



COVID Based Park Closures

As the province has responded to the COVID-19 Pandemic, BC Parks has been following the direction of the Public Health Officer to implement physical distancing while preserving opportunities of the public to avail themselves of provincial parks to get outdoors.

BC Parks introduced a general facilities closure on March 20. This included the closure of all campgrounds until April 30, in line with Parks Canada and other PT jurisdictions. It also included service withdrawal from all but a select handful of parks where day use facilities were maintained to provide the public with some limited serviced areas. These serviced parks were primarily in the Lower Mainland/Sea to Sky and Vancouver Island.

The weekend following the general closure saw peak season levels of use at all parks, overwhelming parking lots, trails and trailheads. Citizens, local government officials and police all raised concerns with overcrowding and lack of social distancing. In response, portions of Stawamus Chief Park were immediately closed to address the overuse. Following further review of weekend overuse and large crowds at the following parks, they were closed, most in their entirety:

- French Beach Provincial Park
- Goldstream Provincial Park
- Gowlland Tod Provincial Park (closure restricted to McKenzie Bight and Tod Inlet)
- Juan de Fuca Provincial Park (includes China Beach, Sombrio Beach and Botanical Beach)
- John Dean Provincial Park
- Spectacle Lake Provincial Park
- Chilliwack Lake Provincial Park
- Joffre Lakes Provincial Park
- Murrin Provincial Park
- Shannon Falls Provincial Park
- Stawamus Chief Provincial Park and Protected Area
- Skaha Bluffs Provincial Park
- Liard River Hot Springs Provincial Park

While in most cases the closures have proven successful in limiting use in those parks to manageable levels, and has facilitated better compliance with physical distancing, it has also resulted in higher usage of the parks that remain open as users seek open alternatives. Recent inclement weather has also contributed to lower attendance over the last 14 days. However as we approach Easter and the long weekend, concern is growing amongst BC Parks management about the potential to again see large numbers of users flock to parks creating challenges to properly manage for COVID and general public safety.

In preparing for the expected increase in usage, the following factors come into play

<u>Public understanding</u>: The current mix of full and partial park closures, combined with the full
system service withdrawal, are creating confusion about what is and isn't accessible by the
public. A number of provincial and state parks systems are currently under complete closure and

- this further adds to the confusion amongst park users in BC. This confusion is best addressed by a more consistent approach rather than the mixed approach currently in place in BC.
- <u>Lack of social distancing</u>: Many provincial parks have natural gathering areas where social
 distancing is challenging if not impossible (parking lots, trailheads, popular trails, day use areas).
 Even where social distancing is possible, public compliance remains an issue. There are
 insufficient resources in BC Parks to police social distancing requirements.
- Park Management Capacity: Provincial park facilities are managed in partnership with private Park Operators. Many of these operators are losing staff to self-isolation and/or are refusing to undertake the work necessary to keep facilities open during the COVID crisis. BC Parks has not yet brought on seasonal rangers and is currently operating with just regular staff which is insufficient to manage the anticipated levels of service. Recall of seasonal rangers is challenged by the inability to provide the necessary safety and operational training, given the ban on large gatherings. Any front-line service provision requires Personal Protective Equipment which is being redirected to front line health workers.
- Reservation services: Public facing reservation services (Discover Camping) are provided under contract to a private provider, US eDirect. US eDirect is headquartered out of New York city which is facing COVID challenges that are acknowledged as the epicenter of the US outbreak. As a result, US eDirect is facing staffing challenges that are limiting their capacity to support the current fragmented approach to closures and the cancellations and client refunds that come with rolling closures. BC Parks' Discover Camping team is very lean and has been reduced by self-isolation and COVID issues. As such BC Parks has been challenged to manage public communications and reservation management under the current mixed closure approach.
- <u>Local government concerns</u>: BC Parks and MLAs are fielding regular complaints from the public about perceived lack of physical distancing in parks and concerns with provincial parks remaining open. Displacement of use from closed parks is also resulting in overcrowding effects (e.g. illegal parking) in neighbourhoods adjacent to parks that remain open.
- <u>Search and Rescue (SAR)</u>: SAR resources are also impacted by COVID and as a result BC Parks has
 been receiving requests from SAR for full back country closures. Such a closure would help to
 prevent risky back-country recreation activities which can divert critical resources to injury calls
 and SAR searches. Injuries from risky back-country behaviours also divert medical resources
 away from COVID response as was highlighted in a back-country closure request BC Parks
 received from an emergency room physician from Vancouver.
- <u>Seasonal openings</u>: Most parks in BC remain under winter closure and are under snow. This has
 allowed BC Parks to focus on managing issues in the Lower Mainland and Vancouver Island
 where parks remain open all year and issues were greatest. With the warmer weather, pressure
 will increase on parks in other parts of the province, creating additional pressures on rangers
 and park operators at a time when resources are limited. Any decisions regarding longer term
 closures are best made before general usage increases.

Recommendations:

- 1. Immediately extend general service withdrawal/facility closure to May 31, 2020
- 2. Plan and institute a system wide Provincial Park Closure ahead of the Easter Long Weekend

As discussed, I am requesting approval to proceed with the closure of Porteau Cove Park by 5PM today (see attached RD Order).

Region has provided the following rationale:

- Facilities are closed, however we are still seeing high levels of visitation which is resulting in concerns for the safety of the public and staff.
- Due to the proximity to Vancouver, visitation is anticipated to be high for the coming weekend.
- We have worked with MOTI, the Park Operator, and other stakeholders (CN, \$.22
 s.22 and have their full support/agreement for gate closures.
- Recommendation: to close the park immediately by Regional Director's order and gate the park at the highway.

Eddie Wood has contributed these additional points from Sea to Sky Parks (email attached):

■ The physical nature of Porteau Cove Day Use Area is that there is no room for people to disburse given the volume that use it. The day use areas is a dead end, similar to Murrin Park and Shannon Falls. Park visitors congregate and stay in the immediate area for long periods of time — there is very little room to disburse compared to a trail head where people can move

- on to a trail and maintain appropriate social distancing.
- On sunny days the demand for Porteau Cove is such that the volume of cars will often double and triple park, blocking people in, which requires several staff to manage
- Car clubs continue to use Porteau Cove Day Use Area. The activity is primarily on weekends, we are now also experiencing visits during the week. Car clubs are comprised of 15 cars or more.
- People are using the grounds to defecate/relieve themselves given the washroom facilities are closed
- Visitation is high at Porteau Cove weekends and midweek; based on sunny weather
- STS staffing levels are very low and not in line with maintaining facilities under the current situation. Infection is of great concern s.22 within the small levels we have, this compromises our ability to recover or replace staff. s.22

- C. Due to larger than average crowds and concerns about the potential spread of COVID-19 to the local community, the Park will be closed until further notice.
- D. Section 17 of the Park Act states:

A Director or any Park Officer acting on the Director's behalf may do one or more of the following:

(c) Order any person in any park, conservancy or recreation area to cease or refrain from an action, an omission or conduct that the Director or Park Officer, in his or her discretion, considers dangerous to life or property or detrimental to the public interest.

ACCORDINGLY, the Regional Director orders:

- 1. Closure of Porteau Cove Park to all recreational uses until further notice starting April 3, 2020.
- The duration of the closure period will reflect the level of risk to park visitors due to the COVID-19 outbreak. Any changes to the closure date will be posted on the BC Parks website.

Dear Jim,

After speaking with Jennie Aikman and Dylan Eyers today, I understand that BC Parks is in the process of preparing an announcement on park operations for the coming weeks in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. I am deeply concerned that BC Parks is considering maintaining access to some Day Use Areas despite the direction of BC's Provincial Health Officer regarding mass gatherings, social distancing and the importance of not putting further stress on our healthcare system.

While I understand the importance of being outside during this difficult time, I believe it

is irresponsible to provide access to parks where people congregate in groups greater than 50 and require services from front line staff. Park Operators and Mt. Seymour staff provide services including managing visitor volume, providing park information and answering questions, providing first aid, directing traffic, cleaning washrooms and collecting garbage and recycling. The staff members working in Day Use areas will undoubtedly find themselves in close contact with visitors throughout their shifts. Maintaining the required social distancing measures will be difficult for staff and visitors, especially due to high anticipated volumes as seen in the last several days at most parks.

In addition, we anticipate that staffing Day Use areas will become increasingly difficult. Currently^{s,22}

s.22 As a responsible employer, I am concerned that I will not be exposing my staff to an unsafe work environment. As Dr. Henry continues to indicate now is the time for all British Columbians need to take action to reduce the spread of COVID-19.

If an accident occurs in a park, search and rescue and hospitalization may be required, compromising our health care capacity. This one of the reasons Mt Seymour Resorts, along with other ski areas, closed on Monday, March 16th. We have seen high volume, as evidenced by full parking lots, over the past week in areas including Stawamus Chief, Shannon Falls and Poteau Cove. We have also experienced significant volume at Mt Seymour in the last week.

If BC Parks decides to keep Day Use Areas open this weekend and throughout the pandemic period we will experience overcrowding (groups of more than 50 people) which will contradict the Class Order and direction provided by Minister Adrien Dix and Chief Provincial Health Officer Dr. Bonnie Henry, social distancing will be compromised and our healthcare system will be further taxed. I firmly believe that all Day Use Areas should be closed and that British Columbians should be advised to be outside in their yards and in their neighbourhoods where they can successfully maintain adequate social distancing.

Hi Dylan,

We have made a number of operational changes to address the challenges of staying open during the current health environment. While we have been successful in keeping our staff distanced from potential sources of infection (limited interaction with the public, safe facility cleaning procedures, closing the park before it reaches an unsafe capacity level), there are a few ongoing challenges that exist which are not easy (or possible) to address:

- Security/safety/medical incidents: If a situation arises that requires immediate assistance, our staff will be potentially put in a situation where they have to move within the safe zone to assist. Further, emergency responders (ambulance, RCMP, Search & Rescue) will potentially be put in the same situation. This will be an issue on trails all over, whether parks are open or not.
- Pit toilets: While we are performing a safe clean of the surfaces, if a particularly messy situation arises, we may not be able to adequately clean it, given our lack of access to protective equipment. We may have to close some buildings as time progresses, depending on our ability to address the mess, and clean after an appropriate decontamination time has passed.
- Once the weather improves, we will have large volumes of traffic attempting to come to the park. This will likely result in us shutting access off early in the day and only allowing small batches of

cars up as available room opens up. While we hopeful that the public will be understanding, there is the potential for conflict with some members of the public. Our staff is instructed to remain in their vehicle if approached and close the window if necessary to maintain safe distancing. This may become difficult for us to handle once we get in to 20+ degree sunny weather.

- Thus far most park goers are hiking, the beach is seeing very little activity. This will change as the weather warms. We may see more groups not practicing safe social distancing.
- We will see more evening hour use as the weather warms. This will put increased pressure on staff as many will not obey the 5:30pm closing. It is likely we will need to remain at the gate until late evening (staff will receive so many callouts that it would be better to just stay there).
- As the weather warms, there will be more backcountry and lake camping (allowed or not).

In a nutshell: yes, we can continue to manage the park as it is currently running, and yes, it will become increasingly challenging as the weather warms.

Subject: Conversation with Mayor Ken Williams of the District of Highlands

Hello Shannon and Jim.

I followed up with Mayor Williams this afternoon at the request of Jim. It was a good conversation and Mayor Williams understands the challenges we are facing.

The key points of our discussion:

- I explained that BC Parks' consistent observations in the current portion of Gowlland Tod Park that remains open is that park visitor activity within the park is being managed well. We are finding that the available space in this portion of the park and the wider trails (as opposed to the narrow trails in the nearby CRD Parks) are helping visitors maintain the social distancing and other guidelines and rules communicated by the Provincial Health Officer.
- I also explained that we are aware of the concerns expressed by citizens within his community with the parking along the adjacent municipal roadways. I explained that, while we are conducting patrols in the area with our Park Rangers, BC Parks has no jurisdiction in these locations and any unauthorized parking would need to be enforced by the by-law officers.
- Mayor Williams agreed with our observations of visitor activity within the park and confirmed
 that his by-law officers would be monitoring the situation. He explained that some of the
 parking is not being done in conflict with local by-laws but they are particularly concerned
 about parking congestion obstructing fire hydrants and other needs by the local fire
 department. This will be the focus of the by-law officers.
- Mayor Williams is concerned about the potential increase in parking congestion and traffic in the area as we near the summer.
- Mayor Williams explained that most of his concerns are with the nearby CRD Parks because of their narrower trails, dogs off leash and less than sanitary toilets.
- I explained that we have Park Ranger staff patrolling key locations in the South Island throughout the week and weekend, that Gowlland Tod Park is one of those key locations. I did emphasize that we are very stretched with our capacity but will continue to do our best to monitor the situation in Gowlland Tod Park, promoting to park visitors the need for social distancing and install signage in additional locations where needed.
- He did identify the Emma Dickson Trailhead location as one that is more concerning than the
 others and that we should consider a closure of that trail. I explained that I would investigate
 that with staff, keeping in mind that a trail closure may help with the parking congestion issue
 but that compliance from all would likely not be successful. At the same time it is worth
 investigating and I'll discuss today with staff.

The above covers the main points of the discussion. I provided Mayor Williams with my cell number and offered that he could contact me if he has any further questions or concerns that he would like to discuss with BC Parks. He thanked me for the call and willingness for further discussions as needed.

I hope this helps. Any questions please let me know.

Order of the Executive Director

TO:

Public Notice

DATE:

April 8, 2020

WHEREAS:

- A. This order applies to all Crown land established or continued as a park or ecological reserve under the *Park Act* or the *Protected Areas of British Columbia Act*; .
- B. This order is made in the public interest in response to the COVID-19 pandemic for the purposes of the protection of human health and safety.
- C. This order is in regard to all public access, facilities or uses that exist in any of the lands mentioned in Section A above, and include but are not limited to: campgrounds, day-use areas, trails, playgrounds, shelters, visitor centers, cabins, chalets, lodges, resort areas, group campsites, and all other facilities owned or operated by or on behalf of BC Parks.
- D. This order is subject to amendment, revocation or repeal as necessary to respond to changing circumstances around the COVID-19 pandemic.
- E. The protection of park visitor health, the health of all BC Parks staff, Park Operators, contractors and permittees is the primary consideration in the making of this order.

F. Section 17 of the Park Act states:

A director or any park officer acting on the director's behalf may do one or more of the following:

(c) order any person in any park, conservancy or recreation area to cease or refrain from an action, an omission or conduct that the director or park officer, in his or her discretion, considers dangerous to life or property or detrimental to the public interest;

ACCORDINGLY, the Executive Director orders:

- 1. All Provincial Parks and Ecological Reserves established or continued as a park under the *Park Act* or the *Protected Areas of British Columbia Act*, are hereby closed to all uses by the public.
- Any facility, event, or activity involving the participation of the public, which
 was previously allowed or authorized under the authority of a Park Officer, or
 a Park Use Permit are ordered to cease and are closed for the duration of
 this order.
- Access to any park associated with permitted operations that do not involve
 the participation of the public and are for the purpose(s) of the preservation
 and maintenance of the park and\or private or park facilities; requires a
 written exemption to this order issued by the Regional Director responsible
 for the Park.
- 4. This order comes into effect at 08:00 hrs on Wednesday April 8th, 2020 and remains in effect until repealed by further order.
- 5. If this order is not carried out or is only partially or imperfectly carried out, I may direct any person to carry out or complete the order, and the expense to the government of carrying out or completing the carrying out of the order will be a debt owing to the government by Individual at the suit of the government in any court of competent jurisdiction


Here are our key messages as developed for MLAs. Note that while COVID is definitely a factor in the move to full closure, it is also based heavily on operational challenges related to staffing and over-use that leave us unable to assure public safety and the protection of park assets. In addition to these, specific to Local Governments:

- Like local government we have been trying to support the PHO by providing outdoor spaces for the public to access as we all cope with COVID.
- Unfortunately we have been required to close a number of parks in and around Vancouver and on Vancouver Island due to overuse which was resulting in environmental and facility damage as well as making it near to impossible to manage for physical distancing.
- With the Easter weekend coming, and good weather predicted, all indications are that usage could exceed that seen to date which would be beyond our ability to manage given the impacts of COVID on staffing levels.
- While we share many of the same challenges as local parks managers in our near to community parks, we also have many operating considerations that are unique to BC Parks.
- Key in this is that unlike local parks, most provincial parks are some distance from population centers and require travel to reach them that is inconsistent with recent PHO and Ministry of Health directives not to undertake recreational travel within the province.
- On consideration of all the variables, BC Parks felt that the only viable option is to close our parks until further notice.







This morning my minister presented to caucus our plan to move to a full system closure for the

provincial parks system. Current plan is for the attached news release to go out at 8am this Wednesday. Up to this point, BC Parks has taken a scaled and phased-in approach to park access limits to preserve general access and provide the public with outdoor areas to use, subject to practicing physical distancing. Where we have implemented access restrictions, they have proven successful, but they have also resulted in higher usage of the parks that remain open as users seek alternatives.

With the desire of the public to get out of doors, many parks have already experienced peak season levels of use which overwhelmed parking lots, trails and trailheads, made physical distancing difficult if not impossible in some locations, and resulted in damage to our facilities and the environment. As well, self-isolation and/or concerns with potential for COVID exposure have reduced park management capacity. This puts the public, staff, contractors and volunteers such as SARS at risk. This at a time when resources and supplies are being diverted to support front line health care workers. Spill-over to neighbouring communities has also been a concern raised by citizens, local government officials First Nations and police along with a general concern with provincial parks overcrowding and the lack of social distancing.

With the Easter holiday upon us, and given the challenges posed by COVID, the expected influx of visitors is beyond the ability of BC Parks to manage for physical distancing and general public safety. For all these reasons, we are moving to a full access closure of all provincial parks.



Good morning:

I am emailing today to advise that as of Wednesday, April 8th, 2020, we are closing all provincial parks until further notice. This action is being taken in response to the call for increased action to address the COVID-19 pandemic and aligning with federal and provincial experts requesting citizens to stay home.

With the desire of the public to get outdoors, many parks recently experienced peak season levels of use overwhelming parking lots, trails and trailheads, making physical distancing difficult if not impossible in some locations, and resulted in damage to our facilities and the environment. Along with this, the spill-over to neighbouring communities raised concerns with citizens, local government officials, First Nations and police along with a general concern with provincial parks overcrowding and the lack of social distancing.

Today, with the Easter holiday upon us, and the challenges posed by COVID and the expected influx of visitors, we feel it is beyond the ability of BC Parks to manage for physical distancing and general public safety. We feel this closure is necessary to ensure the health and safety of our visitors, employees, park operators and their staff, volunteers, and park contractors.

This temporary measure means public and vehicle access is no longer available. All trails, roads, day use areas, beaches, lakes, boat launches, and backcountry areas are closed to public access. Park closures will be enforced through regular monitoring and patrols and anyone found in a closed park will be evicted and could face a \$115 fine.

All campgrounds, camping opportunities and accommodations will be closed until at least May 31, 2020. Full refunds will be provided to existing reservation holders during this time and the Discover Camping reservation system will be suspended for all new reservations for the foreseeable future.

A public notice will be issued when this closure is lifted, and facilities are reopened and available for reservation.

Our advice to visitors is to continue following the Provincial Health Officer's direction regarding social distancing and other health measures when they access provincial parks.


Regional staff will be in touch with POs directly to work through all operational questions and park specific plans regarding these closures. Park Operators will receive an exemption from Directors Order closing all parks, and will continue to have access to work and reside in the parks they manage through their Park Operator Agreement.

BC Parks appreciates your understanding, cooperation, and support during this challenging time.

Good morning:

I am emailing today to advise that as of Wednesday, April 8th, 2020, we are closing all provincial parks until further notice. This action is being taken in response to the call for increased action to address the COVID-19 pandemic and aligning with federal and provincial experts requesting citizens to stay home.

With the Easter holiday now upon us, and the challenges posed by COVID along with the expected influx of visitors, we feel it is beyond the ability of BC Parks to manage for physical distancing and general public safety. We feel this closure is necessary to ensure the health and safety of our visitors, employees, park operators and their staff, volunteers, and park contractors. Along with this, the spill-over to neighbouring communities raised concerns with citizens, local government officials, First Nations and police along with a general concern with provincial parks overcrowding and the lack of social distancing.

This temporary measure means that any activity involving the participation of the public is prohibited for the duration of the order. Where permit holders need to access a park for activities not involving the participation of the public, but as required for the preservation and maintenance of the park or their own private facilities, they must have a written exemption from the Regional Director responsible for the park in question. Requests for exemptions should be coordinated through the BC Parks staff contacts listed on your permits. Park closures will be enforced through regular monitoring and patrols and anyone found in a closed park without a written exemption may be evicted and could face a \$115 fine.

A public notice will be issued when this closure is lifted, and regular public access and permitted operations can resume.



I am emailing today to advise that as of Wednesday, April 8th, 2020, we are closing all provincial parks until further notice. This action is being taken in response to the call for

increased action to address the COVID-19 pandemic and aligning with federal and provincial experts requesting citizens to stay home.

With the Easter holiday now upon us, and the challenges posed by COVID along with the expected influx of visitors, we feel it is beyond the ability of BC Parks to manage for physical distancing and general public safety. We feel this closure is necessary to ensure the health and safety of our visitors, employees, park operators and their staff, volunteers, and park contractors. Along with this, the spill-over to neighbouring communities raised concerns with citizens, local government officials, First Nations and police along with a general concern with provincial parks overcrowding and the lack of social distancing.

This temporary measure means that any activity involving the participation of the public is prohibited for the duration of the order. Where permit holders need to access a park for activities not involving the participation of the public, but as required for the preservation and maintenance of the park or their own private facilities, they must have a written exemption from the Regional Director responsible for the park in question. Requests for exemptions should be coordinated through the BC Parks staff contacts listed on your permits. Park closures will be enforced through regular monitoring and patrols and anyone found in a closed park without a written exemption may be evicted and could face a \$115 fine.

A public notice will be issued when this closure is lifted, and regular public access and permitted operations can resume.





With the desire of the public to get outdoors, many parks recently experienced peak season levels of use overwhelming parking lots, trails and trailheads, making physical distancing difficult if not impossible in some locations, and resulted in damage to our facilities and the environment. Along with this, the spill-over to neighbouring communities raised concerns with citizens, local government officials, First Nations and police along with a general concern with provincial parks overcrowding and the lack of social distancing.

Today, with the Easter holiday upon us, and the challenges posed by COVID and the expected influx of visitors, we feel it is beyond the ability of BC Parks to manage for physical distancing and general public safety. We feel this closure is necessary to ensure the health and safety of our visitors, employees, park operators and their staff, volunteers, and park contractors.

As part of this system-wide closure, all provincial Ecological Reserves (ER) will also be closed to access. In accordance with this direction and to simplify visitor management, ER Wardens are asked to cease their volunteer activities for the duration of this closure. ER Wardens should cease all park activities, including engaging with members of the public around issues of compliance, and should instead advise BC Parks regional office of any concerns. Critical or urgent activities that cannot be deferred or delayed will need to obtain an exemption from the BC Parks Regional Director before they may be allowed to proceed.

This temporary measure means public and vehicle access is no longer available. All trails, roads, day use areas, beaches, lakes, boat launches, and backcountry areas are closed to public access. Park closures will be enforced through regular monitoring and patrols and anyone

found in a closed park will be evicted and could face a \$115 fine.

All campgrounds, camping opportunities and accommodations will be closed until at least May 31, 2020. Full refunds will be provided to existing reservation holders during this time and the Discover Camping reservation system will be suspended for all new reservations for the foreseeable future.

A public notice will be issued when this closure is lifted, and facilities are reopened and available for reservation.

Our advice to visitors is to continue following the Provincial Health Officer's direction regarding social distancing and other health measures when they access provincial parks.

Regional staff will be in touch with POs directly to work through all operational questions and park specific plans regarding these closures.



We are aware of the concern for the spread of Covid-19 to rural/remote communities and are heeding all travel restrictions at the national, provincial, and local levels. We are currently working with our sponsor, the US National Science Foundation, on plans to potentially delay or fully postpone all field activities this summer.

Our team has spent several months this winter creating a detailed plan for the removal of 87 seismic stations throughout Alaska and northwestern Canada, concluding the temporary USArray project. If we are unable to remove stations this year, we will plan to operate one additional year (with no planned in-person service visits), with decommissioning work shifting to 2021. Fortunately, this extended timeline would be covered by our current permit (#108176) which does not expire

until 12/30/2021.

Dear Park Use Permit Holder,

In order to ensure public safety, and in an effort to mitigate the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic, BC Parks has taken the extraordinary measure to close many BC Parks facilities and restrict overnight camping for the public. BC Parks recognizes that this closure may have a direct impact on your ability to carry out some or all of the activities that are authorized in your existing or pending Park Use Permit.

BC Parks has temporarily suspended services at marine parks, visitor centres, nature houses, washrooms and day-use facilities. All campgrounds, camping opportunities and accommodations will be closed until at least April 30, 2020. Provincial park visitors may continue to use trails and areas where accessible. In addition you should be aware parking lots in some parks may be closed and gated where necessary.

This direction is not meant to restrict park use permit holders from accessing front country and back country areas to provide guided day-use activities that are compliant with the direction of the Provincial Health Officer. This order does not restrict permittees from accessing private structures in parks, or conducting maintenance or operations associated to land use\occupancy permits or to maintain critical operations or infrastructure within parks. Permittees are still allowed to access the park, and have their staff or contractors access the park to undertake necessary works and maintenance to protect their infrastructure.

In addition, research and monitoring activities can continue as long as it can meet the requirements of the Provincial Health Officer, and does not involve access to, or use of park facilities.

Full provincial park closures are also being implemented on a case-by-case basis where required to address concerns regarding health and safety. If you have any questions or concerns as it relates to this closure, please get in touch with your regional contact for the parks that you are permitted to operate in. In addition, any changes to access or services at provincial parks will be posted to the BC Parks website at http://bcparks.ca/





COVID Based Park Closures

As the province has responded to the COVID-19 Pandemic, BC Parks has been following the direction of the Public Health Officer to implement physical distancing while preserving opportunities of the public to avail themselves of provincial parks to get outdoors.

BC Parks introduced a general facilities closure on March 20. This included the closure of all campgrounds until April 30, in line with Parks Canada and other PT jurisdictions. It also included service withdrawal from all but a select handful of parks where day use facilities were maintained to provide the public with some limited serviced areas. These serviced parks were primarily in the Lower Mainland/Sea to Sky and Vancouver Island.

The weekend following the general closure saw peak season levels of use at all parks, overwhelming parking lots, trails and trailheads. Citizens, local government officials and police all raised concerns with overcrowding and lack of social distancing. In response, portions of Stawamus Chief Park were immediately closed to address the overuse. Following further review of weekend overuse and large crowds, 14 additional parks were closed, most in their entirety.

While in most cases the closures have proven successful in limiting use in those parks to manageable levels, and has facilitated better compliance with physical distancing, it has also resulted in higher usage of the parks that remain open as users seek open alternatives. Recent inclement weather has also contributed to lower attendance over the last 14 days. However, as we approach Easter and the long weekend, concern is growing amongst BC Parks management about the potential to again see large numbers of users flock to parks creating challenges to properly manage for COVID and general public safety.

In preparing for the expected increase in usage, the following factors come into play

- Park management capacity: Provincial park facilities are managed in partnership with private Park Operators. Many of these operators are losing staff to self-isolation and/or are refusing to undertake the work necessary to keep facilities open during the COVID event. BC Parks has not yet brought on seasonal rangers and is currently operating with just regular staff which is insufficient to manage the anticipated levels of service. Recall of seasonal rangers is challenged by the inability to provide the necessary safety and operational training, given the ban on large gatherings.
- Discouraging unnecessary travel: Many park users are travelling some distance to get to the park
 of their choice, contrary to PHO direction to avoid unnecessary travel. In southeastern BC there
 are growing concerns with Albertans coming in large numbers to use BC's provincial parks,
 increasing the risk of cross border transmission.
- Public understanding: The current mix of full and partial park closures, combined with the full
 system service withdrawal, are creating confusion about what is and isn't accessible by the
 public. In addition to the Parks Canada full closure, parks systems in WA, OR are currently closed
 and AB has implemented a full vehicle access closure, which further adds to the confusion
 amongst park users in BC. This confusion is best addressed by a more consistent approach
 rather than the mixed approach currently in place in BC. Given self-isolation and COVID issues,

- BC Parks has been challenged to manage public communications and reservation management under the current mixed closure approach.
- External concerns: BC Parks and MLAs are fielding regular complaints from the public about
 perceived lack of physical distancing in parks and concerns with provincial parks remaining open.
 Displacement of use from closed parks is also resulting in overcrowding effects (e.g. illegal
 parking) in neighbourhoods adjacent to parks that remain open. First Nations have also
 expressed concerns with parks remaining open adjacent to their communities.
- Search and Rescue (SAR): SAR resources are also impacted by COVID and as a result BC Parks has been receiving requests from SAR for full back country closures. Such a closure would help to prevent risky back-country recreation activities which can divert critical resources to injury calls and SAR searches.
- Seasonal openings: Most parks in BC remain under winter closure and are under snow. This has allowed BC Parks to focus on managing issues in the Lower Mainland and Vancouver Island where parks remain open all year and issues were greatest. With the warmer weather, pressure will increase on parks in other parts of the province, creating additional pressures on rangers and park operators at a time when resources are limited. Any decisions regarding longer term closures are best made before general usage increases.

Recommendations:

- 1. Immediately extend general service withdrawal/facility closure to May 31, 2020.
 - Will take a minimum of a month to return to normal operations
 - Need closure to extend beyond May long weekend to provide lead time to deal with existing reservations and communicate change
- 2. Plan and institute a system wide Provincial Park Closure ahead of the Easter Long Weekend
 - There is insufficient capacity to manage expected surge in usage
 - Concerns with large groups in provincial parks and displacement impacts at and around parks that remain open

SITUATION: Two Ministerial Orders came into affect at 1:00 p.m. Friday, March 27, 2020 temporarily restricting automobile to all provincial parks as well as provincial recreation areas.

CURRENT ACTIVITIES:

AEP Parks Operations and Lands staff developed a COVID-19 Response Plan for Implementing a Temporary System Wide Park closure. Plan was approved for implementation on Friday, March 27, 2020.

Parks staff initiated gating or barricading access points to Provincial Parks and Provincial Recreation Areas Friday late afternoon and evening, and monitoring user compliance. Initial public communication program initiated through social media and web late Friday afternoon as well. Highway signing has been initiated Saturday.

PROVINCIAL REPORT BACK (as of 14:00hrs March 28, 2020):

Use levels vary across the Province, higher levels of use seen west of Rocky Mountain House. Winter storm conditions in the NW has led to low levels of use in that Region. NE Region has seen lower use than previous weekend. The rest of Central region has seen lower or similar levels of use as compared to last weekend – falling temperatures and snow likely factors in the level of use. Southern Region is reporting relatively low levels of use.

Kananaskis Country has reported another busy weekend but visitation levels have dropped from the previous weekend. Parks staff have started closing Parks and Recreation Areas effective Saturday morning. Many areas were already being utilized ahead of the closure activities and they are presently challenged with limited number of barricades and staff to man barricades to interact with approaching users. Coordination with Town of Canmore and AB Transportation, Volker Stevin and Fortis occurring to implement closures.





User response to the temporary vehicle access restrictions are reported as "mixed". If users were unaware of the closure, a general acceptance of the new policy. Some users have expressed their disagreement with this approach. Most often reported questions relate to understanding what outdoor recreational activities are still permitted and exactly where, or alternative access points to lakes for ice fishing. User parking at gated entrances or along roadway or highways adjacent to closed areas has been reported. More of an issue in the Highway 11 corridor west of Rocky Mountain House.


Thanks for this Bob. Looks like they are having the same or similar issues we are with spillover and parking. To me it points to full closure as the best option over vehicle restrictions.

(c) Order any person in any park, conservancy or recreation area to cease or refrain from an action, an omission or conduct that the Director or Park Officer, in his or her discretion, considers dangerous to life or property or detrimental to the public interest.

ACCORDINGLY, the Regional Director orders:

- 1. Closure of Porteau Cove Park to all recreational uses until further notice starting April 3, 2020.
- The duration of the closure period will reflect the level of risk to park visitors due to the COVID-19 outbreak. Any changes to the closure date will be posted on the BC Parks website.

Dear Jim,

After speaking with Jennie Aikman and Dylan Eyers today, I understand that BC Parks is in the process of preparing an announcement on park operations for the coming weeks in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. I am deeply concerned that BC Parks is considering maintaining access to some Day Use Areas despite the direction of BC's Provincial Health Officer regarding mass gatherings, social distancing and the importance of not putting further stress on our healthcare system.

While I understand the importance of being outside during this difficult time, I believe it is irresponsible to provide access to parks where people congregate in groups greater than 50 and require services from front line staff. Park Operators and Mt. Seymour staff provide services including managing visitor volume, providing park information and answering questions, providing first aid, directing traffic, cleaning washrooms and collecting garbage and recycling. The staff members working in Day Use areas will undoubtedly find themselves in close contact with visitors throughout their shifts. Maintaining the required social distancing measures will be difficult for staff and visitors, especially due to high anticipated volumes as seen in the last several days at most parks.

In addition, we anticipate that staffing Day Use areas will become increasingly difficult. Currently^{s.22}

employer, I am concerned that I will not be exposing my staff to an unsafe work environment. As Dr. Henry continues to indicate now is the time for all British Columbians need to take action to reduce the spread of COVID-19.

If an accident occurs in a park, search and rescue and hospitalization may be required, compromising our health care capacity. This one of the reasons Mt Seymour Resorts, along with other ski areas, closed on Monday, March 16th. We have seen high volume, as evidenced by full parking lots, over the past week in areas including Stawamus Chief, Shannon Falls and Poteau Cove. We have also experienced significant volume at Mt Seymour in the last week.

If BC Parks decides to keep Day Use Areas open this weekend and throughout the pandemic period we will experience overcrowding (groups of more than 50 people) which will contradict the Class Order and direction provided by Minister Adrien Dix and Chief Provincial Health Officer Dr. Bonnie Henry, social distancing will be compromised and our healthcare system will be further taxed. I firmly believe that all Day Use Areas should be closed and that British Columbians should be advised to be outside in their yards and in their neighbourhoods where they can successfully maintain adequate social distancing.

1. Fully Closed Parks

Porteau Cove Park

- Overall, weekend closure was successful, with Park Ranger and Park Operator staff posted at the entrance gate.
- High volumes of vehicles turned away from the park on both Saturday and Sunday.
- Current traffic configuration allows vehicles to stop in the area in front of the gates. If left unattended, vehicles would use this area as a rest stop and turn-around causing congestions.
- Park rangers did not allow vehicle to stop there on Sunday. Had to keep a truck with emergency lights flashing and a ranger doing traffic control from noon to 4pm.
 SUGGESTIONS:
 - Improve highways messaging to drivers, or/and
 - Have a flagger during peak hours to do traffic control, or/and
 - Cone off the exit lanes (preferable)

Golden Ears Park

- High numbers of vehicles turned away all weekend; 480 vehicles on Saturday and 500 on Sunday.
- Park ranger and park operator stationed at the gate.
- Signage effective, but additional signage required on highways to warn visitors of the park closures well before they arrive at the park.
- VIP/park closure signage generally being ignored.
 - I'm not sure if this includes motorcycles there were quite a few groups, given the sunny weather
- Overall good compliance (and some praise!) from vehicle visitors. A significant number (~50) of hikers/bikers/equestrian visitors that passed by visible closure signage and were attempting to get further into the park. Anticipate the ongoing need to have Park Operator/Park Ranger presence on the trails in the south end of the park, turning trail users around before they get further into the park.
- Sam Stickney visited Rolley Lake on Saturday afternoon many visitors displaced from GE have created traffic/parking issues on Bell Street that have been a concern in previous winters (narrowed road access, blocking driveways and the park gate).

Stawamus Chief Park and Protected Area

- Still seeing considerable non-compliance with the closure. Visitors parking outside the park and walking in.
- Park Ranger Ali MacKellar joined the PO in enforcing the closure at the Chief on Sunday; many visitors had already arrived via walking in by the time staff were on site.

Shannon Falls Park

• Better compliance than the Chief, but people parking at Darrell Bay and walking into the park

Murrin Park

- Some visitors still using outhouses despite closed signage.
- Many visitors were walking through Murrin to access Petgill Lake.

Joffre Lakes Park

Only one car ignored the closed sign at Joffre all weekend.

Chilliwack Lake Park

No weekend patrols.

2. Partially Closed Parks

Cypress Park

- Road closures still an effective means of controlling visitors; constant flow of cars turning around. Critical for PO to maintain gate staffing 24/7.
- Handful of park users reportedly skiing in the resort while groomers are still operating.
- Bikes not slowing down coming down to the gate despite the barriers and STOP signs.
- PO observed a biker crashing into the gate (no injuries). Some safety concerns around that for people working the gate.

Mount Seymour Park

- Road closures still an effective means of controlling visitors; constant flow of cars turning around. Critical for PO to maintain gate staffing 24/7.
- Old Buck parking lot over capacity; overflowing onto Anne McDonald Way. So far no complaints received.

Alice Lake Park

No weekend patrols.

3. Other Parks

- Nairn Falls: 10 cars parked outside the gate.
- Brandywine Falls: 5 cars Sunday afternoon.
- Garibaldi Park:
 - 21 vehicles between both upper and chainup area/2 vehicles and 10 vehicles parked along roadway up to Rubble Creek
 - Social distancing mostly being observed.

Generally use in our parks was manageable...thanks to some rather inclement weather across the region.

We are getting good compliance with our Director's order closure at Skaha Bluffs, but anticipate the long weekend will be challenging with off-site parking.

Kalamalka Lake Park and Ellison Park witnessed high numbers of people but most are self-regulating with social distancing. The gate at Ellison Park was compromised which allowed for vehicle access to the parking lot. The gate is being fixed today.

Lussier Hot Springs at Whiteswan Park did see some non-compliance but a very strong presence by BC Parks staff and the COS helped deflect most of the use.

West Kootenay experienced the majority of the issues over the weekend. They are seeing a significant increase in use in parks that are accessible: Syringa, Kokanee, Beaver Creek. Along with lots of people our ranger staff and the PO are observing lots of non-compliance; dogs, gatherings, of people using facilities(tables).

- Physical distancing works.
- For that reason, the PHO continues to encourage people to stay home and avoid recreational travel, even within the province.
- Until now, BC Parks has taken a scaled and phased-in approach to park access limits to preserve
 general access and provided limited access to outdoor areas and has encouraged people to
 practice physical distancing.
- Where we have implemented access restrictions and park closures, they have proven successful, but they have also resulted in higher usage of the parks that remain open as users seek alternatives.
- Many parks have already experienced peak season levels of use that has resulted in overwhelmed parking lots, trails and trailheads, making physical distancing difficult if not impossible in some locations. It has also resulted in damage to our facilities and the environment.
- Self-isolation and/or concerns with potential for COVID-19 exposure have reduced park management capacity.
- This puts the public, staff, contractors and volunteers such as search and rescue services at risk.
 This at a time when resources and supplies are being diverted to support front line health care workers.
- Spill-over to neighbouring communities has also been a concern raised by citizens, local
 government officials, First Nations and police, along with general concerns about overcrowding
 and the lack of physical distancing in provincial parks.
- With the Easter holiday upon us, and given the challenges posed by COVID-19, the expected
 influx of visitors is beyond the ability of BC Parks to manage for physical distancing and general
 public safety.
- For this reason, we are implementing an immediate closure of all provincial parks and a continued ban on all camping.
- This action is difficult but necessary. We ask that you please respect the closures by not attempting to access provincial parks.
- BC Parks recognizes the value of nature in contributing to public health and wellness, and will
 expand access to the park system as soon as the PHO indicates it can be done without increasing
 the risk of COVID-19 transmission.







RLC has brought forward concerns around the health and safety of their staff members if they are required to service the sani station during the pandemic. Concerns are similar to those of cleaning Pit Toilets, an activity that has been stopped in most areas.

RLC is recommending opening up the Sani-station, not charging for use, not turning the water on, not cleaning or maintaining the equipment, and clearly signing the Sani-station as unmaintained.

This would remove their staff from the health risk and allow visitors to dump their septic tanks.

Pumping of the sani-station septic would be paid for through PMA.

During the discussions with the PO, this was considered to be the best solution given the current situation. Does this plan work for the agency?

- D. This order is subject to amendment, revocation or repeal as necessary to respond to changing circumstances around the COVID-19 pandemic.
- E. The protection of park visitor health, the health of all BC Parks staff, Park Operators, contractors and permittees is the primary consideration in the making of this order.

F. Section 17 of the Park Act states:

A director or any park officer acting on the director's behalf may do one or more of the following:

(c) order any person in any park, conservancy or recreation area to cease or refrain from an action, an omission or conduct that the director or park officer, in his or her discretion, considers dangerous to life or property or detrimental to the public interest;

- Continued access and use of areas described in Section A (page 1) to accommodate Indigenous people's social, ceremonial, and cultural activities in provincial parks and protected areas must align with current health directives for public health and safety.
- 5. This order comes into effect at 08:00 hrs (PST) on Wednesday April 8th, 2020 and remains in effect until repealed by further order.

6. If this order is not carried out or is only partially or imperfectly carried out, I may direct any person to carry out or complete the order, and the expense to the government of carrying out or completing the carrying out of the order will be a debt owing to the government by Individual at the suit of the government in any court of competent jurisdiction

All BC Parks closing

VICTORIA – BC Parks is immediately closing all provincial parks in response to the widespread call for increased action to address COVID-19.

The closure responds to both the federal and provincial directives that people should stay close to home to reduce COVID-19 transmission risk. This temporary measure means people should not be going to provincial parks until further notice.

"Because physical distancing works, it is critical that we take every action needed to restrict the spread of COVID-19. This applies to British Columbians and out-of-province visitors who were planning to visit or stay at our provincial parks. The message is clear: stay home, avoid travel, do not put yourself or others at risk," said George Heyman, Minister of Environment and Climate Change Strategy.

"I understand and share the love people in British Columbia have for the outdoors and the connection between health and proximity to nature. We tried to provide safe space for people to get some exercise and fresh air in our beautiful parks. But it has proven too challenging to maintain safe distance between visitors. This action is difficult but necessary. We look forward to the day we can welcome people back to our wonderful parks."

The decision to close the park system is informed by continued feedback from RCMP, local government, First Nations, local search-and-rescue organizations and the general public. While many people are observing the physical distancing requirements set by the provincial health officer (PHO), some continue to ignore the order, making enforcement in a wilderness setting challenging.

The timing of this decision is important given the upcoming long weekend and the beginning of the busy season for outdoor recreation and camping. BC Parks is also extending the ban on all camping in provincial parks until May 31, 2020, in alignment with neighbouring jurisdictions and the temporary closure of Canada's national parks. Refunds for bookings up to May 31 will be sent automatically.

As previously announced, the Recreation Sites and Trails BC (RSTBC) branch of the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development has also closed its campgrounds and amenities in response to the COVID-19 situation.

BC Parks has taken a scaled and phased in approach to limiting park access following PHO requirements and the latest COVID-19 transmission data. BC Parks recognizes the value of nature in contributing to public health and wellness and will expand access to the park system as soon as the PHO indicates it can be done without increasing the risk of COVID-19 transmission.

BC Parks Messaging – Full System Closure

- Physical distancing works.
- For that reason, the PHO continues to encourage people to stay home and avoid recreational travel, even within the province.
- Until now, BC Parks has taken a scaled and phased-in approach to park access limits to preserve
 general access and provided limited access to outdoor areas and has encouraged people to
 practice physical distancing.
- Where we have implemented access restrictions and park closures, they have proven successful, but they have also resulted in higher usage of the parks that remain open as users seek alternatives.
- Many parks have already experienced peak season levels of use that has resulted in overwhelmed parking lots, trails and trailheads, making physical distancing difficult if not impossible in some locations. It has also resulted in damage to our facilities and the environment.
- Self-isolation and/or concerns with potential for COVID-19 exposure have reduced park management capacity.
- This puts the public, staff, contractors and volunteers such as search and rescue services at risk.
 This at a time when resources and supplies are being diverted to support front line health care workers.
- Spill-over to neighbouring communities has also been a concern raised by citizens, local government officials, First Nations and police, along with general concerns about overcrowding and the lack of physical distancing in provincial parks.
- With the Easter holiday upon us, and given the challenges posed by COVID-19, the expected
 influx of visitors is beyond the ability of BC Parks to manage for physical distancing and general
 public safety.
- For this reason, we are implementing an immediate closure of all provincial parks and a continued ban on all camping.
- This action is difficult but necessary. We ask that you please respect the closures by not attempting to access provincial parks.
- BC Parks recognizes the value of nature in contributing to public health and wellness, and will
 expand access to the park system as soon as the PHO indicates it can be done without increasing
 the risk of COVID-19 transmission.
- While we are closed to public access, we'll be using the time to prepare our parks for re-opening and look forward to when we can welcome the public back #ExploreBC...later

Why are some parks throughout the province now fully closed, and what does this mean?

BC Parks received numerous complaints and concerns from the public, RCMP, First Nations, regional and municipal governments related to the increase in visitors in certain parks and a lack of people adhering to social distancing directives currently place. This raised concerns regarding our ability to preserve the health and safety of the public in our parks and we decided to close these parks.

The public may not enter any parks that have been closed under an Executive Directors Order. These closures have been put in place to preserve the public health and safety.

Who has the authority to close a park?

- Under the Park Act, Section 17 Authorities of Directors and Officers, BC Parks Executive Directors and Regional Directors have the ability to issue an order for closure.
- Parks closed under an Directors Order prohibit access of the public.
- The public can continue to access those parks that remain open but in doing so must remember that services have been suspended and facilities in most parks, including washrooms, have been closed.
- Please visit specific park pages to get more information on parks currently available for visitation.

Which BC Parks are closed:

Due to public health and safety concerns BC Parks is immediately closing the entire BC Parks system, including all parks, protected areas, conservancies, recreation areas, and ecological reserves. All provincial parks and camping (front and backcountry) is now banned until May 31st, 2020. This action is being taken in response to the call for increased action to address the COVID-19 pandemic.

How will park closures be enforced?

- This temporary measure means public and vehicle access is prohibited until further notice. All trails, roads, day-use areas, beaches, lakes, boat launches, and backcountry areas are closed to the public.
- Park closures will be enforced through regular monitoring and patrols and anyone found in a closed park will be evicted and could face a \$115 fine.

Can I still access trails?

• This temporary measure means all trails, roads, day-use areas, beaches, lakes, boat launches, and backcountry areas are closed to the public. Also, all public and vehicle access is prohibited until further notice.

Visitors may use frontcountry, backcountry and marine areas where accessible but should keep in mind they are responsible for their own safety and that washroom facilities will not be available at parks. Parking lots in many parks may be closed and gated where necessary to ensure public health and safety. Complete park closures may also be implemented on a case-by-case basis where required.

Parks close to urban centres can attract large numbers of people, so please keep this in mind when choosing which park to visit. To keep each other safe, visitors are reminded to follow social distancing direction set out by the provincial health officer and the BC Centre for Disease Control.

Can I still go camping?

All current reservations with arrival dates between March 20 and April 30 May 31, 2020, inclusive, are being automatically cancelled and fully refunded. Please allow 7-10 business days for your refund to be processed. Please do not cancel your own reservation if you have reservations that fall within this booking window as cancelling your own reservation or submitting a refund request may delay processing.

If you currently hold a reservation with an arrival date beyond April 30 May 31st, regular reservation and cancellation rules apply. However, as we move through this pandemic this date may change. Check back on the BC Parks homepage for further updates.

The Discover Camping call centre is available for reservations support during the updated call centre hours of:

Monday–Friday, 9am–5pm PT Saturday–Sunday, 10am–4pm PT

Please note – the Discover Camping call centre is for reservations-related transactions and questions, only. They do not have general park access information.

No new reservations will not be accepted until further notice.

Good Morning Jim,

We are aware of the concern for the spread of Covid-19 to rural/remote communities and are heeding all travel restrictions at the national, provincial, and local levels. We are currently working with our sponsor, the US National Science Foundation, on plans to potentially delay or fully postpone all field activities this summer.

Our team has spent several months this winter creating a detailed plan for the removal of 87 seismic stations throughout Alaska and northwestern Canada, concluding the temporary USArray project. If we are unable to remove stations this year, we will plan to operate one additional year (with no planned in-person service visits), with decommissioning work shifting to 2021. Fortunately, this extended timeline would be covered by our current permit (#108176) which does not expire until 12/30/2021.

We thank you for your flexibility and willingness to work with us during this unprecedented time.

Good morning:

I am emailing today to advise that as of Wednesday, April 8th, 2020, we are closing all provincial parks until further notice. This action is being taken in response to the call for increased action to address the COVID-19 pandemic and aligning with federal and provincial experts requesting citizens to stay home. With the Easter holiday now upon us, and the challenges posed by COVID along with the expected influx of visitors, we feel it is beyond the ability of BC Parks to manage for physical distancing and general public safety. We feel this closure is necessary to ensure the health and safety of our visitors, employees, park operators and their staff, volunteers, and park contractors. Along with this, the spill-over to neighbouring communities raised concerns with citizens, local government officials, First Nations and police along with a general concern with provincial parks overcrowding and the lack of social distancing.

This temporary measure means that any activity involving the participation of the public is prohibited for the duration of the order. Where permit holders need to access a park for activities not involving the participation of the public, but as required for the preservation and maintenance of the park or their own private facilities, they must have a written exemption from the Regional Director responsible for the park in question. Requests for exemptions should be coordinated through the BC Parks staff contacts listed on your permits. Park closures will be enforced through regular monitoring and patrols and anyone found in a closed park without a written exemption may be evicted and could face a \$115 fine.

A public notice will be issued when this closure is lifted, and regular public access and permitted operations can resume.





- 1. Will park facility operators and other park staff be laid off as a result of the park closures, or will they continue to work?
 - We continue to work with our Park Operators to manage the current closure.

 operators and park rangers. Signs are posted at various locations within parks to
 provide notice about the closures to the public and barricades will be installed at

Hi,

As requested here is the approach that we discussed with the Regional Directors in regard to exemptions from the Executive Director Order closing parks to public access. Park Operators and Contractors working directly for BC Parks capital program are being considered as "agents" of BC Parks, and are not included as "public" in the order and won't require specific exemptions. Also included in this are Emergency responders when addressing emergencies (ie: Police, SAR, EMBC, BCWS etc).

Park Use Permittees and other entities from the public that are authorized to have infrastructure or conduct activities in Parks would be required to have an exemption in order to access the park, and these exemptions are at the discretion of the Regional Director and are based on the criteria that;

- there is no participation of the [general] public in the activity being exempted (eg: Guide Outfitter clients) and;
- that it is necessary for the permittee to access the park to maintain their infrastructure in the park, continue critical operations that preserve and maintain park values, or is necessary to access private or park facilities (within or outside the park).

We have developed a template for those exemptions (attached above).

Some examples of where exemptions are being considered is:

- Permittees with cabins or other private infrastructure in the park for the **maintenance** of that infrastructure (ie: not just private recreational use).
- Utilities and utility corridors with maintenance or infrastructure requirements (hydro lines, gas lines, cell towers etc).

• Other government agencies that need access to perform or maintain their critical operations (eg: DFO – Nav Aids; Provincial fisheries enumeration, stocking etc.)

The Regional Director is the discretionary decision maker will be basing their decision on the intent of the order and the specific request that they are considering. The paramount goal is to manage the park consistent with the closure of access to the general public for recreation and other non-essential purposes in support of broader government messaging of the public remaining at home to protect public health.



As requested here is the approach that we discussed with the Regional Directors in regard to exemptions from the Executive Director Order closing parks to public access. Park Operators and Contractors working directly for BC Parks capital program are being considered as "agents" of BC

Parks, and are not included as "public" in the order and won't require specific exemptions. Also included in this are Emergency responders when addressing emergencies (ie: Police, SAR, EMBC, BCWS etc).

Park Use Permittees and other entities from the public that are authorized to have infrastructure or conduct activities in Parks would be required to have an exemption in order to access the park, and these exemptions are at the discretion of the Regional Director and are based on the criteria that;

- there is no participation of the [general] public in the activity being exempted (eg: Guide Outfitter clients) and;
- that it is necessary for the permittee to access the park to maintain their infrastructure in the park, continue critical operations that preserve and maintain park values, or is necessary to access private or park facilities (within or outside the park).

We have developed a template for those exemptions (attached above).

Some examples of where exemptions are being considered is:

- Permittees with cabins or other private infrastructure in the park for the **maintenance** of that infrastructure (ie: not just private recreational use).
- Utilities and utility corridors with maintenance or infrastructure requirements (hydro lines, gas lines, cell towers etc).
- Permittees with permits allowing access to private inholdings or private lands adjacent to the park.
- Research or time bound scientific investigations where the information is of a benefit to the park, and the PHO directives can be maintained.
- Trappers, Range tenure holders and others who have obligations under other legislation that require access to the park.
- Critical conservation work requiring access to the park for specific individuals or entities and where the PHO directives can be maintained.
- Other government agencies that need access to perform or maintain their critical operations (eg: DFO Nav Aids; Provincial fisheries enumeration, stocking etc.)



This closure is in direct response to both the federal and provincial directives that people should stay home and reduce transmission risk. This temporary measure means people should not be recreating in provincial parks until further notice.

"Now, more than ever, it is critical that we take every action to restrict the spread of COVID-19. This applies to people in British Columbia and those who would typically visit our provincial parks and from those outside our borders. The message is clear – stay home, avoid travel, do not put yourself at risk." said BC's Environment and Climate Change Strategy Minister George Heyman. "I understand and share the love people in British Columbia have for the outdoors and the need to be close to nature. This action is not taken lightly, but is necessary."

The decision to close the park system is informed by continued feedback from RCMP, local government, First Nations, local Search and Rescue organizations and the general public. While many people are observing the physical distancing requirements set by the provincial health officer (PHO), some continue to ignore the order increasing the risk of transmission.

BC Parks is also extending the ban on all camping in provincial parks until May 31st, 2020 in alignment with neighbouring jurisdictions and the temporary closure of Canada's national parks. Refunds will automatically be provided to those with existing reservations during this time.



Dear Jim,

After speaking with Jennie Aikman and Dylan Eyers today, I understand that BC Parks is in the process of preparing an announcement on park operations for the coming weeks in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. I am deeply concerned that BC Parks is considering maintaining access to some Day Use Areas despite the direction of BC's Provincial Health Officer regarding mass gatherings, social distancing and the importance of not putting further stress on our healthcare system.

While I understand the importance of being outside during this difficult time, I believe it

is irresponsible to provide access to parks where people congregate in groups greater than 50 and require services from front line staff. Park Operators and Mt. Seymour staff provide services including managing visitor volume, providing park information and answering questions, providing first aid, directing traffic, cleaning washrooms and collecting garbage and recycling. The staff members working in Day Use areas will undoubtedly find themselves in close contact with visitors throughout their shifts. Maintaining the required social distancing measures will be difficult for staff and visitors, especially due to high anticipated volumes as seen in the last several days at most parks.

In addition, we anticipate that staffing Day Use areas will become increasingly difficult. Currently \$.22

have indicated they are not willing to work in this environment. As a responsible employer, I am concerned that I will not be exposing my staff to an unsafe work environment. As Dr. Henry continues to indicate now is the time for all British Columbians need to take action to reduce the spread of COVID-19.

If an accident occurs in a park, search and rescue and hospitalization may be required, compromising our health care capacity. This one of the reasons Mt Seymour Resorts, along with other ski areas, closed on Monday, March 16th. We have seen high volume, as evidenced by full parking lots, over the past week in areas including Stawamus Chief, Shannon Falls and Poteau Cove. We have also experienced significant volume at Mt Seymour in the last week.

If BC Parks decides to keep Day Use Areas open this weekend and throughout the pandemic period we will experience overcrowding (groups of more than 50 people) which will contradict the Class Order and direction provided by Minister Adrien Dix and Chief Provincial Health Officer Dr. Bonnie Henry, social distancing will be compromised and our healthcare system will be further taxed. I firmly believe that all Day Use Areas should be closed and that British Columbians should be advised to be outside in their yards and in their neighbourhoods where they can successfully maintain adequate social distancing.



Subject: Conversation with Mayor Ken Williams of the District of Highlands

Hello Shannon and Jim.

I followed up with Mayor Williams this afternoon at the request of Jim. It was a good conversation and Mayor Williams understands the challenges we are facing.

The key points of our discussion:

- I explained that BC Parks' consistent observations in the current portion of Gowlland Tod Park that remains open is that park visitor activity within the park is being managed well. We are finding that the available space in this portion of the park and the wider trails (as opposed to the narrow trails in the nearby CRD Parks) are helping visitors maintain the social distancing and other guidelines and rules communicated by the Provincial Health Officer.
- I also explained that we are aware of the concerns expressed by citizens within his community with the parking along the adjacent municipal roadways. I explained that, while we are conducting patrols in the area with our Park Rangers, BC Parks has no jurisdiction in these locations and any unauthorized parking would need to be enforced by the by-law officers.
- Mayor Williams agreed with our observations of visitor activity within the park and confirmed
 that his by-law officers would be monitoring the situation. He explained that some of the
 parking is not being done in conflict with local by-laws but they are particularly concerned
 about parking congestion obstructing fire hydrants and other needs by the local fire
 department. This will be the focus of the by-law officers.
- Mayor Williams is concerned about the potential increase in parking congestion and traffic in the area as we near the summer.
- Mayor Williams explained that most of his concerns are with the nearby CRD Parks because of their narrower trails, dogs off leash and less than sanitary toilets.

- I explained that we have Park Ranger staff patrolling key locations in the South Island throughout the week and weekend, that Gowlland Tod Park is one of those key locations. I did emphasize that we are very stretched with our capacity but will continue to do our best to monitor the situation in Gowlland Tod Park, promoting to park visitors the need for social distancing and install signage in additional locations where needed.
- He did identify the Emma Dickson Trailhead location as one that is more concerning than the
 others and that we should consider a closure of that trail. I explained that I would investigate
 that with staff, keeping in mind that a trail closure may help with the parking congestion issue
 but that compliance from all would likely not be successful. At the same time it is worth
 investigating and I'll discuss today with staff.

The above covers the main points of the discussion. I provided Mayor Williams with my cell number and offered that he could contact me if he has any further questions or concerns that he would like to discuss with BC Parks. He thanked me for the call and willingness for further discussions as needed.

I hope this helps. Any questions please let me know.



On Saturday I received 6 text messages from individuals concerned about behaviour in the Squamish so on Sunday at 1300h I decided to go take a look for myself and what I observed was outrageous. It has already been explained to me that people are being encouraged to go outdoors and that we are hoping that they will adhere to the Medical Health Guidelines for distancing but here is what I observed.

Large groups....yes, close quarters....yes but that's only the start.

I drove to the Sigurd trail head in the Ashlu and then to 11 km in the Squamish. I stopped counting vehicles at 500, the rec sites where overloaded with campers, beaches covered with people, high speed driving on the wrong side of the road with oncoming traffic, drinking while driving, throwing cans out of the vehicle, I observed 16 moto cross, 2 side X sides and an ATV with no licensing (also 11 motor bikes were licensed), Vehicles ripping up the floodplain in places were they would have to cross fish bearing side channels to get, and everywhere you stop gunfire including handgun fire at the pit at 5 Km.

I spoke to 2 different groups...first to a group of 12 motocross riders and I casually mentioned the need for licensing and insurance to ride on the mainline. The response was expletive who's going to check us.

The second group was 24 guys partying at the Ashlu, I asked them were they were from and why were the there....the response was, we can't gather in Van we will get fined so we came here to party, drink and shoot guns.

Every weekend is now like the worst long weekend.

As some of you know the last 2 weekends have been similar and I expressed concerns regarding social behaviour and mixed messaging. It's obvious that people are stupid or have no regard for the well being of others but my concerns now switch to wildlife. We are expecting a warm week and Grizzlies will be emerging and dropping to the floodplain were the food is. They will be met by 100's to 1000's of people drinking with guns. Not an ideal situation.

Something has to be done, any suggestions?

Good afternoon all.

This morning my minister presented to caucus our plan to move to a full system closure for the provincial parks system. Current plan is for the attached news release to go out at 8am this Wednesday. Up to this point, BC Parks has taken a scaled and phased-in approach to park access limits to preserve general access and provide the public with outdoor areas to use, subject to practicing physical distancing. Where we have implemented access restrictions, they have proven successful, but they have also resulted in higher usage of the parks that remain open as users seek alternatives.

With the desire of the public to get out of doors, many parks have already experienced peak season levels of use which overwhelmed parking lots, trails and trailheads, made physical distancing difficult if not impossible in some locations, and resulted in damage to our facilities and the environment. As well, self-isolation and/or concerns with potential for COVID exposure have reduced park management capacity. This puts the public, staff, contractors and volunteers such as SARS at risk. This at a time when resources and supplies are being diverted to support front line health care workers. Spill-over to neighbouring communities has also been a concern raised by citizens, local government officials First Nations and police along with a general concern with provincial parks overcrowding and the lack of social distancing.

With the Easter holiday upon us, and given the challenges posed by COVID, the expected influx of visitors is beyond the ability of BC Parks to manage for physical distancing and general public safety. For all these reasons, we are moving to a full access closure of all provincial parks.



BC Parks Response to COVID 19: Full BC Parks System Closure

BC Parks is immediately closing all provincial parks in response to the call for increased action to address the COVID-19 pandemic.

With the desire of the public to get outdoors, many parks have already experienced peak season levels of use that have resulted in overwhelmed parking lots, trails and trailheads, making physical distancing difficult, if not impossible in some locations. It also resulted in damage to our facilities and the environment. By taking this action, BC Parks is aligning with federal and provincial directives for people to stay home and reduce COVID-19 transmission risk.

This temporary measure means public and vehicle access is no longer available. All trails, roads, day use areas, beaches, lakes, boat launches, and backcountry areas are closed to the public. Park closures will be enforced through regular monitoring and patrols and anyone found in a closed park will be evicted and could face a \$115 fine.

In addition to the full system closure, the campground closure has been extended to May 31. Full refunds will continue to be provided to those with existing reservations during this time. The Discover Camping reservation system has been suspended for all new reservations. A public notice will be issued once facilities are reopened and the system is able to accept new reservations.

BC Parks continues to monitor the COVID-19 outbreak closely and is following the recommendations set out by the provincial health officer and Minister of Health for decisions related to closure and reopening of parks and facilities.

VICTORIA – BC Parks is announcing the immediate closure of all provincial parks in response to the call for increased action to address the COVID-19 pandemic.

The closure responds to both the federal and provincial directives that people should stay close to home to reduce COVID-19 transmission risk. This temporary measure means people should not be recreating in provincial parks until further notice.

"Now, as we see that physical distancing works, it is critical that we take every action needed to restrict the spread of COVID-19. This applies to British Columbians and out of province visitors who were planning to visit or stay at our provincial parks. The message is clear – stay home, avoid travel, do not put yourself or others at risk," said B.C.'s Environment and Climate Change Strategy Minister George Heyman. "I understand and share the love people in British Columbia have for the outdoors and the connection between health and proximity to nature. We tried to provide safe space for people get some exercise and fresh air in our beautiful parks, but it has proven too challenging to maintain safe distance between visitors. This action is difficult but necessary. We look forward to the day we can welcome people back to our wonderful parks."

The decision to close the park system is informed by continued feedback from RCMP, local government, First Nations, local search and rescue organizations and the general public. While many people are observing the physical distancing requirements set by the provincial health officer (PHO), some continue to ignore the order, making enforcement in a wilderness setting challenging.

The timing of this decision is important given the upcoming long weekend and the beginning of the busy season for outdoor recreation and camping. BC Parks is also extending the ban on all camping in provincial parks until May 31, 2020, in alignment with neighbouring jurisdictions and the temporary closure of Canada's national parks. Refunds for bookings up to May 31 will be sent automatically.

As previously announced, the Recreation Sites and Trails BC (RSTBC) branch of the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development has also closed its campgrounds and amenities in response to the COVID-19 situation.

BC Parks has taken a scaled and phased in approach to limiting park access following PHO requirements and the latest COVID-19 transmission data. BC Parks recognizes the value of nature in contributing to public health and wellness and will expand access to the park system as soon as the PHO indicates it can be done without increasing the risk of COVID-19 transmission.

Park Act

Order of the Executive Director

TO:

Public Notice

DATE:

April 8, 2020

WHEREAS:

- A. This order applies to all Crown land established or continued as a park, conservancy, recreation area, or ecological reserve under the *Park Act*, the *Protected Areas of British Columbia Act* or protected areas established under provisions of the *Environment and Land Use Act*.
- B. This order is made in the public interest in response to the COVID-19 pandemic for the purposes of the protection of human health and safety.
- C. This order is in regard to all public access, facilities or uses that exist in any of the lands mentioned in Section A above, and include but are not limited to: campgrounds, day-use areas, trails, playgrounds, shelters, visitor centers, cabins, chalets, lodges, resort areas, group campsites, and all other facilities or lands owned or operated by or on behalf of BC Parks.
- D. This order is subject to amendment, revocation or repeal as necessary to respond to changing circumstances around the COVID-19 pandemic.
- E. The protection of park visitor health, the health of all BC Parks staff, Park Operators, contractors and permittees is the primary consideration in the making of this order.

F. Section 17 of the Park Act states:

A director or any park officer acting on the director's behalf may do one or more of the following:

(c) order any person in any park, conservancy or recreation area to cease or refrain from an action, an omission or conduct that the director or park officer, in his or her discretion, considers dangerous to life or property or detrimental to the public interest;

ACCORDINGLY, the Executive Director orders:

- All Provincial Parks, Conservancies, Recreation Areas and Ecological Reserves established or continued under the Park Act, the Protected Areas of British Columbia Act, or protected areas established under provisions of the Environment and Land Use Act, are hereby closed to all uses by the public.
- Any facility, event, or activity involving the participation of the public, which
 was previously allowed or authorized under the authority of a Park Officer, or
 a Park Use Permit are ordered to cease and are closed for the duration of
 this order.
- 3. Access to any park, associated with any authorized or permitted operations, that do not involve the participation of the public and are for the purpose(s) of the preservation and maintenance of the park; access to or maintenance of private or park facilities; requires a written exemption to this order issued by the Regional Director responsible for the Park.
- Continued access and use of areas described in Section A (page 1) to accommodate Indigenous people's social, ceremonial, and cultural activities in provincial parks and protected areas must align with current health directives for public health and safety.
- 5. This order comes into effect at 08:00 hrs (PST) on Wednesday April 8th, 2020 and remains in effect until repealed by further order.

6. If this order is not carried out or is only partially or imperfectly carried out, I may direct any person to carry out or complete the order, and the expense to the government of carrying out or completing the carrying out of the order will be a debt owing to the government by Individual at the suit of the government in any court of competent jurisdiction

Good morning:

I am emailing today to advise that as of Wednesday, April 8th, 2020, we are closing all provincial parks and protected areas until further notice. All campgrounds, camping opportunities and accommodations will be closed until at least May 31, 2020. This action is being taken in response to the call for increased action to address the COVID-19 pandemic and aligning with federal and provincial experts requesting citizens to stay home.

With the desire of the public to get outdoors, many parks recently experienced peak season levels of use overwhelming parking lots, trails and trailheads, making physical distancing difficult if not impossible in some locations, and resulted in damage to our facilities and the environment. Along with this, the spill-over to neighbouring communities raised concerns with some First Nations, local citizens, local government officials, and police along with a general concern with provincial parks overcrowding and the lack of social distancing.

Today, with the Easter holiday upon us, and the challenges posed by COVID-19 and the expected influx of visitors, we feel it is beyond the ability of BC Parks to manage for physical distancing and general public safety. We feel this closure is necessary to ensure the health and safety of all, including that of our neighbouring Indigenous communities.

This closure is in no way intended to restrict Indigenous social, ceremonial, and cultural activities in provincial parks and protected areas that align with current health directives for public health and safety.

In these challenging times, BC Parks continues to recognize and respect the rights of Indigenous peoples. Thus, while taking these necessary steps to ensure public health and safety and to prevent the further spread of COVID-19, BC Parks will continue to make every reasonable effort to ensure that the steps taken will be respectful of Aboriginal and Treaty rights of Indigenous peoples.

BC Parks would like to address any concerns and input you may have regarding health and safety measures for the provincial park system during the COVID-19 crisis.

A public notice will be issued when this closure is lifted, and facilities are reopened and available for reservation.

Our advice to visitors is to continue following the Provincial Health Officer's direction regarding social distancing and other health measures.

Our regional staff will be in touch with park operators directly to work through all operational questions and park specific plans on the ground regarding these closures and we certainly invite you to reach out to us with any concerns you may have as well

BC Parks appreciates your understanding, cooperation, and support and we hope that your families and community members are staying safe and well during this challenging time
