CO CAITHNESS attends, BBs are GOA by 5 min. Port Moody PD on scene, who advised that he spoke to the homeowner at \$20 where the sow and at least one cub entered an opened garage door and grabbed a bag of garbage. Homeowner told PD member that her son had just ran inside for a minute after playing basketball on the driveway and that the bears must have accessed it immediately, as she is super diligent keeping it closed. The recycling at \$.22 on the back side of the home had been accessed with pizza boxes, drink containers etc spilled out. Sow and COY grabbed a bag of garbage from one of the residences and were eating it on a walking path just off the street when the PD member hazed them back into the green space, 5 min prior to COS arrival.

CO CAITHNESS foot patrols area, no sign of bears on scene but evidence of garbage being pulled into the green belt to the West of $\underline{s}.22$ Speaks to multiple residents on $\underline{s}.22$, who report the sow and cubs coming by almost daily in the morning between 0900-1100hrs, and several residents approach CAITHNESS who have seen the entire family unit inside garages that were left open. Advised tomorrow is garbage and green waste pick up day, so family unit will likely be back.

2019-08-01 09:30

CO CAITHNESS attends area, observes a lone, adult BB eating garbage on the blvd in front of a small green space along CO CAITHNESS hazes the bear with noise (clapping and yelling) and it immediately runs into green space. CO CAITHNESS then receives info from WSO MERCER/ELDER that they are Port Moody PD (PMPD) are on scene just down the street with the sow and 3 COY playing on a swing set in the back yard. COS attempts to tree family unit, who split off and run into the green space. CO PILE and HUNTER now attend as well. This green space is small, confined on all sides by residences. COS flush bears out of green space and again attempt to tree, cubs split off and run in multiple directions, and sow runs into the forest north of a 22 . Over the course of the next six hours, cubs are all eventually successfully immobilized and placed in LBT that was on scene for the past two weeks, which was unsuccessful at capturing family unit (see emailed list of HWCRs for trap set justification). During this time, the sow was running around in the green spaces surrounding the neighbourhood, attempting to flank the COS, so a significant armed PMPD and COS response was required in order to keep the sow in the woods while officers worked to immobilize cubs. Two cubs had gone very high up a bushy tree, and it was not possible to get a dart in them safely. WSO MERCER eventually got the cubs to come lower down by playing sow sounds, at which point they were immobilized and placed in the LBT. During this time, the lone male bear that had been hazed earlier appeared in the green space and neighbourhood again, and caused some confusion, prior to being chased out of the area again by CO CAITHNESS and WSO ELDER. The entire family unit was habituated to people, had entered multiple garages, and was food conditioned. The COS attempted numerous times to tree the sow in order to immobilize her and remove her as well, however she simply would not tree. The sow was eventually euthanized approaching the LBT with her cubs with a single shot. The back drop was ideal, a earth berm leading into a heavily forested area. Sow was not a suitable candidate for relocation. Staining on cubs teeth upon examination. Cubs taken to Critter Care in the evening of 01-09-2019 by CO PILE.

CO PILE ensured scene was cleared and controlled and backed off and called for more officers and more COs. CO PILE notified the residence on both sides.

CO PILE watched BB until COs and police arrived. when a/SGT STARK arrived COs decided to euthanized BB on site due to high likelihood of BB running $\epsilon_{S.22}$ just behind the residence, or turning around heading deeper under the deck.

COs were able to approach BB on other side of fence to about 6 feet COs destroyed BB on site shooting in a downward angle to ensure safe direction and safe backdrop.

COs removed BB for disposal and cleaned up area. BB destroyed was dry sow. no COY or yearlings on site.

COM has encountered it in his backyard several times, does not scare off, COM felt it was "sizing him up". Last night, COM was on back porch and bear came over gate and ran at COM on porch. COM able to get away, no contact.

CO MILLER already advised City and Tri Cities Bear Aware (TCBA). When CO MILLER attended, TCBA was out doing door knocks handing out educational pamphlets and speaking to residents advising of attractant management practices and safety tips. Residents advised that there are two bears in the neighbourhood, a big one and a smaller one, not reported being seen together. The smaller one is the one that charged COM.
