<p>2021-09-07 13:00 hrs. CO Owens attended approx. 4 km 6 mile creek road locating and treeing three orphaned bear cubs. Bear cubs known to of been fed by fire fighters and residents in area past several weeks dog food, apples and other human food items. CO tranquilized, ear tagged and relocated bear cubs to more natural suitable habitat. Bear cubs were in excess of 40 lbs each, adequate size and health. Considering after Aug 1 and scientific research states that bear cubs after Aug 1 of adequate size and health can survive and den on own with low levels of human habituation and food conditioning. Considering White Rock fire in immediate area of where cubs captured and <b>s. 16</b> not an option short distance relocation <b>s. 16</b> Bear cubs 2 males and one female tagged 8-155, 8-152 and 8-162. <b>s. 22</b> provided through e-mail bear attractant bear safety info. Incident command and locals advised unlawful to feed bears and consequences. Caeley Thacker, provincial wildlife vet consulted. 19:00 hrs. Bear cubs released young creek area <b>s. 15</b> 2021-09-10 HWCR's received related to male ear tagged cub Fintry park. 2021-09-15 13:30 hrs CO Beck and WSO Lyra Tuck notified of treed black bear cub at <b>s. 22</b> 13:37 hrs WSO Tuck tranquilized bear cub from 10 yards using 2 cc single port barbed dart left hind. <b>s. 15</b> mixed 100 mg/ml. Bear cub ear tag 8-152 poor health injury left hind 1" x 1" exposed meat. Cub highly habituated and previously fed by people. Cub short distanced relocated Sept 7 returning to near original capture site. Cat 1 bear euthanized and disposed of. 2021-09-17 HWCR 21-21890 - CO Seitz attends Fintry Park and darts cub in tree. Due to poor health cub is put down. 2021-09-20-1000 - CO Seitz attended 6 Mile Ck Rd. Located cub with ear tag #8-155 in poor health. Put cub down. HWCR concluded.</p>

Please call me <b>S.22</b> or <b>S.22</b> who is currently on route to the island to do what he can to keep them from entering the house. I'll be on the call re:Bamfield tonight ; we've had a small bear in our house there, but I think we can dissuade him; he's much less of a concern. I'll see you there! int he last 24 hrs, one large male , and one mom with yearling cub. Both 'groups' have tried to get in. <p>2021-09-21 @ 1835 hrs. Rural, forested areas nearby. WSRO BLAKE called COM. COM stated bears have been consistently trying to access the unoccupied cabin. COM stated there are no attractants inside, however explained there were unopened pop bottles, food in Rubbermaid totes, barbeque utensils and mitts in the cabin. COM stated the bears have been successful in entering the dwelling previously through a screen door, destroying furniture and making a mess with pop. Unknown which bears have been successful entering cabin, unknown which bears have had food reward. COM stated an upwards of 6 bears have been at the property. COS to attend and assess. 2021-09-22 at 10:30 hours Riddell attended the COMs address. CO Riddell was met by the COM who showed Riddell the property. s.22</p> <p>s.22 However, COM stated over the last several years the bear activity and boldness has gotten progressively worse. In previous years they have had issues with bears accessing fruit trees, and these have since been removed to eliminate the attractant. Bears have made attempts in previous years to access the residence, and bunk house, and steps were taken to secure these structures in those years. However, this year the problem is 10x worse and the come has been have persistent issues with the bears attempting to, and have successfully, accessed their residence on many occasions. The bears first entered through a screen porch and at puzzles, batteries, tools, and some food in plastic bins, as well as soda water. Each time the COM has attempted to fortify the residence with more sheet metal, 2x6 wood, and nails. However, the bears are continually ripping these off to gain access. The problem had gotten so bad the COM has placed live cameras around his property and has captured the bears accessing and ripping open the siding to get into the residence. COM showed Riddell a video of a sow and cub entering the structure, and 3 more bears which appear to be siblings; 1 of which, maybe all 3, have entered the residence. COM has video of a bear 10 feet away as he screams and shouts and throws things at the bear to haze it away without success. COM said in years past it has been s.22 been leaving food out for the bears. CO Riddell did watch several videos from the COM that shows these different sets of bears entering and ripping apart wood and debris to gain access to residence. COM further says when the siding is too hard to pull, they try the windows, and have gone on top of the roof of the house also. CO Riddell advised the COM that Riddell will bring up what was observed at the residence and the videos tomorrow at our zone meeting with zone Sergeant on a course of action since there is roughly 5 bears that are gaining access. (2) Please remain open. 2021-09-24 @ 1030 hrs. CO RIDDELL and WSRO BLAKE attended location. Set traps #2 and #3. Showed COMÆss.22 how to reset traps. Since there is a family unit, call RAPP line immediately if a bear goes in. 2021-09-24 @ 1130 hrs. RIDDELL and BLAKE saw two bears heading towards traps. Sat and waited for 30 minutes to see if they would enter trap. Bears did not enter. Sow and two year old cub. Photo of traps set in HWCR folder. *one family unit of sow and cub, and three individuals *SGT. BATES informed FLNRO biologists PENDERGAST, WILTON, MARSHALL for input on solutions since approximately 5 bears are candidate for removal due to attempting or successfully entering a dwelling. Leave open until bears are captured or timeline expires. UPDATE 1: 2021-09-24 at 2030 hours CO Sterling contacted COM, COM advised three siblings at location one is in a trap and second trap sprung, CO advised officers would attend in the morning to relocate and reset trap 2021-09-25 At 0930 CO Riddell and CO Sterling arrived at s.22 for the black bear in live trap. On arrival to the property, while the COÆs drove down the driveway, two more black bears were walking up the driveway away from the live traps. COÆs attempted to locate bears after they</p>

moved off the driveway towards the property at s.22, no success. COÆs met COM at the residence who showed a video he captured from his live cameras set up on the traps and the property. The video shows three bears moving towards the live traps, one enters and is captured, the others enter live trap #2 but the trap door fails in capturing these bears. Prior to arriving to the property COÆs sought direction from Fish and Wildlife on what they would like to see happen if the three siblings were caught. The COÆs were seeking direction because the COM could not be sure which of the 3 siblings (believed to be siblings) were entering and breaking into his residence. Direction was provided these bears were all category 1 bears and high risk public safety. If captured, bears are to be euthanized due to entering human structures, habituation to humans, and food conditioning to non-natural food sources. While waiting to direction COÆs tranquilized the captured bear with s.15 vial #19-102 at a mixture of 4 CC. This was injected by pneudart to the rear left leg of the bear. At 1000 hours s.22 also s.22 and spoke with the COÆs. s.22 also provided concerns about their safety with all of the bears living in the vicinity and it was believed there were 6 bears in total. s.15 s.22 stated on several occasion garbage bags have been s.22 by the bears, and the s.22 have walked the beach and found plates of human food mixed with dog food s.22 At 1020 CO Riddell walked up the COM driveway in an attempt to locate the other two bears observed on arrival. CO Riddell took a trail which eventually lead onto the property of s.22 While looking down the driveway CO Riddell observed two large Black bears sitting in the driveway of the address eating something off the ground. CO Riddell returned and updated CO Sterling as to the location of the other two black bears. CO Riddell mixed two more s.15 darts at a mixture of 4CC each, vials 19-91 and 19-101, and gave CO Sterling one of the darts as Sterling had the tranquilizer gun. As the COÆs moved towards the address, s.22 two more bears were present between a shed and a residence, for a total of 4 bears in the driveway of the address. CO Riddell was within 20 feet of what appears to be a sow and COY, and neither were afraid of CO Riddell as he approached, they slowly moved to the Center of the driveway where the other two large bears remained sitting and eating off the driveway. CO Riddell did observe 1 of the large black bears eating what appeared to be dog food off of the ground, CO Sterling tranquilized this bear, bear barely reacted to the dart, moved 10 feet away and then slowly walked inside a shed on the property. After the dart was fired the cub went up a tree, the sow went up another tree, and the other large black bear ran off into a bush where Riddell lost sight of it. CO Riddell could hear voices s.22 As Riddell was moving across the driveway to where the sow was, s.22 came out of the residence and wanted to talk to CO Riddell. CO Riddell advised he was not available to talk at the moment as there were currently 4 bears running free on s.22 property. The s.22 stated to CO Riddell s.22 was sorry, and that s.22 put the dog food out for the bears to eat to keep them on s.22 property because of what was happening next door (believed s.22 was implying to the live traps set). CO Riddell stated he didn't have time to discuss this and he would return to take a statement from the s.22 when it was safe to do so. Riddell attended and spoke to s.22 about what was happening. s.22 stated they understood why, s.22 and they had heard s.22 was feeding the bears. s.22 returned to their residence for safety reasons while the COÆs managed the situation. Sterling arrived and advised the bear which was tranquilized was sleeping, and he will remain under the tree with the sow. As CO Riddell returned to the residence at s.22 Riddell observed the bear which had ran into the bush had since returned to the

property and was sitting in the carport of the residence s.22 Riddell tranquillized this bear and the bear very slowly moved away from the front door and between a shed, and crawled under an older shed. As the COÆs were aware of evidence that the sow and cub were food conditioned, and had entered a secure residence multiple times, these bears were categorized as category 1 and were to be euthanized for public safety reasons. CO Riddell followed the direction provided for the siblings as they too were to be euthanized as they were category 1 bears as well. Both bears which were currently tranquillized matched the video footage provided by COM to size, and were observed moving up the driveway from the live traps and towards the s.22 These were the siblings the COÆs were looking for. CO Riddell euthanized both bears that were tranquilized. CO Eichstadter arrived on scene and Riddell directed him to assist CO Sterling with sow up the tree. CO Sterling euthanized bear out of the tree with a single shot as this was a sow categorized as category 1 and has entered a secured residence with the cub multiple occasions. CO Eichstadter then euthanized the cub out of the tree, as the cub had entered secure structures with the sow and was also food conditioned to non-natural food sources, was not a candidate for relocation or to be transferred to a rehabilitation facility. All bears were collected and transported to the s.15 Landfill. Along with the black bear which remained in the live trap that was tranquilized. The bear in the live trap was categorized as category 1 and was to be euthanized for entering secure structure and food conditioning to non-natural food sources. CO Riddell euthanized the bear in the trap. COÆs documented the 5 bears. After examining the 5 bears it was determined there were 2 sows, 2 sub-adults, and 1 coy. DNA was taken from all from bears. All bears were disposed of at the s.15 landfill. 2021-09-29 Admin placed copy of email from s.22 including videos into HWCR folder as per CO Riddell's request as well as email from CO Riddell to CIZ Zone staff.

2021-09-21 @ Approx. 13:30 hours CO Petrovcic û NIZ received a update from CO Gord Gudbranson (Gudbranson had been contacted directly by COM û Mr. Randy Carpenter. Reports received directly by CO Gudbranson (via text communication) suggest desensitized and un-natural food habituated bear(s). Some suggestion of bears accessing human structures (unknown if occupied by humans as the area described sounds more ôindustryö than residential. 2021-09-21 @ 14:15 hours CO Petrovcic placed a call to COM: Randy Carpenter, Heiltsuk Emergency Services Manager, 250-957-8132 Randy shared: ôThe bears were getting a bit aggressive with the workers at the recycling / landfill area. The bears were starting to stand their ground where the garbage is dumped. The crews go in with the excavator to push garbage around. The crew has been trying to push the bears off with the use of bear bangers. The crew did not use bear bangers this morningö. ôThe Supervisor (Wally JACKSON), who is in charge of solid waste, contacted me. The bears were present between 11:00 AM and 1:00 pm. Wally tried to get in touch with our by-law enforcement officer but it was at about 11:45 when they finally got in touch with me. WallyÆs crew is confident that it is the same three bears, the sow and the two cubsö. ôThere was a house last night that had two bears pushing on a window. The home owner,<sup>s.22</sup> told me the bears pushing on the window were the two smaller bears, not the sow.<sup>s.22</sup> figured the sow was in the immediate area thoughö. It was <sup>s.22</sup> house <sup>s.22</sup> A few weeks ago they had left apples and oranges in their car and the bear had accessed the car (on two separate occasions). It had ripped the handle of the back door (on one visit to access the fruit) and the trunk latch (on another visit where the bears did not get anything). It is the same bears. It is the Sow with the two cubs. They look like they are maybe one year old bears. They are definitely not tiny. Maybe last years cubsö. ôWe have salmon in the rivers right now. We have three different rivers right close to us. We have Chum, Coho and a few pinks in the rivers now. These bears are not feeding on fish, they are garbage bearsö. CO Petrovcic asked Randy ôWhat do you think the position is of Chief and Counsel right now regarding these bears?ö Randy responded: ôI think they would support destruction. They realize that there is significant distance and cost involved with moving bears. These bears are garbage bearsö. CO Petrovcic asked if Marilyn SLETT is still the Chief Counsellor and Randy advised Marilyn is the Chief of the Nation. CO asked if there an option for the Nation to implement / install improved perimeter fencing at the garbage & recycling site. Randy shared that it would be the Chief that the COS would need to speak with in regards to infrastructure expansion / improvement. Randy shared that the area is currently only fenced on a few sides (along the highway) so bears do have the ability to access the site. CO Petrovcic and Randy discussed the use of electric fencing. CO Petrovcic shared that Kingcome Inlet FN and the Oweekeno (Wuikinuxv) FN have implemented pretty significant electric fencing projects to prevent bears from accessing garbage and/or recycling. CO asked if such an approach was something the Heiltsuk FN had considered. Randy shared that he was heading over to the band office so he would speak with Chief and Counsel and the Chief may give CO Petrovcic a direct desk call. CO Petrovcic thanked Randy for the discussion and shared that he would speak to him again very soon. 2021-09-22 @ 10:34hrs: CO Petrovcic spoke with Heiltsuk FN Chief, Ms. Marilyn SLETT and discussed bears and attractants in the community<sup>s.16</sup> : by COS. Chief SLETT will get back to CO Petrovcic today after the meeting to advise of outcome. CO Petrovcic shared that Shelley Marshall, FLNR Biologist maybe have some funding to assist with perimeter fencing and hotwire to the nation's solid waste storage site. 2021-09-22 @ 14:35 hours CO Petrovcic

spoke with Randy Carpenter - Bella Bella emergency services and response coordinator. CO Petrovcic advised Randy of COS travel plans and he advised he would update chief and Council right away. Randy was very appreciative of the scheduled COS Field response in their community. 2021-09-22 Conservation officer Petrovcic discussed the Bella Bella Black Bear HWCRAEs with Sergeant Mike Newton. CO Petrovcic had called and discussed bear activity in the community with Heiltsuk Emergency Services Coordinator, Mr. Randy Carpenter. CO Petrovcic had received a phone message from Heiltsuk Chief Counsellor, Ms Marilyn Slett. CO Petrovcic had subsequent communication with the Chief and discussed response options. <sup>s.16</sup>

s.16

the safety concerns are present and the counsel would like the bears destroyed to address community safety concerns. CO Petrovcic to continue communication with Randy Carpenter and with Davie Wilson. Sgt. Newton discussed the Bella Bella HWCRAEs with acting inspector Scott Norris and the two concurred that officer presence in Bella Bella was necessary and to be conducted as soon as possible. Sgt. Newton coordinated flights into the remote community and CO Petrovcic worked with local Bella Bella RCMP Cst. Marcel Taekema to secure accommodations for CO Jillian Bjarnason and himself. 2021-09-24 Conservation officer Petrovcic departed his residence at 05 30 hrs. to travelled north to pick up CO Bjarnason. Both officers travelling north to Port Hardy and then on to Bella Bella via Wilderness Sea Planes. 2021-09-24 @ 12:53 hours Officers arrived at the airport in Port Hardy and Cst. Natalie Cooper picked-up officers. The Cst. to work with COs during afternoon portion of her shift. Officers staying at RCMP accommodations and are assigned a RCMP patrol vehicle for use while working in community. Officers met with Cst. Marcel Taekema at Detachment. Officers discussed the directive/wishes received from the local First Nation. COS explained that Randy Carpenter and Davie Wilson had outreached to COS after repeated human-wildlife conflict at the community solid waste management area (comprised of a partially fenced garbage transfer bin site, a food recycling area, and a general waste storage & recycling area). Information received by COS indicated that there was a family unit (a sow with large cubs) frequently the site and the family unit had evolved to a severely desensitized and habituated state. Davie Wilson (community bylaw enforcement officer) had described how the sow was not backing off anymore and despite the solid waste management site staff yelling and hazing the bear(s) that they would no longer back off. Davie Wilson described how bear bangers had become ineffective and he elaborated on how he had shot a bear banger at the sow the day earlier and it reluctantly moved back but soon returned. Davie Wilson shared that staff were concerned for their safety at the site. Note: the human health and safety factor was discussed at length when CO Petrovcic spoke with the local FN Chief, Ms. Marilyn Slett. Chief Slett was the person who raised the bear safety issues/concerns at a council meeting on Sept. 22, 2021, and relayed a Joint Leadership decision to request the BC COS attend and destroy the family unit. Special Note: The Heiltsuk FNs Emergency Services Coordinator - Mr. Randy Carpenter - was tasked with relaying the Joint Leadership message to CO Petrovcic. At approx. 15:00 hours COs attended to the solid waste management area after receiving a report of the problem sow and cubs were present at the site. Officers attended, met with the witness/complainant (Mr. Rene Wilson - Roads Supervisor.). Mr. Wilson explained that the sow and Cubs that were just at the site is the family unit that has been aggressive towards staff and has been the bear that bluff charged staff over the past few weeks. COs discussed the access points to the facility. Some discussion occurred around the need to expand fencing to prevent bear access. The group discussed the benefits of full perimeter fencing and the use of electric fencing. COs patrolled area and hiked perimeter but no bears located. Signs of significant bear access to the site from the compromised fence on the north-east, and the absence of fencing on the north and

west sides of the solid waste management yard. COÆs returned to the site at 16:44 hours after being contacted and advised the same family unit had returned. Officers travelled to site and once again observed the bears Rene Wilson had reported earlier. Rene Wilson was still present and reiterated that the family unit was the same family unit he had reported earlier. COÆs observed the bears but there was no safe shooting opportunity. The bears (family unit) retreated back into the forest on the north west side of the facility. At approx. 1834 hours COÆs returned to the solid waste facility. COÆs observed the family unit access the solid waste facility yard and make their way to the fenced / gated food composting bays located on the east side of the compound. The sow squeezed herself between the swing gate and the adjacent post. The two large Cubs followed the sow into the first (northern) recycled food bay. The bears were all observed digging and appeared to be eating food waste that had been mixed with wood chips. Another large (adult) bear entered the compound from the west and approached the same bay occupied by the family unit. The sow exited and engaged the other adult bear with some loud grunts/vocalization. COÆs on the ground were familiar with the fact that the relatively flat geography of the community presented limited shooting opportunities. COÆs were also aware of the fact the area immediately north, north-west, and west of the solid waste management site presented a safe firearm discharge area. COÆs communicated with local RCMP and asked that they travel in their PC to the east side of the food recycling bays and to sound their horn in order to try and scare the bears out of the fenced/gated bay and back into the compound. The RCMP members utilized their PCÆs horn and influenced the bears to move out into the open compound. CO Petrovcic ran out into the open and verbally engaged the bears to make them retreat in a north-west direction. COÆs were presented with a safe shooting opportunity and the sow and three cubs were destroyed on site. The other large adult bear was not engaged and it ran off to the north. The Conservation Officers updated the local RCMP. The bear was euthanized based on extensive conflict history and assessed as a category 1 bear with high levels of human habituation and food conditioning in a dense urban area having caused property damage. The bear was identified as a lactating sow. WSRO CHAYER became aware that 2 cubs were high up a nearby tree and notified CO SOUCY. 2021-09-25 22:49 PETROVCIC and BJARNASON were assisting RCMP on a call when they received an email report from ECC. The report read there was a black bear in the COM's garbage at <b>s.22</b> COS attended arriving at the residence at 22:55. Upon arrival BJARNASON observed a sow and a cub feeding from a garbage bin approx. 3 metres from the west side of the residence. PETROVCIC and BJARNASON approached and searched for safe shooting opportunity but sow and cub moved down the bank and into the bush. PETROVCIC and BJARNASON heard the sow fighting with another bear (possibly a large boar that has been reported in the same area) and observed intense tree movement - approx. 20 metres from the residence. BJARNASON spoke with COM who stated that the cubs were up on her deck and that the sow had dragged the garbage bin from beside the stairs to the edge of the property and tipped it over to eat the contents. COM stated that these bears were there the previous night and were also at <b>s.22</b> at house <b>s.22</b> - adjacent to her residence - where they accessed a freezer. Photos of the accessed garbage were taken. BJARNASON and PETROVCIC observed a large bear head poke up from the bushes but were unable to determine if it was the sow or a different large bear. PETROVCIC and BJARNASON explained to COM that the bears were likely to return and that if anyone is returning to the residence they should be very vigilant with scanning the area. COM advised they would honk their horn before coming from the car into the house. BJARNASON asked that COM call the RAPP line and provide an update if the bears returned. PETROVCIC and BJARNASON patrolled the lower streets searching for bears and also attended <b>s.22</b> house to see if there was any bear activity there. No activity observed at <b>s.22</b> property. At 23:30 PETROVCIC and BJARNASON received email update from ECC stating that the bear had returned to <b>s.22</b> COs attended again arriving at approx. 23:35. COs snuck up to residence. BJARNASON observed sow and cubs walking away from the garbage bin. <p>2021-10-14 Sgt. NEWTON and CO ADAMS met with Chief NELSON and discussed on going bear issues in the community. Chief Nelson described a sow and two cubs as being garbage habituated and desensitized. Other community members that were present at the time of the discussion have observed the sow and cubs up on porches, in carports and in residential crawl spaces. The sow and two cubs (COY's) have been a source of constant conflict and fear within the community. The three bears has been consistently under houses, on porches, and looking in windows over the past three weeks. At this time, Chief Nelson also advised about a forth bear, an adult male who is also exhibiting the same behaviour. The male bear has been frequently observed sleeping in the town's cardboard recycling shed. Chief NELSON requested COS to euthanize and remove the conflict bears from the community due to the safety concerns observed with the recent escalating behaviour. Sgt. NEWTON and CO ADAMS attended the Quatsino Band Office. Sgt. NEWTON and CO ADAMS were approached by several community members who have shared their personal experiences with the multiple bears in the community . A sow and two cubs of the year (all female) were observed up a tree above a commercial dumpster, a place where the sow and two cubs have been observed multiple times a day consuming unnatural food sources. All three bears could not be hazed or scared off. They demonstrated desensitized behaviour with no fear of people, even aggressively snapping at a First Nation elder who had waved a stick at them. Sgt. Newton outreached to Wildlife Biologist Shelley MARSHALL who agreed with Chief NELSON, all four bear pose a public safety risk. The habituated and desensitized behaviour to unnatural food sources does not allow for relocation. Sgt. NEWTON and CO ADAMS euthanized the two cubs and sow, a culvert trap was placed on site to capture the adult male bear described by Chief NELSON. COS is continuing to monitor for calls and updates. (BA) 2021-10-15 10:59hrs ECC called CO Gudbranson for bear in trap, x-reference 21-22755. CO Gudbranson called James Redford back and advised that officers are enroute sometime this afternoon and to keep the public away. A/Sgt. MCARTHUR to get PAT trailer from PG and will be enroute to location. CO HARRIS advised he was responding via email. CO EAGLES phoned RCMP OCC and ascertained following information: - EHS was initial caller, EHS received report of a <sup>s.22</sup> male with massive bits all over body. - Offending animal believed to be a black bear. - EHS was enroute but would be staging until enforcement staff were on scene for safety. - The male was conscious and breathing but sustained serious injuries. - The black bear was chased off by other individuals on scene however may still be in the area. - The attack occurred approximately 200m into the brush line from the property. - Victims information was unknown upon initial call from EHS. - Responding RCMP Member CST. GAUTHIER (250-699-1773) - OCC advised property appeared to be a farm/rural type property on NW side of Fraser Lake. - Fraser Lake RCMP File 21-863 CO EAGLES requested OCC advised GAUTHIER of the items COS would be needing secured if he arrived on scene (victim clothing, physical bite mark evidence, tracks, DNA sampling of bite marks and measurements), CO EAGLES also asked OCC to get COM information from EHS. 1041hrs CO EAGLES phoned A/Sgt. MCARTHUR and relayed above information. 1045hrs Call back from RCMP OCC to CO EAGLES: - EHS did not obtain COM name but phone number<sup>s.22</sup>. OCC queried number in PRIME but the phone number did not come back with any results. - EHS staging but will move in as close as possible. - OCC advised the Air Ambulance would be getting deployed from Prince George, flight time approx 30 min in addition to ground EHS unit. CO EAGLES contacted A/Sgt. MCARTHUR and updated, CO EAGLES to head to Prince George to address victim assessment. CO HARRIS, A/Sgt. CO EAGLES advised EHS could call CO EAGLES for direction as needed. 1153 Paramedic Ivan contacted CO EAGLES on speaker phone with the victim identified as s.22 in good spirits and was being transported to Vanderhoof hospital. CO EAGLES swabbed the area around s.22 lower back which the nurse advised she had not cleaned however s.22 was treated by first aid on scene and believed they may rinsed the wound. CO EAGLES obtained sterile swab to be safe. CO EAGLES photographed all wounds and measured as many as possible, given time crunch as s.22 was going in for surgery. The staff advised that Steve NOVAK was the head of food and beverage for Sun Peaks Resort, owner of the building and associated restaurant - Massa's, however Mr. NOVAK was not available as he was in a meeting. The staff provided Mr. NOVAK's number and advised they would try and find another person to discuss matter. SANDERSON inspected the gated area around the bin containing the cooking oil and the forested and creek area south and across the road from the building/parking lot. There was a larger scat pile adjacent to the door of the guest services building No containers were located. There was also a pile of scat with content that was consistent with the bear feeding on grease and/or cooking oil. Upon returning to the guest services lodge, SANDERSON was met by Dave BARON, from SPR maintenance. Mr. BARON advised he was not aware of a bear getting into the used cooking oil container at Massa's restaurant, however he was emailed on Monday (2021-10-04) about a bear getting into the used oil container at the Anex Restaurant. The Anex Restaurant's located ~ 150 meters west, with the SPR day care located between the 2 locations. There were kids playing in the front/fenced area. Inspection of the oil bin area at the Annex restaurant found the following: -the used oil bin's plastic lid was removed. - there was no oil in the bin as it was previously pumped out as the Anex Restaurant is not used in the summer. -there was scatt around the area, indicative of a sow and cubs (based on the size). -the bears were climbing on and other things including the back door to the Anex Restaurant, a large refrigerator and/or cooler (not breached - it was securely locked) and the large garbage compactor - also not breached. While on site, Mark White (Risk Management &amp; Safety Programs Director for SPR) arrived. SANDERSON explained the concerns regarding the used oil not being secure and that a dangerous wildlife protection order would be issued to clean the areas and secure the oil. SANDERSON also advised he was disappointed that no one from SPR called about the incidents as this seemed to be a prevailing issue in the community which SANDERSON conveyed in an interview to Sun Peaks Independent News a couple weeks ago. Mr. WHITE advised SANDERSON he was not aware of it, recognizing SPR maintenance was aware. SANDERSON advised he was concerned about the behaviors of the bear(s) advising he was aware of a sow and 2 cubs (discussed the increased risks associated with family units) and a solo bear likely a boar in the community. Mr. WHITE advised he would have staff work on the issues discussed and start cleaning the areas immediately. 1500 hours SANDERSON issued a DWPO to Mr. White and set an LBT. 2021-10-07 SANDERSON received 3 calls from ECC regarding the 2 cubs in the trap and sow on outside. SANDERSON called CO CONNATTY to assist. SANDERSON called the COM - Marc White - who advised he received the report from staff. SANDERSON called COM #2 who called 2 times - he was calling on behalf of an employee named Dale. SANDERSON called Dale - who advised the sow was onsite - but had run off. She was not showing signs of aggression. ~2100 hours SANDERSON and CONNATTY assessed the site. Confirmed 2 cubs in the trap, with sow on outside. drove truck up to the trap/sow. Sow moved went under gate/fenced compound seeking hiding - this happened 3 times. On 4th attempt to move sow off trap, she ran around the annex restaurant - west then south across the parking lot. SANDERSON pursued the sow with truck, till she went overbank and the officer lost sight of her. Officers repositioned to Sun Peaks road, immediately to the south and located the sow beside a large spruce tree. CONNATTY pushed sow partially up tree. Sow went about 20 feet up tree then returned to the base. Decision to shoot bear at the base as there was good backdrop of bank. CONNATTY shot sow - which killed her with one shot. Officers loaded the bear in truck, then loaded hooked up the trap and left the scene (~ 25 mins). There were 2 security staff posted on either end of the parking lot to prevent public from entering the area. Cubs were dispatched on <b>s.15</b> FSR - away from the scene. SANDERSON disposed of the 3 carcasses at <b>s.15</b> see also COORS file 202110066 (DWPO issued to SPR)</p>

There is an adult male in the video who is standing 5-10 yards from the bear and is tolerating this distance gap. The bear circles the male then runs to a different tree. CO Kneller replied to the CO with the following text: - Thanks for sending the video That is an adult bear and most likely has been fed by someone in a golf cart. It is still hesitant and fearful of people (running to the trees) but is somewhat habituated and remains close expecting someone to throw it food. It is very important that people using the golf course do not feed this bear and do not tolerate it being near. If this behavior escalates we will have to euthanize the bear. The person standing beside the golf cart is exhibiting VERY foolish and stupid behavior acting like that. He is asking to be attacked by this bear and is further perpetuating the bears behavior of being close to people. That person is doing a disservice to himself and "training" the bear to approach other humans, without consequence, who may be more fearful of the bear and could result in in the next person being attacked. He could have just drove the cart past or got in and drove away when approached. Please relay this message to that person and advise all people using the golf course to not act in the same way. s.22 replied: - Thanks. This may be a different bear that the one we refer to as the "little guy". I agree, they could have done more than just stand there. During CO FORD/Es conversation with s.22 a sow and juvenile BB walked onto s.22 property walking in our direction. Both BB/Es appeared very health and exhibited signs of habituation. CO EAGLES was advised on two occasions the BB has not scared off, notably one incident last night where the COM was out smoking and the BB began to approach, the COM tried to scare the BB off, it began walking away for a small distance then began to close distance on the COM again which COM managed to get inside before any other sort of escalation occurred. CO EAGLES was also told two nights ago, the BB had flanked the COM, following him through the camp but flanking him on the opposing side of a cabin. COM was made aware by another worker on the site and managed to get inside. COM advisd he is used to BB's on this property but this one is displaying noticably different behaviour making him worried for his safety. 1630 hrs CO EAGLES attended site and inspected the site for attractants. Property appeared clean, no other attractants present. CO EAGLES spoke with COM about the situation and determined the BB was displaying human conditioned behaviour and was beginning to show interest in humans and was indifferent to them trying to scare it off. CO EAGLES set a culvert trap on the property due to the category 1 behaviour and the fact the BB was returning continually despite there being no attractants visibly present.
