- the outcome of the investigation into fish plant effluent across the province last year?
- whether any changes have been implemented at the plant in Tofino, or elsewhere following the investigation
- whether the ministry has concerns about PRV being found near outfalls from fish plants If someone is available to speak to this, I'm available to do the interview by phone.

(EMA) for fish processing facilities. The objective of the project is to ensure that effluent discharge permits in the fish processing sector contain provisions that are protective of the environment. The permit amendment project is currently underway.

Through this work, some facilities have proposed additional treatment to improve their effluent quality.

Request

I'm a writer for HowStuffWorks. My editor assigned me to write a short article about the large cave recently discovered in Wells Gray Provincial Park, which I have read actually was first spotted by employees from the ministry who were doing a caribou survey from the air. Is there someone who would be able to answer a few questions about the cave and its discovery (and the significance) by email?

Recommendation

- 1. What is the significance of the discovery of the cave in Wells Gray Provincial Park? Is it mostly the size that is noteworthy, or are there other qualities that make it an important find?
 - Geologist, Catherine Hickson, who did her PhD research in Wells Gray Provincial
 Park, visited the cave in September of this year, has stated that the cave is the
 largest known of its type; a variety of striped karst, which is marble interspersed
 with other types of ancient rock Additionally, it is in an area where a cave of this
 type is unusual.
- 2. Since the cave has such a large, prominent entrance, why did it remain undiscovered for so long? Is that due to the remote location?
 - It is thought that due to the recession of the glaciers, it is now visible, however this is yet to be confirmed.
 - There is no way to determine its age until further exploration takes place.
- 3. What were the circumstances of the aerial discovery? Was that the first time that an

aircraft had flown over that location?

- In the spring of 2018, members from the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource
 Operations and Regional Development were conducting a caribou survey by
 helicopter and photographed a large pit that is now known to be the opening to
 the karst cave.
- This is not the first time this survey has been conducted however the cave was not noticed during previous flights - the cave could have been missed or obscured by snow/ice.
- 4. What are the cave's estimated dimensions at this point? How much uncertainty is there about the size?
 - The actual size of the cave in Wells Gray Park is not known at this time, since an
 expedition has only ventured into the opening area. It has the potential to be
 massive
 - The entrance pit to the cave is about 100 metres long and 60 metres wide. While its depth is hard to measure because of the mist from a waterfall, initial examinations show it is at least 135 metres deep.
- 5. What was the extent of the subsequent investigation of the cave site? The Canadian Geographic article said that one of the explorers was able to go 80 meters into the cave before an underground river prevented further passage.
 - 80m would be approximate, however this should be confirmed by those cavers involved in the investigation.
- 6. Has the cave been surveyed using LIDAR or other technological tools at this point?
 - We are not able to confirm what technology was used by the cavers involved in the initial exploration.
- 7. What will be the process or strategy for exploring the cave? What will be the next steps? Is it feasible for a team of explorers to venture inside? If so, who will do that?
 - Until risks to public safety have been assessed and engagement with First Nations
 has been concluded, the newly discovered cave and surrounding area will
 remain closed and no cave exploration will take place.
 - When First Nations consultation has concluded, BC Parks will work with First Nations, geologists, and experienced advanced cavers to move toward planning and conduct further exploration. Any access granted to the cave would be through application and approval of a Park Use Permit.
- 8. I know the exact location hasn't been revealed publicly, but will the BC government be taking other steps to prevent people from finding it and attempting to enter? Is there a way to remotely monitor the entrance?
 - As stated on our BC Parks webpage, a Director's order has been issued closing the area surrounding the cave
 - Until First Nations Consultation has concluded, for Public Safety, and conservation and ecological values have been determined, the Director's Order will remain in effect and no further exploration will be conducted.
- Any member of the public in contravention of Order is subject to the following: i. Under Section 17 of the *Park Act*, Section 28
- ii. 28 (1) A person who contravenes any provision of this Act commits an offence and is liable to a fine of up to \$1,000,000 or a term of imprisonment of not more than one year or both.
- iii. (3) When a contravention of the Act or regulations continues for more than one day, the person is guilty of a separate offence for each day on which the contravention

Request

Reporters are inquiring about the closure (posted on the BC Parks website) of the cave in Wells Gray Provincial Park and are wondering if someone can talk about it.

- Why does BC Parks want people to stay away?
- How will you deter people from showing up?
- What are the potential penalties?
- How important is the cave?
- What First Nations are being consulted?
- Will the province be contributing any funds to the expedition?

Recommendation

- Why does BC Parks want people to stay away?
 - BC Parks has issued a Directors Order to ensure Public Safety, accommodate First
 Nations consultation, provide time to determine heritage, conservation and
 ecological values, and to preserve the integrity of the cave and surrounding area.
- How will you deter people from showing up?

• By issuing the Directors Order under Section 17 of the Park Act, closing the cave and surrounding area.

Any member of the public in contravention of Order is subject to the following:

Park Act, Section 28:

- A person who contravenes any provision of this Act commits an offence and is liable to a fine of up to \$1,000,000 or a term of imprisonment of not more than one year or both.
- (3) When a contravention of the Act or regulations continues for more than one day, the person is guilty of a separate offence for each day on which the contravention continues
- BC Parks is managing the situation of closure as it relates to the Director Order issued for the location. Consideration is being given to compliance actions at this time (signage, cameras, patrols, but detailed information may not be released publicly).
- What are the potential penalties?

Any member of the public in contravention of Order is subject to the following: i. Under Section 28 of the *Park Act*:

- (1) A person who contravenes any provision of this Act commits an offence and is liable to a fine of up to \$1,000,000 or a term of imprisonment of not more than one year or both.
- (3) When a contravention of the Act or regulations continues for more than one day, the person is guilty of a separate offence for each day on which the contravention continues.
- How important is the cave?
 - This is thought to be the largest cave in Canada, however this has not yet been confirmed.
 - Until heritage, conservation and ecological values have been determined and further exploration has concluded, it is difficult to determine the importance of the cave.
 - Geologist, Catherine Hickson, who conducted her PhD research in Wells Gray
 Provincial Park, visited the cave in September of this year, has stated that the
 cave is the largest known of its type; a variety of striped karst, which is marble
 interspersed with other types of ancient ocean rock. Additionally, it is in an area
 where a cave of this type is unusual.

Which First Nations are being consulted?

- Simpcw First Nation
- Canim Lake Indian Band.

Will the province be contributing any funds to the expedition?

- The initial exploration flight in September was partially funded by BC Parks.
- Additional funding for further exploration has yet to be determined.
