BC's wild salmon are in danger.

Fish farms in the Broughton Archipelago are **poisoning vital water sources** and spreading deadly diseases to wild salmon -- **putting Indigenous communities and over a hundred species at risk.** [1][2]

They're going to deliver the petition directly to John Horgan tomorrow, but before they do, we need as many people as possible to sign on and support their call to remove open-net fish farms from their waters.

With every day that passes, diseases and viruses from fish farms spread to more and more wild salmon. Sign the petition now, and call on the BC government to end open-net salmon farming in the Broughton Archipelago before it's too late.
