand and stated he would be unable to give out that information. CO HARRIS advised her to attempt to contact Bc Parks instead of the RAPP Line. CO HARRIS stated that since the incident was in a Provincial park the COS would not have anything to do with the outcome of the matter. COM advised he was able to scare bears off site. COM stated they have a 40 acre farm out of residential area. COM has game birds and several other livestock. COM has electric fencing around coop and also has guard dog. COM advised they are very bear aware. COM stated while they were away in the day the turkeys were free ranging and were killed by bears. COM advised game birds are valuable and bear has killed 2 turkeys and over 11 chickens. COM advised bear family unit was on property prior and responded well to hazing. COM advised bear have not retreated far and it appears will continue to feed on the livestock. COM advised all birds and livestock are secure for the night in coops/paddocks. MUELLER provided advice and advised will attend property in the morning and make assessment for action/response required. COM advised bears are not tagged - not family unit removed earlier in week from Portage Rd. 2017-09-30 MUELLER reviewed HWCR reports for family unit within Pemberton area @0815hrs CO MUELLER attended location and met with COM. COM advised bears were on property last night did not access coop. MUELLER did patrol of area. All chickens and turkey inside plywood coop with electric fencing. Based on history reports of sow/cubs accessing coop and killing livestock/property damage. Trap was set for capture - destroy. SEE REF REPORTS Unknown outcome for cubs - determine age/condition/ history to make decision. Believed to be COY. 2017-10-18@ 1100hrs CO MUELLER attended location and removed trap. COM was not present on site. CO noticed some upgrades to husbandry - birds were not free ranging however further upgrades are needed to secure coop and livestock. MUELLER noted a pickup bed full of garbage. Unknown if all bags were attractants. 2017-10-19 @ 1416hrs CO MUELLER contacted COM. COM advised the bears never returned however the trap did catch his dog. No further bear issues were reported. MUELLER advised further upgrades to husbandry are required for COS continued response. MUELLER also discussed concerns for the unsecured garbage. COM stated he was taking the garbage to Whistler today. COM advised he has no secure place to store garbage. MUELLER provided education/advice and advised it is an offence to leave attractant and something is to be done. CO provided advice on shed/duty box. COM stated he has no money to pay for storage and cannot leave garbage in the house as a bear can easily access by pushing on the door since there are no working locks. MUELLER contacted COM who advised sow with cubs (untagged) attended the property around 0830hrs and accessed the secure coop. Bears got one heritage bird and also accessed chicken feed stored in Tupperware containers. COM advised bears have been in area but is the first time they had attended property. COM advised they will be installing electric fencing as they have several birds. @1230hrs CO MUELLER attended location. Location is across the street from where trap was previously set. MUELLER provided trap/bear safety information. 2017-10-27 @ 0800hrs MUELLER received call from ECC Bear in trap. MUELLER attended location and met with COM. Two COY observed on front property. Sow was captured in the trap. COM was concerned as house showing was to occur and didn't want bears shot on property. MUELLER darted sow in trap with good response. COYS were treed and both hit with 2CC first cub went down within 3 minutes and placed in trap with Sow. 2nd COY had no response. 2nd dart was delivered 2cc. No response and bear retreated to large green space. After foot patrol of area cinnamon COY could not be located. Sow and 1 COY were destroyed off site.
