HUNTER contacted the complainant at the number provided and learned the bear is not leaving and is right next to the school yard. The bear has not left for several hours and appears to be lethargic and confused. Sgt. HUNTER learned that it was close to the time children would be released from the school. Sgt. HUNTER provided advice on controlled release. Sgt. HUNTER contacted CO PLAMONDON and re-directed the officer to the school as he was the closest officer to respond. The school was just about to let children out for the day. At approximately 15:00 and 15:30 hrs, officers arrived on scene and observed the bear. An attempt was made to immobilize and remove the bear but was unsuccessful due to the dense shrubbery and vegetation. Sgt. HUNTER learned the bear had been frequenting the area and there was signs the bear had been in area for quit some time. Showed signs of habituation to un natural food sources and was frequenting the area. The Bear was euthanized due to high level of habituation and to ensure the publics safety in the area. Living in a small wooded area adjacent to homes and school. Found to be an adult female approx. 3-4 years of age with no signs of lactation or swollen mammary glands. Bear was removed from the wooded area by officers. The school will put out a bulletin regarding promoting bear smart practices and some details of why it had been removed. Bear was provided to the Katzie First Nation for ceremonial purposes. 2019-02-06 19:30hrs concluded outcome and ended shift. 2019-02-07 11:11 File completion.</p>
