BC – AB Trade Dispute

Highlights:

- On Feb 6, Alberta Premier, Rachel Notley announced that the Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission would stop buying BC Wine.
- Opposition and media may ask if this move violates either the New West Partnership Agreement or the Canada Free Trade Agreement, both of which govern interprovincial trade.

Contrast:

- BC wine producers are facing an unfair attack from Alberta. That's wrong.
- The attack violates the New West Partnership and the Canadian Free Trade Agreement.

Solution:

- Our government is standing up for BC wine producers.
- Alberta's unfair actions on wine contravene both the New West Partnership and the Canadian Free Trade Agreement.
- We have filed a formal complaint under the Canadian Free Trade Agreement.

Background:

- On Feb. 19, BC officially filed a request for consultation under the CFTA, which starts the clock under the dispute resolution mechanisms.
- The first consultation process can take between 120 and 357 days. After the consultation phase, there are several appeals and compliance phases.
- This will be the first time the dispute process under the CFTA has been used. The federal government is responsible for enforcement under this Agreement.

Timeline of dispute:

- On January 30, the BC Environment Minister announced the government is proposing a second phase of regulations to improve preparedness, response and recovery form potential spills.
- On February 1st, Alberta announced it would cease talks on upgrading the existing electricity intertie between BC and Alberta.
- On February 7th, Alberta announced that the Alberta Gaming and Liquor Corporation will cease all purchase of BC wine. In 2017 \$70 million was paid to BC producers for wine shipped to Alberta.
- The move is a violation of AB obligations under both the New West Partnership and the Canadian Free Trade Agreement.
- On December 19, 2017 the Federal Government announced funding for oil spill research "to bring scientists together to improve our collective understanding of how oil spills behave, how best to clean and contain them, and how to best minimize their environmental impacts."
- In 2016, BC wine exports increased 4% to \$9.7 million shipped to 17 international markets.
- The top markets for BC wine were China (54%), Taiwan (23%) and the US (11%)
- Ice wine exports were \$1.8 million of the total.

NEB Appeal

Highlights:

- On Feb 16th, BC filed with the Federal Court of Appeal for leave to appeal the NEB decision to allow Kinder Morgan to bypass City of Burnaby bylaws.
- The Leader of the Opposition has suggested it will inflame tensions with Alberta.

Background:

- The provincial government has applied for leave to appeal a Dec. 7, 2017, ruling by the National Energy Board (NEB), allowing Kinder Morgan to bypass specific City of Burnaby bylaws related to construction work at the Burnaby Terminal and the Westridge Marine Terminal.
- The NEB ruled that Kinder Morgan does not need to comply with City of Burnaby bylaws because the pipeline had been approved by the federal government.
- Kinder Morgan had complained that the municipal permitting process was taking too long and alleged that Burnaby was intentionally delaying.
- BC intervened in the NEB proceedings to argue in favour of municipal and provincial rights to regulate within their jurisdiction.
- The province's position is that the NEB decision erred by too broadly defining federal jurisdiction over interprovincial pipelines.
- Andrew Wilkinson is quoted in media as responding:
 - "John Horgan started this battle and it is totally unnecessary. He really has to rise to the occasion, swallow his pride, and make that phone call to Edmonton to make this all go away. This is hurting BC and it's going to get worse because Ottawa and Edmonton have decided they're going to win, and that means we lose."
