Hope all is well with you. lovely coverage of your journeys throughout our wonderful Province.

An update of our adventures I will try to keep it short.

16 more vessels from mainly Sooke and Pender Island have been approved for removal.

We are trying to get 32 more fast-tracked before the rit is dropped on the Fed Election. 5 Sechelt, 5 Gabriola, 6 Penelakut, 1 St Vincent Bay, 1 Long Harbour, 1 Ganges Habour, 2 Fulford Harbour, 6 Sooke Harbour and Basin, 2 Port Browning, 1 Booth Inlet.

We are asking the Transport Minister through MP Pam GoldSmith Jones for fast-tracking seizure as most are these are sunk or destroyed, that regions of lesser population be granted 100 % cost. And last but not least \$100,000 for our feasibility study going ahead with all things Dead Boat Breaking and sustainable recycling St Vincent Bay.

The CRD till the end of the program will allow us to access \$168,000 for 25% of the funding Abandoned Boats.

Of note and please keep this under your hat, Ralmax has gone forward and built a ways for recycling vessels up to 175 ft and 1200 metric tons at the east end of Point Hope Ship, this will be an ISO standard ship breaking/wrecking facilities, will allow us to go forward with the abandoned boats. The only one so far in the West Coast of North America, I am so excited. Picture below
