

Re: Tulsequah Chief Mine clean up

Dear Minister Ralston and Minister Heyman,

The member groups of Organizing For Change would like to thank you for the development of a remediation plan to clean up the acid mine drainage being generated by the Tulsequah Chief Mine. This has been a problem for decades and we applaud your government for being the one to take steps to deal with the effluent flowing into the lower Taku. We respectfully urge you to see the clean-up and closure process through to completion.

Tulsequah is situated next to the very ecologically rich lower Taku River. This is where the Taku's wide floodplain cuts through the Coast Range to the sea. Its very low elevation and more temperate climate adds to floodplain's productivity and biodiversity. The lower Taku's ecological importance has long been documented along with the valley's stunning scenery and recreation attributes.

While most of the lower Taku River corridor was protected through the *Wóoshtin wudidaa* (the 2011 Atlin Taku Land Use Plan), a key portion of the floodplain located at and just upstream of the Taku-Tulsequah confluence was not protected due to mining-related complications like Tulsequah Chief. This unprotected area was identified on the Taku River Tlingit's 2009 *Tlatsini* map which "*identified areas of special importance to the Tlingit for the conservation of biodiversity and for sustaining Tlingit khustìyxh ('way of life'*)" and was also proposed for protection by Canadian Parks and Wilderness Society and other ENGOs through the Atlin Taku Land Use Plan's stakeholder engagement process. However, it was not included in what ultimately became the immediately adjacent Taku River/T'akú Téiú' Conservancy.

The Atlin Taku Land Use Plan was a policy priority for the members of Organizing for Change going back to 2009. We have remained concerned about the fate of the Tulsequah Chief mine due to its continued deleterious impact on the Taku River and the salmon and people who depend on it.

Dear Minister Conroy,

I am writing you because Sierra Club BC is extremely concerned about the request to transfer Canfor's license in the Fort Nelson region to Peak Renewables and we call on your government to deny the transfer of License A17007. As outlined below, we believe the license transfer is not in the public interest and would undermine the paradigm shift in forest management your government promised to pursue.

In the fall of 2020, Premier Horgan promised his government would implement the recommendations from the independent Old-growth Panel 'in totality' and subsequently included this task in your mandate letter. The recommendations with a three-year-framework call for working with Indigenous governments to protect at-risk forests and seek a paradigm-shift in how BC's forests are being managed, prioritizing ecosystem integrity and biodiversity.

Implementation of the Old-growth panel recommendations is an opportunity for the BC government to make progress implementing BC's 2019 B.C. Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act and speed up reforms how land-use decisions are being made in the province.

The BC government also promised to prioritize value over volume in forest management. In January, the BC government responded to Sierra Club BC's "Intact Forests, Safe Communities" report about the role of intact forests reducing climate change impacts by stating that the province will consider our findings in the context of BC's climate action plan Clean BC.

The transfer license would undermine a number of crucial promises your government made and opportunities your government stated to pursue. It would undermine the opportunity to work with Indigenous governments to save endangered forests and reform forest management before more forest destruction is locked in for years to come, undermine the goal of value over volume and make the climate crisis worse, instead of strengthening CleanBC.

Recent science indicates that burning wood pellets for energy emits more carbon than burning coal, causing wood pellets to be one of the dirtiest ways to produce energy. Given the climate emergency, it is in the public's interest to reduce carbon emissions and use clean energy alternatives like wind and solar power, not dirty energy like wood pellets.

Unless this transfer is stopped, Peak Renewables will be harvesting at an unprecedented rate in the Fort Nelson region, utilizing whole trees to feed their planned pellet mill. Pellet plants were initially intended to use the tops and branches of trees after they had been processed into logs. Peak Renewable's plan to use whole trees for pellets is the opposite of a value-added product. This plan will generate an extraordinarily low number of jobs per cubic meters of wood, on par with the number of jobs produced by shipping whole logs overseas. The spruce logs that will be harvested under this license transfer will be shipped out of the Fort Nelson region for processing in mills further south, shipping more jobs away from the hard-hit town. One of your mandates is to transition the forestry sector from high-volume to high-value, and this license transfer does the opposite of that.

We are extremely concerned about the lack of adequate public consultation in the context of this license transfer. With the scale of impact that this transfer will have on the public, a heightened level of public consultation must take place. We call on you to extend the public comment period for 4 weeks beyond the current deadline and improve advertisement of the proposed license transfer.

We call on your government to undertake a full assessment of opportunities for the forests and communities in the Fort Nelson region. This is an opportunity to diversify and add value to the forest industry. It's an opportunity to help the community reduce its dependency on one company and one industry. It's an opportunity to implement the recommendations from the Old Growth Strategic Review and to fulfill the mandate that the Premier has set out for you.

Dear Premier Horgan and Minister Conroy,

The Union of BC Indian Chiefs (UBCIC) writes to bring your attention to the significant concerns and points raised in the recent reports and maps released by a trio of researchers, Dr. Rachel Holt, Dr. Karen Price, and Dave Daust, regarding areas of old growth deferrals. Their data reveals a disturbing reality that needs to be addressed with immediate action and engagement with affected First Nations: there are only pockets of old growth forests remaining and current logging deferrals, which were enacted in September 2021, have done nothing to protect the most at-risk old growth areas.

Mapping 3 million hectares of old forests with high ecological value and areas of existing cutting permits, Dr. Holt concluded that although less than 3% of old growth is found in higher-productivity forests, there is a distinct and alarming lack of protection afford to them, with protected areas highly biased towards lower-productivity, less-at-risk forests in which 80% of old growth can be found. This reductive, counterintuitive approach towards B.C.'s current old-growth protection strategy needs to be rectified, and UBCIC supports the researchers' call for the Province to not only use their mapping project as a blueprint to figure out which at-risk old growth should be set aside from logging as it transitions to a more sustainable system, but to augment their maps with old-growth areas identified as culturally important by Indigenous Nations.

The Province has a commitment to implement all of the Old Growth Strategic Review (OSGR) Panel's recommendations, including OGSR Recommendation 6, which states: *Until a new strategy is*

implemented, defer development in old forest where ecosystems are at very high and near-term risk of irreversible loss. Moving forward, the Province needs to **immediately** engage and consult with First Nation Title Holders about old growth considerations and decision-making on their territories, and this will fundamentally include working together to develop accurate maps that identify areas of ecological and cultural significance for Nations that must be protected by deferrals.

Previously, by Resolution 2020-23 "Implementation of an Old Growth Strategy that Protects First Nations' Welfare and Endangered Old Growth Forests," the UBCIC Chiefs-in-Assembly welcomed and supported the OGSR Report and Recommendations and called upon the Province and the Ministry of FLNRORD to provide further details on how they planned to shift logging deferrals to permanent protection, and to engage and work with impacted First Nations on expanding these deferrals to include all threatened old-growth forests. Unfortunately, months have passed, and old growth forests are still at very high and near-term risk of irreversible loss. Furthermore, tensions have risen between First Nation members and activists, and we are seeing on the ground conflict over old growth in the Fairy Creek Watershed area that is exacerbating and reinforcing harmful divisions within the community.

All of this points the time sensitive and urgent need for the Province to defuse rising tensions. UBCIC subsequently calls upon the Province to work with First Nations and the independent researchers of the mapping report to map and identify at-risk, higher-productivity areas of old growth that meet the OGSR Panel's criteria for deferral, and to begin critical conversations and shared decision-making with the Nations on whose territories the proposed deferrals are located.

UBCIC reminds you that, facing a global climate and biodiversity crisis, we are at a critical point in time for ensuring the survival of old forests that sustain healthy ecosystems and keep our water and air clean. We cannot protect what is not there. In order to see a revitalized, sustainable old growth strategy that comprehensively actions the OGSR Panel's recommendations, First Nations must be included up front and engaged every step of the way, with their insight and guidance helping researchers and scientists protect remaining old growth forests well into the future. We look forward to your response.

Thanks for the revised TOR and work plan David.

There are a couple of issues I'd like to raise.

- 1. In the Confidentiality section, I'd like to ensure that not only our "past" but also our "ongoing independent" analyses and work are not considered confidential.
- 2. I'm concerned by the references to prioritisation. The entire map will show priority areas. Ecologically, it's difficult to come up with a rationale for prioritising beyond immediate risk of harvest. My concern is that IF a) regions/Nations are prioritised AND b) deferral candidate areas cannot be released until they have been agreed upon THAT Nations in "lower priority" areas will not be able see the areas within their territories. This seems at odds with transparency and fairness. It also may compromise our relationships with Nations who ask us about a deferral map for their territory. I believe that the entire map should be available simultaneously to all Nations. If there are concerns about viewing the entire province, it would be possible to clip the map to territories.
- 3. I'd like to ensure that the entire "candidate deferral area" map, once we all agree on the areas, can be released to Nations. While highlighting areas at immediate risk of harvest is important, it is also important to show important areas that may not be in the current stream of harvest planning so that Nations can include them in legal deferral areas to avoid initiation of harvest plans in the following 2 years during planning.

It may be that there are two sets of maps: one shows the deferral area candidates that meet the OGSR criteria as best we can; the second shows the legal deferral areas that have been agreed to between Indigenous and Provincial Governments. The first map should be available to all Nations at the same time. Prioritisation lies with implementation of the second map.

I've included a couple of suggested revisions in the document attached.

Old Growth Deferral Technical Advisory Panel Terms of Reference (DRAFT for discussion)

June 10, 2021

Background

The Old Growth Strategic Review includes a recommendation to implement temporary deferrals to protect areas of old growth at immediate risk of irreversible biodiversity loss. Deferrals are one key part of the 14 recommendations, intended to be an immediate but temporary measure. More permanent conservation measures are needed to achieve the paradigm shift envisioned in the Old Growth Strategic Review and will be developed through the balance of the recommendations and in conjunction with other stewardship initiatives such as species at risk planning, land use planning etc.

The deferral recommendation included implementation advice on how government could identify potential deferral areas. The implementation advice included five criteria that could be used as part of the information to inform where deferrals are needed. Ministry staff and members of the panel have completed separate analysis on elements of the five criteria, however further input is needed to ensure deferral areas are addressing the intent of the recommendation.

Purpose

The purpose of the Old Growth Deferral Technical Advisory Panel (the Panel) is to provide analysis and advice to the provincial government on where to locate additional temporary deferrals and the priority for implementation of deferral areas, consistent with recommendation 6 from the Old Growth Strategic Review.

The Panel will operate as an independent group providing advice directly to the Ministry and will provide a briefing to Minister Conroy, and Minister Heyman on their recommendations.

The provincial government will use the information provided by the Panel to support discussions with Indigenous Nations on deferrals.

The Panel will be supported by the Ministry of Forest Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development as well as the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy, and will have access to Ministry technical experts. David Muter (ADM Resource Stewardship Division) will

serve as facilitator for the group and coordinate any additional technical resources needed by the Panel.

- Respect for Indigenous Rights and Title Holders. Once a prioritized list of deferrals has been developed, the Ministry will reach out to Indigenous Nations with traditional territory over the deferral areas to determine if they agree to the deferral or would like to discuss and provide further input to the deferral location. If considered appropriate by Indigenous Nations, the Panel will be invited to support any technical briefing with Indigenous Nations on recommended deferral areas. Discussions with Indigenous Nations on deferrals are intended to be quick and focused only on the deferral; other land use and conservation initiatives will be part of broader conversations with Indigenous Nations. Final decision on deferrals will be between the provincial and Indigenous governments.
- <u>Timely Release to All Indigenous Nations.</u> When a technical map of deferral candidate areas has been completed, it will be made available to all Indigenous Nations simultaneously.
- Address Areas of High Risk. Government will follow the prioritization of deferrals recommended by the Panel and will include consideration of harvest plans over the next 2

years as well as other considerations discussed with the Panel. Areas that are identified by the Panel but do not face risk of harvest over the next 2 years may not be deferred but will be <u>included in the deferral candidate map to inform part of discussion on setting broader old growth and biodiversity targets (consistent with recommendation 9 and 10 in the Old Growth Strategic Review).</u>

- Continuous Implementation. As deferral areas are confirmed by Indigenous and
 provincial governments, they will be submitted for approval by Cabinet. It is expected
 that several packages of deferral areas may need to be developed and advanced when
 they are ready.
- Engage Industry and Local Government. Once deferral areas are identified with Indigenous Nations, Ministry staff will engage with tenure holders and local governments. This will be an opportunity to discuss the conservation objectives for the area and how to best minimize and mitigate socio-economic impacts. The Panel will be invited to support these discussions.

The Panel will be involved in ongoing discussion on the prioritize deferral areas and the implementation process. It is expected that as deferrals are developed and implemented there will be regular and ongoing dialogue with the panel on the development and implementation of deferrals.

Data Transparency

Data used in analysis will be transparent and made available to all panel members.

Remuneration

Panel members will be compensated for their work on the Panel.

Confidentiality

The intent of this work is to provide transparency to the public on how deferrals are identified, while at the same time respecting the confidential nature of government to government discussions. Panel members may discuss this initiative and the work in general with other technical experts in order to best inform and support the recommendations. Information on specific deferral recommendations and locations will remain confidential until the deferral area has been finalized with Indigenous governments and approved by Cabinet. Maps developed through the Panel process will also remain confidential until a deferral area has been approved. Any past, or ongoing, independent analysis or work completed by panel members will not be considered confidential.

Communication

The work of the Panel will be an important part of improving public information on the status of old growth in BC (consistent with recommendation #5 from the Old Growth Strategic Review). Government will support regular information updates on the work of the panel through a news release announcing the formation of the Panel, including the terms of reference, and by posting regular updates online to the government old growth web site. Regular updates will include the

specific identification of deferral areas once they have been approved by Cabinet. Any communications materials will be reviewed and agreed to by the Panel and government before they are released.

Panel members are free to speak publicly about their work on the Panel provided no confidential information is released.

1. How will this panel help government to implement the recommendations of the old growth panel?

- Government has committed to implementing all 14 recommendations of the independent panel on old growth.
- The Old Growth Strategic Review includes a recommendation to implement temporary deferrals to protect areas of old growth at immediate risk of irreversible biodiversity loss.
- These deferrals are intended to be an immediate but temporary measure while the Province develops a comprehensive old growth strategy.

•

- We've already deferred old growth harvesting in 11 areas of the Province and are beginning and continuing talks with Indigenous Nations on other deferrals.
- This panel will ensure we're using all the best science and data available to identify atrisk old growth ecosystems, and prioritize where deferrals are implemented.

2. Why does government need a technical panel – can't government do the science on its own?

- The strategic review panel on old growth provided advice on how government should identify deferral areas and criteria that should be considered.
- Government and the technical panelists have completed separate analyses on these criteria bringing panelists to the table to provide outside technical advice helps ensure we're addressing the intent of the independent panel on old growth.

VICTORIA – British Columbia is releasing its Hydrogen Strategy, a roadmap for how hydrogen development will support the ambitious climate goals of CleanBC, while creating new jobs in B.C.'s growing clean tech sector.

"This Strategy provides a clear direction for how we'll embrace the hydrogen opportunity available to us in B.C.," said Bruce Ralston, Minister of Energy, Mines and Low Carbon Innovation. Investing in B.C.'s Hydrogen advantage

The Canadian Hydrogen Strategy, published in 2020, recognized B.C. for its abundant feedstocks, export capabilities and nation-leading adoption of electric vehicles. It also highlighted the province's potential for the production of low-carbon-intensity hydrogen.

The Province's Hydrogen Strategy is informed by the B.C. Hydrogen Study, completed in 2019. The study identified mid- and long-term roles for hydrogen development in the province. In line with the recommendations of the Study, the Hydrogen Strategy was created to guide the building of a vibrant and robust hydrogen economy in British Columbia.

The Province is investing in hydrogen development today to ensure all British Columbians benefit from the promise of a low-carbon future:

- Through StrongerBC, the Province committed \$35 million for a Centre for Innovation and Clean Energy to commercialize clean technology in B.C., which will create good jobs and support cleantech advancements. This is supported by an additional \$25 million from the federal government.
- B.C.'s Low Carbon Fuel Standard Part 3 Agreements have contributed over \$36 million to hydrogen fuelling projects that will advance the production and supply of clean hydrogen.
- In Budget 2021, the Province allocated \$10 million for the development of the hydrogen economy and to reduce the carbon intensity of fuel.
- There are already six hydrogen fuelling stations operating in B.C., with another 10 expected to come online by the end of 2023.

Chilliwack to expand public EV charging network

CHILLIWACK – People in Chilliwack will have more options for charging their electric vehicle (EV) with four new EV stations that are being built.

Funding for the new EV stations will come from the CleanBC Go Electric Public Charger program.

"As of December 2020, B.C. had more than 54,000 EVs on the road," said Bruce Ralston, Minister of Energy, Mines and Low Carbon Innovation. "With the highest reported uptake rates of EVs in North America, we're building out the infrastructure needed to support the increasing amount of EV drivers. This support for EV charging not only moves us toward our CleanBC goals, it also helps EV drivers save on fuel costs – about \$1,800 every year for the average B.C. driver."

The City of Chilliwack is receiving \$110,000 from the Province's CleanBC Go Electric Public Charger program to install four new EV charging stations in on of the City owned parking lot just north of Five Corners, allowing more EV drivers in the community and post-pandemic travellers to charge up. Work on the new charging stations is expected to begin in October 2021.

B.C. is home to one of the largest public charging networks in Canada. At the end of 2020, there were over 2,500 public charging stations in B.C.

With \$7 million from the Province announced in September 2020 for the CleanBC Go Electric Public Charger program, Indigenous Nations, local governments, communities and businesses

can apply for support to open new fast-charging stations. Applicants can receive up to 50% of the cost of equipment and installation to a maximum of \$80,000 per station. Increased rebates of up to 90% of project costs to a maximum of \$130,000 per station are also available for Indigenous-owned fast-charging stations. The program is being delivered by the Fraser Basin Council on behalf of the Province.

"As a signatory of the B.C. Climate Action Charter, the City of Chilliwack is committed to reducing emissions and working towards a more sustainable future," said Ken Popove, mayor of Chilliwack. "We are grateful the Province shares this vision and hope to see more electric vehicle users in Chilliwack once this project is complete."

In addition to the funding for the expansion of the EV public charging network, a range of rebates for new EVs and home and workplace EV charging infrastructure are available to British Columbians through the CleanBC Go Electric program.

The Zero-Emission Vehicles (ZEV) Act requires automakers to meet increasing annual levels of ZEV sales to reach 10% of new light-duty vehicle sales by 2025, 30% by 2030 and 100% by 2040. B.C. is on its way to exceeding the 2025 targets with light-duty EV sales representing 9.4% of all new light-duty vehicle sales in B.C. in 2020.

Minister,

Kevin asked me to provide some advice to you in support of Cabinet working group discussions tomorrow on forestry. This should be consistent with FLNRORD's advice tomorrow. I have not seem the final materials that will be presented so am working here off of latest drafts and discussions with David Muter.

If you need anything else, or want to discuss, let me know.

1. Terms of reference

- The experts have been cautious of participating in a government process in large part because they do not want to be:
 - o part of 'government spin' that does not result in real action; and,
 - o cited as a reason for further delays by government to stop current logging of old growth
- We have now largely agreed to a Terms of Reference that will bring these experts on side.
- The outstanding issue this week was around when information maps would be released publicly:
 - o BC wanted to withhold maps until after First Nations engagement and direction from Cabinet
 - The experts saw this as significantly problematic as the information resource should be provided to the public to be transparent, have a more informed public debate, and build public trust.
- The experts developed a solution that attempts to meets both interests
 - Provide to First Nations and the public, as soon as they are a ready, a series of maps that show technical information layers for BC old growth;
 - Then develop separately a prioritization of areas to be considered for protection by First Nations and the province. This prioritization list would not be released publicly in advance of those decisions.
- This approach aligns well with old growth report's recommendation 5 (provide better information to the public) and recommendation 6 (use different criteria to prioritize old growth areas for protection).
- ENV advice recommends that government supports the proposed approach.
 - It is fundamental to getting these experts to participate,
 - meets the governments core interest of not having a priority list that results in pre-emptive campaigns on First Nations; and,
 - better informs the public on the complex choices that need to be made in making decisions.

2. Communications of the creation of technical table

- The panel is aware that the government wants to announce the technical panel next week to build public trust and show continued momentum on the file.
- They have a series of concerns that government messaging/communications strategy will need to address, including:

Expectations management

- the panel sees its role as providing information resources for decisions made by the province and First Nations. They are concerned that an announcement might raise expectations for the table in setting out the decisions.
- The expert panel recognizes it does not include the full range of views that would be needed for decision making (implications for industry; local community interests, First Nations interests and indigenous knowledge).

A sense of urgency

The panel wants to see government recognize the immediate issue of logging (estimated at 50 to 60k hectares of old growth logged per year) that needs to be addressed to provide the space for the larger analytical work to take place.

A paradigm shift

- The panel wants to see messaging by government that commits to the longer term substantive reforms envisioned by the old growth recommendations.
- The view of these experts is that government messaging to date implies that "lots of protections are in place and that everything is ok".
- Government messaging for the creation of a technical table will need to use substantively different messaging than what has been used previously if it's to build trust with the expert group that government is serious about these efforts.
- With direction, staff will work to finalize communications materials for a release next week.

Thx Megan. Just an idea for you to ponder...

When we did the original 9 deferrals, we messaged out that these were known areas where Nations had indicated there were past issues with old growth and that all involved were trying best avoid these areas. Some, like Incomappleaux, were log-arounds for many, many years. Back last Sept we communicated a stronger message that these were areas that respected those challenges and were areas where government was demonstrating early that it was open to the idea of deferrals.

More recently, some of the messaging has moved to those areas were some of the most at-risk OG in the province. They were not. They were still important to the Nations who wanted the deferrals, but from an ecological at-risk perspective they were not as important as other areas according to the ecologists. The tech members have concerns on that messaging because in their minds, it ties them to that message, which they disagree with. As professional ecologists, they want to make sure their professional advice remains unchallenged.

If we can soften that cast-back info on past deferrals, and focus more on the good work to come, we will get some good support, I believe.

Below is a list of points that have been uncovered as key issues with the tech panel. These are areas that we should be aware of and to discuss at noon.

- While its true government has deferred about 198,000 ha. of old forest, the panel does not believe the vast majority of this old forest meets the criteria the report outlines in recommendation 6. Can we try to avoid any <u>qualitative</u> statements about that old forest?
- The deferrals to date are important areas that were agreed to, and supported by Nations, and were longstanding log-arounds due to past conflicts. The 9 from September were originally cast as quick deferrals that demonstrated governments seriousness about moving on the recommendations. They were not intended at the time to be analyzed against the criteria, but their value was that these were OG areas agreed to in Government-to-government dialogue.
- The numbers about 10M ha. protected has been problematic from the panel's perspective. They view the statement that if 10M has been protected, there really isn't a problem. So we've agreed to get to more detail about the status of old forest in the biogeoclimatic zones and variants, which much more analysis of specific types of old forest that suits deferrals being both ecologically very important and having high risk.
- The panel believes government should be messaging out the "paradigm shift" message more forcefully as they see this as a critical foundation to change management.
- The panel sees risk to themselves and their reputations if government messaging that they oppose is part of
 communications where they are profiled. So, for this week's release, more "neutral" statements focusing on
 the work ahead and how that will help with recs 5 and 6 may be better





Science to help drive old growth deferrals

VICTORIA – The Government of British Columbia has brought together an independent Old Growth Technical Advisory Panel to support its next steps in its science-based approach to transforming old growth management.

"This new technical panel will ensure we're using the best science and data available to identify at-risk old growth ecosystems and prioritize areas for deferral," said Katrine Conroy, Minister of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development. "We are committed to a science-based approach to old growth management, and our work with the advisory panel will help us break down barriers between the different interpretations of data that are out there."

The five members of the Old Growth Technical Advisory Panel will build on initial technical work by government and others to provide maps, analysis and detailed information on the status of old growth forest ecosystems in B.C. This work will be critical to improving public information on old growth, consistent with Recommendation 5 from the Old Growth Strategic Review, and will help inform government-to-government decisions with First Nations on future deferral areas. Decisions on specific deferrals will continue to be made at a government-to-government level with First Nations rights and title holders.

The technical panel will also provide recommendations and advice on priority areas for development of deferrals that will aid in government-to-government engagement. This work addresses a priority recommendation of the independent strategic review panel on old growth – Recommendation 6 – to defer development in old forests where ecosystems are at very high and near-term risk of irreversible biodiversity loss, until a new strategy is implemented.

"I am hopeful that this step marks a movement towards increased transparency and towards the promised paradigm shift needed to maintain ecological resilience and biodiversity" said Karen Price, forest ecologist and Old Growth Technical Advisory Panel member.

In September 2020, government released the report of the Old Growth Strategic Review and committed to adopting all 14 of its recommendations. To date, 11 areas of old growth throughout B.C. have been deferred from harvest, most recently in the Fairy Creek watershed and central Walbran area.

"Old growth forests provide unique and critical habitats that preserve biodiversity, support clean watersheds and capture carbon crucial to reducing our province's climate footprint," said George Heyman, Minister of Environment and Climate Change Strategy. "This panel's work will be a key element in transforming forestry and conservation practices here in B.C. by drawing on science to ensure that the important range of old growth forest values are protected for

generations to come."

Government is also addressing the old growth panel's high priority recommendation to consult with Indigenous peoples and has committed to continued consultations and work on further deferrals with First Nations rights and titleholders.

B.C.'s actions on old growth

B.C. released "A New Future for Old Forests," the report of the strategic review panel on old growth, in September 2020 and has begun to implement its 14 recommendations. Actions to date include:

As a first step, government engaged with the First Nations Leadership Council to discuss the report and begin work on the approach for Recommendation 1: "Engage the full involvement of Indigenous leaders and organizations to review this report and any subsequent policy or strategy development and implementation."

In response to Recommendation 6: "Until a new strategy is implemented, defer development in old forests where ecosystems are at very high and near-term risk of irreversible biodiversity loss," harvest has been deferred in 11 areas of old growth throughout B.C. The most recent deferrals include those in the Fairy Creek watershed and central Walbran area, initiated at the request of the Pacheedaht, Ditidaht and Huu-ay-aht First Nations. Work is ongoing to identify additional deferral areas throughout the province.

Recommendations 1 and 6, as outlined above, are underway as are Recommendation 5 regarding public information and Recommendation 7, which addresses compliance with existing requirements.

Garry Merkel

Merkel is a member of the Tahltan Nation in northwest British Columbia. He is a registered professional forester with over 45 years of experience in the field, management, academic, research and community aspects of forest and land management. He has also worked in many fields, some of which include organizational development, community development, business development and management, governance, community-based land management and education. Merkel was a member of the two-person independent panel that reviewed B.C.'s old growth strategy.

Rachel F. Holt (PhD)

Holt is an independent ecologist based in Nelson on the unceded territory of the Sinixt, Ktunaxa and Okanagan Nations' peoples. She has worked on the ecology and management of old growth forest from many angles over the last 25 years, from defining indices of old growth in the field in the 1990s, to policy, planning and cumulative effects assessments for the Province of B.C. and First Nations in a wide variety of ecosystems. Holt was on the board of the Forest Practices Board for six years, and vice-chair for two of those. Her goal is to bring transparency to the use of data and science in land management issues in B.C. Holt runs her own one-woman consulting company, Veridian Ecological: https://veridianecological.ca/

Lisa Matthaus

Matthaus is the Provincial Lead for Organizing for Change and based on the unceded territory of the Songhees, Esquimalt and WSÁNEĆ peoples. She has worked on B.C. forest policy and climate issues for 25 years, including key discussions that led to ecosystem-based management in the Great Bear Rainforest land use agreements and the negotiation of the initial Forest Stewardship Council standards for British Columbia. She has an MSc in environmental and resource economics.

Karen Price (PhD)

Price is an independent ecologist based near Smithers B.C. on unceded Wet'suwet'en territory. Price has worked on old growth and land-use policy for 25 years, aiming to bring science and transparency to decisions. She focuses on how to maintain ecological resilience given cumulative effects of management and climate. Peer-reviewed publications address old growth species from epiphytic lichens to stream insects and birds, forest structure, ecosystem-based management and the status of B.C.'s old growth.

Dave Daust

Daust (MSc, RPF) is a landscape analyst based near Smithers on unceded Wet'suwet'en territory. Daust's background includes harvest design, silviculture and ecosystem-based woodlot management. For three decades, he has designed approaches for assessing impacts of human activities on forest biodiversity and on focal species—including caribou, grizzly bears, goshawks, marten and salmon—for Indigenous and provincial governments. In the past decade, he has incorporated climate change into assessments and recommendations.

Background

The Old Growth Strategic Review includes two important recommendations related to improving public information through timely and objective information (recommendation #5), and implementation of temporary deferrals to protect areas of old growth at immediate risk of irreversible biodiversity loss (recommendation #6). Deferrals are part of the 14 recommendations, intended to be an immediate but temporary measure, with a recognition that improved analysis can help provide governments with best information to assist in deferral decisions. More permanent conservation measures are one part of what is needed to achieve the paradigm shift envisioned in the Old Growth Strategic Review and will be developed through the balance of the recommendations and in conjunction with other stewardship initiatives such as species at risk planning, land use planning etc.

Achieving the paradigm shift from a timber-based focus to an ecologically-based focus as envisioned in the Old Growth Strategic Review will require building a deeper understanding amongst all British Columbians on the goal of improving old growth management, why this is important and what it will mean for the province. It will also require government to develop and resource new processes, policies and approaches for old growth management that involve British Columbians and provides greater opportunity to participate and be informed on old growth management.

The deferral recommendation from the Old Growth Strategic Review included implementation advice on how government could identify potential deferral areas. The implementation advice included five criteria that could be used as part of the information to inform where deferrals are needed. Ministry staff and members of the Old Growth Technical Advisory Panel (the Panel) have completed separate analysis on elements of the five criteria. However, further input is needed to ensure deferral areas are addressing the intent of the recommendation.

Purpose

The purpose of the Panel is to provide maps, analysis, and detailed status of old growth ecosystems in British Columbia in order to improve public information, consistent with recommendation #5 from the Old Growth Strategic Review. The Panel will also provide recommendations on priority areas for implementation of deferrals, consistent with recommendation #6 from the Old Growth Strategic Review.

The Panel will operate as an independent group, working collaboratively with ministry technical staff to share detailed information on old growth and to develop mapping and data sets that reflect best understanding and status of old growth forests in British Columbia. The Panel will provide information directly to the ministry and will provide a briefing to Minister Conroy and Minister Heyman on their analysis and conclusions.

The Panel will be supported by the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development as well as the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy and will have access to ministry technical experts. David Muter (Assistant Deputy Minister Resource Stewardship Division) will serve as facilitator for the group and coordinate any additional technical resources needed by the Panel.

Mapping Old Growth

The work will begin under the intent of recommendation #5 with the objective to improve the data and mapping of old forests as a foundational task to support other old growth report recommendations. Ministry staff will collaborate with the Panel on analysis of old growth data and mapping and will share existing maps and data with the Panel. Ministry staff will also support the panel as needed, in developing additional maps and data as requested by the Panel to support the work. Some Panel members have also developed their own analysis on at risk old growth ecosystems, and this information will also be included in the work of the Panel.

The Panel will develop an agreed-upon suite of maps and supporting analyses showing:

- all old growth,
- protected old growth, and
- rare and at-risk old growth ecosystems.

Once complete, these technical maps will be made available to all Indigenous Nations and the public simultaneously. This will significantly help with the communication and transparency around old growth moving forward, as per Old Growth Strategic Review recommendation #5 (provide the public with timely and objective information about forest conditions and trends).

Identification of Candidate Deferral Areas

In order to ensure that areas of highest biodiversity risk are addressed first, the Panel will provide the provincial government recommendations on the prioritization of areas for deferrals, based on the agreed-upon at-risk old growth maps.

It is expected that in some cases the implementation of deferrals will require more detailed discussion with Indigenous Nations. Once a prioritized list of candidate deferrals areas has been provided by the Panel, government will immediately begin discussions with Indigenous Nations to identify and implement the deferrals. Government will apply the following principles in implementing deferral areas.

- Respect for Indigenous Rights and Title Holders. Ministry will reach out to Indigenous Nations with traditional territory over the identified areas to determine if they agree to a deferral or would like to discuss and provide further input to the deferral location. If considered appropriate by Indigenous Nations, the Panel will be invited to support any technical briefings with Indigenous Nations on identified areas. Discussions with Indigenous Nations on deferrals are intended to be quick and focused only on the deferral; other land use and conservation initiatives will be part of broader conversations with Indigenous Nations. Final decision on deferrals will be between the Provincial and Indigenous governments.
- Address Areas of High Risk. Government will follow the prioritization of deferrals
 recommended by the Panel and will include consideration of harvest plans over the next two
 years as well as other considerations discussed with the Panel. Areas that are identified by the
 Panel but do not face risk of harvest over the next two years may not be deferred but will be
 included in the deferral candidate map to inform discussion on setting broader old growth and
 biodiversity targets (consistent with recommendations #9 and #10 in the Old Growth Strategic
 Review).
- Engage Industry and Local Government. Once deferral areas are identified with Indigenous
 Nations, ministry staff will engage with tenure holders, local governments, and workers. This
 will be an opportunity to discuss the conservation objectives for the area and how to best
 minimize and mitigate socio-economic impacts. The Panel will be invited to support these
 discussions.
- Continuous Implementation. As deferral areas are confirmed by Indigenous and Provincial
 governments, they will be submitted for approval by Cabinet. It is expected that several
 packages of deferral areas may need to be developed and advanced when they are ready.

The Panel will be involved in ongoing discussion on the prioritized deferral areas and the implementation process.

Data Transparency

Data used in analysis will be transparent and made available to all Panel members.

Remuneration

Panel members will be compensated for their work on the Panel.

Confidentiality

The intent of this work is to provide transparency to the public on the status of old growth forests in British Columbia, and how deferrals are identified, while at the same time respecting the confidential nature of government to government discussions. Panel members may discuss this initiative and the work in general with other technical experts in order to best inform and support the recommendations. Information on specific deferral areas and locations will remain confidential until the deferral area has been finalized with Indigenous governments.

Any past, or ongoing, independent analysis or work completed by Panel members will not be considered confidential.

Communication

The work of the Panel will be an important part of improving public information on the status of old growth in British Columbia (consistent with recommendation #5 from the Old Growth Strategic Review). Government will support regular information updates on the work of the Panel through a news release announcing the formation of the Panel, including the terms of reference, and by posting regular updates online on the government old growth website. Regular updates will include maps on areas of at-risk old growth ecosystems. Once deferrals have been approved by Cabinet, detailed information on the deferral will also be released.

Any communications materials will be reviewed and agreed to by the Panel and Government before they are released.

Panel members are free to speak publicly about their work on the Panel provided no confidential information is released.

Also – I forgot to provide a quick update on yesterday's meeting. The group did take a percentage of the time to work together without government officials which was really productive. We then had a private conversation between the panel and David Muter, Brian B, and myself. The main focus was to get an understanding of why government was 'stuck' in getting to decisions and how the panel can focus it's work to help us get 'unstuck'. There is a bunch of work happening over the next week. "Interim protection of spatial old growth areas is under active development. Long term protection will come through a finalized land use plan anticipated once a broad public process has been completed."

Was hoping to get further detail on the plans for interim protection.

- BC's beautiful forests are part of what makes our province a great place to live. They're part of who we are as British Columbians and we need to protect them for generations to come.
- A renewed provincial old-growth strategy will balance the need to support and protect workers with the need for additional deferrals of old growth to protect species at risk, key species habitat and enhancing biodiversity.
- That's why we've committed to and are working to implement the 14 recommendations of the Provincial Old Growth Strategic Review panel.
- The first step to doing more to protect old growth is putting Indigenous peoples at the centre of land management in their respective territories.
- Implementing the recommendations of the Forest Practices Board report on the Prince George Timber Supply Area will also include working closely with First Nations to ensure all values are considered as we identify protection areas based on ecological risk.
- The Ministry will start by identifying areas for retentions where lower amounts of old growth forest are remaining.
- We will also work closely with local First Nations to ensure that they have opportunity to participate in the selection of the areas.

Can you say when they will come into effect and how long they will remain in place? (I imagine until the long-term protection measures are in place but was hoping you could confirm).

- There is no specific timeline for establishment of areas identified in the Forest Practices Board report on Biodiversity in the Prince George Timber Supply Area, but the strategy is to move as quickly as possible to mitigate impacts to other stakeholders.
- The priority will be to establish areas based on their relative ecological risk. Areas which have been heavily impacted will be the priority.
- Protection areas will likely come into effect soon after areas are identified, recognizing that not all areas will be determined at the same time.
- These areas are expected to remain in place until future land use planning confirms or replaces them based on their value, location and intent.

Will there be detail provided on where they will be located, how large they will be, species protected etc?

- Protection areas will be located throughout the Prince George Timber Supply Area.
- They will vary in size, but will be large enough to provide ecosystem protection and connect wildlife habitats.
- They will include a range of species and ages similar to the historical composition for that area.
- Selected areas will be representative of the landscape units described in the Order Establishing Landscape Biodiversity Objectives in the Prince George Timber Supply Area.

ISSUE: Fairy Creek and other Numbers

STATUS: Provided background

- The Fairy Creek watershed is 1,199 hectares in size and includes approximately 884 hectares of old forest which is deferred from harvest.
- o Zone A 562 ha previously protected, 299 additionally protected. Additional younger forests is protected in Zone A.
- o Zone B 15 ha protected and 7 ha additional protected.
- This new deferral area does include existing Old Growth Management Areas, Wildlife Management Areas and Ungulate Winter Ranges. Deferrals enhance the level of protection for the previously protected areas and ensure no old growth harvesting will be happening in these areas. Prior to the deferral, some operational and discretionary activity like roadbuilding or trading 'like for like' areas could have been approved. This is no longer the case.

Quick email on today's OGTAP meeting and follow up with Lisa on the Organizing for Change briefing note

- 1. Old Growth Technical Advisory Panel update (OGTAP)
 - We're still resolving technical issues with how to reconcile data and portray map layers – this is largely a function of the insufficient quality of government data. The workplan target is map products for July 30th that cover both the 'at risk' forests that should be candidates for referrals, as well as an overview of where we have current protections in place.
 - Because we continue to have specific data issues to resolve, there's
 concern that we won't complete that task on time. I understand that our
 main issue will be the level of accuracy of those products so we are
 thinking now of three milestones for products that can continue to be
 cleaned up through that process:
- i. Maps to inform the work of the panel in recommending priorities for deferrals (July 30^{th})
- ii. Maps to inform Cabinet early August

- iii. Maps to be part of a public announcement ideally with the next round of deferrals (late August or later)
 - This staged approach seems to work for people. It does not appear that future changes affect provincial scale planning but will be important to individual areas so good to address when we can.
 - The rest of the meeting was about how to brief the two Ministers next Monday. We want to provide specific timelines around next steps and products, as well as use this as a pressure point on our group to resolve any outstanding issues. Lisa and I are doing an annotated agenda for the group to review this week.
 - 2. Organizing for Change (OFC) note on strategy/next steps
 - Spoke with Lisa. Generally my view is the strategy note is helpful but raises two issues
- i. Process should the advice come from OFC members or from the OG TAP (given that OG TAP is generally advising in the same direction)
 - This has been in development for some time and was effectively a negotiated view across several member organizations
 - 2. The role of Lisa for OFC and OG TAP does complicate things but there doesn't appear to be a better approach
 - 3. There is some urgency with providing this advice given that ENGOs have been developing it for some time – and many moderated their views to be a part of it – and it would be hard to move it over to OG TAP
- ii. Great Bear Rainforest
- There have been some discussions internally about the intersection between G2G work on GBR with the work of OG TAP. By making some explicit direction on next steps for GBR, the note might land the wrong way, or provoke the issue before we're ready.
- 2. This issue is an important one for ENGOs to put forward.
- In short, Lisa understands both elements and is going to think about it.
 My gut reaction is that we can manage the first issue about Lisa's role in
 two separate processes, but that if GBR is complicated it might be helpful
 if that advice came from ENGOs separate for the OG TAP process. We can
 then sort out any subsequent direction from that and adjust the OG TAP
 process.

Meeting of Old Growth Technical Advisory Panel with Minister Conroy and Minister Heyman

July 26, 2021

Purpose:

 To confirm with Ministers the expected deliverables and timelines leading to upcoming public announcements.

Areas of Work

- 1) A series of mapping resources on BC's old growth for public release
 - These maps build on existing work already completed by individual Panel members updated with data and analysis through the Panel's work with government officials.
 - As the inventory was built for timber management and does not include accurate
 information required to manage for old growth, various analyses were required to make
 the best logical, statistically relevant and defensible approximations of at-risk old
 growth areas.
 - Three sets of maps to be released:
 - i. All old growth in BC
 - ii. State of current protections for BC's old growth forests
 - iii. Old-growth areas currently at risk based on criteria laid out in recommendation #6 of the OGSR: age, rarity by Biogeoclimatic Ecosystem Classifications, intact watersheds, etc.
 - Maps are being generated now but have required significant effort to deal with data gaps and quality control. We are currently aiming at this timeline:
 - End of July: late-stage draft maps to enable the Panel in identify priority areas for deferral; will be available for discussions internally and with Indigenous Nations
 - ii. Mid August: maps to inform decisions (Part 13) by Ministers on deferrals
 - iii. <u>Late August</u>: final maps for release to the public as resources to inform discussions on old growth. These maps should be included as part of an announcement on new deferrals.
- 2) Recommendations for priority deferrals
 - The Panel is finalizing a set of principles that, in conjunction with the maps, will guide advice on priority areas for deferrals.
 - Aiming for priority deferrals to be provided to Ministers by mid-August for decision

 It is the strong recommendation of the Panel that the Province uses any formal or informal means to ensure logging ceases in all areas recommended for deferral even if the legal designations cannot be finalized right away.

3) Improved communications (Lisa)

- Communications supporting the announcement of deferrals and release of the mapping
 products will be crucial in helping to build trust in this process and maintaining the
 integrity of the Panel which underpins it. We hope to play a strong role in the
 development of the communications materials.
- The Panel will also provide advice on how to enhance overall government old growthrelated communications to better characterize the problem facing British Columbia, the urgency we face, as well as how government actions are showing progress.
- 4) Initiating a longer-term paradigm shift (Garry)
 - While the deferrals are an important starting point for the implementation of the OGSR recommendations, they are meant to enable a larger conversation about the needed paradigm shift in how BC's forests are managed. The Panel is completing a paper on how that shift needs to be facilitated and supported in the coming years to be fully realized.

Meeting of Old Growth Technical Advisory Panel with Minister Conroy and Minister Heyman

July 26, 2021

Purpose:

 To confirm with Ministers the expected deliverables and timelines leading to upcoming public announcements.

Areas of Work

- 1) A series of mapping resources on BC's old growth for public release
 - These maps build on existing work already completed by individual Panel members updated with data and analysis through the Panel's work with government officials.
 - As the inventory was built for timber management and does not include accurate information required to manage for old growth, various analyses were required to make the best logical, statistically relevant and defensible approximations of at-risk old growth areas.
 - Three sets of maps to be released:
 - i. All old growth in BC
 - ii. State of current protections for BC's old growth forests
 - iii. Old-growth areas currently at risk based on criteria laid out in recommendation #6 of the OGSR: age, rarity by Biogeoclimatic Ecosystem Classifications, intact watersheds, etc.
 - Maps are being generated now but have required significant effort to deal with data gaps and quality control. We are currently aiming at this timeline:
 - i. <u>End of July</u>: late-stage draft maps to enable the Panel in identify priority areas for deferral; will be available for discussions internally and with Indigenous Nations
 - ii. Mid August: maps to inform decisions (Part 13) by Ministers on deferrals
 - iii. <u>Late August</u>: final maps for release to the public as resources to inform discussions on old growth. These maps should be included as part of an announcement on new deferrals.
- 2) Recommendations for priority deferrals
 - The Panel is finalizing a set of principles that, in conjunction with the maps, will guide advice on priority areas for deferrals.
 - Aiming for priority deferrals to be provided to Ministers by mid-August for decision

- It is the strong recommendation of the Panel that the Province uses any formal or informal means to ensure logging ceases in all areas recommended for deferral even if the legal designations cannot be finalized right away.
- 3) Improved communications (Lisa)
 - Communications supporting the announcement of deferrals and release of the mapping
 products will be crucial in helping to build trust in this process and maintaining the
 integrity of the Panel which underpins it. We hope to play a strong role in the
 development of the communications materials.
 - The Panel will also provide advice on how to enhance overall government old growthrelated communications to better characterize the problem facing British Columbia, the urgency we face, as well as how government actions are showing progress.
- 4) Initiating a longer-term paradigm shift (Garry)
 - While the deferrals are an important starting point for the implementation of the OGSR recommendations, they are meant to enable a larger conversation about the needed paradigm shift in how BC's forests are managed. The Panel is completing a paper on how that shift needs to be facilitated and supported in the coming years to be fully realized.

KEY MESSAGES:

- Work by our two governments on a Nature Agreement is progressing well. An announcement at this time is not required but, if substantive, could provide momentum to these efforts.
- Likewise, our government is advancing an ambitious agenda on old growth that includes:
 - Commitment to implement the recommendations of the Old Growth Report;
 - An intentions paper that is engaging the public now on long term reforms to BC's forestry industry; and,
 - A new Old Growth Technical Advisory Panel that will produce maps of at-risk old growth and priorities for deferral later in August.
- It will be important if we do proceed with an announcement that it supports these efforts and timelines.
- For an announcement to be meaningful, BC would be looking to see Canada:
 - commit to a specific spending plan for the already committed funding for spotted owl;
 - show concrete progress by announcing new funding to support indigenous capacity on old growth and to support Healthy Watersheds;
 - signal a significant share of the overall \$2.4B of federal funding for implementing the agreement; and,
 - recognize the significance of this work for BC communities and economy and commit the two governments to work together on those economic costs and opportunities

DISCUSSION:

• Staff from B.C. and ECCC are meeting daily to discuss the scope and content of the announcement. ECCC has started drafting a Statement of Collaboration for announcement.

- B.C. will be co-drafting this document with ECCC.
- ECCC staff have signaled that Minister Wilkinson has a particular interest in advancing old growth protections, including deferrals and conservation planning.
- ECCC indicated that they expect Minister Wilkinson to be supportive of funding that:
 - Enables Indigenous consultation and engagement;
 - Starts and continues conversations about conservation more broadly (e.g. beyond just deferrals); and
 - Brings private sector funding as well (similar to Challenge funded projects where leases were bought out).
- B.C. has communicated to ECCC that there is a need to understand the magnitude of funding available for our province. ECCC will be challenged to do so. B.C. is prepared to compromise on what the language in a media release may say regarding the amount of national funding to support the Nature Agreement.
- ECCC has shared their national criteria for allocating Nature Agreement funds across the country based on these federal interests:
 - o 25% by 2025 and 30% by 2030
 - Priority species (in BC, those are boreal caribou, southern mountain caribou, and spotted owl)
 - Reconciliation and Indigenous leadership
 - Carbon storage
- In addition to a statement of funding, B.C. is looking to ensure that the following interests are incorporated into a Statement of Collaboration:
 - A commitment to work on a modernized approach to implementing the federal Species at Risk Act to help create greater legal and land use certainty for all parties.
 - The need to strike a working group to assess and recognize a wide scope of stewardship activities of shared interest (e.g., OECM) versus "hard" protection to make progress toward its targets of 25% by 2025 and 30% by 2030.
- B.C. expects that any decisions regarding new conservation measures will be made by B.C. through B.C.- and Indigenous-led land-use planning processes, collaborative stewardship forums or other B.C.-led or sanctioned delivery mechanisms

Background

The Old Growth Strategic Review includes a recommendation to implement temporary deferrals to protect areas of old growth at immediate risk of irreversible biodiversity loss. Deferrals are one key-part of the 14 recommendations, intended to be an immediate but temporary measure. More permanent conservation measures are one part of what is needed to achieve the paradigm shift envisioned in the Old Growth Strategic Review and will be developed through the balance of the recommendations and in conjunction with other stewardship initiatives such as species at risk planning, land use planning etc. Achieving the paradigm shift from a timber-based focus to an ecologically-based focus as envisioned in the Old Growth Strategic review will require building a deeper understanding amongst all British Columbians on the goal of improving old growth management, why this is important and what it will mean for the Province. It will also require government to develop and resource new processes, policies and approaches for old growth management that involve British Columbians and provides greater opportunity to participate and be informed on old growth management.

The deferral recommendation included implementation advice on how government could identify potential deferral areas. The implementation advice included five criteria that could be used as part of the information to inform where deferrals are needed. Ministry staff and members of the Ppanel have completed separate analysis on elements of the five criteria, however further input is needed to ensure deferral areas are addressing the intent of the recommendation.

Purpose

Mapping Old Growth Identification of Deferral Areas

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The Panel will develop a series of recommended deferral an agreed-upon suite of maps and supporting analyses showing:

- all old growth
- protected old growth, and
- rare and at-risk old growth ecosystems (as per recommendation #6 from the Old Growth Strategic Review),

-areas including specific areas that can be used to develop legal orders to implement the deferrals and a prioritization for the implementation of the deferrals. Ministry staff will support the Panel to develop specific shape files for these data layers recommended deferral areas. As some forest data sets are strategic level data and do not include site specific information, the Panel may also provide advice and guidance on the specific approach for locating, identifying, and implementing the deferrals, including incorporation of field based information.

Once complete, these technical maps will be made available to all Indigenous Nations and the public simultaneously. This will significantly help with the communication and transparency around old growth moving forward, as per OGSR recommendation #5 (Provide the public with timely and objective information about forest conditions and trends).

It is expected that in some cases the implementation of deferrals will require more detailed discussion with Indigenous Nations. In order to ensure that areas of highest biodiversity risk are addressed first, the panel will may provide recommendations on the prioritization of areas for deferrals, based on the agreed-upon at-risk old growth maps, that can be used by government to ensure efficient develop deferrals and inform implementation.

It is expected that in some cases the implementation of deferrals will require more detailed discussion with Indigenous Nations. Once a list-map (and prioritized list if warranted) of deferral

The Panel will be involved in ongoing discussion on the prioritized deferral areas and the implementation process. It is expected that as deferrals are developed and implemented there will be regular and ongoing dialogue with the panel on the development and implementation of deferrals.

Data Transparency

Data used in analysis will be transparent and made available to all panel members.

Remuneration

Panel members will be compensated for their work on the Panel.

Confidentiality

The intent of this work is to provide transparency to the public on how deferrals are identified, while at the same time respecting the confidential nature of government to government discussions. Panel members may discuss this initiative and the work in general with other technical experts in order to best inform and support the recommendations. Information on specific deferral recommendations-areas and locations will remain confidential until the deferral area has been finalized with Indigenous governments-and approved by Cabinet. Maps developed through the Panel process will also remain confidential until Indigenous Nations agree to their release. a deferral area has been approved.

Any past, or ongoing, independent analysis or work completed by panel members will not be considered confidential.

Communication

The work of the Panel will be an important part of improving public information on the status of old growth in BC (consistent with recommendation #5 from the Old Growth Strategic Review). Government will support regular information updates on the work of the panel through a news release announcing the formation of the Panel, including the terms of reference, and by posting regular updates online to the government old growth website. Regular updates will include maps on areas of at-risk old growth ecosystems-provided Indigenous Nations agree to the release. Once deferrals have been approved by Cabinet, detailed information on the deferral will also be released..the specific identification of deferral areas once they have been approved by Cabinet.

Any communications materials will be reviewed and agreed to by the Panel and government before they are released.

Panel members are free to speak publicly about their work on the Panel provided no confidential information is released.
