Background

There is a complex interplay between gender and climate change that impacts women in developing and developed countries in significant ways. Women are more vulnerable to the impacts of climate change, and subject to greater economic and employment disparities, and fewer training and career opportunities than men. They are also key agents of change for social, economic and environmental sustainability. In efforts to mitigate and adapt to the impacts of climate change (e.g., the transition to renewable energy, the drought, flood, agricultural failures, forced migration) additional impediments such as social status, economic marginalization, personal safety, access to credit, control and ownership over resources in the household, and the community and society place women in greater conditions of vulnerability. According to the Canadian Women's Health Network "research focused on understanding gendered differences in vulnerability to climate change impacts is sparse." Research on policy and leadership issues must consider approaches that can help surpass stereotypes of women's role in water security, especially women refugees, and women head of households, and help bring about true behavioural and policy changes" [1]. The 2016 global agreement to combat climate change signed at COP21 and the introduction of the UN Sustainable Development Goals, highlight the need to address gender inequality in economic, social and ecological development as interconnected. As Lauren Ravon of Oxfam Canada notes, "targeting adaptation to women can address both climate change and women's rights -- key priorities for this [Canadian] Government." A research and policy roundtable conference that critically examines both vulnerabilities and opportunities through an interdisciplinary lens is timely and relevant.

In Summer 2018 SFU's Faculty of Environment will partner with Women Transforming Cities, the Columbia Institute, BC Council for International Cooperation and others to host an invitational roundtable on Women and Climate Change. "The assignment of responders in Operations to focus on non-floating oils was useful and a

best practice. It is unclear why the non-floating oil detection tactics developed for the U.S. side of the spill

scenario were not also planned for the Canadian side."

The post mortem also noted that the tactics meeting should have but didn't do enough to pin BC down on its resources for spill response: "It should not be a presentation, but instead an engaged interactive meeting. For example, this would have been an opportunity to talk about why the non-floating oil tactics

planned on the Washington side of the river were not also planned for British Columbia, as well as to discuss

the sourcing and type of the equipment resources that were planned for use on the British Columbia side."

Dear Minister Heyman,

As we patiently wait to hear back from your office regarding a meeting to discuss how to capture more of the biodiversity values for these low elevation forests on the Elphinstone slopes, I think its important to look back at the 2003 Park Management Plan and recognize that the way the park was initially set-up did not meet best practices for how to form a park and in fact contained an error that still has not been redressed.

Please note below in bold (c/p from the BC Parks' own web site) what it has to say about the park so you can read it directly in this email.

As a response I've made comments in relation to the 3 issues raised:

- Item #1 regarding Site 2 refers to the fact a logging cutblock occurred in the previously agreed to protected boundary. A "boundary adjustment" to add lost intact forest to Site 2 never happened. A nearby forest area would have been an excellent candidate to add to Site 2 but was log in 2016. That logging resulted in a 2 month road blockade and split the community apart.
- Having a park divided into 3 separate sites with logging occurring in between them is just poor conservation planning and as far as I can tell there is no other provincial park divided into separate zones. Connectivity is a priority to link up the parks and yet BCTS continues o push ahead with a cutblock in the Clack Creek Forest that would break an opportunity to connect up Site 2 with Site 3. Previously, this government has stated that they will address the long over due connectivity issue, however will not consider a moratorium on proposed cutblocks.

Unauthorized mountain bike trailbuilding continues at a rapid pace and our
complaints to the local Conservation Officer has not deterred trailbuilders.
On any given weekend, the park is crowded out with bikers from the Lower
Mainland and Pacific Northwest states. In the mountain biking world you
do Whistler, North Shore, Moab, Utah and then Elphinstone. This is great
for local tourism, however hard on the ecology and needs to be regulated.

The longer our meeting is delayed and a resolution to the 3 Management issues are addressed the ecology of the area will diminish.

Mount Elphinstone Provincial Park Purpose Statement and Zoning Plan Primary Role

The primary role of Mount Elphinstone Provincial Park is to protect a mixed old growth and second growth forest and the very diverse and rich fungi populations associated with the forest. The park protects a relatively undisturbed lower elevation forest in three separate sites and provides the biogeoclimatic conditions appropriate for extensive fungi populations. Secondary Role: The secondary role is to provide local and regional recreation opportunities for fungi interpretation and viewing, hiking and mountain biking.

Known Management Issues Response:

- 1. The boundary of Site 2 of the park was incorrectly identified during the designation process and needs to be readjusted. Environmental Stewardship is now discussing a boundary adjustment with Ministry of Forests and will work towards a legislative change.
- 2. All three of the park sites are relatively small and could be impacted by adjacent development or forestry activities. Work with adjacent management agencies and land owners to protect park values.
- 3. Unauthorized trail developments could negatively impact natural values in the park. Ensure local community and organizations are aware of park boundaries and mandate, work with local groups to prevent

I wondered if you folks had put out an updated statement over the weekend on the Trans Mountain spill outside Kamloops.

I also would like to know if we would work out 5 or 10 minutes in the minister's schedule today for a brief interview. There's a lot of curiosity about how this unfolded and we'd like to get a better understanding of the spill reporting process and why it took almost two weeks to get a better

understanding of the spill's volume and/or consequences. And I'd like to get a better sense of how the ministry responds when a spill like this is reported.

Recommendation (email response below attributed to the Ministry)

At approximately 5am on May 27, 2018, Kinder Morgan notified the ministry of an oil spill at their Darfield Pump Station near Barriere, B.C. The Kinder Morgan initial report indicated approximately 100 litres of light crude oil had leaked from a flow meter. The leak was reported by Kinder Morgan and they indicated it was contained within their property and no waterways were affected. The company's emergency response was activated and spill clean-up was initiated.

Regulatory notifications to First Nations, neighbours and other stakeholders in the vicinity were completed at the time of the spill Under provincial regulations, 100 L is the minimum threshold that needs to be reported. Later, on the day of the spill, Kinder Morgan issued a public statement indicating clean-up was underway, they were investigating and there was no specific estimate of volume spilled available.

On June 1, 2018, Kinder Morgan revised the spill volume from 100L to 4800L.

Ministry officials have communicated with Kinder Morgan the importance of accurate and timely volume reporting.







In accordance with the *Greenhouse Gas Reduction Targets Act*, every provincial public sector organization (PSO) must annually publish a Carbon Neutral Action Report (CNAR) detailing their greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions for the year, their plans and actions taken to reduce emissions, and offsets retired to achieve net-zero emissions.

The Provincial government's total GHG emissions increased by 4.3% from 2016 to 2017. This is largely the result of increases in both fleet and building related emissions. The weather of 2017 was an important factor in both cases.

On one hand, warm and dry conditions during the summer of 2017 contributed to a more intense fire-fighting season and a significant increase in consumption of fleet fuels in support of wildfire suppression, enforcement and investigation, as reported by the ministries responsible (FLNRORD, and ENV).

On the other hand, the colder winter of 2017, as evidenced by a significant year-over-year increase in "Heating Degree Days" (a measure of the demand for energy to heat a building), led to an increase in consumption of fuels for space heating in Provincial government buildings, and thereby, increased related emissions.

Notwithstanding the recent year-over-year increase in emissions, Provincial government emissions have been trending downward since the 2010 baseline year, with 2017 still consistent with that trend at 22.7% below 2010 levels.
