Request

To speak with the minister regarding a group of citizens concerned with Upland Excavating dumping creosoted timbers in a landfill close to the city of Campbell River's drinking water supply and the potential for contamination this brings.

Background

Recommendation (provide bullets)

- Upland Excavating Ltd.'s application for a new Operational Certificate (to replace the existing, outdated permit), to upgrade their facility to an engineered lined landfill, is under review by Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy (ENV).
- Any new Operational Certificate would only be issued once sufficient technical assessments are completed to confirm that the proposed activities will be protective of the environment or downstream water users.
- Any new Operational Certificate would include notification to stakeholders and feedback received will be considered by the ENV decision maker.
- Upland recently accepted creosote-treated timber from BC Hydro over the summer, and ENV staff are working to collect samples and conduct assessments to determine if the

material has potential to generate leachate that could cause environmental issues. Samples are undergoing analysis and ENV will review the results and recommendations, when available.

- ENV compliance staff conducted an inspection of the site on Sep 12, 2017 and no significant issues were identified. Compliance staff are conducting follow up and reviewing test results regarding the creosote treated timbers to determine if it acceptable to receive this waste source.
