[redacted] stated that a sow and cub had entered his house on 2 separate occasions and accessed his fridge and his pantry. CO PAQUIN confirmed the sow and cub were not present and were not currently in the house. [redacted] stated that on Sunday night the sow and cub broke into his house through the side of his house and raided his fridge. [redacted] stated that the bears returned last night, entering through the hole in the house they made and raided his pantry. [redacted] stated enough is enough and elected to call CO PAQUIN. [redacted] further stated that he is leaving tomorrow until and will be returning Sunday. [redacted] stated that he has barricaded the hole in the house with plywood and will be fixing it when he returns. CO PAQUIN and [redacted] discuss WLA 26(2), WLA 75, and safe use of firearms if bears return prior to COS attendance. [redacted] stated that he would prefer not to deal with it himself as he doesn't care to have to do the paperwork required after the fact. [redacted] advised he can be reached through his partner's cell phone. Partner - [redacted] cell phone is [redacted] CO PAQUIN currently in Parksville for WCR Regional Meeting. CO PAQUIN advised Sgt. NEWTON and due to the behaviour of the bear and entering the house multiple times CO PAQUIN will respond and set trap. 14:15 CO PAQUIN departed Parksville for the North Island. CO PAQUIN had to stop at Black Creek office and Sayward along the way. CO PAQUIN called [redacted] and left his a VM advising him that he would be attending that day to set trap. 19:18 hrs CO PAQUIN missed a call from [redacted] CO PAQUIN returned the call and spoke with [redacted] [redacted] advised that [redacted] is watching his residence over the next couple days. [redacted] had [redacted] go and close the door on his fridge so the compressor wouldn't burn out. [redacted] advised that the other night the cub tried to enter the [redacted] through a dog/cat door. [redacted] recommended I call the [redacted] to speak with [redacted] [redacted] stated that [redacted] walks home after work at night and frequently runs into the sow and cub and the sow reportedly huffs and vocalizes towards [redacted] frequently. [redacted] stated CO PAQUIN can set trap anywhere on the property. CO PAQUIN called the [redacted] and spoke with a female who identified herself as [redacted] [redacted] stated that [redacted] was currently not in. CO PAQUIN spoke with [redacted] about the sow and cub, and [redacted] stated that they had entered [redacted] place a couple times. [redacted] confirmed that the cub had poked his head through the cat/dog door in attempt to enter the pub. [redacted] confirmed that it is the sow and single cub that has been causing issues, not the sow with 2 cubs that had previously been in the community. CO PAQUIN advised that he was en route to Holberg, and requested that RAPP be called if sightings or conflicts with the family unit occurred. 22:30 CO PAQUIN arrive in Holberg. CO PAQUIN had difficulty locating [redacted] residence. CO PAQUIN had to attend the WFP office and spoke with a female janitor. The janitor asked CO PAQUIN if he was in town for the sow and cub. CO PAQUIN confirmed he was and the janitor stated that they had been into several house/residences. The janitor stated she didn't like the thought of what was going to have to happen, however she understood that the behaviour of the bears presents a high degree of public safety risk. The janitor showed CO PAQUIN [redacted] residence on a community map in the office. 23:34 CO PAQUIN set trap in the driveway of [redacted] residence. [redacted] residence surrounded by tract of greenspace and a natural stream nearby. If cub is trapped and sow free ranging, several retreat options for sow if public member comes into the driveway. The residence is off the main road and is 1 of 2 residence on the small spur road, therefore little risk of public walking by or walking to the residence. [redacted] is not at home currently, therefore CO PAQUIN will have to return in the morning to check the trap. Bears were not on site at time CO PAQUIN attended and patrols of community CO PAQUIN did not observe any bears. Scene investigation showed that [redacted] property was cluttered with various items and the residence was a trailer that was open underneath. CO PAQUIN observed several pieces of torn up insulation underneath the trailer that was consistent with bear or wildlife causing the damage. CO PAQUIN observed the metal siding on the ground and the plywood barricading the hole in the side of the residence. No attractants observed insecure. 2017-11-23 08:07 CO PAQUIN briefed for HWCR 17-24813. Bear currently in the trap, unknown if sow or cub. 10:49 CO PAQUIN arrive on scene and discover single cub captured in the trap. Sow up an alder tree adjacent to the trap. No other cubs or bears observed. As CO PAQUIN was driving to Holberg, he met [redacted] resident of Holberg who stated to CO PAQUIN that the cub that was caught and the sow up the tree was the target family unit and the ones that have been breaking into residences and structures. 10:59 CO PAQUIN euthanized the sow with his 30.06 rifle. Sow was in a large alder tree that provided a suitable back stop. CO PAQUIN retrieved the sow from the greenspace and noted that the sow was in healthy body condition, had healthy dentition, and was estimated to be 175-200 lbs. [redacted] - WFP employee and COM for HWCR 17-24813 arrived on scene and spoke with CO PAQUIN. [redacted] inquired into the fate of the cub, and CO PAQUIN explained with the bear behaviour of multiple break ins to occupied structures as well as repeated access to the occupied structures the cub is not a candidate for rehabilitation. [redacted] understood and expressed disappointment with community members for being careless/lazy with attractants.
