2018-01-13 15:12hrs Called COM ██████████ and determined that a bear "approx. size of a Rottweiler or Pyranees dog" although COM believes it is a baby, has been hanging around a house all day. The house has been vacant all winter but COMs ██████████ into the house today. COM believes that the bear may have been denned up under the residence, and that the presence of people around the house today has woken the bear up. The bear keeps trying to get past them and into the porch where the cat food is kept. Bear does not show much fear of humans. CO gave direction to COM to attempt to keep the bear from getting back underneath the house by blocking the hole but advised them to be very careful. 16:15hrs CO attended residence and immediately located the bear cub about 15 feet from the front door of the house even though at least 3 people were actively moving in and out of the house. Bear is smaller than original complainant indicated, approximately 30-40lbs. Met with ██████████ who pointed out the tracks indicating that the bear had been under the house. ██████████ explained that the bear has been present all day and continues to try to enter the porch. No sow has been sighted. COMs ██████████ mentioned that the bear shows no fear and that her ██████████ touched it on the nose a few times. Due to level of food conditioning and human comfort of the cub combined with its young age and fact that it is mid-winter, CO determined that euthanasia is the only option in this circumstance. 16:30hrs Bear removed from residence (male cub) and file concluded. 2018-02-15 10:00 Rec'd voicemail from COM ██████████ advising that she believes there is still something under house. Her ██████████ heard loud bumping, some carpet got sucked down through a small hole in the floor, and the cats will not go anywhere near the house anymore. 2018-02-21 14:01 COs Elliott, Keenan-Toop + Sgt Ackles attended residence and physically went under the house with a thermosensing camera and flashlights. No animals were located. 2018-02-21 14:02

The cub appeared to be struggling and lethargic. COM advised that the cub had been there since earlier this morning and there is no sign of its mother. CO advised COM that he will leave the cub for now in hopes that its mother returns and will follow up in a few hours. CO discussed with Wildlife staff Holger BOHM and COS Sgt. Beetlestone. Wildlife Branch supported capturing cub and sending to Northern Lights Wildlife rehab centre if it appears to be ok enough for transport. 12:12 CO Hawkes received a call back from COM advising that the cub was still on sight and doesn't appear to be doing well. CO attended and checked cub. Area is still under heavy snow cover and there didn't appear to be any food available or signs of another bear. CO was able to walk up to cub and pick it up. It was lethargic but had good muscular strength and didn't appear to have any injuries. CO and lodge staff checked area for other bear tracks in the snow or bear sign but nothing was found. CO transported cub to Selkirk vet clinic for check up. Vet advised that the cub didn't appear to have any injuries or other medical issues other than it was skinny and requires fluids. Vet provided 150 cc of fluids through skin. CO updated Sgt. Beetlestone and Holger Bohn. CO notified  at Northern Lights and confirmed she will rehab cub and arrange for transport. 19:30 CO received call back from COM advising that there was an adult bear sighted walking up their road and turned around but didn't go near the area the cub was rescued. COM not sure if it was the mother or another bear sighted. CO Hawkes provided update to Holger Bohm, Wildlife Biologist. 2018-05-08 0730 CO Hawkes phoned Wildlife Biologist Holger Bohm and discussed further response. Bohm advised that due to the cubs health and the uncertainty of whether the second bear was its mother or if it was the likelihood of returning, the best option for the cubs survival would be to send it off for rehab. 0830 CO Hawkes met with Northern Lights volunteer and sent cub off for rehab. 1400 CO updated COM.

CO was successful in removing another cub and destroyed it. CO's to monitor and await fresh sightings of bears. 2018-08-07 12:19 CO Schoenthal moved and reset at 6 22 2018-08-08 16:00 CO Schoenthal arrived at trap that was reported closed by CO Debruin.
