Thanks – here are the draft bullets, let me know what you think:

- The BC Conservation Officer Service responded to a call from RCMP on Thursday, December 21, to the Buckley Bay area regarding an injured bear on Highway 19.
- An injured and emaciated black bear cub was wandering near the road, causing drivers to stop, and creating a traffic hazard.
- Conservation Officers were confident that the bear was too injured and weak to survive and euthanized the bear as a humane option.
- We continue to advise the public to stay away from bears and other wildlife.
- If you see a bear along the roadside, it may be trying to cross or it is feeding on lush vegetation or berry-producing shrubs. Use caution and slow down but do not stop, especially on highways.
- Pulling over to stop and take photos of bears can lead to habituation of both humans and vehicles.
- Remember, we all have a part to play in keeping wildlife wild.




