Narrative	2015-10-12 at approx. 20:45hrs, Sgt. HUNTER contacted NV Police dispatcher. The dispatcher advised there are several officers on scene at the residence and the bear is still inside and not coming out. The dispatcher advised that the bear has an ear tag in its ear. Sgt. HUNTER advised dispatch that the circumstances does merit euthanizing and if the opportunity is provided to take it. At approximately hours, Sgt HUNTER arrived at the LOC and met with the police. Sgt. HUNTER met with a Sgt on scene in backyard and was briefed. Sgt. HUNTER examined the back door residence with the police and found one lone large bear laying in the kitchen of a basement suite eating. The fridge door was open and contents were scattered all over. Sgt. HUNTER was informed that the homeowner came home, was in the back deck area and noticed sliding glass door open of basement suite. Upon further examination the homeowner sent inside and found the residence ransacked with kitchen contents and food scattered all over kitchen area. The homeowner checked out the suite and was confronted by the bear. The homeowner ran to safety and called 911. Sgt. HUNTER and the police flushed the bear from the residence in attempt to flush bear to the back so it would go into a safe line for Sgt. HUNTER to shoot it. There no good shot angles or opportunities for immobilization inside residence. Given the circumstances and previous known issues with tagged bear in North Vancouver, Sgt. HUNTER did not believe the bear was a suitable move candidate, but fit destruction and onsite is best instead of allowing the bear to remain at large in the community hoping a trap would work. The bear did not go in the direction hoped and it went up and around toward the front yard where it was shot by a policeman. Sgt. HUNTER chased the wounded bear through to back yards of several residents where he got into a close confrontation with the bear. Sgt. HUNTER discharged two shot gun slug rounds into the bear at point blank range and flash point shooting. The bear ran to a backyard where Sgt. HUNTER placed two 30.06 rounds into the bear trying to flee into wooded area across the back of residence. Sgt. HUNTER then chased the bear down through the bushes at the back of a residence and placed a follow up fatal shot to ensure bear was dead. The bear was removed from the yard and taken to the NV parks compound and left outside with tarps and blocks on top. 2015-10-12 01:30 Concluded report writing and TOL and went 1035. 2015-10-13 13:00 Sgt. HUNTER departed residence to NV to retrieve carcass and remove it from Park. Sgt. HUNTER disposed of carcass in Squamish landfill with a coyote carcass. 2015-10-13 17:00hrs. Sgt. CO MCNAUGHTON spoke to the principal of the school who informed CO MCNAUGHTON that the bins had been moved to a different location in an attempt to deter the bears from accessing them. CO MCNAUGHTON advised that the bins needed to remain locked no matter where they were located. The principal stated that the bears didn't get into his garbage containers any more but into neighbours garbage bins. CO MCNAUGHTON determined that there was a level of habituation to non natural food sources that was on going with this bear and that it was indifferent to the presence of humans at this point. Due to its location and the public safety concern present as kids were present throughout the area, CO MCNAUGHTON decided to dart the bear and remove it from the area. Upon the first injection of the bear of one vial of zoletil, CO MCNAUGHTON waited a period of 25 minutes. At this point the bear exhibited no signs of the drug and a second vial of Zoletil was darted into the bear. After a period of 35 minutes from second darting, the bear was exhibiting minor symptoms of the drug including licking mouth area, drooling and difficultly moving, but still had full mobility as it moved around branches in the tree. CO MCNAUGHTON shot a third higher concentration vial of ZOLETIL into the bears shoulder in an attempt to drug the bear but this was ultimately ineffective as well. After contacting SGT HUNTER, CO MCNAUGHTON was advised to try another dart, and if unsuccessful HUNTER would bring a different shipment of zoletil provided to Maple Ridge office earlier in the summer. The fourth dart did not have immobilizing effects and SGT HUNTER was called to the scene at roughly 1800. Sgt. HUNTER attended the LOC and met with CO MCNAUGHTON to assist; brought different drugs and darts and assisted. on scene 18:45-20:30.
