2018-11-07 11:45 CO PARKER phoned C/N. C/N stated that a cougar had killed 3 and injured 2 of her sheep over the course of three incidents. C/N discovered one sheep injured in the neck area and patched it up then left for a short time. On her return the sheep had been killed and another was injured. Later that evening another sheep was injured and C/N put it down, At 1am C/N and S.22 found one more badly injured sheep and one injured sheep. s.22 put badly injured sheep down. In total, 1 sheep was found dead, 2 were injured and put down, and 2 were found injured and bandaged up.

12:10 CO PARKER and CO BERGER attended location. \$.22 showed CO's where the sheep were located in the field. CO's examined the area and found a mix of coyote and domestic dog tracks. All coyote tracks identified were fresher than the kill based on the frost found in the tracks and the frost over the kill sites. Many dog tracks appeared to be same age as the kills. There were signs of a struggle with blood and tracks around all kill sites.

CO's examined all three carcasses and found many canine marks all along sides and a few bite marks on throat. On skinning carcasses CO's observed most bites had not punctured the hide. There was no sign of feeding on any of the carcasses. CO's observed one of C/N's dogs (great Pyrenees) stays with sheep and had blood frozen to fur on snout and head, and appeared to be afraid. C/N stated that this dog was tied up during all but the first attack. Other two dogs were a St. Bernard with canines that appeared to be similar to marks found on sheep, and a Red Heeler. C/N stated that they would like to know what dogs were killing their sheep and would set trail cams to monitor sheep.
