COS has significant history of conflict in the area with "very large BB". COS not to follow up with any attractants as all were secured to comply with port Coquitlam Bylaws.

Bear came right into site while people standing there, same behaviour that has been exhibited by this bear for past few weeks at Rocky Point, Kearsley, and Sayers Lake Rec Sites. No fear of people, coming into sites while people cooking, taking food off tables, stealing coolers, entered tent, coming within a few feet of people, not scared. Now displaying aggressive behaviour when attempting to get food.

CO MILLER searched for bear on foot, not located.

01:45 While CO MILLER was dealing with a prohibited campfire nearby, camper came over and advised the bear was back and came right up close to them again. CO MILLER and RCMP attended. Bear in bush, came back out again. CO MILLER dispatched bear. Small, mature female with hair loss on face, wearing and staining on teeth indicate mature adult. Not lactating. CO MILLER removed carcass and disposed of in wilderness area.
