<p>2017-11-06 21:35 CO HODGSON located the black bear in the yard belonging to s.22 . CO HODGSON attended the scene with RCMP Cst CHARLES. Black bear was feeding on apples and leaning against the side of s.22 house and CO HODGSON notified home owner that the bear was leaning against the house and would be hazed out of the yard and to stay inside. The black bear showed no fear of people and was inside a fenced in area approximately 10 yards from the front door as HODGSON spoke with s.22 The bear did not respond to hazing from truck horn and verbal attempts and did not leave when approached. Black bear was then hit with a bean bag at 12 yrds and bear only went 4 feet then bedded back down in tall grass out of sight. The bear was then challenged again and finally left the area and disappeared into dense bushes behind the house, where more fruit trees were located. It was unsafe to pursue the bear any further. 2017-11-07 0800 CO HODGSON patrolled the down town area and made contact with home s.22 to talk about attractant management.s.22 was not interested in picking up fruit even though bear was in her yard, in very close proximity to kids walking around town.s.22 was instructed to contact the gleaning program or the Nuxalk Bear team to place an electric fence around the fruit if s.22 was not willing to pick it up herself.s.22 stated she would be contacting the gleaning program. 2017-11-07 14:30 CO HODGSON deployed culvert trap in yard adjacent to s.22 for bear. No apples were picked by this point by s.22 and there was evidence of a black bear obtaining garbage at adjacent residence. A plastic bucket containing food was knocked over and packaging scatted and chewed up with black bear tracks all around it. 2017-11-10 17:00 CO HODGSON removed culvert trap as no sign of bear going into the trap but still sign of bear in the area. 2017-11-13 CO HODGSON received multiple reports of the black bear in the same neighborhood: property damage of a vehicle that had left over scent on it from a recent moose hunt, the bear climbed all over the vehicle and scratched up the paint on the hood and roof. The black bear remained under the porch of s.22 an elder four doors down from s.22 until they were walking out to her car and bear stepped in front of them and would not leave the area. The black bear also walked through the RCMP parking lot and had to be hazed out, where it did not run away but only slowly walked off when being challenged. As s.22 name unknown, reported to CO HODGSON that when she was walking home down the alley behind her house, house is directly across the road from s.22 residence, the black bear was there and would not leave and that it only looked at her. 2017-11-14 14:15 CO HODGSON spoke with s.22 2 doors down from s.22 and s.22 reported that the bear has been around for over a month and something needs to be done with it before it hurts someone. Bear was around s.22 residence regularly and s.22 does have fruit trees, but no fruit on them. s.22 contacted Nuxalk band office to have fruit trees removed, but no one has gotten back to her and s.22 is frustrated about not getting any help. 21:30 While on patrol for the black bear, local residences notified CO HODGSON that the bear was in s.22 yard under her apple tree. CO HODGSON attended the sight with Cst FISHER. Bear was in same location as found in November 6th: inside fenced in area of s.22 residence. The black bear approached the fence when CO HODGSON approached the fence and was only 10 feet from HODGSON at the closest distance. The bear fed on apples that still had not been picked up. Multiple people were walking up and down the road where bear was located and stopped to tell CO HODGSON and Cst FISHER of encounters they have had with the bear over the past couple of weeks and all residences were worried about walking around with this persistent bear in town. 21:44 CO HODGSON euthanized the black bear in s.22 yard based on the sever level of habituation in a dense urban environment; the bear was highly food conditioned; was causing property damage and was creating a very significant public safety concern especially for the youth in area. 2017-11-16 0900 CO HODGSON delivered the black bear to the cultural program at the Acwsalcta school for an educational and cultural session with students, teachers and community members. Bear will be utilized for food, medicine and regalia.</p>	Destroyed by COS
