A mature adult, male wolf was provided to the wildlife veterinarian by CO Kissinger at 8 AM, March 26, 2020. s.16 in a fresh state and transported to the Nanaimo Regional office for necropsy.

NECROPSY FINDINGS:

The necropsy was performed at noon. The carcass (as presented) weighed 65 lbs. There was significant subcutaneous fat. A bullet entry site was noted caudal to the left shoulder with the trajectory wound passing through the thorax and into the right shoulder area. A large blood clot was covering the lungs and heart on opening the thorax. The left upper lateral 2^{nd} to 5^{th} ribs were fragmented by the bullet and the ventral trachea and both cranial and middle lung lobes were lacerated. On removal of the lungs and heart, 10 hard, oblong, pale masses from 1-2.5 cm in size were observed on the right 10 ribs, midway up the thoracic wall in a lateral chain. While the ribs were rigid, the bone was easy to cut through, above and below the masses. There was significant fat in all body depots. The stomach contained most if not an entire adult beaver. The remainder of the gastrointestinal tract was not examined. The carcass was labelled and frozen.

COMMENTS:

The wolf was in excellent body condition and appeared to have been feeding on natural food sources. There was a significant pre-existing injury of the thorax where 10 ribs on the right side of the animal appeared to have been fractured and subsequently healed. However, it is also possible that the rib lesions are from a chronic infection so laboratory work is needed to confirm the cause of these rib lesions. The cause of death was gunshot and the death was immediate.



DISTRICT OF ELKFORD

BYLAW NO. 747, 2014

A bylaw to regulate the discharge of Firearms

The Municipal Council of the District of Elkford, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

1. Citation.

This Bylaw may be cited for all purposes as "District of Elkford Firearms Regulation Bylaw No. 747, 2014".

2. Definitions:

In this bylaw:

Bow means a longBow, recurve Bow, short Bow, compound Bow or crossBow from which any arrow or bolt may be discharged by means of a Bowstring and that is capable of causing serious bodily injury or death.

Bylaw Enforcement Officer means any member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, British Columbia Conservation Officer Service, a Bylaw Enforcement Officer or any Person appointed by Council to enforce this bylaw pursuant to s. 264 of the *Community Charter*.

Council means the Mayor and Council of the District of Elkford.

District means the District of Elkford.

Firearm means a barreled weapon from which any shot, bullet, or other projectile can be discharged by means of an explosion, compressed gas or spring and that is capable of causing serious bodily injury or death to a Person. This includes rifle, shotgun, handgun, pellet gun, BB gun, spring gun, paintball gun and includes any frame or receiver of such a barreled weapon and anything can be adapted for use as a Firearm.

Person means any individual, corporation, partnership, association or other legal entity and includes any trustee, executor, administrator or other legal representative.

3. Discharge of Firearms

- 3.1 No Person shall discharge or cause or permit to be discharged a Firearm or Bow within the area of the District of Elkford as shown on Schedule 'A' attached hereto.
- 3.2 Notwithstanding 3.1 a Peace Officer, an employee of the Province of British Columbia, Government of Canada or the District may discharge Firearms, within the District of Elkford, when required to do so in the performance of their duties.

3.3 No provision of this Bylaw shall prevent or restrict the discharge of a Firearm under the Livestock Act, in the District of Elkford.

4. Permits

- 4.1 Notwithstanding Section 3.1 a permit may be issued to a Person or organization for the discharge of Firearms within the No Discharge of Firearm Boundary for a special event or festival and the permit issued shall be in the manner of Schedule 'B' attached hereto.
- 4.2 Any permit issued pursuant to the provisions of Section 4.1 may be cancelled by the Bylaw Enforcement Officer or Corporate Officer for any just cause or reason.
- 4.3 Applications for a permit must be made in writing and deposited with the Corporate Officer and must clearly indicate the purpose for which the permit is required; the time and place at which the use will take place; the Person who will be responsible; and any further information which the Corporate Officer or the local police department may require.


5. Enforcement and Entry


5.1 A Bylaw Enforcement Officer is authorized to enforce this bylaw and to enter, at all times, on any day, upon any property within the District if the Bylaw Enforcement Officer has grounds to believe that the provisions of this bylaw are not being complied with to ascertain whether there is compliance with the provisions of this bylaw.

6. Offence

- 6.1 A Person is guilty of a contravention of this Bylaw and commits an offence who:
 - a) violates any provisions of this bylaw;
 - b) causes or permits any act or thing to be done in contravention or violation of any provisions of this bylaw; or
 - c) neglects or omits to do anything resulting in contravention of this bylaw.
- 6.2 For each day that a contravention of this bylaw occurs, such shall constitute a separate and distinct offence.
- 6.3 Every Person who commits an offence under this bylaw is liable to:
 - (a) a fine and penalty of not more than \$1,000.00 and not less than \$100.00 for each offence if issued a municipal ticket under the District Ticket Information Bylaw or any amendments thereto; or
 - (b) a fine and penalty of not more than \$10,000.00 and not less than \$500.00 for each offence if prosecuted pursuant to the provisions of the *Offence Act*, R.S.B.C., Chapter 338.
- 6.4 The District may restrain a Person who contravenes this bylaw by making application to a Court of competent jurisdiction for injunctive relief in addition to any penalty that may be imposed pursuant to s. 6.3 hereof.

Thanks for the photos! He does look like he is less than two in the initial photo. Since that makes him at least 8 years of age, lets go with that. His challenge is to find a new habitat. Wolves do this all the time. Packs get broken up and they redistribute. If he encounters an established pack he will likely avoid them but no one can predict that he will be accepted or attacked. If he finds another single wolf he may have company. He is quite a unique fellow so I think the best result is that we never do know — I wish him well.

Thank you for responding to my query and the information you provided. The one question I have concerns his age and whether it is possible to ascertain what that might be? I have sent you some images of Takaya that you can do with as you please.

This image is of Takaya when I first encountered him on 19 September 2012. He seems fully formed to me, but to a Veterinarian he may show some immaturity. For some reason we thought he might be a least two years old. What is your more knowledgeable assessment based on the image?

Over the many years that I have observed him from my kayak, he doesn't seem to have altered in any significant way regarding his physical structure. His fur coloration has

altered slightly over the years. <image002.jpg>

This image provides details about his head and upper body. Although it seems that I am fairly close, the lens I employed was 600mm.

From our observations over the last seven and a half years, his nose seems to be the one part that has been injured most often. Encounters with River Otters and Harbor Seals would I suspect be the cause. He also had a burden of fleas as we would see him scratching himself on numerous occasions.

He is certainly a remarkable, adaptable and intelligent animal. Hopefully those characteristics will insure his continued survival.

I have not and did not plan to produce anything formal. What was it you were looking for?

The wolf was an adult male of a similar coat colour to the wolf on Discovery/Chatham Is. He had one partially broken canine tooth, again similar to that wolf. He had recovered from an anesthesia the previous night and was alert and stable. I did not resedate him but after a visual examination and discussion with the Conservation Officer confirmed the wolf to be in good body condition, with a good haircoat and no injuries. Due to his history and behaviour there was no reason not to release him. A hair sample was collected from between his shoulder blades and that is now archived at this time. He has a small yellow standard BC Wildlife ear tag as is done routinely after immobilizing wildlife. I do not have any photographs but know that there are lots out there.

Our Wildlife dept. is diligently trying to keep our management team, stakeholders and First Nations liaisons duly informed with pertinent information. We will not be disseminating the release location as we know it. However, unconfirmed information has been also flowing inwards locally and from the West Coast Trail/ Renfrew area in regards to the release location. The common concern is that the wolf was released within proximity of a one of the communities without notification to the appropriate local Wildlife representatives.

I understand that the situation is fluid and that this consideration has probably already been accounted for.

Personally, I still have hope that he will make his way into the Park on the West Coast Trail. More chances for survival and a lot less urban hazards for him.





On February 29, 2020 CO SANO(SANO) called COM. COM stated the following:

Two weeks ago his close friend who walks multiple dogs was walking on private trails and land at the end of Island rd. north east of Port Renfrew. She saw a wolf approach and her dogs were barking at it. It appeared and disappeared into the forest and shadowed her dogs parallel as they were walking. No aggressive behaviour noted by the wolf. The dogs with COM chased the wolf away. The female then contacted \$22\$ who attended this property to look for the wolf.

On Thursday February 27 2020, the same female was walking multiple dogs on island rd. On the North (park) side of the road she noticed that the wolf was intrigued by her dogs and was paralleling her movements as she moved up the road. The female then departed without incident. She then contacted her friend the COM for this report. He stated he then attended Island road with his husky and small dog. He was walking up the road when the wolf appeared to follow his dogs from the treeline. The wolf and his dog were communicating both making whimpering noises. COMs little dog charged at the wolf and the wolf exhibited no aggressive behaviour the two dogs were nose to nose. COM called his dog back and his dog would not come to him. The wolf then ran away at high speed into the forest. COM continued his walk up the road for 10 minutes without seeing the wolf. He then notices 80 ft behind him the wolf was walking up the road behind him. The wolf and his dog was wining back and forth to each other. At 30 feet away COM yelled at the wolf who responded and would stop or run off into the bushes. The wolf would continue to follow COM at a distance. For the whole encounter the wolf was on the North side of Island road. The COM turned around to go back to his vehicle and at 30 ft the wolf stood its ground. COM approached and the wolf ran off and continued to follow until they reached the vehicle. He then yelled at the wolf who went into the treeline. As soon as COM was in motion in his vehicle was heading down the road the wolf emerged and trotted and followed the vehicle as COM left.

COM stated he owns dogs \$.22 and is not an expert in wolf behaviour. He did not note to SANO that he felt the wolf was not predatory towards his dogs.

CO SANO spoke to Sargant NORRIS at 0930 am to discuss next steps.

We have credible information that the wolf relocated from Victoria area by COS in January has been shot and killed by a cougar hunter near Shawnigan Lake this morning. SIZ officers are investigating to determine circumstances and legality. Probably a legitimate hunter kill (currently open season) in which case we will not seize it. Information (including a pic of the ear tag) is currently circulating on local cougar hunter social media sites. This community is fairly "porous" so we can assume it will eventually become public knowledge with subsequent backlash.

More info as it becomes available. Recommended messaging is COS is investigating to determine legality, all other questions regarding wolf hunting or special protection diverted to FLNRORD.

Summary

Initiated by Insp. York at direction of MO. Called to notify reporter of the following:

The Discovery Island wolf, that was relocated from James Bay earlier this year has been shot and killed by a hunter, the Conservation Officer Service can confirm. We understand many British Columbians and people around the world shared care and concern for the well-being of this wolf and this update will affect many people.

The wolf was killed on Tuesday March 24 near Shawnigan Lake, approximately 50 kilometres away from where it was released in late January.

Conservation Officers released the wolf in rugged and remote wilderness outside of Port Renfrew, on the west side of Vancouver Island. This isolated coastal habitat similar to Discovery Island was carefully chosen to give the wolf the best chance possible. This decision was made in consultation with biologists from the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development (FLNRORD), as well as the Provincial Wildlife Veterinarian.

The wolf was not taken back to Discovery Island as it left for a reason – it may have been looking for food or resources. For the safety of the public and the animal, the wolf was relocated out of the urban environment in Victoria. The provincial hunting regulations are administered by

FLNRORD.

The COS investigation is ongoing and further details will be released as they become available.

I'm filling in for David Karn on the media phone and I just got a call from a freelancer working for CBC's the Nature of Things named Laura Boast.

She was hoping you – or someone else who's dealt with Takaya the wolf – could give her a call sometime this morning.

She had a few questions she let me know in advance – she wanted more on the rationale for returning him to Vancouver Island; she had heard a rumor Takaya likes dogs and wanted to chat about that, in case COS has advice for people with dogs; and she had heard concerns that Takaya may come into contact with hunters/trappers.

Wildlife Act Sec 97.6 Disposition of wildlife seized and detained as evidence - "... dispose of as Minister directs"

COS Policy and Procedure – Disposition of Wildlife Seized under the Wildlife Act Sect 8.

8.0 DISPOSED OF AS THE MINISTER DIRECTS

- 1. Where seized wildlife may be disposed of by the COS, pursuant to section 97.3, 97.6 or 84 (6.3), it must be disposed of "as the minister directs".
- 2. Generally, "as the minister directs" means disposal of seized wildlife in accordance with policy and procedure approved by the minister for the Wildlife Act.
- 3. Officers will refer to Appendix 2, Wildlife and Habitat Branch Procedure Disposal and Storage of Dead Wildlife and Parts, for guidance.

Wildlife and Habitat Branch Procedure – Disposal and Storage of Dead Wildlife and Parts Section 4(3)

- (3) Priorities for disposal of parts of wildlife other than meat are:
- (a) Government uses e.g. research, education, museum exhibits and collections etc.
- (b) Bona fide scientific or medical uses
- (c) Traditional ceremonial or dress purposes; aboriginals receiving first priority
- (d) Commercial sale (Disposal by Government Auction)
- (e) Private possession in accordance with Policy and Procedures
- (f) Natural decomposition
- (g) Destruction in accordance with community by-laws and practices, as in 4 (1)(e) above
- (h) Fur bearers and their parts are to be given to the B.C. Trappers Association.

We have credible information that the wolf relocated from Victoria area by COS in January has been shot and killed by a cougar hunter near Shawnigan Lake this morning. SIZ officers are investigating to determine circumstances and legality. Probably a legitimate hunter kill (currently open season) in which case we will not seize it. Information (including a pic of the ear tag) is currently circulating on local cougar hunter social media sites. This community is fairly "porous" so we can assume it will eventually become public knowledge with subsequent backlash.

More info as it becomes available. Recommended messaging is COS is investigating to determine legality, all other questions regarding wolf hunting or special protection diverted to FLNRORD.

Given the potential misinformation swirling around on this issue, can you provide any further clarification on whether there were complicating circumstances at play here? My understanding is the hunter said his dog was attacked by Takaya. I also have another report from a contact in Port Renfrew who says Takaya attacked his dog a few days earlier. He reports that Takaya was acting strangely, doing things like running alongside his truck, a behaviour not regularly seen in non-habituated wolves in Port Renfrew.

The impression left by the statement saying the Discovery Island wolf "has been shot and killed by a hunter" seems to be leading people (including <u>CBC</u>) to conclude it was a trophy hunting kill, when perhaps that's not the case?

I'd appreciate any clarifications you can provide. I'm hoping to interview the hunter in question, as well as the man who ran into Takaya in Port Renfrew days before the wolf's death.

Hi Emma.

As mentioned on the phone, you can attribute the following to the B.C. Conservation Officer Service:

The Discovery Island wolf, that was relocated from James Bay earlier this year has been shot and killed by a hunter, the Conservation Officer Service can confirm. We understand many British Columbians and people around the world shared care and concern for the well-being of this wolf and this update will affect many people.

The wolf was killed on Tuesday March 24 near Shawnigan Lake, approximately 50 kilometres away from where it was released in late January.

Conservation Officers released the wolf in rugged and remote wilderness outside of Port Renfrew, on the west side of Vancouver Island. This isolated coastal habitat similar to Discovery Island was carefully chosen to give the wolf the best chance possible. This decision was made in consultation with biologists from the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development (FLNRORD), as well as the Provincial Wildlife Veterinarian.

The wolf was not taken back to Discovery Island as it left for a reason – it may have been looking for food or resources. For the safety of the public and the animal, the wolf was relocated out of the urban environment in Victoria. The provincial hunting regulations are administered by FLNRORD.

The COS investigation is ongoing and further details will be released as they become available.



s.22 Said he was trying to have SOC relinquish hide (again, w/o suggestion or recommendation of CO). I gave direction to accept it if brought in, but to ensure a release of demands form was signed off.

A couple points of clarity

- any seizure of hide by action of CO (vs spontaneous relinquishment) would be for evidence of unlawful possession under WLA stemming from trespass violation, not evidence of trespass itself.
- no seizure has been made or contemplated for the sole or primary purpose of turning the animal over to the Songhees Nation. My statement to the Chief pertained to eventual disposal of any seizure if not required for LE or lawful for SOC to possess. I suppose that would now also apply if SOC relinquished wildlife to Crown voluntarily.
- carcass had already been disposed of by SOC by dumping on rural property, not placed or stored for COS. SOC told COS to take it if we wanted it. Helen requested it for necropsy and we collected it for that purpose. Given that there was no informed consent and investigation had not progressed to RPG of trespass, there is no intent to use as evidence.

Hope that helps. Happy to discuss further. I have my daily RLT call 9-10, but flexible thereafter. Let me know what time works for you.

They need to be careful about seizures made for one reason and held out for another.

Also lots of case law around a hunter acquiring rights to wildlife and if it isn't taken lawfully they have no right to it — Tons of case law similar where elk shot on private land by legal and licensed hunter. He does not acquire legal rights to that wildlife. The question here is about the evidence of the trespass and the tightness of the permission. Sounds weak to me.

We should not even entertain where any part of the wildlife goes at this time.

Our Wildlife dept. is diligently trying to keep our management team, stakeholders and First Nations liaisons duly informed with pertinent information. We will not be disseminating the release location as we know it.

However, unconfirmed information has been also flowing inwards locally and from the West Coast Trail/ Renfrew area in regards to the release location. The common concern is that the wolf was released within proximity of a one of the communities without notification to the appropriate local Wildlife representatives.

I understand that the situation is fluid and that this consideration has probably already been accounted for.

Personally, I still have hope that he will make his way into the Park on the West Coast Trail. More chances for survival and a lot less urban hazards for him. Thanks.

SANO encountered on the road the COM who gave COS the ear tagged trail camera photos taken on private land at the end of He stated that his friend just had another adult wolf with similar markings approach his s.22 it sat on his lawn he took his dog inside and returned with his phone. The wolf without an ear tag sat 10-15 feet away from him looking at him then trotted off into the woods. In the video and in his statement to SANO there was no ear tag.

SANO believes with the photographic evidence that there are two wolves that do not have a fear of humans that has appeared to residents in the past week. One ear tagged and one not.

There are s.22 residents on this road. The last house took the video of the non ear tagged wolf on February 22. The other video footage from this area shows another wolf with an ear tag in its left ear.

SANO spoke to Cheryl ALEXANDER (250) 588-6882. She stated that the ear tagged wolf has not been reported seen since February 27th. She stated that the port Renfrew facebook group was how the community was alerted to the wolf being inquisitive to dogs. This group could be a good means to disseminate messages for COS. Another local was mentioning that half the community wants the wolf to coexist and some in the community will most likely come looking for the wolf to hunt it.

The road was quiet with few vehicles as the facebook post told residents not to walk their dogs in this area as there is a wolf.

In speaking with the local FN and the residents there appears to be ample food in this area and the presence of an existing pack.

I know that there has been another large Wolf that has been sighted along and quit regularly. I know that he has been approaching dogs and has gone as far as attacking an off leash dog as recently as today. It is not Takaya but another robust Wolf of similar coloring and markings. The big problem we have here is that there are many people, at least 7 that I have seen. That regularly run their dogs in front of their car as they travel up and down s.22 . That road is soaked in dog urine and with dogs that live at the end of \$.22 . It's no wonder that Wolves that travel through that area are drawn to this location. I strongly suggest that signs be put in place warning visitors and residents about proper dog and owner etiquette while being in known Wolf country. They do this in Pacific Rim National Park and perhaps they should think about signage down in this section of their park. I've talked to Bob Henson from Wildsafe BC. as well as Todd Windle of Pacific Rim National Park about this situation. They both realize that something should be done.

I will continue to monitor the Wolf activity in this lower estuary and will keep you up to date on anymore of Takaya's activity. If the company of other Wolves is what he was seeking then he has most certainly found it. I don't think that we have seen the last of him......for now at least.

I had a conversation with Mike Stalberg after Takaya was killed. It was regarding my questions about what would happen to the wolf's remains and also what was known about the incident.

Could you please confirm the following:

- 1. I understand that Helen is conducting a necropsy on the 'internal' remains of the wolf that were provided to her by the hunter when and how will the results of this be available? To my knowledge the necropsy has been conducted and the results provided to the Conservation Officer Service. I will look into how and when the results can be released.
- 2. I know that the Songhees are requesting those remains to be returned to them for proper burial on the islands Is this what will happen, and when? I am not sure about this. I will have to ask the COS what the

final disposition of the carcass will be.

3. I believe that the hunter has a legal right to keep the hide and skull of the animal, should he wish to do that - is this what is happening? I am not aware of what the hunter decided to do or retain. As you have stated, the hunter has a legal right to keep the hide skull or any other part of the carcass they wish to retain.

4. I asked that i be put in touch with the hunter and do realize that you are not able to give me his name due to protection of privacy laws, but that you would be able to speak with him and give him my contact

information. Has this been done? I am not aware if this has been done or not. I was not involved in any of

the investigation surrounding the harvest of the wolf. COS may have the hunters information and may have

contacted them. I can follow up on this for you.

5. What kind of investigation is the Conservation Service or Wildlife branch doing? Can you confirm that the hunter had dogs and whether or not the hunter has said that they were 'attacked' by the wolf. I am not currently aware of what form of investigation COS are conducting if any. I am not aware if the hunter stated

they were attacked by the wolf or not. I can try and verify this.

6. How can people be assured that this was not a 'trophy hunt'? I am not sure what you mean by this.

Hunters are able to harvest wolves in BC under the current regulations and utilize the animal as per the

regulations.

7. Can you provide me with specific about the location where the wolf was killed? I would like to visit the

spot. I am not sure of the specific location where the wolf was harvested. I will see if I can find this information but hunters are only required to provide a 'nearest landmark' when reporting a harvest. Ie:

'Shawnigan Lake'

The Discovery Island wolf that was relocated from James Bay earlier this year has been shot and killed by a hunter, the Conservation Officer Service can confirm.

We understand the public shared care and concern for the well-being of the wolf and this update will affect many people.

The COS has verified this was a legal hunt by a licenced hunter. There is no investigation underway. The wolf was identified through its ear tag.

The wolf was killed near Shawnigan Lake, approximately 50 kilometres away from where it was released in late January. Conservation Officers released the wolf in rugged and remote wilderness outside of Port Renfrew, on the west side of Vancouver Island. This isolated coastal habitat similar to Discovery Island was carefully chosen – in consultation with biologists – to give the wolf the best chance possible.

The wolf was initially not taken back to Discovery Island as it left for a reason – it was looking for food or resources. For the safety of the public and the animal, the wolf was relocated out of the urban environment in Victoria.

Inquiries regarding hunting regulations should be directed to the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development.

The Discovery Island wolf, that was relocated from James Bay earlier this year has been shot and killed by a hunter, the Conservation Officer Service can confirm. We understand many British Columbians and people around the world shared care and concern for the well-being of this wolf and this update will affect many people.

The wolf was killed on Tuesday March 24 near Shawnigan Lake, approximately 50 kilometres away from where it was released in late January.

Conservation Officers released the wolf in rugged and remote wilderness outside of Port Renfrew, on the west side of Vancouver Island. This isolated coastal habitat similar to Discovery Island was carefully chosen to give the wolf the best chance possible. This decision was made in consultation with biologists from the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development (FLNRORD), as well as the Provincial Wildlife Veterinarian.

The wolf was not taken back to Discovery Island as it left for a reason – it may have been looking for food or resources. For the safety of the public and the animal, the wolf was relocated out of the urban environment in Victoria. The provincial hunting regulations are administered by FLNRORD.

The COS investigation is ongoing and further details will be released as they become available.

The Discovery Island wolf, that was relocated from James Bay earlier this year has been shot and killed by a hunter, the Conservation Officer Service can confirm. We understand many British Columbians and people around the world shared care and concern for the well-being of this wolf and this update will affect many people.

The wolf was killed on Tuesday March 24 near Shawnigan Lake, approximately 50 kilometres away from where it was released in late January.

Conservation Officers released the wolf in rugged and remote wilderness outside of Port Renfrew, on the west side of Vancouver Island. This isolated coastal habitat similar to Discovery Island was carefully chosen to give the wolf the best chance possible. This decision was made in consultation with biologists from the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development (FLNRORD), as well as the Provincial Wildlife Veterinarian.

The wolf was not taken back to Discovery Island as it left for a reason – it may have been looking for food or resources. For the safety of the public and the animal, the wolf was relocated out of the urban environment in Victoria. The provincial hunting regulations are administered by FLNRORD.

The COS investigation is ongoing and further details will be released as they become available.

The James Bay wolf has been safely released back into the wild, in a coastal habitat on the west side of Vancouver Island. Conservation Officers are confident this is the same wolf that once lived on Discovery Island, due to several factors.

The mature male wolf was assessed by the provincial wildlife veterinarian on Monday morning. The wolf had no apparent injuries, was in good body condition and was considered healthy and suitable for release.

The wolf had not shown any aggression towards people while it was roaming the Victoria neighbourhood over the weekend.

Although Conservation Officers believe the wolf swam to the capital, it is not being released on Discovery Island as it left for a reason – the wolf was looking for food or resources, and for the safety of the public and the animal, it was relocated out of the urban environment.

The Conservation Officer Service recognizes the public's care and concern for the well-being of the wolf. A similar coastal habitat was carefully chosen, in consultation with biologists, to give the wolf the best chance possible.

The Conservation Officer Service would like to thank the Victoria Police for their help and assistance, as well as the residents of James Bay for reporting sightings of the wolf.

WILDLIFE NECROPSY WILDLIFE HEALTH ID: 20-008 March 26, 2020

A mature adult, male wolf was provided to the wildlife veterinarian by CO Kissinger at 8 AM, March 26, 2020. 's.16 in a fresh state and transported to the Nanaimo Regional office for necropsy.

NECROPSY FINDINGS:

The necropsy was performed at noon. The carcass (as presented) weighed 65 lbs. There was significant subcutaneous fat. A bullet entry site was noted caudal to the left shoulder with the trajectory wound passing through the thorax and into the right shoulder area. A large blood clot was covering the lungs and heart on opening the thorax. The left upper lateral 2^{nd} to 5^{th} ribs were fragmented by the bullet and the ventral trachea and both cranial and middle lung lobes were lacerated. On removal of the lungs and heart, 10 hard, oblong, pale masses from 1-2.5 cm in size were observed on the right 10 ribs, midway up the thoracic wall in a lateral chain. While the ribs were rigid, the bone was easy to cut through, above and below the masses. There was significant fat in all body depots. The stomach contained most if not an entire adult beaver. The remainder of the gastrointestinal tract was not examined. The carcass was labelled and frozen.

COMMENTS:

The wolf was in excellent body condition and appeared to have been feeding on natural food sources. There was a significant pre-existing injury of the thorax where 10 ribs on the right side of the animal appeared to have been fractured and subsequently healed. However, it is also possible that the rib lesions are from a chronic infection so laboratory work is needed to confirm the cause of these rib lesions. The cause of death was gunshot and the death was immediate.
