Caelie – FYI. There is no substantive difference between what was presented in the RFL and what will be presented to LRC. There are 2 very minor changes. The RFL indicated that Official Plans would be available for approximately 19 ecological reserves. We are only bringing 15 of these Official Plans forward. We are bringing forth an Official Plan for one additional Class A park (Chilliwack Lake Park) than what was presented in the RFL. This was a requirement of the Office of the Surveyor General since we were providing an Official Plan for Chilliwack River Ecological Reserve which shares a portion of its boundary with the park.

Checking back with you to inquire on the draft report release date looking at how to increase the ecological values on the Elphinstone lower slopes, specifically within the park expansion area.

Since the January 2018 Forest Practises Board report, 'Managing At-Risk Plant Communities near Mount Elphinstone Park', is the most up-to-date look at the ecological values in the study area (building off of the 2015 McCrory Wildlife Conservation review of the same area), I trust that you will be using their report as the main lens in which to address the lack of protection of red and blue listed 'plant communities' in the park expansion area within the context of the Chapman LU.

We look forward to the review and commenting phase.

Known Management Issues Response - The boundary of Site 2 of the park was

incorrectly identified during the designation process and needs to be readjusted. Environmental Stewardship is now discussing a boundary adjustment with Ministry of Forests and will work towards a legislative change. All three of the park sites are relatively small and could be impacted by adjacent development or forestry activities. Work with adjacent management agencies and land owners to protect park values. Unauthorized trail developments could negatively impact natural values in the park. Ensure local community and organizations are aware of park boundaries and mandate, work with local groups to prevent unauthorized developments.

Needless to say that we are in disbelief that with so little old-growth areas left on Vancouver Island business as usual prevails, now with a new government, even in “extreme” locations like this with additional unique values such as orca rubbing beaches at risk, even with government controlled BCTS.

The science for coastal rainforest developed for the GBR is clear: 30% remaining old-growth (for each type of coastal rainforest by landscape unit) is the high ecological risk threshold. Logging more than 70% means we are losing the web of life as we know it. This is what is happening across large parts of Vancouver Island now and there is only a small number of areas left where relatively intact areas with more than 50 or 70% of remaining productive old-growth could be set aside to achieve moderate low ecological risk for species. Our 2016 map (attached) shows that the two adjacent landscape units Tsitika and Naka with Schmidt form the only remaining relatively intact larger area along the entire Eastern half of the Island, with currently more than 50% (moderate ecological risk).

I think the key question that needs to be answered is what “sustainably managing old-growth” (mandate letter) means. I’d think that there would be a threshold informing when you want to stop logging a certain type of old-growth ecosystem (as we have in the GBR) or you log the ecosystem and species found in it out of existence. It’s easy to see that there is no agreement to pursue 70% RONG by ecosystem (with few exceptions) as in the GBR, on Vancouver Island. If not this threshold, what is the provincial perspective for the Island overall and by landscape unit? 30, 20, 10, 5, 1...?

working on a story today about forthcoming federal methane regulations and as part of that I was wondering if it might be possible to speak with Minister Heyman about how BC plans to take action on emissions in BC while seeking to attract LNG investment. Is the minister planning to tax methane emissions through the carbon tax? When might this come into force?

How will federal regulations affect action taken by BC?

Recommendation

Statement (previously approved)

“Our government has always maintained we would welcome potential LNG development only if fits within our four conditions, which include our climate goals and our legislated GHG reduction targets. We’ve committed to reduce our greenhouse gas emissions by 40 percent below 2007 levels by 2030 and by 80

percent by 2050. That remains our goal. We are also working with emissions-intensive industry to ensure they remain competitive. We cannot achieve the necessary reductions in greenhouse gas emissions and do our part in protecting both BC's and the global environment without a significant shift – across all sectors – to a low carbon economy. And while the proposed LNG Canada project in Kitimat would be the world's cleanest in terms of GHG emissions intensity, the work for all of us – in government, business, labour and beyond – is only just beginning. All resource development proposals must be considered within the context of our global commitment to protecting our air, land and water”.

Regarding methane emission carbon tax.

• The is Government committed to taking steps to reduce methane leaking from the oil and natural gas industries.

• To date the carbon tax has not covered these emissions.

Regarding Federal regulations.

• The federal government brought forward proposed regulations to reduce methane emissions from the oil and natural gas sector by 45% by 2025.

• B.C. has the option to adopt these federal regulations or to develop equivalent policies that will attain the same level of methane emission reductions. The Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy is working with other Ministries to review the federal regulations and develop effective methane reduction policies for the oil and gas sector.

Honourable Minister Heyman

We are in receipt of your letter dated April 6, 2018 and we wish to appeal your decision based on the following timeline and facts:

Timeline:

In 2005 the Minister of the Environment approved the Waste Transfer Site as the location for a consolidated WWTP. This is an 18 acre site, owned by the City, not in ALR, and away from all residential homes.

Between 2005 and 2013 the City started looking at a partnership with Catalyst Mill for a WWTP thinking that they could save a lot of money. The Waste Transfer Site was still the approved site.

In 2013 the City disbanded the Advisory Committee for the WWTP.

In 2014 there was a referendum where the community said no to a partnership with Catalyst Mill and yes to a stand alone WWTP. The Waste Transfer Site was still the approved location.

In February 2015 the City officially said no to a partnership with Catalyst Mill.

In June 2015 the City chose to build a consolidated WWTP at a new location in Townsite.

Facts:

The WWTP Advisory Committee, that is mandatory under the MOE guidelines, had their last meeting 2013 and the City shut down this Committee at that time.

The Public was never asked whether they wished to discuss a 4.5 acre WWTP on

the old golf course lands in Townsite with historic homes less than 100 meters away.

In Public Consultation, the minimum standard requires 'those that are most affected by a decision' must be consulted. The City never consulted with those most affected.

From the time the initiative to explore a partnership with Catalyst Mill and the Stage 3 approval by the MOE, there was no public consultation about placing the WWTP in Townsite.

For the past 3 months approximately 70 residents have come to the City's Council of the Whole meetings, overflowing the room and standing in the corridor, saying that they were never consulted about the location and objecting to the lack of discussion on this matter. Something is not right!

Concerned residents of Powell River have asked for details from the City about the process of public consultation for this enormous project. The City's response was that the MOE has approved the process.

Therefore we are asking: For a meeting with yourself and your Deputy Minister in Victoria to discuss the facts as you have been told by the City of Powell River and our facts as residents of Powell River concerning public consultation.

We think you owe us as residents of BC and taxpayers the opportunity to have this discussion.

The Vancouver Fraser Port Authority (VFPA) has been undertaking a Project and Environmental Review (PER) process for the proposed Centerm Expansion Project (Centerm).

Today at 10.00 AM, the VFPA will announce that they have approved Centerm, subject to 86 conditions. Information about the VFPA's decision can be found here: <https://www.portvancouver.com/development-and-permits/status-of-applications/centerm-expansion-project/>.

The EAO will be notifying Aboriginal groups and any public stakeholders who expressed an interest in Centerm, to inform them that the EAO will be reviewing the VFPA's decision over the next few weeks and that, following this review, the EAO will notify them of the proposed next steps and of any opportunities to provide input into the EAO's process.

After a decision has been rendered by VFPA, the EAO will be reviewing

VFPA's decision materials to determine if there are any significant adverse effects anticipated from the project, and if there are any outstanding issues of provincial interest. Through this review, the EAO will determine whether an environmental assessment certificate is required, or whether consideration of an exemption under section 10(1)(b) of the *Environmental Assessment Act* may be appropriate.

The following public stakeholder groups will be notified: Strathcona Residents Association, Burrardview Community Association, and Grandview-Woodland Area Council.
