The blaze is indeed that from yesterday's unaccompanied fire within [REDACTED] yard space with many wreck vehicles scattered throughout it. The mini-flame-thrower incident was in-front of the same property, and caused by those associated with [REDACTED] son's - two days prior to the main fire itself.

The black smoke and putrid smell - gave rise for concern toward repeated burning of vehicle tires on [REDACTED] residential property for which those within the local Environmental Agency have already created a report from his mass improper behaviour relating to fluids/oil spewing from those leaking commercial vehicles on his property (littering directly on the main water shed) and highway between his property and our own.

Good Morning,

Within minutes of reporting this very concerning incident within [REDACTED] residential yard directly opposite ourselves yesterday to RAPP - noted the arrival of two Fire Engines from our local station.

The engines had to remain outside on the roadside due to the many differing vehicles/obstacles within [REDACTED] yard causing an obstruction of passage for the Fire Personnel's ability to gain access - vehicles were moved - allowing the Fire Engine to progress into [REDACTED] yard, and after approximately forty minutes on-site - they fully extinguished the fire before leaving.

As previously reported - this is not the first extremely damaging and disturbing fire created by [REDACTED] Approximately two years ago in the commercial yard below - he created an extremely alarming fire from his actions when crushing a large number of wrecked vehicles - which sparked their contents into a raging fire and billowing black smoke across this entire area - placing residents at risk.

We would like to thank in admiration the First Class service of the men and women of our local Fire Department for their professionalism, speed and agility toward bringing this concerning matter to a safe conclusion. The positivity shown from the Fire Department provides comfort knowing we reside within a heavily wooded semi-rural location - where this kind of behaviour can easily create a wild fire for all to endure.

More concerning, one of the male individuals involved with the desire toward creating mini-flame-throwers via the use of aerosol cans (not present from the extremely large fire) allegedly advised RCMP he had some form of "fire training" which he presumably felt allowed him to act in this fashion!

Good Afternoon,

Less than three days have past since the report invoking the use of aerosol cans to produce a mini-flame thrower within the tree's roadside opposite of driveway by [REDACTED] friends, and within the past thirty minutes we returned home on this road - passed by [REDACTED] in his vehicle recovery truck prior to reaching our residence. On arrival to our driveway - glanced-over due to our gaze being caught by large flames and black smoke emanating from [REDACTED] yard. The flames were so large they began to catch the tree's on fire high above. The fire was close to numerous wrecked vehicles within his yard. We took images as evidence of this unaccompanied fire - which may have had vehicle tires burning within it as the smoke was black and the smell was intense.

I quickly went inside to call RAPP 5555 to report it - they were processing the report to the fire Marshal.

Please can you assist with the clarity required surrounding those who deliberately use aerosol cans - convert them in to mini-flame-throwers, and slice through shrubbery/trees outside of private property (roadside of the highway) which could have create a Forest Fire in these current extremely hot/dry conditions.

Staff Sergeant Ryan Curtis (Commander) Creston BC RCMP - believes from the images sent to him directly after the incident, and after his female officer left the site without corresponding with me as the complainant - simply telephoned me some time after she left - indicating she accepted the response from the males in-question and made no attempt toward obtaining the images I advised her were available.

Wouldn't this be considered attempted arson?

We reside in a rural location surrounded by thousands of acres of shrubbery/trees - very irresponsible approach taken by Creston RCMP in my opinion.

Today, we have noted numerous visits to the original yard below by [REDACTED] in order that he can transport all the vehicles from that location to- newly intended site. Clearly, any reports of his active use of this area as his newly installed wreckers yard remains very active on his part regardless of the fact he has no permission or any decision made by the ALC.

Equally today - noted male associates of [REDACTED] working on dismantling of vehicles in his residential yard as a group. The two visiting males decided to use filled aerosol cans - which they then set on fire in order to create mini-flame-throwers. I took images via iPhone (provides a two second movement as an image) showing them slicing through the air and on-to trees at chest height. When they saw me taken their pictures - they quickly threw the cans over the fence in-to [REDACTED] yard and got in-to their [REDACTED] and drove-off.

The same two males returned approximately an hour later - parked as before, and went inside [REDACTED] yard.

We called RCMP due to their behaviour - when they finally arrived - the males denied causing any fire/flame-throwing and the female officer accepted their response. I advised her I had images which would clarify the opposite - she made no attempt toward obtaining these images - only asking if I wanted to talk with [REDACTED] about it. I politely refused!

Good Afternoon Each Respectfully,

Today, and within the past two hours - received a telephone call from Mr. James Barber (Conservation Officer Creston BC) indicating his recent attendance of s.22 "residential" property, and discussion entered into with Mr. Michael Moore (Creston Fire Chief)

Mr. Barber advised me - his discussion with the Fire Chief made clear there were NO prohibited Materials being discovered from s.22 most recent large fire, and equally indicating s.22 had covered-over the site with soil. I was provided with Mr. Barber's advice to s.22 - indicating he was now being watched locally and should note that when burning in the future. Mr. Barber stated - I can't fine someone for being dangerous or stupid - I can't just dish-out tickets willy-nilly as I have to justify with evidence my reasons to the court.

I spoke with the Fire Chief soon after receiving this call from Mr. Barber, in order to obtain his own clarity toward his findings - no such indication was indicated toward the burning of prohibited materials to Mr. Barber, and this can equally be confirmed from within the Fire Chief's own email previously issued below, and from within this thread.

Mr. Barber, from my own conclusion of his limited approach toward these repeated matters - clarified my enquiry of him - no action or fine will be issued to s.22 for the following...

(1) From the image showing the smashing-up of part of his residential home previously issued to all local authorities as an unsightly condition within his yard for a lengthy period of time.

(2) The same site of that smashed-up building containing hundreds of used tires previously alleged by s.22 as an intended retaining wall.

(3) Setting fire to those contents.

(4) s.22 leaving his residence in his flat-bed-truck - thus an unattended large fire.

(5) Less than 48 hours of this major fire - same residence involved within the igniting of aerosol cans as mini-flame-throwers being sliced through the trees/shrubbery roadside.

(6) two weeks previously to the main fire - another fire took place during the evening hours on s.22 property. We were forced to close all windows/doors as the extremely heavy black putrid smoke from burning rubber was causing considerable disturbance within our home. s.22

s.22

s.22 - I was asked to report the matter to RAPP instead, and they would feed it down-the-line to him the official way once back at work.

(7) Approximately two years ago - major fire caused by s.22 irresponsibility when crushing vehicles in the yard below - sparking their contents into a raging inferno for traffic movements to endure on the main highway alongside it, and residents to be on readiness of evacuation.

What does s.22 have to cause before any responsible action is taken against his chosen preferred repeated behaviour - behaviour which appears to be aided and abetted by certain agencies lack of responsible action.

When I first begun reporting serious matters to all respective authorities - local residents advised me I would be wasting my valuable time and safety by reporting matters - they simply go ignored or result in no action towards s.22 behaviour. All you encourage is s.22 constant wrath towards you. We (residents) gave-up long ago reporting him knowing he simply gets away with whatever he causes - this is why we haven't added ourselves into your complaints in large numbers.

I maintained an open mind, and asked them to assist regardless. We can't expect action - if we don't report it. However, since making those reports, and receiving the complete lack of

assistance via RDCK or Mr. Barber (Conservation Officer) I can only conclude those residents to be correct in their own conclusive frustrated positions.

Therefore, and from the total disregard toward safety within the community. I have reached the disturbing and sadden decision - which will result in my avoidance toward any future reports that would normal aid the authorities in their investigations due to either silence or negativity to-date. If any future fires are ignited by s.22 - which may possibly result in a serious forest fire or major environmental pollution within our rural location - understand why we now take this equally negative approach as certain other agencies of failure toward the community.

I passed this same sadden position to our local Fire Chief earlier today. However, making clear - no negativity was being pointed towards the men and women of our first class Fire Department.

Within minutes of reporting this very concerning incident within s.22 residential yard directly opposite ourselves yesterday to RAPP - noted the arrival of two Fire Engines from our local station.

The engines had to remain outside on the roadside due to the many differing vehicles/obstacles within s.22 yard causing an obstruction of passage for the Fire Personnel's ability to gain access - vehicles were moved - allowing the Fire Engine to progress into s.22 yard, and after approximately forty minutes on-site - they fully extinguished the fire before leaving.

As previously reported - this is not the first extremely damaging and disturbing fire created by s.22 . Approximately two years ago in the commercial yard below - he created an extremely alarming fire from his actions when crushing a large number of wrecked vehicles - which sparked their contents into a raging fire and billowing black smoke across this entire area - placing residents at risk.

We would like to thank in admiration the First Class service of the men and women of our local Fire Department for their professionalism, speed and agility toward bringing this concerning matter to a safe conclusion. The positivity shown from the Fire Department provides comfort knowing we reside within a heavily wooded semi-rural location - where this kind of behaviour can easily create a wild fire for all to endure.

More concerning, one of the male individuals involved with the desire toward creating mini-flame-throwers via the use of aerosol cans (not present from the extremely large fire) allegedly advised RCMP he had some form of "fire training" which he presumably

Today, we have noted numerous visits to the original yard below by s.22 in order that he can transport all the vehicles from that location -to- newly intended site. Clearly, any reports of his active use of this area as his newly installed wreckers yard remains very active on his part regardless of the fact he has no permission or any decision made by the ALC.

Equally today - noted male associates of the s.22 working on dismantling of vehicles in his residential yard as a group. The two visiting males decided to use filled aerosol cans - which they then set on fire in order to create mini-flame-throwers. I took images via iPhone (provides a two second movement as an

image) showing them slicing through the air and or on-to trees at chest height. When they saw me taken their pictures - they quickly threw the cans over the fence in-to s.22 yard and got in-to their s.22 and drove-off.

The same two males returned approximately an hour later - parked as before, and went inside s.22 yard.

We called RCMP due to their behaviour - when they finally arrived - the males denied causing any fire/flame-throwing and the female officer accepted their response.
