Dear Minister Donaldson,

In a Dec. 21, 2018 letter sent to the Sunshine Coast Regional District (SCRD), the Executive Director for the Coast Region, Mr. Allan Johnsrude, address two forestry issues facing the lower Sunshine Coast - The Reed Rd Forest and The Clack Creek Forest area. These 2 forests are proposed BCTS blocks, however each has been deferred for over 4 years due to community concerns and ongoing new information bringing to light their unique ecological and recreational values.

You're aware that the SCRD is opposed to any 'forestry development' in each area. In the letter Johnsrude writes: "Cognizant of the expressed concerns, a response to these SCRD resolutions from Minister Donaldson is expected in the near future."

Minister, residents are wondering what the time-frame of the "near future" might be? We're concerned that if this near future is 6-10 months out, then current forest development proposals on the 2 blocks may proceed under current land use & management approaches.

We urge you to be cautious about supporting a land use plan for the Mt. Elphinstone area while at the same allowing logging to occur in the two most contentious areas. As you can appreciate - Log & Talk would not be welcomed

here.

Can you respond directly to ELF, as the lead group on these two forest protection campaigns, providing more certainly on the status of these two critical forests?

Representatives from the PRRD and Concerned Citizens for Caribou Recovery met with the Provincial Ministers of Environment and Forests and Lands on January 23 at the BC Natural Resources Forum.

The meeting concluded with a commitment from the Province to initiate public and stakeholder engagement in early February on the draft Partnership Agreement to recover caribou in the Peace region. As part of the engagement the Province committed to sharing data and analyses on potential impacts of the Agreement and made a commitment to work with the PRRD on the evaluating impacts of the Agreement on Peace communities. The Agreement will not be finalized until engagement is complete and potential impacts on communities and workers are understood.
