Re: Warning Letter, Unauthorized Discharge, 5084 Island Highway South, Union Bay, BC V0R 3B0, Effluent

On January 27, 2022, Ministry of Environment, Environmental Protection Division staff conducted an inspection of your facility, located at 5084 Island Highway South, Union Bay, BC V0R 3B0. The inspection determined that Deep Water Recovery is out of compliance with the *Environmental Management Act*, Part 2 Prohibitions and Authorizations, Section 6(2) waste disposal. This Warning Letter lists the compliance verification information below.

By discharging waste under Environmental Management Act without a valid authorization Deep Water Recovery commits an offence under the *Environmental Management Act (EMA)*. Section 120(3) of *EMA* states as follows:

120(3) A person who contravenes any of the following commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding \$1 000 000 or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both: (a) section 6 (2), (3) or (4) [waste disposal];...

It should also be noted that, as an alternative to prosecution of the offence referenced above, the Ministry may initiate action to impose an administrative penalty against Deep Water Recovery. The Administrative Penalties Regulation (EMA) (B.C. Reg. 133/2014) (APR) was brought into force in 2014. The APR describes the prescribed provisions of the EMA as well as that of specified regulations under which administrative penalties can be assigned. Section 12(1) of the APR states as follows:

12(1) A person who contravenes section 6 (2), (3) or (4), 7, 8, 9 (1) or (4), 11, 25 (2), 40 (1), (2), (3), (6) or (7), 48 (8), (10) or (15), 55 (1), 72 (1) or (2) or 76.2 of the Act is liable to an administrative penalty not exceeding \$75 000.

I request that Deep Water Recovery immediately implement the necessary changes or modifications to correct the non-compliance(s) listed above with the *Environmental Management Act*. Further, I request that Deep Water Recovery notify this office in writing, by email or letter within 30 days of this letter, advising what corrective measures have been taken, and what else is being done, to prevent similar non-compliances in the future.

As a result of this Warning, this authorization will be prioritized for follow-up inspection. The corrective measures will be reviewed by an Officer as part of the next inspection.

Finally, if you fail to take the necessary actions to restore compliance, you may be subject to escalating enforcement action. This Warning Letter and the alleged violations and circumstances to which it refers, will form part of the compliance history of Deep Water Recovery and will be taken into account in the event of future violations.

Deep Water Recovery failed to comply with the Environmental Management Act, section 6(2) as outlined below.

Inspection Details:

On April 5, 2022, Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy (Ministry) Environmental Protection Officer Kyle Lynch and Oana Enick conducted an on site inspection of the Deep Water Recovery Ltd. (facility) located at 5084 Island Highway South which functions as a marine vessel dismantling and waste disposal facility in Union Bay, due to complaints received by the Ministry. In attendance during the site visit was the registered owner and operator of Deep Water Recovery Ltd., Mark Jurisch (owner).

Environmental Management Act, Waste Discharge Regulation (320/2004) (EMA)
2 (1): The industries, trades and businesses, and classes of industries, trades and businesses, listed in the Table in Schedule 1 and in column 1 of the Table in Schedule 2 are prescribed for the purposes of section 6 (2) of the Act.
As confirmed during the on site visit and by the owner in a verbal conversation on April 5, 2022, the facility is operated as a marine vessel dismantling operation for derelict and decommissioned vessels (Photo 1). These vessels are accepted at the facility for dismantling and disposal and are considered waste/refuse under the Waste Discharge Regulation. The Vessels accepted for disposal bat the facility are from a variety of commercial and institutional sources from provincial and international locations. Once these vessels are at the facility they are removed from the marine environment and brough out of the water at the facility onto a concrete pad, above the high tide line for dismantling. The dismantling process includes cutting the vessels into smaller sections and separating the various materials into their respective waste streams. All the materials and wastes produced during the dismantling of vessels are stored at the facility until transportation for disposal is conducted. During the inspection Mr. Jursich informed the Officers that only barges had been dismantled at the facility historically, several ships (Photo 2) were stored in the marine environment until such a time as they were to be disposed of. At the time of inspection, the vessels at the facility that were in the process of being dismantled were unpowered barges.
Not Determined
Environmental Management Act, Environmental Management Act
6 (2): Subject to subsection (5), a person must not introduce or cause or allow waste to be introduced into the environment in the course of conducting a prescribed industry, trade or business.

Details/Findings:	During the site visit on April 5, 2022, it was observed that the operating areas of the facility was composed of a mix of open gravel, beach front and asphalt pad. As confirmed by Mr. Jurisch and observed during the on site inspection, the asphalt pad area (Photo 1/2) is where the bulk of the dismantling operation is conducted. The asphalt area of the facility is designed in such a way as it directs effluent from the facility to one of three water collection basins (Photos 3, 4 & 5). The primary open water collection system (Basin 1) and two unlined collection systems were observed north (Basin 2) and south (Basin 3). Mr. Jurisch confirmed that Basin 1 was pumped out regularly, however, records pertaining to this removal were requested during the inspection, at the time of writing no records had been provided. No treatment systems were observed connected to the basins which drained directly to the marine environment. On April 25, 2022 a search of the Ministry's AMS data base was conducted and confirmed by the owner in a conversation on April 5, 2022, that no authorization or application has been submitted since the on site inspection for this facility. Refuse that originates from residential, commercial, institutional, demolition, land clearing or construction sources is a prescribed industry, listed under Schedule 1: Commercial waste management or waste disposal industry "means establishments primarily engaged in the commercial collection, handling, storage, treatment, destruction or disposal of waste soil, solids or liquids"; of the Environmental Management Act (EMA) - Waste Discharge Regulation. Therefore, the facility is operating as a prescribed industry and has no authorization on file. Any discharge resulting from these sources is regulated under the EMA and requires a waste discharge authorization. The introduction of waste to the environment from a prescribed industry without an authorization is prohibited, therefore; as the facility has allowed effluent waste to be introduced to the environment in th




