<!--[if !supportLists]-->•<!--[endif]-->The funds were used to clean the site and remove the debris that was hanging from the structures, to make the site safe for additional assessment.

<!--[if !supportLists]-->•<!--[endif]-->The assessment resulted in the development of the proposal and budget from Heritageworks Ltd. (attached).

Parks and Heritage Branch to ensure that there is agreement on what kinds of heritage maintenance the structure requires and if the costs as proposed are appropriate. This is underway now.

<!--[if !supportLists]-->•<!--[endif]-->Should the decision be made to fully implement the Heritageworks proposal, funding will need to be pursued, either from Treasury Board, from partners, or a combination of sources.

- Friends of Morden Mine met with MLA Routley and presented a funding request for \$158K and apparently, MLA Routley was optimistic about finding the funding.
- RJC engineers are doing structural analysis (as per their proposal) and developing a prioritised strategy for repairs that can be implemented during multiple phases as/when funds allow.
- Repair work using the current funding is scheduled to start during the week of August 27<sup>th</sup>.
- Update from Heritageworks Ltd.: Tentatively scheduled to start work next week but they haven't received the engineering report from RJC that they were expecting. Heritageworks is following up with RJC and expects the work will be delayed a couple of weeks.
