Good afternoon,

Today, I would like to share with you B.C.'s 2020 Climate Change Accountability Report.

The report includes detailed information on CleanBC progress over the 2019-2020 period to reduce carbon pollution, prepare for climate impacts and create low-carbon economic opportunities for people across the province. It also includes emissions data for the 2018 reporting year, which precedes the release of the CleanBC plan and most of its emissions reduction programs and actions.

Since 2019, we've made significant early progress on a wide range of programs and policies, and we continue to work on new areas for greenhouse gas reductions while improving current programs. We are also committed to releasing B.C.'s new climate preparedness and adaptation strategy, developed in collaboration with Indigenous peoples.

The 2020 accountability report, the first to be tabled publicly in the legislature, is a result of B.C.'s commitment to improved accountability under the *Climate Change Accountability Act*. As part of this, the Province has also set a new interim emissions target of 16% below 2007 levels by 2025 that will help provide an important early indicator of progress to our 2030 GHG target. We are also working to establish targets for individual sectors of the economy by March 31, 2021.

We look forward to strengthening our partnerships and collaborating further to deliver, not only our current plan, but also the next slate of CleanBC policies needed to build a cleaner, stronger future.

And we will continue to work with the federal government as it releases its plans to meet Canada's greenhouse gas targets to ensure our efforts are coordinated and that we find the most efficient pathways to meet our goals.



Attached is a copy of the 2020 Climate Change Accountability Report. Pursuant to the *Climate Change Accountability Act*, the report was tabled in the B.C. legislature today and released <u>publicly</u>.

The report includes detailed information on CleanBC progress over the 2019-2020 period to reduce carbon pollution, prepare for climate impacts and create low-carbon economic opportunities for people across the province. It also includes emissions data for the 2018 reporting year, which precedes the release of the CleanBC plan and most of its emissions reduction programs and actions.

Since 2019, we've made significant early progress on a wide range of programs and policies, and we continue to work on new areas for greenhouse gas reductions while improving current programs. We are also committed to releasing B.C.'s new climate preparedness and adaptation strategy, developed in collaboration with Indigenous peoples.

The 2020 accountability report, the first to be tabled publicly in the legislature, is a result of B.C.'s commitment to improved accountability under the *Climate Change Accountability Act*. As part of this, the Province has also set a new interim emissions target of 16% below 2007 levels by 2025 that will help provide an important early indicator of progress to our 2030 GHG target. We are also working to establish targets for individual sectors of the economy by March 31, 2021.

We look forward to strengthening our partnerships and collaborating further to deliver, not only our current plan, but also the next slate of CleanBC policies needed to build a cleaner, stronger future.

And we will continue to work with the federal government as it releases its plans to meet Canada's greenhouse gas targets to ensure our efforts are coordinated and that we find the most efficient pathways to meet our goals.

Meeting Request: Greater Victoria Harbour Authority – Shore Power

Dear Mr. Jardine,

I am writing to you today to request a virtual meeting between yourself and Ian Roberston, Chief Executive Officer of the <u>Greater Victoria Harbour Authority</u> (GVHA) in your capacity as Deputy Minister of the BC Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy.

In this meeting, Ian would like to discuss with you GVHA's recent decision to proceed with the next stage of the shore power project for the Victoria Cruise Terminal at The Breakwater District at Ogden Point. This decision follows the release of the Ship Emissions Mitigation Technology Assessment and Business Case that was completed late last year by consulting firm, Moffat and Nichol. The report shows that the installation of shore power at Ogden Point's Pier B, which welcomes 75 per cent of the cruise ships during a season, would result in a reduction of more than 46 per cent of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions and criteria air contaminants (CACs), equivalent to nearly 1,400 cars on the road per year.

While the outbreak COVID-19 has had a devastating impact on the cruise industry, GVHA believes it can pursue shore power in a timeline that dovetails with the global restart and rebuild of the tourism sector. Although cruise visitation was suspended in Canadian ports by Transport Canada due to the pandemic, the cruise industry contributes significantly to the Greater Victoria economy. In 2019, the Victoria Cruise Terminal welcomed 256 ships calls, carrying 709,000 passengers and 300,000 crew. The industry is responsible for 800 indirect and direct jobs and contributes more than \$130 million to the local economy annually.

As you may know, cruise ships are the largest emission source for The Breakwater District at Ogden Point and accounted for some 96 per cent of total GHG emissions at the terminal in 2018. GVHA believes this shore power project will help the not-for-profit corporation achieve its goal of becoming one of the greenest port in North America and is well-aligned with the province's climate plan, CleanBC.

GVHA is a not-for-profit corporation that owns and operates various properties in the heart of the Lekwungen territory, including the Victoria Cruise Ship Terminal, Steamship Terminal, Fisherman's Wharf, and the Causeway, Ship Point, Wharf Street, and Johnson Street marinas.







This provides more information which the ADMO and DMO may appreciate prior to the Feb 2<sup>nd</sup> briefing.

This e-mail is regarding the *Water Sustainability Act* (WSA) in relation to the draft Hydrogen Strategy (HS).

### **Upcoming Minister's Briefing**

 On February 2<sup>nd,</sup> the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Low Carbon Innovation (EMLI) has scheduled a briefing with Minister Heyman on the upcoming Hydrogen Strategy.

#### Hydrogen Strategy (HS)

- Through CleanBC the Province has committed to drive decarbonization of B.C.'s energy systems and to advance development of hydrogen and fuel cell opportunities.
- The HS is being developed to support legislated greenhouse gas reduction targets and large-scale deployment of hydrogen to enable hydrogen production in B.C.
- The HS may be released to the public in spring 2021 pending government approval.
- WPSB has reviewed WSA-related content to the HS and recommended inclusion of an action item to amend the WSA.

### **Hydrogen Production and the WSA**

- Hydrogen production is not currently enabled under the WSA.
  - Existing WSA water use purposes are too specifically defined to be inclusive of hydrogen production.
- Amendments to WSA related regulations are required to include hydrogen production as an authorized water use and to set new water fees and rentals.
- Not all hydrogen production facilities will require a new water licence under the WSA issued by the Province.

- Facilities which already hold a water licence for another purpose and wish to convert that use to hydrogen production can apply for a change in water use purpose, provided they are not applying to use more water.
- o Facilities supplied with water from a water utility work directly with the utility on volume and rental agreements.

#### **Next Steps**

• WPSB will work with EMLI and the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations to align WSA amendments with advancement of the HS.

# Here's a summary of the FCM Ask

- Since April 2019, the Mayors' Council has been calling on the federal government, through their Cure Congestion campaign, to establish a permanent, predictable and direct federal fund that can be invested, in addition to local and provincial government commitments for transportation and transit.
- In November 2019, the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) released an action plan for the newly elected federal minority government that included a call for Canada to establish a permanent federal funding allocation that would deliver \$34 billion for a 10-year plan (2028-29 to 2037-38) with \$30 billion in allocation-based funding and at least \$4 billion for a complimentary merit based stream, with consistent funding of \$3.4 billion each year during the 10-year period.
- In December 2019, Minister McKenna's mandate letter included a commitment to introduce a permanent, direct federal funding mechanism for modern public transit and a funding program to support the transition to emissions-free battery electric buses.
- In February 2020, in submission to Canada ahead of the 2020/2021 federal budget, the Mayors' Council echoed the FCM's request for a national Permanent Transit Fund of \$3.4 billion annually (\$375 million annually for Metro Vancouver) that be legislated by 2021 (similar to how the permanent Gas Tax Fund was established beginning in 2012). (See Attachment 1 for the Mayors' Council February 2020 submission to the federal government)
- Most recently, in November 2020, the Mayors' Council wrote to Minister McKenna and Federal Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance, Christie Freeland to ask the federal government to accelerate the launch of the Permanent Transit Fund to assist with their pandemic recovery strategy and long-term transportation planning. (See Attachment 2 for the November 202 letter from the Mayors' Council to Ministers Freeland and McKenna)

#### Here's a summary of today's announcement

The Prime Minister, Justin Trudeau, today announced \$14.9 billion for public transit projects over the next eight years, which includes permanent funding of \$3 billion per year for Canadian communities beginning in 2026-27. This announcement provides cities and communities the predictable transit funding they need to plan for the future, and is part of our plan to create one million jobs, fight climate change, and rebuild a more sustainable and resilient economy. These investments will:

- Help Canadians move around easier and create new jobs by building major public transit projects, providing dedicated planning funding to accelerate future major projects, and supporting the expansion of large urban transit systems that many Canadians depend on every day.
- Reduce pollution and create jobs for Canadians by enhancing public transit systems
  and switching them to cleaner electrical power, including supporting the use of zeroemission vehicles and related infrastructure, complementing the work of the Canada
  Infrastructure Bank.
- Support healthy lifestyles in our communities and meet the growing demand for active transportation projects, including by building walkways and paths for cycling, walking, scooters, e-bikes, and wheelchairs.
- Help Canadians living in rural and remote areas travel to and from work more easily
  and access essential services, by working with rural, remote, and Indigenous
  communities to identify and create transit solutions that meet their needs.
- Support our cities and communities by making a permanent and stable federal
  commitment to funding public transit, and facilitate partnerships between all orders
  of government, Indigenous communities, transit agencies, and other stakeholders to
  develop an approach to permanent public transit funding in a manner that offers the
  greatest benefits to Canadians.

Investing in public transit infrastructure will build strong communities across the country and deliver a better quality of life for all Canadians. The government will continue to invest in projects that best support our recovery, create middle class jobs and economic growth, and help us reach our climate targets. Together, we can create a Canada that is cleaner, more competitive, and more resilient for generations to come.

### Clean Communities - Plastics Action Plan

- Municipal bylaws to ban single-use plastics the Minister has now approved nine bylaws (five in September 2020 plus four announced February 12<sup>th</sup>, 2021 2021 – Nanaimo, Surrey, Esquimalt and Rossland)
- Staff will be reaching out to UBCM in March 2021 to invite local governments for their input on the proposed new regulation under the *Community Charter* to allow local governments to ban certain single-use plastics without requiring provincial approval
- The Province has launched two StrongerBC economic recovery funding programs that may see projects awarded in your communities. Application intake closed on February 15; recipients will be announced by April
  - Recycled Plastics Manufacturing Stimulus fund to support projects in B.C. that are able to increase the use of post-consumer recycled ("PCR") plastic in the production of plastic items, focusing on innovation, supply chain resiliency and supporting the plastic circular economy
  - Clean Coast, Clean Waters Initiative fund to support marine shoreline clean-up and derelict vessel removal in coastal communities within British Columbia

### EPR - Update on IP

- On September 12, 2020 the ministry announced the release of the <u>Recycling Regulation Policy Intentions</u>

#### Clean Communities - Plastics Action Plan

- Municipal bylaws to ban single-use plastics the Minister has now approved nine bylaws (five in September 2020 plus four announced February 12<sup>th</sup>, 2021 2021 – Nanaimo, Surrey, Esquimalt and Rossland)
- Staff will be reaching out to UBCM in March 2021 to invite local governments for their input on the proposed new regulation under the *Community Charter* to allow local governments to ban certain single-use plastics without requiring provincial approval
- The Province has launched two StrongerBC economic recovery funding programs that may see projects awarded in your communities. Application intake closed on February 15; recipients will be announced by April
  - Recycled Plastics Manufacturing Stimulus fund to support projects in B.C. that are able to increase the use of post-consumer recycled ("PCR") plastic in the production of plastic items, focusing on innovation, supply chain resiliency and supporting the plastic circular economy
  - Clean Coast, Clean Waters Initiative fund to support marine shoreline clean-up and derelict vessel removal in coastal communities within British Columbia

### EPR - Update on IP

- On September 12, 2020 the ministry announced the release of the <u>Recycling Regulation Policy Intentions</u>
   <u>Paper</u> (IP), which outlined proposed amendments to the Recycling Regulation through the priority products identified from the ministry's 2019 service gap analysis and through feedback from the CleanBC Plastics Action Plan consultation paper.
- The ministry received substantive feedback from key partners and stakeholders such as local governments by the November 20, 2020 submission deadline; this feedback is being summarized and will be made publicly available this spring.
- The feedback will inform the development of a five-year plan for amending the Recycling Regulation to include more products under extended producer responsibility programs.
- Amendments to the site identification process under the Environmental Management Act and Contaminated Sites Regulation came into effect on February 1, 2021 that directly affect all municipalities in BC.
- Supporting amendments were also made to the Local Government Act, Land Title Act, Islands Trust Act and Vancouver Charter to reflect these changes.
- This process ensures potentially contaminated industrial and commercial properties are investigated and remediated following site closure and prior to redevelopment.
- Municipalities can no longer opt out of site identification administration; 43 municipalities had
  previously opted out under the former process. To facilitate a smooth transition the ministry has
  reached out to all of these municipalities to provide support on implementing the updated

Dear Premier Horgan and Ministers Robinson and Ralston,

On behalf of Geoscience BC, I am writing to request funding that will enable our not for profit organization to continue its minerals, energy and water public geoscience research that attracts investment and encourages economic recovery through responsible natural resource development; boosts competitiveness and innovation; enables climate action; and supports reconciliation with Indigenous peoples.

Geoscience BC is grateful for previous support, and requests that the Province of British Columbia continue to support a 'made-in-BC' coordinated and adequately resourced provincial approach to public geoscience by:

- Funding Geoscience BC \$6.5 million, which was understandably deferred last year due to COVID-19, for fiscal year 2021/22;
- Establishing a sustainable long-term funding mechanism for Geoscience BC, with an annual investment of \$5.5 million for fiscal years 2022/23 and 2023/24; and
- Providing a sustainable level of base funding for the British Columbia Geological Survey so that it can continue to collaborate with partners to deliver its complementary mandate and work with Geoscience BC to leverage further federal government support.

Geoscience BC's submission to the B.C. Budget 2021 Consultation outlined how we are aligned with government objectives and have strong industry and community support throughout the province. We were grateful to see that the Report on the Budget 2021 Consultation included unanimous, all-party endorsement for funding the British Columbia Geological Survey and Geoscience BC.

Our request brings together and has diverse support and input from industry, governments, academia, Indigenous groups and communities. It will allow Geoscience BC to provide a strong return on investment as the province emerges from the COVID-19 pandemic by leveraging remaining funds, attracting additional partner contributions and extending our applied research work. Without further funding Geoscience BC will begin shutdown measures in 2022 and close by March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023.

Geoscience BC's most recent core funding received from the Province was \$5 million in one-year bridge funding, announced in May 2019 by Minister Mungall, as recommended by the BC Mining Jobs Task Force. The Task Force also recommended that a geoscience review determine a "longer-term funding direction". The funding received in

2019 is being used to complete 39 innovative and collaborative research projects in the coming two years. Almost all funding received to date is committed to these projects, and there is strong demand for additional public geoscience research, as evidenced by the numerous letters of support for Geoscience BC received to date.

Continuing Geoscience BC's core provincial funding will allow us to continue to work with you to build a better future for all British Columbians as we move through COVID-19 and into economic recovery. This includes collaborating and coordinating with the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Low Carbon Innovation, BC Oil and Gas Commission, BC Geological Survey and others. Announcing further funding for Geoscience BC now will attract and leverage critical partner funding to undertake multi-year research projects that align with key provincial initiatives such as CleanBC, the Economic Recovery Task Force, the BC Mining Jobs Task Force, the Mining Innovation Hub, Scientific Hydraulic Fracturing Review Panel and the Climate Solutions Council.

Future proposed research programs include targeting geoscience for critical minerals and metals needed in clean technologies and energy production; carbon capture, storage and use for natural gas and hydrogen production; understanding effects of hydraulic fracturing; greenhouse gas emission reduction; assessing supplemental clean power for natural gas fields; and zero-emission dispatchable geothermal power.

These programs have sufficient flexibility to consider and incorporate further expert opinions and subject matter input from a variety of sources, including further consultation and coordination with government agencies, industry, communities and Indigenous groups. Any proposed projects within these programs will be further reviewed, modified and prioritized through Geoscience BC's Technical Advisory Committees (these committees include technical staff from the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Low Carbon Innovation, British Columbia Geological Survey, BC Oil and Gas Commission and the Geological Survey of Canada) before funding recommendations are put forward to Geoscience BC's Board of Directors.

For additional detail and background to support our request, I have attached for your consideration:

- Letters exemplifying the diverse support for Geoscience BC received from industry, academia, Indigenous groups, local governments and contributing funding partners;
- Copy of Geoscience BC's June 25, 2020 submission to the all-party Select Standing Committee on Finance and Government Services and their unanimous August 21, 2020 recommendation #40 found in the Report on the Budget 2021 Consultation Volume 1 to continue funding Geoscience BC; and
- Letter received from Minister Ralston in April 22, 2020 regarding his deferred funding decision due to COVID-19 and Geoscience BC's reply letter of April 23, 2020.

We look forward to healthier times and new opportunities to continue collaborating with you and your staff on our many joint public geoscience goals, strategic initiatives and announcements that help drive economic growth and a healthy environment throughout the province.

Your ministries have been engaged in development of the strategy through staff-level and executive director working groups. There has also been strong involvement at the ADM-level.

Should the plan be approved and receive funding, we look forward to continued collaboration with our ministry partners as we move into the implementation phase of the strategy, including reporting annually on its progress in the Climate Change Accountability Report as required by the Climate Change Accountability Act.




