
- 1) renewal of the BC approach to prioritization (listing) of species at risk, and
- 2) consistent implementation of mitigation and offsetting for development activities in BC.

#### Renewed federal mandate for Species at Risk Act Modernization

- The Province of BC will work with the federal government to identify opportunities for pilot projects to better align federal and provincial approaches with a goal to enhance species protection and recovery.
- Much has been learned through the Southern Mountain Caribou process and those learnings could be applied to other species and projects moving forward.

#### Projects that will provide benefits ds biodiversity and species management:

- · FRPA amendments
- Land Use Planning and Modernized Land Use Policy (regional pilots and the more strategic Framework)
- Together for Wildlife Strategy (Wildlife Act amendments)



Both EMP and CPSL have these key challenges

- B.C. has a uniquely important role in conservation nationally and globally.
- B.C.'s current legislative framework for addressing species at risk & environmental mitigation spans many acts, regulations and policies across multiple ministries & agencies.
- We need to be sensitive to the different sectors and ensure that we are supporting economic development while ensuring that we are improving conservation outcomes.

### **Project 1: Conservation Priorities and Species Listing**

- Update and strengthen SAR listing processes in B.C. and propose a more coordinated approach for focusing effort on priority habitats and/or species.
- The project will focus on the following three main milestones: a legal review and analysis, developing a listing prioritization framework, and finally a draft policy paper by December 2020.





## **Project 2: EMP Policy Review**


- Review the Environmental Mitigation Policy & Procedures (EMP) and propose long-term solutions for habitat offsets that are strategic, landscape-level, and transparent in order to address key challenges across the natural resource sector.
- Solutions may be regulatory and non-regulatory, and will be determined through exploring all mitigation tools, including financial offsets and area based approaches within the current regulatory structure.




## **Project 2: EMP Policy Review**

#### **History of EMP in BC**

- 2015: EMP endorsed by NR Board
- 2014/15/16: provincial training
- 2017-2020: Piloting of draft habitat decision support tool to support convos on ecological equivalence with offsets
- **2019/20:** Challenges noted by Indigenous Nations, mining, oil & gas







### **Proposed Engagement**

- Aiming for collaborative policy development
   — mindful of COVID-19 response
- Provide options for Indigenous Nations engagement through existing forums and tables; similar approach for stakeholders



#### Assess interest and capacity for engagement through existing relationships and continue development of policy options with new engagement avenues

- Provide options for engagement with Indigenous nations where there are existing relationships, forums and conversations.
- Reach out to existing forums and tables where the management of species is being discussed.:
  - One such opportunity exists in the Together for Wildlife Indigenous Forum.
  - Other opportunities may include Land Use Planning pilot projects, such as the Nicola Watershed and as part of the Mining Reform project.

As the B.C. web pages related to SAR are out of date, an update could be done in June to highlight the ongoing work related to SAR, as well as the two policy priority projects. This online update could be complemented, later in the fall, by two SAR update webinars for Indigenous nations and stakeholders that participated in the engagement on the development of SAR legislation.

## **Timeline & Next Steps**

- Aiming for completion of policy options papers in December 2020.
- Initiating engagement with Indigenous Nations and key industry sectors in late May/early June
  - Through existing forums and tables (e.g., Land Use Planning Pilots, Mining Reform projects)
  - Introducing projects to the Together for Wildlife Indigenous Forum



Staff will continue to revisit and adapt engagement plans to match what is possible and appropriate with COVID-19 recovery efforts throughout project timelines.





#### Milestone 1

#### Legal review and analysis

#### Report and recommendations

•The work will consider how to include aquatic species and ecosystems in the listing process. The analysis will look at the legal processes for updating existing legal SAR lists and whether a single species at risk list could be established using existing legislation.

#### Draft Prioritization Framework

•Involves developing criteria and a procedure for filtering species into different categories and, ultimately, prioritizing them on a list. These categories might be different management options (e.g., data gathering, stewardship), one of which will be legally listing 'at risk'.

#### Milestrone 3

#### •Draft policy options paper

•Writing will be ongoing throughout the project and will result in a policy options paper that clearly lays out the recommended prioritization framework, a prioritized species and ecosystems at risk list, and identifies recommendations for next steps.

Committee regarding old growth management

#### **BACKGROUND:**

 The independent old growth panel submitted their recommendations report to Minister Donaldson at the end of April 2020. The report is being internally reviewed but has not yet been publicly released.

- The Minister met with environmental non-government organizations including the Sierra Club BC, Ancient Forest Alliance and Wilderness Committee (the ENGOs) on April 2, 2020 to discuss their perspectives on old growth management. The ENGOs continue to lobby for increased protection of old growth across BC. The ENGOs presented a highly-critical account of old growth management over the last decades.
- A follow up meeting with the ENGOs was held on April 16, 2020 with ADM Tom Ethier and Executive Director Brian Bawtinheimer. The ENGOs reiterated their interest in increased protection and wish to see a moratorium on 14 "hot spots" on Vancouver Island.
- The ENGOs are aware the Minister has received the report and it is expected they will
  question the Minister on publicly releasing the report and whether the provincial government
  will endorse the recommendations.

#### DISCUSSION:

The old growth report has 14 recommendations ranging from shorter-term tactical actions (e.g. protect most rare stands; improve compliance and monitoring) to long-term complex shifts (e.g. ecosystem-priority forestry; new zoning structures). Economic impacts from the recommendations have not been assessed but are potentially significant should longer-term shifts occur.

The report will be a challenge for government considering the strong interest in old growth for economic objectives, forestry dependent communities and jobs, habitats and species at risk, First Nation cultural values and use, and tourism.

The ministry has retained outside contracted help from former Deputy Ministers Larry Pedersen and Derek Thompson who are developing a government response options paper for consideration. Rick Jeffrey has been hired to liaise with industry to better understand their approach to the old growth process. Economists Robert Prins and Jim Hackett are available to assist in an economic overview of the recommendations.

The ENGOs may raise a recently released report on old growth by Karen Price, Rachel Holt and Dave Daust (Appendix 1). The report is an enhanced version of the written submission by Price and Daust which is available under the written submission section of the EngageBC website. In the coming weeks, staff will review the report against the previous written submission to determine if any new information is provided or whether it is enhanced information previously provided.



No new information on the old growth report or future process can be given to the ENGOs at this time. The Minister did commit to engaging with them at the appropriate time, along with engagement with First Nations and industry. It is expected the ENGOs will request the Minister to release the report in the near future.

#### MINISTRY RESPONSE:

Although specific discussion on the report content, timing of release, and engagement process cannot be provided, the Minister could reiterate the following messages:

- Once again thanking the ENGOs for their participation in the panel process and their continued interest in this issue.
- Building a consensus on managing old growth forests has been a challenge for more than 30 years. This is a problem many years in the making and it won't be solved immediately.
- It will take some time to review the panel's recommendations and determine the best way forward we remain committed to releasing the report no later than the end of October as per the terms of reference.
- The panel was clear that engaging with First Nations, industry, non-government organizations and the public on any proposed policy shifts was paramount, and we are building an engagement strategy for these conversations.
- We need an approach and solutions that respect and understand the benefits of old growth to biodiversity in our forests and that includes First Nations, communities, industry and the public.

We met with the group of ENGOs as organized with John/Wildsight and Lisa/Organizing for Change.

We stuck to the plan of introducing our task of

- advancing good work on species at risk in the time left in this mandate, and
- engaging with ENGOs on this work.

We also presented on the two projects that we are working on (listings; offsets and mitigation) and asked them to give us advice on the best way to work with them on this.

Overall, it went as expected:

- Definitely a message of frustration in delayed action on this file and that legislation is unlikely to come forward this mandate
- A mostly positive reaction on the ministry's task described above and agreement that this is the right course of action right now
- Some were critical of the choice of projects. Offsets was viewed as the last policy choice to be taken and that we should be prioritizing habitat protection
- General sense of urgency and that the province needs to take action on habitat protection now while this work happens.

### **BACKGROUND:**

 The independent old growth panel submitted their recommendations report to Minister Donaldson at the end of April 2020. The report is being internally reviewed but has not yet been publicly released.

- The Minister met with environmental non-government organizations including the Sierra Club BC, Ancient Forest Alliance and Wilderness Committee (the ENGOs) on April 2, 2020 to discuss their perspectives on old growth management. The ENGOs continue to lobby for increased protection of old growth across BC. The ENGOs presented a highly-critical account of old growth management over the last decades.
- A follow up meeting with the ENGOs was held on April 16, 2020 with ADM Tom Ethier and Executive Director Brian Bawtinheimer. The ENGOs reiterated their interest in increased protection and wish to see a moratorium on 14 "hot spots" on Vancouver Island.
- The ENGOs are aware the Minister has received the report and it is expected they will
  question the Minister on publicly releasing the report and whether the provincial government
  will endorse the recommendations.

# DISCUSSION:

The old growth report has 14 recommendations ranging from shorter-term tactical actions (e.g. protect most rare stands; improve compliance and monitoring) to long-term complex shifts (e.g. ecosystem-priority forestry; new zoning structures). Economic impacts from the recommendations have not been assessed but are potentially significant should longer-term shifts occur.

The report will be a challenge for government considering the strong interest in old growth for economic objectives, forestry dependent communities and jobs, habitats and species at risk, First Nation cultural values and use, and tourism.

The ministry has retained outside contracted help from former Deputy Ministers Larry Pedersen and Derek Thompson who are developing a government response options paper for consideration. Rick Jeffrey has been hired to liaise with industry to better understand their approach to the old growth process. Economists Robert Prins and Jim Hackett are available to assist in an economic overview of the recommendations.

The ENGOs may raise a recently released report on old growth by Karen Price, Rachel Holt and Dave Daust (Appendix 1). The report is an enhanced version of the written submission by Price and Daust which is available under the written submission section of the EngageBC website. In the coming weeks, staff will review the report against the previous written submission to determine if any new information is provided or whether it is enhanced information previously provided.



No new information on the old growth report or future process can be given to the ENGOs at this time. The Minister did commit to engaging with them at the appropriate time, along with engagement with First Nations and industry. It is expected the ENGOs will request the Minister to release the report in the near future.

### MINISTRY RESPONSE:

Although specific discussion on the report content, timing of release, and engagement process cannot be provided, the Minister could reiterate the following messages:

- Once again thanking the ENGOs for their participation in the panel process and their continued interest in this issue.
- Building a consensus on managing old growth forests has been a challenge for more than 30 years. This is a problem many years in the making and it won't be solved immediately.
- It will take some time to review the panel's recommendations and determine the best way forward we remain committed to releasing the report no later than the end of October as per the terms of reference.
- The panel was clear that engaging with First Nations, industry, non-government organizations and the public on any proposed policy shifts was paramount, and we are building an engagement strategy for these conversations.
- We need an approach and solutions that respect and understand the benefits of old growth to biodiversity in our forests and that includes First Nations, communities, industry and the public.

**ISSUE:** Confirming Species at Risk (SAR) Policy Development Direction

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy (ENV) conducted engagement with Indigenous nations and stakeholders on SAR legislation between April to August of 2018 in response to the Minister's 2017 mandate letter. Through these engagement efforts, a diverse range of interests and concerns around protection and management of SAR were communicated (Attachment 1).

An overarching theme across all responses was the need to take the time to develop the most effective approaches to conserve British Columbia's species at risk. Public feedback was compiled in a draft summary report which was planned to be released in March 2019. However, the release was paused to avoid potential conflicting public messaging while engagement on Southern Mountain Caribou draft agreements was ongoing.

Based on this feedback and current realities, ENV staff continued to develop conservation policies and tools to improve outcomes for SAR and to support several cross-agency conservation initiatives.

Two policy areas were selected for effort in 2020/2021:

- Renewal of British Columbia (B.C.)'s approach to listing SAR. The objective of
  this project is to update and strengthen provincial species at risk listing processes
  and propose a more coordinated approach for focusing efforts on priority habitats
  and/or species; and
- Update Provincial Environmental Mitigation and Habitat Offset Policy. This
  project will review and update the provincial policy and provide a consistent
  approach to mitigation and habitat offsetting that will consider economic
  development and conservation outcomes.

ENV staff met with Wildsight and other Environmental Non-Governmental Organizations (ENGOs) on June 3, 2020 to discuss the two priority policy projects and the proposed engagement approach. ENGOs were generally supportive of the two projects but are seeking a senior political commitment to new SAR legislation. ENGOs are also interested in further discussion of key topics that could form part of a SAR legislation.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

#### Ongoing SAR work

As part of the two priority policy projects, GBA+ and economic implications assessments will be conducted. In addition to these projects, the Ecosystems Branch is also supporting and working on several B.C. Government initiatives that will provide better conservation outcomes for SAR. These include: Together for Wildlife Strategy; amendments to the *Forest and Range Practices Act* and the *Wildlife Act*; Modernized Land Use Planning; and Mining Regulatory Reform.

The federal Minister of Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) has a mandate to evaluate the effectiveness of the existing *Species at Risk Act* and assess the need for modernization. B.C. is working with ECCC to better align federal and provincial approaches through a potential pilot project with a goal of enhancing species conservation while balancing social and economic objectives.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy (ENV) conducted engagement with Indigenous nations and stakeholders on SAR legislation between April to August of 2018 in response to the Minister's 2017 mandate letter. Through our engagement efforts, we heard a diverse range of interests and concerns around protection and management of SAR. We also clearly heard the need to take the time to develop the most effective approaches to conserve British Columbia's species at risk.

Based on this feedback and current realities, the Ministry's approach to improve outcomes for SAR is focusing on developing key policies and tools and supporting several cross-agency conservation initiatives.

Two policy areas were selected for effort in 2020/2021:

#### DISCUSSION:

Conservation Priorities and Species Listing project (Attachment 1):

This project will involve:

- Reviewing the process for updating SAR lists in B.C. statutes, including the *Forest* and Range Practices Act, Wildlife Act, Oil and Gas Activities Act and the Private Managed Forests Lands Act.
- Developing options for introducing a new provincial SAR list (in an existing statute) that would simplify the management of SAR in B.C.
- Developing a draft policy framework to align and update provincial listing processes.
   This will ultimately allow for clearer management direction for species that are at risk and a method to prioritize management actions (including listing), resulting in better outcomes for those species and ecosystems.
- Working with the federal government to better align federal and provincial legal listing of SAR.

Provincial Environmental Mitigation and Habitat Offset Policy (Attachment 2): This project will involve:

- Reviewing and updating the provincial Environmental Mitigation Policy (EMP) to provide a consistent approach to mitigation and habitat offsetting that considers economic development and conservation outcomes.
- Working collaboratively with Indigenous nations and stakeholders using existing
  engagement forums to address challenges related to mitigation and habitat offsetting,
  and through an inter-agency project team that is advising on policy development.
- Supporting the re-boot of economic development through increased clarity, transparency, and guidance for industry, with the aim of enabling project approvals with a focus on the mining industry.

GBA+, and business and economic implications assessments will be conducted as part of these projects.

The Ecosystems Branch is also supporting and working on several B.C. Government initiatives that will provide for better conservation outcomes for SAR. These include: Together for Wildlife Strategy; amendments to the *Forest and Range Practices Act* and the *Wildlife Act*; Modernized Land Use Planning; and Mining Regulatory Reform.

- Much has been learned through the Southern Mountain Caribou process and those learnings could be applied to other species and projects moving forward.



# **Project 1: Conservation Priorities and Species Listing**

- The project will focus on the following three main milestones: a legal review and analysis, developing a listing framework, and finally a draft options paper by December 2020.


#### Conservation Priorities and Species Listing project:

- Completed the legal analysis of existing statutes to explore options for updating and improving the process for legally listing species at risk in B.C..
- Working closely with FLNRORD colleagues to identify criteria and a procedure for prioritizing species into different management categories., Broader engagement with other internal agencies will take place through an inter-agency advisory group and PSARC.
- An introduction to the project and early considerations was shared with the Together for Wildlife Indigenous Forum at the end of May. Looking at additional opportunities for Indigenous engagement through land use planning pilots and the advisory group that was providing thoughts on potential SAR legislation.
- Broader Indigenous engagement will occur with the first draft of the policy intentions paper.
- Targeted engagement with industry, ENGOs and local governments will occur in a virtual environment, depending on availability due to COVID response.

# **Project 2: EMP Policy Review**

- Review the Environmental Mitigation Policy & Procedures (EMP) and propose long-term solutions for habitat offsets that are strategic, landscape-level, and transparent in order to address key challenges across the natural resource sector.
- Solutions may be regulatory and non-regulatory, and will be determined through exploring all mitigation tools, including financial offsets and area based approaches within the current regulatory structure.





#### Provincial Environmental Mitigation and Habitat Offset Policy:

- Advancing policy work on exploring potential solutions, including compensation frameworks and an area based approach to offsetting will take place in summer 2020.
- Strong linkages have been made to align policy work with modernizing land use planning and FRPA amendment initiatives.
- Opportunities to engage on policy development was shared with the Together for Wildlife Indigenous Forum at the end of May, and will be shared with Ktunaxa, Tahltan, West Moberly and Saulteau First Nations (These First Nations are currently involved in mitigation work through project approvals and the Partnership Agreement and have expressed interest in this policy project).
- Engagement will occur with MABC and AME through the Mining Regularly Reform project this summer. Staff are in the process of confirming timelines.
- Engagement with other stakeholders will be limited and depend on interest and capacity.

# **Engagement to date**

- · Aiming for collaborative policy development- mindful of **COVID** response
- Providing options for Indigenous nations and key stakeholders engagement (industry sectors, agriculture and local governments) – currently reaching out to existing forums and tables
- Discussed policy projects with Wildsight and other ENGOs
- Presented policy projects to Together for Wildlife Indigenous **Advisory Forum**



#### Assess interest and capacity for engagement through existing relationships and continue development of policy options with new engagement avenues

- Provide options for engagement with Indigenous nations where there are existing relationships, forums and conversations.
- Reach out to existing forums and tables where the management of species is being discussed.:
  - One such opportunity exists in the Together for Wildlife Indigenous Forum held in May.
  - Other opportunities may include Land Use Planning pilot projects, such as the Nicola Watershed and as part of the Mining Reform project.

ISSUE: Confirming Species at Risk (SAR) Policy Development Direction

#### BACKGROUND:

The Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy (ENV)-conducted engagement with Indigenous nations, and stakeholders, and the public on SAR legislation between April to August of 2018 in response to the Minister's 2017 mandate letter commitment to "Enact an endangered species law and harmonize other laws to ensure they are all working towards the goal of protecting our beautiful province." Through these engagement efforts, and diverse range of interests and concerns around protection and management of SAR-were communicated (Attachment 1).

An overarching theme across all responses was the need to take the time to develop the most effective approaches to conserve British Columbia's <u>SAR</u>species at risk. Public feedback was compiled in a draft <u>'What we Heard'summary</u> report which was planned to be released in March 2019. However, the release was paused to avoid potential <u>for</u> conflicting public messaging <u>during while</u> engagement on Southern Mountain Caribou draft agreements—was ongoing.

Based on this feedback and current realities, ENV staff continued to develop <u>alternate</u> conservation policies and tools to improve outcomes for SAR and to support several cross-agency conservation initiatives.

Two policy areas were selected for effort in 2020/2021:

- Renewal of British Columbia (B.C.)'s approach to listing SAR. The objective of
  this project is to update and strengthen existing provincial SARspecies at risk
  listing processes and propose a more coordinated approach for focusing efforts on
  priority habitats and/or species; and
- Update Provincial Environmental Mitigation and Habitat Offset Policy. This
  project will review and update the provincial policy and provide a consistent
  approach to mitigation and habitat offsetting that will consider economic
  development and conservation outcomes.

ENV staff met with Wildsight and other Environmental Non-Governmental Organizations (ENGOs) on June 3, 2020 to discuss the two priority-policy projects and the proposed engagement approach. ENGOs were generally supportive of the two projects but are seeking a senior political commitment onto new\_SAR legislation. ENGOs are also interested in further discussion of other key-topics that could inform part of a-SAR legislation.

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### DISCUSSION:

# Ongoing SAR work

As part of the two priority policy projects, GBA+ and economic implications assessments will be conducted. In addition to these projects, tThe Ecosystems Branch is also supporting and working on several B.C. Government initiatives that will provide better conservation outcomes for SAR. These include: Together for Wildlife Strategy; amendments to the *Forest and Range Practices Act* and the *Wildlife Act*; Modernized Land Use Planning; and Mining Regulatory Reform.

Additionally, The federal Minister of Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) has a mandate to evaluate the effectiveness of the existing *Species at Risk Act* and assess the need for modernization. B.C. is working with ECCC to better align federal and provincial approaches through a potential pilot project with a goal of enhancing species conservation while balancing social and economic objectives.

Committee regarding old growth management

# **BACKGROUND:**

 The independent old growth panel submitted their recommendations report to Minister Donaldson at the end of April 2020. The report is being internally reviewed but has not yet been publicly released.

- The Minister met with environmental non-government organizations including the Sierra Club BC, Ancient Forest Alliance and Wilderness Committee (the ENGOs) on April 2, 2020 to discuss their perspectives on old growth management. The ENGOs continue to lobby for increased protection of old growth across BC. The ENGOs presented a highly-critical account of old growth management over the last decades.
- A follow up meeting with the ENGOs was held on April 16, 2020 with ADM Tom Ethier and Executive Director Brian Bawtinheimer. The ENGOs reiterated their interest in increased protection and wish to see a moratorium on 14 "hot spots" on Vancouver Island.
- The ENGOs are aware the Minister has received the report and it is expected they will
  question the Minister on publicly releasing the report and whether the provincial government
  will endorse the recommendations.

# DISCUSSION:

The old growth report has 14 recommendations ranging from shorter-term tactical actions (e.g. protect most rare stands; improve compliance and monitoring) to long-term complex shifts (e.g. ecosystem-priority forestry; new zoning structures). Economic impacts from the recommendations have not been assessed but are potentially significant should longer-term shifts occur.

The report will be a challenge for government considering the strong interest in old growth for economic objectives, forestry dependent communities and jobs, habitats and species at risk, First Nation cultural values and use, and tourism.

The ministry has retained outside contracted help from former Deputy Ministers Larry Pedersen and Derek Thompson who are developing a government response options paper for consideration. Rick Jeffrey has been hired to liaise with industry to better understand their approach to the old growth process. Economists Robert Prins and Jim Hackett are available to assist in an economic overview of the recommendations.

The ENGOs may raise a recently released report on old growth by Karen Price, Rachel Holt and Dave Daust (Appendix 1). The report is an enhanced version of the written submission by Price and Daust which is available under the written submission section of the EngageBC website. In the coming weeks, staff will review the report against the previous written submission to determine if any new information is provided or whether it is enhanced information previously provided.



No new information on the old growth report or future process can be given to the ENGOs at this time. The Minister did commit to engaging with them at the appropriate time, along with engagement with First Nations and industry. It is expected the ENGOs will request the Minister to release the report in the near future.

# MINISTRY RESPONSE:

Although specific discussion on the report content, timing of release, and engagement process cannot be provided, the Minister could reiterate the following messages:

- Once again thanking the ENGOs for their participation in the panel process and their continued interest in this issue.
- Building a consensus on managing old growth forests has been a challenge for more than 30 years. This is a problem many years in the making and it won't be solved immediately.
- It will take some time to review the panel's recommendations and determine the best way forward we remain committed to releasing the report no later than the end of October as per the terms of reference.
- The panel was clear that engaging with First Nations, industry, non-government organizations and the public on any proposed policy shifts was paramount, and we are building an engagement strategy for these conversations.
- We need an approach and solutions that respect and understand the benefits of old growth to biodiversity in our forests and that includes First Nations, communities, industry and the public.
