CO MILLER advised that is not indicative of cougar kill and bear will drag too. CO MILLER advised he would attend in AM to inspect carcass. Location is same block where a bear has killed multiple livestock animals in last few days and weeks.

2020-10-30 10:40 CO MILLER attended, inspected carcass. Skinned back hide and observed bear claw marks and significant perimortem damage to left abdomen. Broken ribs and puncture to body cavity. Butt-end partially consumed, broken rear leg. CO MILLER to set cubby snare for bear.

14:30 CO MILLER, CO STARK, CO TYUKODI, and SCO DAMERT attend and set cubby snare set for bear. COM to monitor. COM set trail cam on snare set.

2020-11-03 08:10 Received HWCR 20-25362. Bear attacked another llama, one alpaca missing.

09:15 CO MILLER phoned COM, advised COs would be out shortly.

11:00 COs attended, located alpaca carcass. Inspected cubby set, bait accessed and consumed through side of cubby. Cubby set removed. CO MILLER set culvert trap on neighbour's property where alpaca carcass was found, baited with alpaca leg. COM and neighbour to monitor.

2020-11-05 08:40 COS received HWCR 20-25362 Update 1. Another llama killed yesterday.

11:13 CO MILLER phoned COM. This time the animals were in the smaller paddock near the barn and the bear broke in and killed the llama. Paddock had one strand of electric wire on top. COM left the carcass in the paddock and last night she stayed in the suite over the barn with the animals hotwired in the barn. She observed 2 small bears come up the tree line then bolt into the woods, and she observed a large single bear feed on the carcass. COM is going to put up three strands of electric wire on the small paddock for day use, and will secure in hotwired barn at night. COM would like the trap moved close to the barn. CO MILLER agreed. WSO ELDER to move trap.

She provided STARK with three videos of the bear to get an idea on what it looks like. She also provided STARK with a map of where the bear had recently been accessing food. The host campsite was determined to be the best spot to set the trap because it is right in the area the bear has been accessing food and is far enough away from the other campers. STARK and FERGUSON set the culvert trap and flagged off the area. FERGUSON explained the trap to the ranger and she will monitor it.
