I am following up with you regarding the letter that Deputy Minister Hogan and Associate Deputy Minister Dubuc sent to your Deputy Minister on October 6, 2020 regarding the establishment of the Canada Water Agency. As you are aware, the Government of Canada is committed to creating the new Canada Water Agency in close collaboration with provinces and territories, Indigenous peoples and others. When we met with provinces and territories earlier this year, we indicated that a discussion paper would be developed to use as a basis for further engagement on the Agency and we had several requests for sharing the paper prior to public release.

As you have been identified as a key contact in engaging with British Columbia, I am contacting you today to share an embargoed draft copy of the discussion paper for a red-flag review. We ask that any key concerns be brought to our attention by contacting Ute Holweger at ute.holweger@canada.ca no later than December 2, 2020 so that we can address them prior to finalizing the paper for public release by mid-December. Please note that we are not seeking substantive feedback on the paper during this pre-release review period, rather we are looking to identify any key concerns before the paper is made public. Following public release of the paper, provinces and territories will be asked to review the paper in detail and provide feedback by the end of February 2021.

We are proposing a joint call with provinces and territories at 14:00 EST on November 25, 2020 to provide you or your delegate with an opportunity to ask clarifying questions regarding the discussion paper. We will also share details of our planned public engagement process. A separate meeting notice will be sent to you with dial in information.

Should you wish to discuss any significant concerns bilaterally, please also contact Ute Holweger and she will arrange for us to connect by phone.

I want to thank you in advance for taking the time to review the paper prior to public release and I look forward to continuing to work with you in advancing this important commitment in support of freshwater management in Canada.

Subject: FYI - update to ADMs on economic recovery funding for species, ecosystems and watersheds Hello everyone,

I wanted to provide a short update on the COVID economic stimulus funding relating to species, ecosystems and watersheds as your staff have played a key role in this work and the individual projects relate to your mandates. We also expect this to be part of early announcements on economic recovery progress following Cabinet getting appointed.

For your information, below is information on the process followed to date, and attached is a list of projects expected to be funded.

We have made significant progress since the last public announcement in September. We are currently working with our fund administrators and GCPE to begin to communicate out on this work. I'd just like to acknowledge the work of all staff from across all the ministries engaged in this work. It's been a great cooperative effort and we couldn't have done this without them.

Thanks again and please let me know if you'd like to discuss,

Context

As you are aware, in mid-September ENV received direction from government on a total sum of \$37M as part of government's <u>economic recovery plan</u> for species, ecosystem and watersheds conservation and restoration work. \$27M is for the watershed initiatives proposed by Watersheds BC and \$10M is for broader species and ecosystem conservation and restoration work. Key goals for this work include:

- Money to be transferred by ENV to 3rd parties by March 31, 2021.
- Projects to be implemented and completed on the ground by December 31, 2021.
- Projects are about job creation in addition to species, ecosystems and watershed health.

Oversight

An Executive Director-level strategic oversight group as well as a Director-level steering committee with representation from AGRI, FLNR and ENV have been working since late September.

- The ED strategic oversight group has been providing overall direction and advice on this work.
- The DIR steering committee has been reviewing project proposals to confirm they meet the goals set for this work and making recommendations allocation of resources.
- The ENV team continues to manage this work, work directly with funding organizations and coordinate across agencies.

Fund administrators

The ENV team has signed agreements with two third party funders who will administer this work with grantees:

- The Real Estate Foundation of BC will be administering the funding to the Watersheds initiative (\$27M)
- The Habitat Conservation Trust Foundation will be administering the funding for the Species and Ecosystems Projects (\$10M)

We expect to work closely with both organizations over the next 18 months to ensure successful delivery on this work.

Projects to be funded

Attached are the lists of projects that are recommended for funding – note there are two tabs in the excel spreadsheet. These snapshots show the projects that are recommended to move ahead with the locations of the work – these lists are for internal use only. These lists have been vetted through Directors and Executive Directors in FLNR, ENV and AGRI. Extensive work was also undertaken with AGRI to sort out SRIF funding. Staff have also reached out to inform DFO about this work and share with them where they can expect projects for their engagement. You'll note that no project proponent has been identified in either list - under the terms of the funding (STOB 80 shared cost arrangement), it is the role of the funders to make the decision on who to grant funds to for completion of these project and to finalize the total amounts.

Resources for FLNR to support this work

In addition to the \$37M that went to ENV, FLNR received \$215K to be used to support HR. Through Directors and Executive Directors, regions have been approved for a portion of this amount that reflects the expected workload in their region. This amount is then being authorized for each region as an overspend. Regions are responsible for tracking how this money is spent (e.g., over time, regular hours, auxiliary).

Communications

- Public communications during interregnum continues to be limited. A communications plan is being developed to support communications and as interregnum comes to a close.
- We anticipate a public announcement about this work in late November or early December. Our project funders (REFBC, HCTF) will begin reaching out to project proponents the week of November 16to notify them and begin developing grant agreements.

- We expect to have a range of communications materials to support staff, including frequently asked questions and key messages.

In response to the Office of the Auditor General's (OAG) 2019 report, *The Protection of Drinking Water: An Independent Audit*, the Ministry of Health (HLTH) is delivering on commitments to address the OAG audit recommendations. On March 6, 2020, the Executive Lead of Population and Public Health, Lorie Hrycuik, reached out to your Assistant Deputy Minister to provide a preliminary overview of this work (for convenience, the PowerPoint presentation is attached to this email).

This past spring, the Ministry requested your organization's participation in a review of legislation and mandates related to source water protection, a key component of the action plan. With the official release of the Discussion Paper 'Toward the Creation of a Canada Water Agency' on December 17, 2020, the Government of Canada will be undertaking a comprehensive engagement with provinces and territories, Indigenous Peoples and the public over the coming months to inform this important mandate commitment. On behalf of Assistant Deputy Minister Hilary Geller, I am reaching out to you to further advance our engagement with provinces and territories in the coming weeks, as we seek additional feedback on the Discussion Paper and move towards the establishment of the Canada Water Agency. As ADM Geller noted during our call on November 25, 2020, continued engagement with our provincial and territorial partners is important as we establish a new Agency that adds value for all Canadians. We are appreciative of the input you have provided to date, including your recent red flag review of the Discussion Paper.

BC Hydro/Site C Research fund for bats

- BC Hydro is quarrying near a hibernacula identified as Critical Habitat for endangered Myotis bats. The Vegetation-Wildlife Technical Committee (VWTC) did not support this quarrying due to impacts on bats. However, BCH proceeded with quarrying to meet operational needs. Greg Scarborough's (BC Hydro) letter of May 2, 2019 states that BC Hydro will be developing the quarry and in the final paragraph, states: "In addition, BC Hydro proposes to engage with the VWTC and its associates in the bat research community to find opportunities for us to fund reasonable research with a focus on little brown myotis. We hope this monitoring and additional research can help fill information gaps that limited our ability to determine consequence likelihood. Shortly we will be seeking your input on these new monitoring commitments and research funding opportunity."
- The direct quote is important because the funding is neither for mitigation efforts nor for compensation but to be focused on research that would advance knowledge that would support decision makers in the future
- The VWTC was informed the fund would be a one time non-negotiable amount of \$800,000
- Staff have been in discussion with representatives on the VWTC (Eric Lofroth, representing Conservation Science Section (CSS) and Inge Jean Hanson, representing FLNRO region) on how best to manage this fund
- The research-focus of funds plus current involvement of Conservation Science Section supports transfer of these funds to our Br.
- Use of funds to be determined through an advisory committee including ENV, FLRNO, and regional NGO bat biologists
- There is no time limit on the spending of these funds but the expectation is that this level of funding will support a 3-5 research program

We are requesting approval in principle to initiate the transfer of this funding from BC Hydro to Conservation Science Section

Good afternoon,

As many of you are aware, the federal government through Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) is currently engaging on the development of a new federal Canada Water Agency (CWA). A Discussion Paper has just been released to the public for review.

National and provincial workshops are being planned by ECCC over the next few weeks to support public engagement and dialogue on the CWA. ECCC is also undertaking consultation with Indigenous governments on this work. The federal government has sent this information out quite broadly so a number of you and your staff may already be in receipt of the Discussion Paper.

The province and ECCC have agreed that B.C. will respond to the paper directly, rather than via the public engagement process. As part of these discussions, they have asked that ENV coordinate the provincial response for those ministries that have a strategic interest in water and/or who may be engaging with Canada on water matters.

As Executive Director of the Water Protection and Sustainability Branch at ENV, I have been asked to lead this coordination. My ADM, James Mack, and myself are the primary contacts with ECCC on the file.

To accommodate collation of feedback and approvals we will be asking for Ministry input by February 5. The key areas of provincial interest that we will be looking to provide feedback on, include:

Sustainable water management (agriculture, mining, and industry)
Climate change adaptation and disaster risk reduction


