You "beat me to the punch," but I basically found out what you did.

I called back the com and he stated that:

- the slide never reached the creek
- the creek is called McKay Creek
- that the City of Abbotsford and DFO were also involved with this incident
- the slide was about 100 meters long
- that white cloth (erosion control cloth) had been laid down over the slide area and then it was sprayed with a "fast growth" seed mixture

I then called and spoke with Tanya Beetles (Environmental Coordinator with the City of Abbotsford), who stated that:

- the land slide was caused by an "accidental explosion," that occurred in the rock quarry, when an employee placed too much powder into a charge
- the Ministry of Mines shut the quarry operation down for a time
- that an environmental consultation company (Golder Associates) was hired to provide for onsite erosion control
- that the situation is pretty much under control.

I have a call in to Colin Schwindt (FLNRO Senior Aquatic Biologist) to confirm whether or not salmon are present in McKay Creek (or if it's just trout).

I'm unclear as to who, exactly, is the operator.

Do you have any information about this apparent landslide, including when it occurred, and what was the cause?

Recommendation: Have GCPE provide information on background by email.

- . Following a blast at the Lafarge Ward Road Quarry on Jan. 26, a mass of overburden/soil slid downhill toward a local creek.
- A geotechnical engineering consultant was on site on Jan. 27 to assess the landslide and the stability of the slope. The assessment report concludes the landslide stopped approximately 70 metres from the bank of the creek and remained within the mine boundary, no soil or sediment from the landslide reached the creek, and the main landslide deposit appears stable but no work should be carried-out on the slope until further assessment is completed.
- . Starting on Jan. 26 until Feb. 8, the quarry excavated material from the top of the slide in order to reduce the potential for this material to slide down the slope.
- Two rows of silt fencing have been placed beneath the slide to catch any soil that may erode from the slide and straw matting was placed on the upper portion of the slide to help prevent erosion on the slide material.
- A stop-work order restricting any further blasting in this area of the quarry has been issued by the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources, and will remain in place until a design plan prepared by a qualified engineer is submitted and reviewed by the ministry.
- A provincial Mines Inspector visited the site on Jan. 29 and February 6th. The inspections confirmed the summary and conclusions from the geotechnical engineering consultant's report.
- . Lafarge was required to submit the design plan for resumption of quarrying (as noted above), an investigation report of the incident and the geotechnical engineering consultant's assessment report.
