Hi Merran, Colleen and Jeremy,

I hope you're all managing ok through these very challenging times.

I wanted to share some thoughts on the work the Council could do through this year into 2021. At a high-level, I think the pandemic warrants a rethink of our workplan to make sure we're going to be providing useful advice to govt.

Here are my thoughts on where we could be most useful:

- 1. Finding ways of moving ahead with phase 1 CleanBC commitments. We already had this topic on our list, but I expect the individual pieces will be more challenging to get across the finish line now and may benefit from some additional time/advice from the Council. The key ones in my mind are: strengthening the low carbon fuel standard, legislating the renewable gas standard, implementing the regulations for the ZEV Act, and restarting carbon tax increases. For something like the renewable gas standard, we might benefit by emphasizing the economic development benefits that would be mostly distributed to agriculture and forestry sectors that we could be doing more to emphasize. For something like the carbon tax increase, it may be more successful to link together with some of the ideas in #2 below.
- 2. Figuring out a package of phase 2 CleanBC actions that are central/complementary to covid19 recovery plans. My expectation is that managing through the crisis and then managing the recovery will be govt's top priorities for the foreseeable future. To be successful with phase 2 CleanBC, I think the best approach is to fit into that context. Here are my thoughts on where I think we can successful with phase 2 CleanBC:
 - a. I expect there will to be a need for a significant stimulus package after we make it through the lock-down phase, and I think we should be trying to put as strong a climate lens on that as possible. This could include: \$ for zero emissions wooden affordable housing, \$'s to support industrial decarbonization projects, \$ for transit and active

- transportation expansion, \$ for adaptation, \$ for EV charging infrastructure, \$ to transition BC film sector to zero emissions, etc.
- b. I think we should be trying to help the government package up a some initiatives that make it easier and more affordable for British Columbians to switch to renewable energy and use that energy more efficiently. Some of the ideas in the BC Hydro phase 2 review could easily fit into such a package (e.g. voluntary EV/heatpump rates), as could some of the ideas that Technical Safety BC is considering.
- c. I think we should be trying to help the government package up a set of initiatives that set some expectations that the most well off British Columbians transition to renewable energy faster. I think there's a sweet spot here where we could get some additional tonnes, without running up against competiveness or affordability constraints. An example would be a vehicle feebate that is limited to higher-end vehicles where people have more disposable income and EVs are more readily available.
- d. 2a, 2b, and 2c could all fit well with the interest of collaborating more with local governments on CleanBC. For 2a, stimulus programs could be set up with options for local government top-ups. For 2b, there's lots of local government red tape we could remove to make zero emissions options easier/more affordable (heat pump permits are my favorite Vancouver example). For 2c, this would need more thought, but there would be a lot of local govt interest at least in MV and CRD a good example would be Vancouver's carbon pollution cap on new large homes, which sets a higher expectation for environmental performance if you're lucky enough to be building a new large home in the city.
- 3. Suggesting some areas that could be de-emphasized in the workplan. I expect much of this year is likely to be crisis management and I think our key priority should be doing what we can to have climate action momentum in BC as we make our way out of the crisis. We can't afford another 5 year stall in action like we had after the last recession. With that in mind, it is probably worth some consideration if some elements in the workplan should be deemphasized to enable govt to put greater emphasis on #1 and #2 above. From my perspective, I think we should consider putting a lighter touch on the accountability report, interim targets and sector targets. They're all required by legislation, but I think the end products are fairly flexible. For example, instead of trying to solve the quagmire of industry/building/transportation targets, the first pass targets could be focused on the carbon intensity of electricity, nat gas, and gasoline/diesel.

A quick update on hydrogen initiatives for you all...

- We have had two call with Minister Ralston and staff at his request to discuss "shovel-ready" hydrogen stimulus initiatives. We prepared a summary document with a list of potential projects. He is very positive and has requested further details. Many of your organizations are partners in one or more project. I can provide a copy of the document to those interested.
- 2. There is support for a national instore marine working group in the CHFCA to cooperate on hydrogen energy applications in marine: codes, storage, hydrogen supply, advocacy, training, workshops, funding, etc. Particular interest among the marine engineering groups. Some debate whether this should be integrated with Ports, but the applications are quite different. Possible link with Maritime Centre? If you would like more information, please contact me.

Regarding "Demand Aggregation", the leading shovel ready project is a hydrogen production facility. It is baseloaded on gas blending in NG lines, but will also supply transportation and industrial applications. It will initially be relatively small capacity, but the plan is to scale to a liquid plant on the North Shore that will supply emerging applications in marine, trucking, buses, etc. – plus export to the Pacific Northwest and AB. Demand aggregation will be essential!

Similar hydrogen energy stimulus plans are being developed in AB, ON and QC. Regional differences, but common themes: hydrogen blending in NG lines and buses as the leading applications, with a mix of transportation demos.

I thought I would give you an update from the PCC Resilience Drafting Team call today. You might want to pass this along to Jeremy, as Craig from the Premier's Office does sit on those calls. Craig seems to be in conversations with the Governors around recovery efforts and building the low carbon economy into those.

The discussion shifted a bit from previous calls and there was a desire to do some framing around COVID stimulus / economic recovery and advancing climate resilience as part of that. The question

was then around the timelines to release the framework, with some suggesting that we release it sooner to try and take advantage of opportunities that could come from that. There were no decisions made, but it's on the list for further discussion as to is there perhaps an internal version that could be done now and then a full version later for public consumption.

The European Recovery Plans were seen to have quite a bit of a climate flavour that isn't seen so far in the United States.

In previous calls we had split up sections of the framework to draft, and B.C. received a "gold star" because we were the only ones to have completed our section.

As a next step we could set up a call with Craig for us as another way into the recovery efforts, and to have more detailed information for Jeremy.

I don't have any suggestions for specific ideas at this time.

I suspect that government will have multiple priorities for recovery. I know you're already thinking about this; that the ideas most likely to be funded will be collaborations between ministries checking multiple priority boxes.

I also wonder if there are opportunities to think about how BC capitalizes on the changes to workplaces/life in BC that may come over the next few years. I haven't done much thinking about this, but was listening to Dr. Tam's interview on CBC today where she talked about things like remote work; and these things would have GHG cobenefits. 





Government planning of economic stimulus and recovery measures in response to the COVID-19 pandemic

Dear Premier Horgan and Minister Heyman,

We, members of the Climate Solutions Council, would like to recognize the hard work of the B.C. Government during the COVID-19 global crisis and thank you for your efforts to protect the health and safety of British Columbians. The COVID-19 pandemic is having a significant impact on our province's communities and economy, and we recognize the need to alleviate the short-term economic impacts from this crisis by supporting communities, businesses, and individuals who are, and will be, most affected.

Once immediate relief is in place, the government will put forward an economic stimulus package designed for job creation and rebuilding the economy. We believe this is a critical opportunity to follow recent advice from the International Energy Agency, the UN and influential publications like The Economist, which have all advocated using stimulus to help rebuild a resilient, low-carbon economy. Economic growth and our strong climate policies go hand in hand and B.C.'s long history of climate action has built an enviable foundation for the province's low-carbon industries and strong clean energy sector that will serve it well in recovering from the impacts of the pandemic. Therefore, we urge the Province to apply a climate and equity lens to all stimulus programs implemented to ensure that we promote the growth of a cleaner and more just economy, building on the objectives, values, and actions in CleanBC. This includes ensuring short-term actions are consistent with our longer-term transition to a sustainable low-carbon society and economy. B.C. has an opportunity to be among leading jurisdictions including the EU, Germany and South Korea, which have all made public commitments to link economic stimulus to innovation and decarbonization goals. This leadership—demonstrated by governments, businesses, Indigenous nations and citizens—positions B.C. well to develop COVID-19 recovery policies that spur innovation, create secure jobs and continue the province on a path to decarbonization

CleanBC provides the ideal strategic framework for stimulus investment

B.C. has benefited from climate leadership in the past and would benefit from continued leadership in the future. The economic crisis arising from the pandemic is creating a significant decline in greenhouse gas emissions. But as the economy recovers from the crisis, these emissions will rise again. Now is not the time to reverse our strong climate policies and plans to transition to a low-carbon economy.

B.C.'s prominent natural resource industries can all be part of economic recovery along with the clean energy and clean technology sectors. Independent research has found the province's clean energy sector employs 32,000 British Columbians, from hydro dam workers in the north, to cleantech engineers in Vancouver, to home insulators in the Fraser Valley.

CleanBC provides the ideal strategic blueprint within which to direct a significant portion of stimulus investment to cost-effective (in terms of emissions reduced per dollar spent) near- and mid-term projects, programs, and training, recognizing that some capital investments for infrastructure will take a longer time to come to fruition. CleanBC provides many initiatives that will help restore economic health, reduce carbon pollution, and generate sustainable economic growth.

Specific aspects of CleanBC that are relevant to short-term stimulus might include:

Buildings: Funds to build zero-emission affordable housing, built using B.C. wood products, and funds for heat pump and other energy upgrades for homes and buildings.

Industry: Funds to accelerate and incent large and small businesses to adopt technology to reduce emissions, industrial decarbonization projects including CCS or air capture, and to support grid infrastructure required to advance electrification.

Transportation: Funds for zero-emission transit and active transportation expansion.

We also encourage the government to include stimulus programs that make it easier and more affordable for businesses and households to switch to renewable energy and use energy more efficiently. Doing so provides more opportunity to make investments quickly and can also leverage private sector investments. For example, many of the ideas in the BC Hydro Phase 2 Review Interim Report would make it more affordable for British Columbians and B.C. businesses to switch from fossil fuels to clean electricity with solutions such as electric vehicles and heat pumps.

We strongly encourage you to work with the federal government and B.C. local governments to align stimulus efforts to ensure that they have the maximum impact on jobs, the economy and carbon pollution reduction.

Move forward with Phase 1 Clean BC programs, policies, and regulations

In addition to stimulus measures, we recommend that the government continue moving ahead, to the fullest extent practicable, with programs, policies, and regulations that have been committed to under Phase 1 of the CleanBC plan as well as delivering on other commitments made by government, including the development and integration of low carbon industrial strategy work with CleanBC. Announcements and progress to date on these measures have already sent a clear market signal, shaping business and investment decisions. As you know, these efforts are supporting the transition to clean energy across the economy and can ensure there is ongoing and increasing private sector investment in climate solutions. Key actions from Phase 1 of CleanBC include strengthening the low-carbon fuel standard, zero-emission vehicle regulations, continuing with carbon price increases, and funding CleanBC programs that have been oversubscribed in the past.

Role of the Climate Solutions Council

The intent of this letter is to highlight to the Province this critical opportunity during these exceptionally challenging times. The Climate Solutions Council would like to offer our collective expertise and mandate to support the government's efforts to align economic stimulus and recovery with CleanBC, including its climate targets for 2030 and beyond.

We recommend that the Minister of the Environment and his Deputy Minister be added to the recently announced Premier's Economic Recovery Task Force as well as representation from the BC Climate Solutions Council.

Again, thank you for the leadership your government is taking at this time to 'flatten the curve' and provide relief for B.C. families and businesses. Should you have any questions or wish to discuss these issues further, please do not hesitate to call us.


