#### Narrative:

2017-10-17 0823

Briefed pre-shift regarding a bear "cub" that had been observed walking along the west coast express tracks. Transit police responded and secured staff and patrons from the area. CO SYER was patched through at the time of the call at 0821hrs and spoke to the dispatcher. The dispatcher confirmed with the members that the bear had left the area into a nearby ravine.

Approximately 20 minutes later, CO SYER received a call for the transit police stating the bear was back. CO SYER was given Cst Shannon's cell phone number and asked to call him for an update. CO SYER was enroute to s 1 to get a trap. There were no traps in the yard. Cst Shannon was called for an update. The bear was no longer in their sight, but he thought it was nearby somewhere. He believed this was the same bear that had been observed in a tree in September and their staff and RCMP attended and removed the people from any apparent danger and the bear left the area. This was not confirmed though as the bear was described as a small bear with no distinguishing marks or noted behaviours.

The bear is described as a smaller, non-aggressive, non-tagged bear. Transit police described his behavior as "aggressive" because it was walking on the tracks near to people. Education on bear activity and behaviour was given. Bear is habituated to humans but was not acting aggressively.

Advice was given to the members and they were advised to maintain public safety if the situation presents itself again in the future and to call RCMP and COS. If they can tree the bear then the bear could be captured and relocated if it meets the criteria on the matrix. Currently the bear is not a candidate for removal and destruction based on it's history.

COS will continue to monitor the situation.

2017-10-18, Sgt. HUNTER was contacted by Translink SSGT. HENYZC and incident and background was discussed. Translink is concerned there is a habituated bear in this area and pointed out a previous occurrence. Sgt. HUNTER noted further follow up to the area and concern is merited. Translink will send e-mail to Sgt. HUNTER detailing previous incident and their concerns and contact numbers.

Sgt. Reviewed. E-mail sent to officer and request to attend site for inspection of area and further follow-up.

#### 2017-10-20 10:06

0900 hrs met with translink NCO Tom Sebastian. Inspected area of sighting. Garbage remaining from homeless person's stay located in woods to the west of CP rail track. No other attractants noted. Email sent to Julie Kanya and Sgt Hunter providing update and request for services.

Hi Julie,

I attended at 2920 Barnet Highway and spoke to Translink NCO Tom about the bear cub that was observed crossing the tracks the other day. The site was inspected at the West Coast skytrain and there are no attractants noted. The bear climbed the CP fence on the south side from Hoy creek crossing the tracks to the north side where it checked out the garbage remains from a homeless individual who has since left the area.

The property is believed to be the cities responsibility where the garbage is located. The garbage is located between the Coquitlam central station and the skytrain station. If you walk southbound past the skytrain towards the wooded area you will see the chain link fence. The camp was located in the wooded and brushy area to the right. There is a hole cut in the CP fence that the Translink NCO will notify CP Rail about.

Would the city come out and clean up the debris?

Also the NCO stated that there is supposed to be a homeless camp to the south, across Hoy creek. I walked there off of Dacre Ave and I assume they were living under the overpass in that area. There was no one there now or rather no attractant issues. The area is a natural bear corridor with plenty of berry bushes and fish.

No bear scat was located on any of the paths I walked on so if they are here, It's not often.

I advised the transit police to call us if the bear is observed in the area. We will continue to monitor at this time.
